#### **TREVOR BAILEY**

It was with great sadness that the league heard the news that former England cricketer Trevor Bailey had died at a fire in his home at Westcliff this morning. He was 87. His wife was rescued.

Although he was best known for his achievements on the cricket field, Bailey was also a talented footballer. He won Blues for both sports at Cambridge University and went on to play amateur football, most notably for Walthamstow Avenue although he also represented Leytonstone and Pegasus. Avenue were then one of the top Isthmian League clubs; in the ten seasons after the war they never finished outside the top four and won the championship three times.

Bailey was a valuable member of the side when his cricket commitments allowed and played at inside-right for the team that beat local rivals Leyton 2-1 in the 1952 FA Amateur Cup final, watched by a six-figure crowd at Wembley. His shot was turned on to a post by the Leyton goalkeeper for Jim Lewis to follow up and score the opening goal.

The following season Bailey was in the Avenue side who achieved a stunning 1-1 FA Cup draw at Manchester United. The replay was staged at Highbury and well over 50,000 fans saw the battling amateurs beaten 5-2.

As a cricketer famous for his forward defensive stroke, which earned him his Barnacle nickname, Bailey played his most famous innings at Lord's in 1953 when he batted almost all day with Willie Watson to save the

Second Test against Australia and pave the way for an eventual Ashes triumph.

In all Bailey played 61 times for England, scoring more than 2,000 runs and taking 132 wickets. Meanwhile he was a loyal servant of his beloved home county, Essex, becoming captain and club secretary. In both roles he laid the initial foundations for the county's great future success, although it was more than a decade after his retirement in 1967 when they finally landed their first-ever trophy.

He scored 28,641 first-class runs, took 2,082 wickets and performed the Double (1,000 runs and 100 wickets in a season) eight times.

This writer was lucky enough to see him in action frequently in the latter stages of his career, invariably clad in a red and yellow MCC touring sweater rather than an Essex one. His smooth run-up and action made the most impression on me, along with the fact that when strolling round the ground with one teammate or another, as he frequently did when not in the middle, he was invariably puffing on a cigarette. It was nearly 50 years ago, but even then it came as a shock to the schoolboy eye.

After retiring from the game Bailey was a popular and long-serving member of the Test Match Special team. He covered cricket and football for the Financial Times for 25 years; they also sent him to the 1972 Olympics in Munich and he had to cover the tragic events which unfolded there. Among many other books, he wrote the definitive biography of Sir Garry Sobers.

League chairman Alan Turvey was lucky enough to be present at Southend for the

famous match when Essex became the only side to dismiss the 1948 Australian tourists in a single day. Bailey took two for 128 in 21 overs; not a bad effort in a total of 721! His victims came with successive balls; Keith Miller, a combative cricketer who had no taste for coming in to bat with the scoreboard showing 364 for two, allowed himself to be bowled by Bailey's next delivery. Don Bradman, watching from the other end on his way to 187, was not amused.

Bailey would have bowled more overs had he not been taken ill. He was unable to bat in either Essex innings, though even his noted defensive abilities would have been unlikely to stave off a defeat which came by the margin of an innings and 451 runs.

Alan said today: "Trevor was a great sportsman and I am proud that he played many games in the Isthmian League."

Everyone connected with the league extend their sympathy to Trevor's family.

#### **WEEKEND REVIEW**

#### **Premier Division**

The spotlight on Saturday shone brightly on the five teams seemingly adrift at the foot of the Premier Division table, who conjured up three victories and two draws between them. So the teams who drew were the main losers, so to speak. They fell foul of two of the division's ace marksmen and now occupy the bottom two places.

Aveley are propping up the rest after their 1-1 home draw with Kingstonian, who took a 20<sup>th</sup>-minute lead through Bobby Traynor. It was his 17<sup>th</sup> league goal, making him the undisputed top scorer in the Premier Division, and his 20<sup>th</sup> in all games. Danny Slatter equalised just before half-time, pouncing when Rob Tolfrey parried Kenny Beaney's free-kick.

Folkestone are ahead of the Millers on goal difference after their own 1-1 home draw against Cray. Laurent Hamici denied them all three points with his 20<sup>th</sup> of the season, and 16<sup>th</sup> in the league, after 75 minutes. Frankie Chappell had given Folkestone the lead midway through the first half but they could not hold out with ten men; Roland Edge was shown a straight red card five minutes after the interval.

Croydon Athletic are off the foot of the table at last. They moved up two places by ending a five-game losing streak and putting an end to Tonbridge's 11-match unbeaten run with a 2-0 home victory. Tom Bolarinwa put them ahead after 11 minutes but Croydon had a long, nervous wait for their clincher; longer than you might think since the start of the second half was delayed for 20 minutes because the referee was taken ill. Fine goalkeeping by Charlie Mitten helped to retain the advantage and Stefan Joseph made sure of the points in the 90<sup>th</sup> minute.

Maidstone remain in the relegation zone despite their 3-2 triumph at Hendon. Aaron Morgan put the hosts ahead after 20 minutes

but the strugglers turned it round before the half-hour mark. Nathan Paul struck an instant equaliser and Tommy Whitnell headed the Stones in front. Casey Maclaren levelled the scores against the run of play in the 76<sup>th</sup> minute but Stones had the last word through Danny Hockton.

Hastings, who started the day in 18<sup>th</sup> place, ended it there thanks to a 3-2 home victory over Tooting & Mitcham, their first three-point haul since 2<sup>nd</sup> October. They were indebted to Tooting defender Osa Obamwonyi, who conceded two penalties in the first 27 minutes and received a yellow card for each offence. Sam Adams converted both kicks.

Jamie Byatt pulled one back for the ten men soon after half-time but George Porter quickly made it 3-1. Karl Beckford had the chance to put the Terrors back in it with the day's third penalty but it was saved by Scott Chalmers-Stevens. Beckford eventually found the net in the 89<sup>th</sup> minute and Hastings had a couple of scares before the final whistle.

At the other end of the table, Sutton maintained their eight-point lead with a 2-1 home victory over Lowestoft. A couple of weeks ago this match was shaping up to be a potential title decider but it had been robbed of that lustre by the Trawlerboys' loss of form. From being arguably the championship favourites Lowestoft have tumbled out of the play-off places after taking three points from five games.

They were aggrieved not to get some reward at Gander Green Lane, feeling that Michael Frew's apparent late equaliser was wrongly disallowed. Sutton had gone ahead with a 26<sup>th</sup> minute penalty by Andy Forbes and he made it 2-0 nine minutes after the break only to be shown a second yellow card for his celebration. Scott Mitchell's deflected shot gave Lowestoft new hope with 25 minutes left but the ten men held out with the help of that disputed offside decision.

Tonbridge's shock defeat gave Bury the chance to reclaim second place and they did it decisively, beating Carshalton 3-0 at Ram Meadow. They were two up inside 15 minutes through Neil Andrews and Sam Nunn, with Sam Reed firing a vicious third from outside the box midway through the second half.

Thriller of the day was at Wealdstone and, inevitably, Richard Jolly played a major role. He opened the scoring eight minutes before

half-time and Alan Massey made it 2-0 at the break. Canvey stormed back in the second half, however. Rob King's 54<sup>th</sup> minute penalty opened their account, Leon Gordon levelled it in the 78<sup>th</sup> minute and Jason Hallett put them in front. A draw was the right result for such a close contest, however, and it was Jolly who made it 3-3 five minutes into added time. That makes his tally ten goals in four league games since his loan move from Sutton, which has two matches left to run.

Only goal difference now separates Billericay from a play-off place after their 2-0 derby win over Hornchurch at New Lodge. Cedric Ngakam and Benson Kpaka scored in the first 15 minutes of the second half. Urchins have dropped to 11<sup>th</sup> but are still within four points of the play-offs.

Concord are also well in contention after their 3-0 home win over unpredictable Harrow, who have netted 27 goals in their last nine league games yet have been kept off the scoresheet in four of them. Tony Stokes put them ahead after 17 minutes and James Elmes added a goal in each half.

A serious injury to Horsham captain Ben Andrews, which could end his season, marred their 1-1 home draw with Margate. Long-serving Gary Charman put Hornets ahead three minutes after half-time and Tom Bradbrook squared it ten minutes later.

#### **Division One North**

Any player would be keen to make an immediate impression with a new club, but Wingate's Murat Karagul may feel that he roused rather too much expectation by his dramatic debut at Waltham Abbey on Saturday. Karagul, signed from Ware during the week, came on as a late substitute with the score 2-2 in the Division One North fixture and proceeded to find the net with his first two touches, giving Wingate a 4-2 victory which cemented their third place in the table. Follow that!

Gary Burrell twice put Wingate ahead in the first half. Ryan Maxwell got Abbey's first equaliser and Emmanuel Osei squared it again in the 75<sup>th</sup> minute, paving the way for Karagul's entrance.

Karagul's old club also conceded four goals at home and failed to muster one in reply as they went down to fourth-placed Maldon. Ollie Berquez broke the deadlock a minute before half-time and added another with a 62<sup>nd</sup> minute penalty. James Abbott and Joe Sweeney made it comfortable.

Table-topping Needham Market dropped their first home points of the season in a 0-0 draw with Brentwood, who were determined to make amends for their 6-0 home thrashing by Enfield in midweek. Darren Blewitt led the rearguard action in a game of few chances, the best falling to Needham's Craig Parker and Nathan Stone.

Needham remain four points clear, however, because East Thurrock were held to a 1-1 draw at Harlow. A header by Clark Akers put Harlow ahead on the half-hour and Rocks equalised with 14 minutes left. Guess who scored it? Sam Higgins, last season's golden boot winner with 35 league goals, who has just returned to the club from Chelmsford.

Enfield followed up their midweek goal feast with a more restrained 2-0 home win over AFC Sudbury and climbed into a play-off spot. Leon Osei made the breakthrough on the hour and Liam Hope quickly added a second.

Romford slipped back to sixth after crashing 3-0 at Grays, who are now five points below the play-off places and very much in form. Simon Thomas netted in each half and Marvin Samuel headed the third in added time.

Heybridge are level on points with Grays and also in the form which could make them contenders. They whipped Cheshunt 5-2 at Scraley Road, helped by a double from Chris Bryan: five goals in two games for him. Michael Toner opened the scoring after ten minutes and Bryan added another on 24, only for Cheshunt to hit straight back with a Darrell Cox penalty. Bryan scored his second shortly before half-time and Cox replied six minutes after the break. Russell Pond made it 4-2 with 20 minutes left and Chris Lewis wrapped it up at the death.

Tilbury eased their relegation fears with a 3-1 home victory over Great Wakering, who were handed a third-minute lead by a Billy Crowther own goal. Crowther made amends by equalising in the 25<sup>th</sup> minute and Dockers added a goal at the end of each half through Hulusi Mustafi and Harry Cook.

Waltham Forest remained in deep trouble after going down to a lone Andy Constable goal in the 80<sup>th</sup> minute at Thamesmead, who won for the first time since November.

Fellow-strugglers Redbridge suffered the day's only postponement; a waterlogged Oakside pitch put paid to their game against Potters Bar.

#### **Division One South**

Godalming ended a dismal run of eight successive Division One South defeats in unlikely style on Saturday. Their home game against Burgess Hill was just three minutes old when keeper Jamie Norris felled a visiting forward and was sent off. It was some time before he left the pitch because he needed treatment for a suspected broken jaw.

It was the 12<sup>th</sup> minute before play resumed and Steve Harper fired the penalty past player-manager Neil Baker, who had taken over in goal. The ten men hit back four minutes later, however, with a header by Dave Stevens and, if anything, they had the better of proceedings after that before it finished 1-1.

G's remain very much in the danger zone at the foot of the table, where the five clubs above table-propping Horsham YMCA are covered by three points.

Last-minute goals changed the outcome for three of the bottom six on Saturday. Happiest of that trio were Whitstable after Gareth Cornhill's dramatic 30-yard strike in the 90<sup>th</sup> minute earned them a 1-0 home win over Merstham and lifted them out of the bottom two.

Corinthian-Casuals are now 21<sup>st</sup>, though they salvaged a 1-1 home draw with Faversham with a last-gasp header by Wayne Finnie. The visitors had led from the 23<sup>rd</sup> minute, when Damian Abel struck, and a 2-0 win would have lifted them into a play-off place for the first time.

YMCA remain eight points adrift after their visit to Ramsgate, who equalised in the third minute of injury time. Dayo Oshitola's sixthminute strike for the Sussex club brought an instant response from Paul Axon and the next goal did not come until the 70<sup>th</sup> minute, when substitute Kieran Mercer restored YM's lead. But, with time nearly up, Liam Quinn was brought down and Warren Schulz made it 2-2.

Young Whyteleafe striker Ryan Thomas is transforming their season. The 17-year-old has now scored five goals in four games, three of them victories, as Leafe start to haul

themselves out of trouble. They fell behind to a first-minute Aaron Firth effort at Chatham but Thomas squared it seven minutes before halftime and Chris O'Flaherty hit the winner seven minutes after the break.

Fleet stayed in 18<sup>th</sup> place after a late goal frustrated their comeback at Worthing. After a scoreless first half, Rebels took command in the first ten minutes of the second period with goals from Callum Saunders and Ryan Timms. Fleet rallied and, after Chad Coombes and Darren Wheeler had levelled it, Josh Pearson completed the turnaround in the 85<sup>th</sup> minute. But Saunders had the last word, making it 3-3.

Bognor moved five points clear at the top with a 2-1 victory at Sussex rivals Eastbourne. A Michael Birmingham free-kick after eight minutes gave Rocks a lead which Ben Johnson doubled just before the interval. Greg Manton gave the hosts hope with nine minutes left.

Metropolitan Police regained second place with a 2-0 victory at Sittingbourne. Craig Watkins put them ahead after four minutes and Eddie Smith added the second 20 minutes from time.

Whitehawk dropped back to third after a 1-1 draw at Chipstead. Wes Tate's close-range strike in the 52<sup>nd</sup> minute looked likely to be the winner but Chips snatched a point with nine minutes left through Anthony-James Morrison.

Leatherhead are four points behind Hawks with three games in hand after their 2-0 victory at Walton & Hersham. Mu Mann opened the scoring on the half-hour and Greg Andrews wrapped it up in the 64<sup>th</sup> minute, at the same time increasing his lead in the race for the golden boot. It was his 24<sup>th</sup> league goal, three more than Needham's Craig Parker. Including cup goals, Parker still leads 28-26.

Walton Casuals are sixth, trailing Burgess Hill by a single goal, after a 2-1 success at Dulwich. Manager Neil Shipperley was worried by his side's injury list but they overcame them thanks to a 65<sup>th</sup> minute winner from Liam White. Craig Totton had given Casuals a half-time lead which was wiped out soon after the break by Gerry Gonnella.

#### Ryman Youth League

Progress was made in the Lucas Fettes Youth Cup this week, with four ties completed and yielding a total of 21 goals.

Carshalton and Horsham finally played their first-round match and the young Robins ran out 4-2 winners with Fred Meech contributing a couple of goals.

The other games were all in the second round, though two more had to be called off because of floodlight trouble at Sutton and heavy rain at Maidstone.

A George Isaac hat-trick, two of them penalties, could not keep Hayes & Yeading in the competition. A double from Matt Robinson, including a 90<sup>th</sup> minute equaliser, gave visiting Kingstonian a 3-3 draw and K's won the penalty shoot-out 4-2.

Tonbridge won 4-2 in normal time, though that hardly looked the likely outcome when visitors Maldon carried a 2-0 lead into the last 11 minutes. Then Jack Leighton, Greg Keddy, Brett Milham and Keddy again transformed the game. A first-half double by Kit Tregear gave Burgess Hill a 2-1 victory at Tooting.

Top scorers in the league were Whitehawk, who powered to the top of the South-East Division with a 7-1 victory at Eastbourne Town. Kieron Pamment led the way with a hat-trick.

Maidstone slipped back to third place after their 3-2 defeat at unbeaten Lewes, who lie fourth with games in hand. Larry Egunjobi, Jordan Lang and Harry Bowles got their goals with Jack Simon and Tom Cachett replying, the latter in the last minute.

Simon is the second-highest scorer in the league with 12, but he lost ground on the leader as George Griffiths fired a hat-trick for Walton & Hersham to take his tally to 16. The Swans beat Thamesmead 5-1 in the Central Division.

Kieran Lunn and Dale Malcolm netted secondhalf goals as Leatherhead beat Whyteleafe 2-0 while Matt Cornish got the decider as Metropolitan Police saw off Chipstead by the odd goal in three.

Staines went to the top of the West Division with a 2-1 home win over Harrow, Dominic Ogun netting the winner with 15 minutes left, and an Adam Bicknell goal was all Woking needed at Hampton as they moved into second place.
