NON LEAGUE DAY – 4TH SEPTEMBER 2010

The Zamaretto, Ryman and Evo-Stik Leagues have announced that their 200 clubs would all be encouraged to support Non League Day on Saturday, 4th September.

4th September is a day when football fans are encouraged to support their local non league side, in the absence of any Championship or Premiership football that weekend. The three Step 3 & 4 leagues, whose clubs stretch from Durham to Truro have given the initiative their unanimous blessing, and gone further by agreeing a common approach, as Ryman League Chairman Alan Turvey explains. "This is a fantastic opportunity for football fans to sample the unique atmosphere of the non-league game, and we will be suggesting our member clubs make special offers available to fans of professional clubs that will persuade them to come and watch their local teams."

Zamaretto chairman Ken Turner confirmed that teams in all three leagues who wish to take part in Non League Day are being encouraged by league bosses to give free or discounted admission to season ticket holders at any Premiership or Football League clubs. "We would never force our clubs to take part, especially if they are already expecting a big crowd on September 4th, however we're optimistic that a substantial number will want to take this opportunity to attract first time visitors to their games."

This move is the latest example of cooperation between the three premier semi-professional leagues, as Evo-Stik League Chairman Mark Harris elaborates. "These are difficult times for all clubs at Steps 3 and 4 (of the non league pyramid). As leagues, we can become

stronger and more effective if we speak with one voice on key issues, and especially when it comes to attracting new fans to the semi-professional game. Fans want to see leagues learning from each other, and to adopt a consistent approach to opportunities such as Non League Day, that arise."

WEEKEND REVIEW

Premier Division

The misery goes on for Kent's five Premier Division clubs, who have now played 18 games between them this season and have yet to register a single victory.

That remains the case even though there were two Kent derbies on Monday. Folkestone and Tonbridge failed to contrive a goal while Margate and Maidstone scored one apiece. Actually, Margate scored them both; Laurence Ball put through his own net to give Stones a second-half lead which they held until six minutes from time, when Wayne Wilson levelled matters.

The fifth Kent club, Cray, lost their lead at exactly the same time as Sam Adams converted a penalty to earn hosts Hastings a 1-1 draw after Laurent Hamici had struck for Cray eight minutes earlier. Hastings, the overnight leaders, slipped to fifth place.

None of the Kent quintet are bottom of the table, however. That spot belongs to Horsham, cruelly beaten 3-2 at home to Kingstonian by a Gary MacDonald goal four minutes into added time. Jay Lovett gave Horsham a 17th minute lead, their first goal of the season. Bobby Traynor levelled matters with a penalty soon after the interval and,

although Ben Andrews put the Hornets ahead again, Traynor made it 2-2 with another spot-kick. It was his second penalty double in three games and he is back in his familiar place at the head of the Premier Division scorers with five goals in all. Last season produced a remarkable number of occasions when players scored to atone for being sent off in their previous match, and Andrews followed in that tradition after receiving a red card on Saturday.

Surrey are faring considerably better than Kent, for the only club ahead of K's in the table are neighbours Sutton. Yet to concede a goal after 360 minutes' football, Sutton doubled their goals-for tally with a 3-0 victory at Tooting in front of the day's biggest crowd, 654. Richard Jolly put them ahead in the 11th minute, scoring for the third successive game, Fola Orilonishe doubled the tally on the hour and Bradley Woods-Garness got the third deep into added time.

Hot on the heels of the Surrey duo come Suffolk's finest, Bury and Lowestoft, who both made it three wins on the trot. Bury moved into third place with a 2-1 victory over Aveley, Chris Henderson grabbing a 78th-minute winner moments after Scott Pethers had put the visitors on terms. Craig Nurse had opened Bury's account in the 33rd minute. Lowestoft netted two unanswered goals at Concord. Lee McGlone put them ahead after only two minutes and Danny Bloomfield added another just past the hour.

Another Surrey club, Croydon Athletic, did well to put their troubles behind them and take the honours by the odd goal in three in their derby at Carshalton. Athletic nevertheless led at half-time through Ben Godfrey. Byron Harrison made it 1-1 in the 65th minute but unbeaten Athletic kept going and Gareth Williams grabbed a late winner.

Penalties decided the issue at Harrow, where Lubo Guentchev converted two spot-kicks in the last 12 minutes to see Hendon to a 3-2 victory. Aaron Morgan had put them ahead after only four minutes but Troy Hewitt squared it on the stroke of half-time and Dean Marney netted Harrow's second on 72 minutes.

Two goals in a minute turned likely victory into defeat for Wealdstone at Hornchurch. They looked comfortable after Scott Fitzgerald's 55th minute header put them ahead but a needless

handling offence allowed Tommy Black to equalise from the penalty spot in the 72nd minute and, moments later, Leon Hunter turned in the winner.

A single Danny Charge goal 13 minutes from time decided the Essex derby at Billericay as the home side edged out Canvey in front of another 600-plus crowd.

Hastings had forfeited their 100 per cent record with a goalless draw at Hendon on Saturday. An even game might have tipped Hastings' way when Hendon's Kevin Maclaren was sent off with 15 minutes left but it was actually the hosts who came closer to a winner when Michael Peacock's header was well saved by Clark Masters.

Kingstonian left it even later than they would on Monday; although it was only the 89th minute when Carl Wilson-Denis squeezed a shot in off a post to earn his side a 2-1 victory over Hornchurch, it was well after 5.15 thanks to lengthy delays for traffic problems and then a number of injuries.

Black had given the visitors a 15th minute lead from the penalty spot after Dean Hamlin handled but K's nabbed a crazy equaliser six minutes later when Urchins made a complete hash of dealing with a long kick from Rob Tolfrey. The keeper's clearance was almost in the net when Dean Lodge nipped in to claim the final touch. After that Hornchurch had the better of things but Wilson-Denis had the last word.

Jolly's 13th minute goal proved lucky for Sutton, who beat Folkestone 1-0. They were worthy winners though the visitors, who had Micheal Everitt dismissed just after half-time, did have had chances of their own.

Newcomers Bury Town came from behind to win 2-1 at Maidstone. Having wiped out a 2-0 deficit to come out on top at Tonbridge in midweek, Bury found the Kentish air to their liking again. James Peacock gave Stones the lead from a corner midway through the first half but two goals in two minutes shortly before half-time, from Tom Bullard and Lee Reed, turned the game on its head.

Tonbridge also went down 2-1 at home. Dan McGonigle put Harrow ahead from close range after 27 minutes and Rocky Baptiste's header doubled the advantage with 20 minutes left.

Frannie Collin gave the Angels hope with six minutes left and Harrow had to cling on after the late dismissal of Danny Leech.

Margate took the lead in front of 723 spectators at Lowestoft with a long-range strike by Darren Marsden after 25 minutes. McGlone headed the equaliser within two minutes and Bloomfield drilled home a loose ball for what proved to be the winner soon after half-time. A last-minute red card for Curtis Robinson made the lengthy return trip to the Kent coast a thoroughly miserable one.

Croydon Athletic's first home game in the Premier Division ended goalless, with visiting Billericay having the upper hand for much of the afternoon.

Aveley made it three draws out of three when David Knight fired an 88th minute leveller in their home game with Essex rivals Concord, who had gone ahead nine minutes into the second half with a header from centre-back Brad Thomas. It was 1-1, too, at Canvey with both goals coming in the first half-hour. Paul Johnson's free-kick gave Carshalton the lead and Danny Heale squared it from 20 yards. James Rowe hit the bar for Canvey in the closing stages.

Horsham were well beaten at Wealdstone after making a bright start. The hosts steadily gained a grip and Greg Ngoyi put them ahead eight minutes before half-time. Peter Dean added another just before the break and struck again on 52 minutes to complete a 3-0 victory before Horsham's Andrews was sent off.

Division One North

Enfield Town issued a warning to their Division One North rivals with a 5-0 home win over Harlow on Monday. Harlow had won their first three games of the season but were swept aside in the game's final quarter. Richard Morton put Enfield ahead in the 13th minute and his second, midway through the second half, triggered a burst of four goals in 15 minutes. Lee Protheroe, Adam Wallace and Liam Hope were the other marksmen.

Brentwood still top the table despite being held to a 2-2 home draw by Waltham Abbey. Matt Hayter's 10th minute strike gave the visitors a half-time lead but Brentwood were 2-1 up by the hour mark thanks to Anthony Ryan and Danny Dafter. Abbey's point-saver came from Xaniel Doku in the 71st minute.

East Thurrock are behind the leaders on goal difference after their 1-0 success at Waltham Forest, who might have feared a rout when Neil Richmond headed home in the third minute. It was not until the 77th minute, however, that Kye Ruel nabbed the second.

The derby between Grays and Tilbury was the first meeting of these fierce rivals in a league match since Dockers were relegated to the old Division Two North in 1987, and it attracted a crowd of 427 to Rookery Hill. It turned out to be Grays' day, with Jared Small becoming their hero. He scored in the 72nd and 83rd minutes to wrap up a 3-1 win. Grays had led at half-time through Danny Bunce but Jack West equalised for Dockers on 66 minutes. Then it was over to Small.

Needham Market moved into third place with a 4-0 home win over Maldon & Tiptree. Nathan Stone put them ahead after 16 minutes and two goals in the last two minutes of the first half, from Dan Thrower and a Craig Parker penalty, left the visitors with too much to do. Stone added the only goal of the second period.

Two penalties accounted for Redbridge, who went down 2-1 at home to Thamesmead.

Division One South

Worthing striker Terry Dodd was the man of the weekend. After firing a hat-trick in Saturday's 6-0 FA Cup trouncing of Arundel, Dodd added a second match ball to his collection with another treble in Monday's 5-0 league win over Horsham YMCA.

The match had extra significance for Worthing boss Chris White and many of his players, including Dodd, who moved down the A24 from YMCA during the close season. They were held at bay until the 37th minute, when Dodd opened his account. By that time the visitors were down to ten men after Grant Ludford received a red card, and Matt Geard soon added a second. Dodd made it 3-0 after 70 minutes and again there was a rapid follow-up, this time from Michael Hockett. Dodd took his weekend tally to six in the final minute, leaving Woodside Road fans one short of what tennis players call a double bagel: 6-0, 6-0.

The victory gave Rebels their first points of the season and left YM at the bottom after conceding 12 goals in their three defeats.

There were two other hat-trick heroes in the division: Whyteleafe's Chris O'Flaherty and Greg Andrews of Leatherhead.

O'Flaherty netted twice in the first 15 minutes of his side's home game against Corinthian-Casuals, who pulled one back through Mu Maan. Two goals in a minute just before the hour, from Bradley Drake and O'Flaherty, wrapped up the points before Joel Thompson replied.

Andrews scored all his side's goals in their 3-1 victory at Chipstead, who looked set for a point when Jason Thompson answered Andrews' early opener. It was not until four minutes from time that Andrews restored the lead with a penalty – Chipstead's Lee Coburn was sent off - and he found the net again before the end.

Only six matches took place in this division took place as FA Cup replays took their toll of the programme, and Burgess Hill took the chance to go to the top of the table with a 2-1 home win over Bognor. Steve Harper's 13th minute opener for the Hillians was answered five minutes later by Phil Turner and it was not until the 85th minute that Matt Percival netted the decider.

Newcomers Faversham, also on seven points, lie second on goal difference after Danny Hunt's 19th minute penalty settled their derby at Whitstable in front of almost 300 fans.

Fleet beat Walton Casuals 3-1 in the other game, going ahead on the stroke of half-time through Johnnie Dyer. Quickfire goals early in the second half from Darren Campbell and, again, Dyer made virtually sure of victory. Michael Barima pulled one back with 20 minutes left but that was all.

FA Cup

Of the 42 Division One clubs who started on the FA Cup trail in the preliminary round at the weekend, 31 can still dream of a trip to Wembley in May.

Among the 11 casualties, four bit the dust in all-Ryman ties, the pick of which was the local derby at Chipstead in which the hosts edged out Whyteleafe by the odd goal in seven to claim the £1,500 prize money. Dominic O'Shea started the goal feast on nine minutes and finished it on the hour. In between, Leafe hit back through Alec Brown and Chris

O'Flaherty to go in front at the 30-minute mark only for John Cartledge to make it 2-2 shortly afterwards.

Brown put the visitors 3-2 up just after the interval and could have gone further ahead before Lee Coburn equalised again on 58 minutes and O'Shea grabbed the decider two minutes later.

Another all-Division One South tie saw Leatherhead slump to a 2-0 home defeat by Burgess Hill. A goal in each half, from Lloyd Skinner and Matt Percival, earned the Hillians a well-deserved success.

The third tie involving two teams from this division went to a replay thanks to a last-gasp goal by Richard Shittu which gave Godalming a 1-1 draw at Margate. Mitch Sherwood's 55th minute penalty had seemed to be enough for the Rams.

Two all-North Division ties were 3-0 defeats for the 'Walthams'. Waltham Abbey held out for 56 minutes at East Thurrock until Joe Keith's cross found its way into the net as Neil Richmond's vain attempt at a diving header wrong-footed the defence. Max Cornhill and Richmond completed the scoreline.

Waltham Forest held out even longer at home to Enfield Town before Lee Protheroe's 69th-minute penalty triggered a crushing burst of three goals in six minutes. Michael Bardle and Sam Byfield made sure of Town's progress.

Eight Ryman clubs faced Zamaretto League opposition; four won, three lost and one tie has yet to be decided. Fleet Town were the highest scorers in those games, hitting four unanswered second-half goals against Bedfont Town including a Darren Wheeler double. A single Che Stadhart goal was enough for Harlow at home to Barton and a Ben Boyce strike saw Tilbury through at Uxbridge.

Romford made a flying start against Beaconsfield SYCOB on Sunday, taking a 2-0 lead in 16 minutes with well-struck goals by Richard Oxby and Joe Pearman. Gavin Bamford pulled one back in the 67th minute but Toran Senghore punished a mistake by the visiting keeper three minutes later and Romford won 3-1.

Heybridge went out in a replay on Monday, going down 1-0 at home to Leighton. Swifts

had twice taken the lead through Chris Bryan in the first game but it finished 2-2.

Wingate & Finchley replay on Tuesday after a goalless draw at home to Northwood.

The first-time losers were Ware, beaten 2-1 by a late goal at Hitchin after Billy Healey gave them what proved to be a short-lived lead, and Sittingbourne, who had Billy Manners sent off in the first half of their 1-0 home defeat by Andover. Joe Bannan's own goal decided it.

The top individual scorer of the day was Worthing's Terry Dodd, whose hat-trick led them to a 6-0 thumping of Sussex League neighbours Arundel. Their victory margin was matched by Metropolitan Police at Horley, where the haul included a James Field double.

Anthony Ryan and Ellis Remy shared the goals as Brentwood won 4-0 at Southend Manor and Kris Lee's early strike set up Maldon & Tiptree's 4-2 home win over Hertford.

Horsham YMCA visited South Park, who are being featured in ITV's Road to Wembley series, but they will not be too keen on watching the coverage after a 4-0 defeat at the hands of a club from the lower division of the Combined Counties League. Two Chris Smith goals in the first 11 minutes set the tone.

South Park are from Reigate and are (unless you know better) the first club from that town represented in the FA Cup since Reigate Priory, one of the original entrants in 1871, though they pulled out without playing a game. Priory entered the next four competitions and took part three more times in the 1920s, but only ever won one tie. So, by winning the first two FA Cup games in their history, South Park have already surpassed their neighbours, who still exist.

Merstham were humbled 2-1 at Wessex League strugglers Alton. Ian Humble netted in each half and Merstham's reply was an own goal.

Two Ryman League sides faced tough visits to Step 5 teams with 100 per cent league records, and both went out. Chatham led at half-time through Gary Ward but lost 2-1 at Chertsey while Potters Bar were beaten 3-2 at Newport Pagnall. The Division One North side were gifted the lead by an own goal but had to

wait until the 90th minute for their second, a Jake Parratt penalty, by which time it was too late.

Walton Casuals swept aside Sussex County League club Worthing United 3-0, building on a 20th minute opener by Dan Buckle, while just down the road Walton & Hersham saw off Bracknell by the same margin. Matt York scored after three minutes but Bracknell were very much in the game until substitute Will Jenkins scored twice in the last nine minutes.

Two clubs with a point to prove earned replays against Ryman opposition. VCD Athletic, relegated last season because of ground issues, converted a second-half penalty to draw 1-1 with visitors Eastbourne, who led at half-time through Evan Archibald. Witham, who claimed that they should have been promoted to the Ryman League during the summer, fought out a goalless home draw against Ilford.

Whitehawk earned themselves an attractive tie at home to Maidstone on Saturday week. They narrowly avoided a shock defeat by Combined Counties Division One outfit Hartley Wintney on Saturday. They were 2-0 down and it took a last-minute Paul Armstrong effort to salvage a 2-2 draw. Monday's replay was scoreless until the 57th minute but the visitors were then felled by two goals apiece from Wes Tait and Josh Jones.

Tunbridge Wells, who had two goalless draws to show for their efforts in the Kent League this season, drew again when they entertained Dulwich. But 'entertained' is the right word; it finished 3-3 after goals from both Pinnocks, Sol and Jason, had given Dulwich a 3-1 half-time lead which they held until 12 minutes from time.

Another Kent League side, Beckenham, pulled off a 3-2 victory at Thamesmead and the scoreline was the same at Daventry though here it was the Ryman League visitors, Needham Market, who finished on the right end of it. Trailing 2-1 at half-time, Needham went through with a Craig Parker penalty and a James Evans winner.

Two Ryman victories over Sussex League clubs have already been mentioned and it was, in fact, a full house in five such encounters. Bognor made hard work of beating Ringmer with a lone first-half goal from

Jason Prior while Faversham, at home to Pagham, and Corinthian-Casuals, at Lingfield, both netted twice without reply. Both took the lead at almost the same moment just before the break, with Dane Luchford claiming Faversham's opener while Reggie Savage set Casuals on course.

It may have been a first at Sudbury, for meetings between Ryman clubs and Evo-Stik Northern Premier teams are unlikely to occur at this early, heavily regionalised, stage of the competition. But that was the case here, and will be again on Tuesday when Sudbury travel to Stamford for a replay after a 2-2 draw. Jack Wignall rescued the Ryman side in added time.

Cheshunt must also replay after being held 2-2 at home, in their case by Cockfosters. Chris Meikle's goal salvaged it after the visitors had taken a shock 2-1 lead. And it took a late goal by Billy Johnson to give Great Wakering a second chance after they had trailed 1-0 for most of their tie at Saffron Walden.

Redbridge made the short trip to Essex League side Barking and came away with a 1-0 victory. Anton Agdomar scored midway through the second half.
