WEEKEND REVIEW

Premier Division

The new Ryman League season got under way on Saturday – but no-one told the Premier Division strikers. No fewer than 12 of the 22 clubs failed to find the net.

The shining exception was 18-year-old Millwall loanee Kiernan Hughes-Mason, who fired a hat-trick in his side's 4-3 home win over Hendon.

Goalkeeper Luke Garrard was the only player not making his debut in Mark Beard's revamped Tooting line-up and the new-look squad scored two quick goals around the half-hour mark, when Hughes-Mason headed the first goal and set up former Godalming man Phil Williams for the second. Hendon replied swiftly through Lee O'Leary and Lubo Guentchev missed an easy chance to equalise before Hughes-Mason scored moments before the interval and three minutes after it to complete his treble and open up a 4-1 gap. The Terrors, though, were hanging on at the end after Aaron Morgan pulled one back in the 54th minute and struck again with eight minutes left.

The only other game in which both sides scored was at Margate, where visiting Canvey were held to a 2-2 draw after taking a 2-0 lead. Danny Heale's free-kick put the islanders ahead after seven minutes and James Rowe added another after 28. Margate newcomer Craig Cloke revived their hopes by pulling one back on the stroke of half-time and the lively Dean Grant levelled matters with 11 minutes left.

LEAGUE NEWS

Last season's three defeated play-off teams all had to travel for their opening game – and all three battled out 0-0 draws.

The biggest crowd of the day, 581, were at promoted Bury Town for the visit of Kingstonian, whose star striker Bobby Traynor has been on holiday and took part for only the last 15 minutes. It was K's who came closest to victory with a shot by Matt Gray that hit that bar.

Sutton visited another promoted side, Concord, and the result was the same. Craig Dundas was the chief threat for the visitors while Marc Sontag missed a late opportunity to snatch the spoils for the hosts.

The third blank scoreline was at Horsham, where Aveley were the visitors. Much changed after finishing third last season, Aveley had an early Sean Francis goal disallowed and Horsham's former Worthing midfielder Paul Kennett hit the woodwork.

Six teams won and kept clean sheets, with Billericay going to the top of the infant league table after their 3-0 home win over Tonbridge. There was little between the teams for the first hour but then a header by defender Chris Wild sparked a burst of three goals in 12 minutes, Danny Charge and the excellent Evans Kouassi getting the others.

Of the four 2-0 winners, only Croydon Athletic were successful on the road. Ben Godfrey gave them a sixth-minute lead at Folkestone in the battle of the two clubs promoted from Division One South and Sam Long, whose cross set up the goal, scored himself after 34 minutes. Chris Piper cleared off the line from Peter Williams to prevent a Folkestone reply.

Division One North champions Lowestoft were beaten in a tight game at Carshalton. Paul Johnson broke the deadlock after 40 minutes and Byron Harrison clinched the points for the Robins midway through the second half.

Like Billericay, Hastings had to wait an hour for a defender to head them in front from a set piece. Skipper Sean Ray was the man who did it and the Sussex club polished off Wealdstone five minutes later with a volley from debutant Kenny Pogue.

The other 2-0 victory went to Harrow, who opened their account against visiting Maidstone with a 14th-minute strike by Rocky Baptiste. Harrow went on to hit the woodwork three times but scored only once more, though Kenta Nakashima midway through the second half.

Hornchurch had to settle for a single goal in their home game against Cray. Martin Tuohy, with 63 league goals to his credit in the past two seasons for East Thurrock and Aveley, scored after 11 minutes of his debut and that was enough to spoil the start of Cray's 150th anniversary season, although Laurent Hamici almost levelled matters with a shot that was deflected against the bar.

Division One North

New boys Needham Market made a winning start to their Ryman League career, beating Thamesmead 3-1 in Suffolk. They hit the bar through Sam Newson before taking the lead with a Craig Parker penalty two minutes before half-time, an advantage Newson doubled a minute after the restart. An own goal by Lewis Pemberton gave Thamesmead some hope, but Daniel Thrower put the match beyond their reach.

The biggest opening-day winners were Brentwood, who trounced visiting Leyton 5-0. Two goals in the first nine minutes, from Anthony Ryan and Joao Carlos, put the skids under Leyton but they then held out until the second half. Ellis Remy and Nick Muir made it 4-0 before Carlos wrapped it up in the last minute with his second. It made it a happy return to the club for the winger after spells with Aveley and Dagenham, for whom he played in the Football League.

Relegated Waltham Abbey got off to a flying start in their derby at Enfield Town, taking a third-minute lead with a header by Andy Keepence. Town then took control and

captured the points with two goals in three minutes early in the second half. Sam Byfield equalised and Mark Kirby tapped in the second.

Fancied Sudbury marked their return to the league with victory at Redbridge – but only just. It was goalless until deep into injury time, when the visitors were awarded a penalty. Dave McCartney saved James Baker's kick but Redbridge relief was short-lived as Baker followed up to bury the rebound.

A crowd of 306, the division's best of the day, watched Grays' first game of their tenancy at East Thurrock but it was visiting Harlow who took the points with a 19th minute free-kick by Che Stadhart. It was not all joy for Harlow, who had Clark Akers sent off near the end.

There was a 1-0 win for Heybridge, too, and their goal came at almost the same time, a good strike by Tom English. Here it was the losers who finished with ten men after Bobby Port's dismissal.

The red card was out early at Ware, where Wingate's Marc Weatherstone was given marching orders after only seven minutes. Proceedings after that were largely uneventful and the ten men held out for a 0-0 draw.

East Thurrock, play-off semi-finalists in the past two seasons, took a 76th minute lead through Kye Ruel at Great Wakering only for Dan Trenkel to make it 1-1 within three minutes.

It was all square, too, at Cricklefield where Waltham Forest had the home dressing room for their clash with landlords Ilford. A goal by Ilford's Harry Sintim after 19 minutes looked likely to be the lot but Spencer Harrison's 82nd minute reply sparked a hectic finish. Junior Appiah restored Ilford's lead and Billy Ellis made it 2-2 at the death.

Two unanswered second-half goals gave the renamed Maldon & Tiptree a winning start at Potters Bar. The hosts held out, with goalkeeper Ed Thompson defiant, until Michael Deane opened Maldon's account on 52 minutes. Thompson's day ended ten minutes early when he suffered an injury and after his exit Tony Boot made it 2-0.

Abe Seymour's long-range drive gave Romford a half-time lead against visiting

Cheshunt, who replied ten minutes after the break through Chris Meikle. Matt Toms headed home a corner with 12 minutes left to give Romford a 2-1 win.

Division One South

Tom Parker scored the fastest goal of the new Ryman League when his second-minute free-kick found its way into the Godalming net to give Whitstable the lead. Whether it was the FIRST goal of the season will never be known; Andy Keepence scored in the third minute for Waltham Abbey and, with most matches these days kicking off a few minutes late because of the Respect campaign formalities, who knows which goal went in first?

Parker was to suffer the same fate as Keepence, finishing on the wrong end of a 2-1 defeat. Visiting Godalming, play-off finalists in the spring, were level in the sixth minute when Glenn Stanley punished a defensive mix-up and Graeme Purdie hit their winner with 15 minutes left.

Two other teams expected to be among the front runners, Metropolitan Police and Leatherhead, also had to come from behind to take all three points.

The Police conceded an early goal at home to Horsham YMCA, Edmund Walker scoring after 11 minutes, but after that it was almost one-way traffic. Two goalline clearances kept the visitors in front until the interval but Ty Smith, one of several summer signings from Fleet, levelled it a minute after the restart. Smith missed a penalty shortly afterwards but it did not matter in the end as goals from Gary Drewett and Steve Sutherland completed a 3-1 win.

A much-changed Worthing side went ahead through Luke Gedling after 25 minutes of a bad-tempered affair at home to Leatherhead and they stayed in front until the 72nd minute, when Gabriel Odunaike chipped the equaliser. By then both sides were down to ten men, Leatherhead's Liam Pestle and Worthing's Terry Dodd having been sent off in separate incidents just after the hour. Jack McLeod won it for the Tanners with five minutes left.

The two league newcomers met at Whitehawk's East Brighton Park, where Faversham had to settle for a 2-2 draw after twice taking the lead. Tom Hickman's opener after five minutes was answered 11 minutes

later by Jerahl Hughes. Dane Luchford restored the Kent side's advantage after 25 minutes, after which Hawks had the upper hand and took a point with a 59th-minute goal by Wes Tate.

It was 2-2 at Sittingbourne, too. Hicham Akhazzan's penalty gave the hosts an early lead but a pair of Pinnocks, Sol in the first half and Jason in the second, put Dulwich ahead. Tom Bradbrook equalised with seven minutes left.

A third 2-2 draw arrived at Burgess Hill, where Neil Shipperley's Walton Casuals took the lead after 69 minutes through Adam Willis and held it until six minutes from time. Will Berry then equalised for the Hillians, only for Willis to grab his second. Matt Percival's last-gasp effort squared it again.

Walton & Hersham enjoyed the biggest win in the division, outplaying Ramsgate and netting three unanswered goals. Another side with multiple changes during the summer, Walton went ahead through Adrian Butler in the 20th minute and added second-half strikes by Ray Powell and Nick Barnes.

Bognor, relegated in the past two seasons, made a bright start to Division One life with a 2-0 victory at Fleet. Ben Johnson, signed from fierce rivals Worthing, put them ahead on 69 minutes and substitute Dan Royce wrapped it up with a clever lob.

Chipstead were outplayed by visiting Eastbourne Town in a goalless first half and looked in real trouble when they had Ray Freeman sent off soon after half-time. But they promptly took the lead through John Cartledge. Ashley Robinson squared it on the hour and heroics by Chipstead keeper Martin Grant meant that it finished 1-1.

It was the same scoreline at nearby Whyteleafe, where Merstham were good value for the lead they took just after the hour with a Jordan Cheadle penalty. Alec Brown levelled it 15 minutes later.

A single goal by Joe Fuller on the half-hour gave Chatham all the points at home to Corinthian-Casuals in an uneventful affair.

WALTHAM FOREST FC – VICTOR OMOGBEHIN

Tributes have been paid to a talented young footballer who died suddenly earlier this month. Victor Omogbehin was just 22 when he passed out on 9th August while paying his respects to a deceased family friend. A post-mortem examination failed to find the cause of death and an inquest was opened and adjourned at Walthamstow coroner's court.

The funeral was held for the winger, who lived in Docklands, last week and friends honoured him with a football tournament on Sunday at West Ham Memorial Ground.

Victor had recently joined Waltham Forest FC in the Ryman League having left Ilford in the summer. Having started his career with Barking in 2006, he made 63 appearances for the club, scoring seven goals.

A club statement said, "Victor won much admiration and respect with both his skilful play and his quietly modest unassuming nature and was the supporters' players of the year runner-up for 2007/08. Victor was a very well known and popular figure in local football and will be greatly missed."

Ilford FC added their own tribute, with a statement saying, "An ultra skilful, pacy winger with an eye for goal, he was a handful for defenders and well known to Ryman League clubs throughout Essex. Although his last season with the club was blighted by injury he returned from a three-month lay-off in February this year to notch five goals in 12 games which went some way to securing Ilford place in the Ryman League for another season."
