WEEKEND REVIEW

Premier Division

Harrow Borough are one of the form sides in the Premier Division. Unbeaten since their FA Cup exit at the hands of Chesterfield, they started 2011 as they had finished 2010 and moved into the top half of the table with a well-deserved 3-0 victory at Hendon on Saturday.

There was perhaps a touch of fortune about their opening goal seven minutes into the second half, with Hendon complaining that keeper James Reading had been fouled before he carried the ball over his own line. But Harrow were well worth their lead, which was extended by Troy Hewitt midway through the half and DeWayne Clarke in the dying moments.

Another side on a roll are AFC Hornchurch, who took their unbeaten league run into double figures with an equally decisive 3-0 win at Wealdstone. The elusive Lewis Smith put them ahead after 32 minutes and their full-backs combined to make it 2-0 shortly afterwards, Billy Coyne heading home a cross from debutant Sam Holloway.

Michael Ramkin, in the squad for the first time since he suffered a bad injury in September 2009, came off the bench in the 90th minute and promptly celebrated his comeback with his first goal for Hornchurch, who stayed in fifth place.

Cray, who finished their 150th anniversary year in their highest-ever position, moved up further to second spot as two early goals accounted

for struggling Hastings at Hayes Lane. Kevin Bremner and Laurent Hamici scored in the first nine minutes with Hamici, the division's top scorer, taking his league tally to 15. It was to finish 2-0 with Hastings offering little in reply even though Bremner was sent off six minutes before the break.

Leaders Sutton let two points slip at home to Tooting & Mitcham after taking a 2-0 lead. Tom Davis fired home from long range to give them a 16th minute lead and supplied the second for Bradley Woods-Garness just after the half-hour.

The Terrors replied through Jason Henry on the stroke of half-time but it looked as if they had squandered their chance of a point when Kevin Scriven saved a Karl Beckford penalty. Then, three minutes into injury time, Kiernan Hughes-Mason headed home to make it 2-2.

Croydon Athletic took a 19th minute lead through Shabazz Baidoo at home to Carshalton only to see their hopes of moving off the foot of the table shattered in the second half. Paul Johnson equalised two minutes after the restart and Robins went on to win 4-1, with two long-range blockbusters by Joel Ledgister sandwiching a strike by former Croydon marksman Gary Noel.

Bury Town reclaimed second place on Monday with a routine 2-0 victory at struggling Aveley. The dismissal of Aveley debutant Mitchel Stuart-Evans for a second yellow card in the 37th minute was probably the decisive moment. An own goal by Ryan Andrews gave Bury the lead five minutes after half-time and Lee Reed added another two minutes later.

The shock of the day came at Kingsmeadow, where Horsham continued their revival with a 3-1 win over high-flying Kingstonian. Ks were happy enough when Bobby Traynor netted his 16th of the season in the ninth minute but they were stunned by three goals in ten minutes, starting on the half-hour when Shane Graham netted. Pat Harding added his first goal for three months and Anthony Storey completed the turnaround. Bashiru Alimi almost reduced the arrears after the break, heading against the bar.

Lowestoft moved to within a point of the play-off places, with plenty of games in hand, thanks to a 2-0 home win over Concord. Like Suffolk rivals Bury, they scored both goals early in the second half with Adam Smith and Joe Francis the marksmen.

Canvey came from behind to see off Billericay 3-2 in an exciting game at Park Lane. Harrison Chatting's fifth-minute goal for the visitors was swiftly answered by Jay Curran, who then put Canvey ahead after 20 minutes. A mistake by Billericay keeper Nicky Morgan in the 36th minute gave Alex Rhodes the chance to make it 3-1 and, although Morgan almost got himself off the hook by saving the shot, Rhodes put away the rebound.

Seb Schoburgh pulled one back with 20 minutes left and Billericay were denied an equaliser when Sean Bennett-Johnson hit the bar.

The third 2-0 winners of the day were Margate, who took the honours in the Kent derby at Maidstone. Shaun Welford put them ahead with an 18th minute penalty but the points were not in the bag until James Pinnock added the second in the dying moments.

Tonbridge also won a Kent derby, at home to Folkestone. A single eighth-minute goal by Ben Judge proved enough.

Division One North

Two important Division One North games on Saturday saw teams in the play-off positions clash, and both produced plenty of action though in the end there were no changes in position.

Wingate, in second place, hosted Potters Bar, who are fifth, and took a seventh-minute lead through Lewis Jones. Ahmat Rifat, who had supplied the goal, was sent off after half an

hour but Wingate raised their game and Gary Burrell doubled the lead before half-time.

The visitors made their extra man count in the second half, however. Louis Collins pulled one back soon after the restart and equalised on the hour. Tom Pett then struck in two minutes midway through the half and Potters Bar ran out 4-2 winners. A red card for Jordan Fowler reduced Wingate to nine men before the end.

Maldon, fourth, hosted Needham Market, one point and one place ahead of them, scored four times - and needed a last-gasp penalty to snatch a 2-2 draw! Joe Sweeney's 17th goal of the season gave Maldon a 14th minute lead only for a Jack Haverson own goal to level it 12 minutes later. Needham keeper Danny Gay kept Maldon at bay in the second half and the visitors went in front after 65 minutes with another own goal, this one by Danny Smith. Then Maldon were given their late spot-kick chance to save the day and Craig Arnott obliged.

Top met bottom at Rookery Hill and East Thurrock opened up a seven-point gap with a 4-1 win over Waltham Forest. It was the first game back in charge of Forest for Olawale Ojalabi, who masterminded their escape from relegation two seasons ago but left before the start of the following campaign. He has been reappointed in place of Tony Mercer, who will now concentrate on youth development, something dear to the heart of a club who beat Leyton Orient, Yeovil and West Bromwich to reach the last 32 of the FA Youth Cup five years ago.

Still waiting for the chance to return to their old ground at Wadham Lodge, Forest have won only once this season and never looked like doubling that total on Saturday. Steve Sheehan put Rocks ahead on 16 minutes and Neil Richmond made it 2-0 at the break. A Kris Newby penalty in the 56th minute put the result beyond doubt and Junior Luke's consolation for the visitors was answered by Richmond's second.

Waltham Abbey have found some form after a stuttering start to the season and they thumped Brentwood 5-2 at Capershots. Steve Cawley set the ball rolling in the second minute and Emmauel Osei added another just before then half-hour. Sos Yao, freshly signed from Hornchurch after starting the season at

Harlow, pulled one back for the visitors early in the second half only for Tyler Campbell and Kieron Ogunkoya to make it 4-1. Yao reduced the arrears with his second before Campbell had the last word.

A spectacular long-range strike by Lee Townrow earned Sudbury a 2-1 home win over Heybridge despite playing the second half with ten men. Two goals came in the first nine minutes, James Baker putting the hosts ahead and Nathan Clarke replying. The dismissal of free-scoring Sudbury midfielder Rhys Darg should have tipped the scales towards Heybridge but Townrow had other ideas.

There was a late flurry of action at Harlow, who drew 2-2 with Enfield Town. For a long time it looked as if Jon Moore's first-half goal for the visitors would settle it, but James Peagram headed a 75th minute equaliser. Leon Osei restored Enfield's lead within two minutes only for Clark Akers to reply even more rapidly.

Two goals by Darrell Cox saw Cheshunt to a 3-1 home win over Ware, Nick Thorogood's 16th minute goal gave the hosts a half-time lead which Cox doubled two minutes after the restart. Ware replied with a Ryan Wade penalty on the hour but Chris Meikle's neat pass enabled Cox to clinch it five minutes later.

Leyton's game against Romford was postponed because of problems with a boiler at the Hare & Hounds.

There were three games on Monday and the best contest was at Tilbury, who edged out Grays 3-2 in the first league meeting of the neighbours at Chadfields since 1986. Rare riches for Dockers, who had scored only one goal in their previous nine league games.

Simon Thomas put Grays ahead in the 14th minute and the visitors should really have been out of sight by half-time. But they missed several easy chances, notably when Thomas failed to convert from a matter of inches, and turned round all square after Chris Taylor scored in the 34th minute with an effort that appeared to be meant as a cross.

Ben Bradbury, in his first game since returning to Tilbury from Harlow, put Dockers ahead with a penalty four minutes after the break and made it 3-1 in the 77th minute with another

intended cross. Thomas grabbed his second with six minutes left but Tilbury held out to ease their relegation fears.

Redbridge also moved away from the danger zone, winning 2-0 at play-off hopefuls Thamesmead. It was scoreless for 78 minutes before quick strikes by Hyun-Jin Lee and Kevin McLeod did the trick for the Motormen.

Ilford, though, are still deep in the mire after going down 3-1 at home to Great Woking. Lewis Sparrow's 32nd minute opener for the visitors was answered seven minutes later by a Wayne Grant penalty. But Grant missed another spot-kick before the interval, Dan Trenkel restored Woking's lead midway through the second half and a late goal by Ashley Hawkins made sure.

Division One South

Whitehawk continue to enjoy their Ryman League debut season. Already the league's top scorers, they added five more goals and went to the top of Division One South for the first time on Saturday. They needed a tremendous final flourish to claim their 5-3 victory at Eastbourne. Hawks were 2-0 down at half-time and, despite getting back on level terms, found themselves 3-2 down with only six minutes left.

Ryan James and Sam Crabb provided Eastbourne's interval advantage but a Wes Tate double in the 52nd and 67th minutes squared matters. Eastbourne regained the lead five minutes later with a James free-kick but had no answer to Whitehawk's late surge in which Tate completed his hat-trick in between goals from Jamie Brotherton and Paul Armstrong.

Hawks manager Darren Freeman must be delighted to see his side at the head of affairs but it was another Freeman, Chipstead's Ray, who played a major part in putting them there.

Leaders Leatherhead suffered nothing but frustration against visiting Chips and, after 84 scoreless minutes, it was Freeman who broke the deadlock. Tanners threw men forward but, as the game went into injury time, Freeman made the most of the wide-open spaces to make it 2-0. There was time for the league's top scorer, Greg Andrews, to net his 21st of the season from the penalty spot, but it was too late to avert a shock defeat.

Bognor strengthened their promotion challenge by trouncing Sussex rivals Burgess Hill 4-1 at Nyewood Lane. There were only two points between the teams at kick-off time but Bognor took charge early, with Dan Beck and a Michael Birmingham penalty making it 2-0 by the 19th minute. Lloyd Cotton halved the gap ten minutes into the second half and the points were not secured until Luke Nightingale and Ben Johnson struck in the last four minutes.

Sittingbourne hung on to a play-off spot with a 1-1 draw at Merstham, who were given a 15th minute lead by Billy Marshall. Paul Semaluka replied shortly before half-time and the visitors went on to dominate the second half without finding a winner.

Walton Casuals are hot on their heels, behind them only on goal difference, after their 2-1 home win over Fleet. It was Fleet who went in front with a Lee Riddell header after 19 minutes. Mark Nicholls replied moments before half-time and Charlie Ide nabbed the winner with ten minutes left.

It was reunion day at Godalming, where former boss Chuck Martini named 11 ex-G's in his 16-man Walton & Hersham squad. And it was the old boys who dominated, with two of them, Phil Williams and Phil Morris, giving the Swans a 2-0 half-time lead. Martin Grant added a third with 15 minutes left and it finished 3-1 after a late consolation effort by Gabriel Odunaike.

The title race is turning into a game of musical chairs. After Whitehawk had deposed Leatherhead on Saturday, they were in turn booted off the top on Monday by Metropolitan Police for whom a 71st minute goal by Eddie Smith was enough to claim all three points at Dulwich.

It has been a prosperous 2011 for Bognor and Walton & Hersham, both of whom played on Monday as well as Saturday and took their weekend hauls to six points.

Bognor chalked up a second successive home victory to move on to the heels of the top three. They beat Walton Casuals 2-0 thanks to Jason Prior's five-minute double midway through the second.

Walton & Hersham's expected revival under Chuck Martini has take a while to get under way but a second away victory of the weekend suggests they are now on course. Fleet were

Monday's victims, conceding three unanswered goals. Williams opened the scoring with a 33rd minute penalty, Richard Taylor made it 2-0 right on half-time and Gary Frewen wrapped it up midway through the second half.

The highest-scoring game in the division was at Corinthian-Casuals, where a 3-2 win over Whyteleafe lifted the hosts out of the bottom two. Three goals in seven first-half minutes did the job after Kwabena Agyei had struck early for Leafe. Shaun Lucien levelled it in the 23rd minute and Leon Yarnie netted twice in a minute to put Casuals in command. Dean Gunner gave the visitors vain hope just after the hour.

So Whitstable slipped back into the relegation zone despite taking a point from a 1-1 draw at Faversham. Both goals came in the second half, with Ian Pulman putting the Oystermen on terms after Dane Luchford's opener.

Horsham YMCA drew 1-1 at home to Worthing but are five points adrift at the bottom. Gavin Gordon put YM ahead with a 44th-minute penalty and John Lansdale replied nine minutes after the restart.

The most dramatic finish of the day was provided by Ramsgate's Mark Lovell. Visitors Chatham had apparently taken the points with a 62nd-minute goal by Kane Rice until Lovell equalised in the 89th minute and then converted a penalty in added time to give Rams a 2-1 victory.

And finally...

Merstham and Sittingbourne produced the numerical oddity of New Year's Day; theirs was the only Ryman Football League game to finish 1-1 on 1.1.11.

It is almost certainly the first time in the league's history that there has been such an occurrence. The last time it was theoretically possible was on 9.9.99, and there were no 9-9 draws!

A 5-5 draw on 5.5.55 is slightly more feasible but there were no such results in the Isthmian League that season. 4.4.44 was, of course, in wartime and 3.3.33 was a Friday so it is most unlikely that the only 3-3 draw that season, between London Caledonians and Clapton, would have taken place on that date.

There would have been few midweek games during winter in those days, so 22.2.22 (a Wednesday) and 2.2.22 (a Thursday) can probably be ruled out. For the same reason, so can 11.1.11 (another Wednesday), and the 1.1.11 a century ago was a Sunday, so there were certainly no Isthmian games that day.

There are, however, a number of fixtures on Tuesday week, the forthcoming 11.1.11, so a repeat occurrence is more than possible.
