THE CHAMPIONSHIP MANAGER CUP

In the programme for last season's Championship Manager Cup final it was noted that there had never been a final without Premier Division representation.

Never say never. That has happened this season as Dulwich Hamlet, from Division One South, take on Wingate & Finchley from Division One North, and so for the third successive year the winners will come from the lower section.

Indeed, Premier Division clubs were virtually eclipsed. Only Cray Wanderers got as far as the quarter-finals, and they did so only by winning a penalty shoot-out at Thamesmead in the previous round.

Is it a case of the top clubs not taking the competition seriously enough? Perhaps not, although many clubs in both divisions field squad players in the early rounds of this cup, as they do increasingly even in the FA Cup.

Maybe it's just the case that there is not a great difference in standard between our divisions, certainly not as great as when the league encompassed what would now be called Steps 3-6.

After all, is anyone greatly surprised that two of last season's promoted clubs, Lowestoft Town and Bury Town, are at the time of writing occupying play-off positions in the Premier Division with a third, Concord Rangers, only just outside them? For that matter, two of the promoted clubs in 2009 contested the Premier play-offs in 2010. And the two Division One

champions in 2008, Dover and Dartford, were the next two league title winners. So perhaps we should give ourselves credit for the overall strength of the competition.

Tonight's winners will be the eighth club from outside the Premier Division to lift the cup, which has now run for 37 seasons under its various titles. The previous seven include Tilbury in 1975, the inaugural season, when only clubs from Division Two (the top section

was then called Division One) took part.

Although the Dockers were runners-up the following year, it was 1990 before another club from outside the top division claimed the trophy. Then it was Tilbury's neighbours Aveley, who beat a club from the bottom

half of the Premier Division, St Albans City, 3-0 in the final. Giant-killers Aveley may have been, but they were runners-up in Division Two North that year and almost made it to the Premier Division a year later (though in the end it took them until 2009, with a trip to the bottom half of Division Three along the way).

Chertsey Town were next, again as a Division Two club, when they beat Enfield 3-0 in the 1994 final. Enfield were runners-up to Stevenage in the league that year, so the result stands as the biggest upset in 37 finals. For all that, Chertsey were an exceptional side who collected 102 league points (and only finished second), then won promotion again a year later.

Northwood were the next 'junior' winners and the first Division One side to claim the cup.

That was in 2002, when they beat Hampton & Richmond Borough 3-2 – one of only three finals in which the losers have scored more than once. Northwood were a strong side who finished fifth in Division One while Hampton were 20th in the Premier. A year later they changed divisions, Northwood as champions and Hampton as wooden-spoonists.

Yeading finished 13th in Division One in 2003, the year they beat Premier Division runners-up Canvey Island 2-0 in the cup final. On paper, then, Yeading were the first 'ordinary' lower-division side to lift the trophy. And perhaps not so ordinary. They won the Division One and Premier Division titles in the next two seasons!

Next up were Tilbury in 2009, another midtable Division One side who beat a club of similar status in the Premier, Harrow Borough, 2-0. Unfortunately for Tilbury, it was not the start of something big as it had been for Yeading.

And so, finally, 2010 when Leatherhead, who were to contest the Division One South playoffs and look certain to do so again this season, defeated Wealdstone, who finished sixth in the Premier, on penalties after a lively but goalless draw. It was the third final to be decided in such fashion.

One final note: the name inscribed on the trophy after Wednesday evening's game with be the 25th different one in the past 25 seasons. Sutton United, who beat Uxbridge here in the 1986 final, were the last team to achieve another success, which they did by thrashing Harrow 6-1, a record margin, in 1998. It was their fourth win in all. Slough (1976, 1981 and 2005) and Enfield (1979 and 1980) are the only other clubs, apart from Tilbury, to have won the cup more than once. A total of 28 clubs have come out on top, of whom only ten are currently competing in the league.

DULWICH HAMLET

Dulwich Hamlet have ended 35 years of hurt by reaching tonight's final. They have taken part in every Isthmian League Cup competition apart from the very first, when clubs from the top division did not take part, and the following season when entry was optional.

They have reached the semi-finals on four previous occasions without success. The first was in 1978-79, long before penalty shoot-outs

were introduced, and they battled out two goalless draws with Enfield before losing a second replay 3-2. The sides met again in the last four a year later and this time there was no long drawn-out saga: Enfield won 2-1 at the first attempt. On both occasions they went on to win the final.

Dulwich's next semi-final did not come until 1994-95, by which time they were contested over two legs. A 3-1 defeat at Slough in the first leg left them with a difficult task in the return at Champion Hill and Slough made no mistake, winning 2-1 for a 5-2 aggregate success.

Since then they had reached the last 16 only three times before the current campaign and progressed beyond it only once. That was in 2002-03, when they made it to their fourth semi-final. There were still two legs and Dulwich hosted the first one against Yeading, only to find themselves 3-1 down again at the tie's halfway stage. The return match finished 3-3 with the first Dulwich goal coming from Junior Kadi, who is likely to be in tonight's line-up.

Their current campaign started in undistinguished fashion with a 1-0 home win over Division One North strugglers Ilford in the second round. Jason Pinnock got the goal after 23 minutes.

Next up were Concord Rangers, who proved to be the only Premier Division side Dulwich would face in the competition. The men from Canvey had home advantage but a single goal was again enough for the Hamlet to account for Essex opposition. It came after 56 minutes from David Moore.

In the fourth round Dulwich faced more Essex boys, Division One North promotion-chasers Romford, at Champion Hill and it was Boro who went ahead in the second minute through defender Matt Toms. Paul McCallum, a highly-rated 17-year-old, equalised midway through the half and then scored a last-minute winner. They were to be his last goals for the club; shortly afterwards he was snapped up by Premier League giants West Ham.

It could have come as no surprise to Dulwich that they found themselves in Essex for their quarter-final, facing One North side Heybridge. It looks as if this was their easiest win so far, by a 2-0 margin. Actually, though, the game

was goalless until the 86th minute, when Ray Powell found the target. Nyren Clunis added another as Dulwich booked their fifth semi-final.

One Essex side, Maldon, were still involved but Dulwich avoided them in the draw and instead found themselves in leafy Surrey to South Division One high-fliers Leatherhead, the holders. But Tanners manager Mick Sullivan had just resigned (he has since returned) and perhaps that contributed to a poor performance on the day. Dulwich took an early lead through Kevin James and, although Mu Maan equalised on the half-hour, it was almost one-way traffic after that. Clunis and Powell made it 3-1 to Dulwich before half-time. James got his second on 68 minutes and Kalvin Morath-Gibbs put the icing on the celebratory cake as Dulwich reached the final for the first time with a crushing 5-1 win.

WINGATE & FINCHLEY

Wingate & Finchley are playing in their first Championship Manager Cup final, but the Division One North promotion-chasers have been in unknown territory since the quarterfinals.

They had never before been past the last 16, a stage they had reached three times. They lost to Hendon in 2003, Hampton in 2004 and Canvey Island last season. The original Finchley club, members of the league until 1991, also reached the last 16 three times but advanced no further.

While Dulwich have got away with one tie against Premier Division opponents, Wingate took on and beat top-level clubs in their first three matches.

They started in the second round with a home game against Bury Town and took a grip on proceedings with two goals in as many minutes towards the end of the first half. Leon Smith and David Laird did the damage, and when Gary Burrell added a third 11 minutes after the break it was virtually game over, although Bury made it 3-1 through Perry Moody with 20 minutes left.

Next, Wingate had to travel to Wealdstone and took the lead through Ahmet Rifat after 78 goalless minutes. The home side forced extra time, however, with a Kieron Forbes goal and Martin Carter put them ahead moments before the half-time whistle. Smith replied

immediately after the restart, it finished 2-2 and Wingate held their nerve to win a penalty shoot-out 5-3.

That earned them a trip to Harrow in the last 16 and it was a game that seemed as it would never end. The first 90 minutes were scoreless, leading to an extra half-hour which was not really what the doctor ordered on a cold January night. There was much, much more to come. The deadlock was broken just before the interval when James Bent scored for Wingate, who still had time to concede a penalty before the change of ends and Jonathan Constant equalised. It stayed at 1-1, a repeat of the scoreline when the sides had met in the London Senior Cup a few weeks earlier. Wingate won the shoot-out 3-1 at the end of that game but it was not to be so simple this time.

It was 7-7 before Harrow's Jasper Owen missed, giving Ola Williams the chance to put Wingate through. But his shot was turned on to a post. On they went, with both goalkeepers hitting the target to make it 10-10 after everyone had had a go. That became 11-11 but then Kurt Morlese fired wide and Lewis Jones made no mistake to see Wingate through.

Metropolitan Police, going well in Division One South, were the quarter-final visitors to the Abrahams Stadium for what proved to be an intriguing contest. It started well for the hosts with Smith, Josh Cooper and Burrell putting them 3-0 up in little more than half an hour. But James Field pulled one back before the interval and when Steve Noakes notched a second for the Met two minutes after the restart it was anyone's game again. Jordan Fowler's 67th-minute penalty restored the two-goal gap and Smith made it 5-2 in the last minute, ensuring that the police would have to settle for staging the final.

There had been little between Wingate and Maldon in the league table for most of the season, so a close affair was expected when they were paired in the semi-final. It proved to be just that. Wingate, with home advantage, had a couple of narrow escapes in the first half and fell behind to a Dan Nielsen own goal five minutes after the restart. But Joe O'Brien levelled matters four minutes later and he struck again in the 62nd minute with a shot that hit a post and went in off a post, to the chagrin of Maldon defender Jack Haverson, who had

twice struck a Wingate post with headers and watched the ball bounce clear. O'Brien's double settled it as Wingate went through 2-1.

Smith has the chance to become the competition's undisputed top scorer tonight. At the moment he shares the lead with Tommy Hutchings of Leatherhead, both having four goals to their credit.

WEEKEND REVIEW

Premier Division

Bury Town, second in the Premier Division, did what they needed to do on Saturday with a 2-1 victory at third-placed Billericay. The Reed brothers, Lee and Sam, scored their goals in the last 15 minutes of the first half, with

Harrison Chatting replying three minutes from time. Bury had a late scare when keeper Nick Pope almost carried an Adam Flanagan header over the line but Billericay's claims that he had actually done so were waved away.

That was an early kick-off and took Bury to within four points of leaders Sutton, putting the U's under pressure when their home game against Canvey began at the usual time.

But Sutton responded solidly with a 2-0 victory to restore the seven-point gap, surely a decisive one with only six matches left. Canvey kept them at bay until the 65th minute, when Craig Dundas eluded two tackles to make the breakthrough, and Leroy Griffiths added a late second.

Billericay's defeat allowed Tonbridge to reclaim third spot with a 2-0 home win over Wealdstone, who now need something special to haul themselves back into the play-off race. Ade Olorunda opened the scoring on the half-hour mark and Carl Rook made sure with ten minutes left, finishing the job when Olorunda's shot came back off the bar.

Saturday's games did little to clarify the battle for play-off places. Billericay are two points clear of three clubs on 59 points with three more within two more points.

Lowestoft's slump continued with their 14th draw of the season, a goalless affair at home to Tooting, but they hung on to fifth place on goal difference. Michael Frew headed against a post for the Trawlerboys and Reece Hall did the same for the visitors

Harrow, whose hopes seemed to be fading when they lost three on the trot not long ago, suddenly find themselves in sixth place after Kenta Nakashima's 10th minute goal was enough to see off visiting Kingstonian, themselves down to eighth but still very much in the thick of things.

Seventh spot still belongs to Concord, though they had to settle for a 1-1 home draw with Carshalton. Chris Henry gave the Robins the lead midway through the first half and Luke Pigden almost added another with a shot that hit a post. Tony Stokes had an effort turned on to a post by visiting keeper Craig Ross just before the interval but the equaliser came two minutes after the break when Stokes was brought down and Harry Elmes scored from

the spot. Concord skipper Nicky Cowley hit the bar as his side sought a winner in vain.

Hornchurch are level on points with Kingstonian after their 2-2 draw at Margate. Dean Hill gave Margate a ninth-minute lead but Urchins turned it round with a leveller from Kieron St Aimie in the 34th minute followed two minutes later by a go-ahead strike by Martin Tuohy which put his side on course for a win that would have taken them back into a playoff spot. Margate, though, squared it 11 minutes into the second half with a wind-assisted Wayne Wilson corner and Aaron Lacy's goalline clearance denied Frankie Curley a last-gasp winner for Urchins.

Like Wealdstone, Cray have left themselves much to do after going down 3-1 at Croydon Athletic, a result which lifted Croydon two places to 19th as they battle to escape the drop. Kevin Sefaah gave the Rams a tenthminute lead which Stefan Joseph doubled ten minutes before the break. Laurent Hamici replied with a penalty, his 22nd goal of the season and 18th in the league, with 12 minutes left but Croydon held out and clinched it in the 90th minute through Tommy Whitnell, newly signed from fellow-strugglers Maidstone.

The Stones, meanwhile, gave themselves new hope with a 2-1 victory at Aveley. It was not enough to lift the Kent side off the bottom of the table but they are back in touch with the rest. Alex Flisher, 18, netted his first senior goal to put Stones ahead after 17 minutes and they stayed in front until the 76th minute, when Junior Dadson levelled it. Aveley's hopes were soon squelched again as Dan Stubbs notched an 82nd-minute winner. Romayne Marsh-Brown was sent off in the closing stages but Millers had little time to profit from their extra man and they dropped to 20th.

Folkestone also slipped back a place, to 21st, though they looked likely to do better after Frankie Chappell gave them the lead against Hendon three minutes after half-time. But Darren Smith missed a penalty shortly afterwards and it was the visitors who ran out 2-1 winners as their top scorer Belal Aite-Ouakrim scored twice in the last 15 minutes.

There was a crucial clash between the two sides immediately above the relegation zone and it finished all square at Horsham where Sussex rivals Hastings were the visitors. Horsham went ahead after ten minutes when

Ashley Robinson opened his account for his fourth Ryman League club of the season. Ben Andrews was sent off in the 65th minute, however, and Hornets paid the price when Ollie Rowe headed home to make it 1-1 ten minutes later.

Division One North

First-half goals by Kris Newby and Max Cornhill earned leaders East Thurrock a 2-0 victory at Potters Bar on Saturday. Cornhill fired home a free-kick after 25 minutes and Newby slotted home a penalty shortly before half-time. Tom Pett twice hit the woodwork as the hosts tried to rally.

One more point will ensure that Rocks can finish no lower than second and, with title rivals Needham Market having the day off, they were able to open up a four-point gap at the top, though the Marketmen now have a game in hand.

Brentwood's nine-match winning run came to an abrupt halt at Ilford, where Junior Appiah pounced on loose balls to score in each half. Ilford have themselves gone seven games without defeat, a sequence that includes five draws, in two of which they let a 3-1 lead slip, and they are ten points clear of bottom club Waltham Forest.

It will take a remarkable revival to enabled Forest to beat the drop. They were beaten 3-0 at Enfield Town, for whom Liam Hope scored after 21 minutes of each half, the first coming from the spot. Stuart Blackburne volleyed the second eight minutes after the break and Forest had Gbenga Sonuga sent off near the end. Enfield are eighth but only three points off a play-off place.

Brentwood remained third despite their defeat, but are looking over their shoulders at in-form Harlow, who moved up to fourth, five points behind with a game in hand. The Hawks dealt a huge blow to Romford's play-off prospects by thrashing them 4-1. Lee Roache and Bertie Brayley both scored in each half before Petrit Elbi netted the consolation. Brayley's second was the pick of the bunch, a 25-yard shot from a penetrating pass by Donny Barnard. Despite the result, Romford are still within four points of the play-offs with two games in hand.

AFC Sudbury edged Wingate & Finchley out of fifth place but may yet regret their failure to do better than a 2-2 draw against lowly

Cheshunt. Tom Devaux headed a 17th minute opener for the hosts, who conceded a penalty four minutes before half-time and allowed David Hicks to square it. James Baker restored Sudbury's lead with another penalty in the 74th minute but this time Cheshunt hit back straight away with a header by Peter Antoniades.

Wingate were beaten 2-1 at Grays, who are still just about in the promotion hunt. Mark Henry put Wingate ahead just before the half-hour but Simon Thomas equalised four minutes later and, after both sides hit the woodwork, Jason Fontaine nabbed the winner with time running out.

Heybridge also kept their hopes alive with a lone-goal victory at Ware, who played three-quarters of the game with ten men after Sam Berry earned two early yellow cards. Luke Callander was the marksman ten minutes into the second half.

Maldon dropped to seventh after being held to a 1-1 home draw by Thamesmead. Lea Dawson scored for the visitors after nine minutes and it was a similar time before the end when Ollie Berquez squared it from the spot.

Ben Bradbury gave Tilbury a 25th minute lead at home to Waltham Abbey by completing a 27-minute hat-trick of penalties after his late spot-kick double against Romford in midweek. It stayed 1-0 until the 75th minute, when a foul on Steve Cawley gave Abbey a penalty of their own. Cawley, the regular penalty-taker, was injured in the challenge and required treatment, so one of the more ludicrous recent laws meant that he had to leave the field and could not take the kick. Kieran Ogunkoya took on the responsibility and made no mistake.

A goalline clearance by Steve Good prevented Tyler Campbell putting Abbey ahead and Aaron Matthews hit the bar with a scorching 25-yarder at the other end. Matthews was not to be denied, however, and burst through in the sixth minute of added time to give Dockers a 2-1 win with a cool finish.

Redbridge deservedly won 3-1 at Great Wakering, whose consolation goal by Joe Gardner did not come until the 90th minute. Shane Stamp had put the Motormen ahead after 10 minutes, Ceraig Arnott made it 2-0 in

26 and Lee Townrow claimed the third midway through the second half.

Division One South

The see-saw at the top of Division One South rocked again at the weekend. Metropolitan Police, who had taken over the leadership from Bognor in midweek, saw the Sussex club repass them on Saturday by beating Chipstead 3-0. The Met then retaliated with a 6-0 romp at Whitstable on Sunday and are once more a point ahead of Bognor, who have a game in hand.

Whitstable, not yet safe from relegation despite their recent improved form, were always up against it. Ian Pulman and Lloyd Blackman, who had shared 12 of the club's 14 goals in their last seven games, were both missing, leaving their attack somewhat toothless.

And they were given a mountain to climb when Luke Hickie fired the Met ahead in the ninth minute and Eddie Smith made it 2-0 less than a minute later. Craig Watkins and Smith doubled the score before half-time, James Field claimed the fifth in the 72nd minute and Rob Haworth wrapped it up in the 86th. The Police also missed a string of chances, the best of them fired over the bar by new arrival Wilson-Denis, just signed It was the third six-hit of the Carshalton. weekend in the division.

Bognor's goalscoring aces did the damage in their win over Chipstead. Jason Prior put them ahead in the 41st minute with his 30th goal of the season, set up by Luke Nightingale who headed the second himself 2-0 after 71 minutes, his 20th in the league and 25th in all. Prior wrapped it up in the last minute and now shares the league leadership with Needham's Craig Parker, who has also scored 31 in league and cup. Prior has 25 in the league alone, two short of the pace being set by Greg Andrews of Leatherhead.

Chatham took a second-minute lead at home to third-placed Whitehawk and lived to regret it as the Sussex side responded with a six-goal blast. Bradley Potter was the man on target for the Chats. Josh Jones fired home a free-kick to equalise in the 17th minute and Hawks were 3-1 up by half-time thanks to Sam Gargan's header and another Jones free-kick. Karl Akehurst added to Chatham's misery four minutes into the second half, Jones completed

his hat-trick on the hour and Paul Armstrong made it 6-1 as Hawks confirmed their status as the league's top scorers with 89 goals.

Chatham are now deep in trouble at the wrong end of the table. Corinthian-Casuals, in 21st place, are just one point behind them with a game in hand after their 1-1 draw at Walton & Hersham. A header by Damian Matthews in the 74th minute seemed likely to win it for Walton, especially as Casuals had been playing with ten men since Byron Brown was sent off in the 44th minute. But the visitors kept going to the end and Jamal Carr saved them.

Walton & Hersham remain sixth, two points behind Burgess Hill who beat Worthing 2-0 at Leylands Park. A Steve Harper penalty opened the scoring after 19 minutes and Lloyd Cotton got the second seven minutes later. Worthing rarely looked like hitting back and had skipper Tony Timms sent off near the end.

Hillians are ten points behind Leatherhead, who maintained their pursuit of the top three with a 2-1 win at Eastbourne. Mu Maan gave them the lead in the seventh minute and, after Ryan James converted a twice-taken 55th-minute penalty to level it, Jack MacLeod slotted in the winner three minutes later.

Dulwich warned up for Wednesday's Championship Manager Cup final against Wingate & Finchley (at Metropolitan Police – kick-off 7.30 p.m.) by trouncing Fleet 6-0 at Champion Hill. The goals were shared around; after a scoreless first half-hour Vernon Francis and Ray Powell, with a penalty, made it 2-0 at half-time. Kalvin Morath-Gibbs, Nyren Clunis, Dean Carpenter and Rob Gradwell joined in the fun after the interval.

It kept Dulwich in the hunt, five points behind Burgess Hill, a situation shared by Ramsgate who won 2-1 at Merstham. Liam Quinn scored after three minutes and James Gregory made it 2-0 before the interval. Sean Rivers pulled one back with an 83rd-minute header but it was too late.

The highest-placed team to lose on Saturday were Walton Casuals, who slipped back to ninth after crashing 4-0 at Whyteleafe. Chris O'Flaherty scored after four minutes and that was all for the first half thanks to Fabien Batchelor's penalty miss. Another penalty six minutes after the interval was safely converted by Fred Fleming, Batchelor made it 3-0 and,

although Leafe had young striker Ryan Thomas sent off with five minutes left, they pressed on and Bentley Graham completed the rout.

Nick Reeves missed a penalty for Sittingbourne as they struggled to break through in their home game against rock-bottom Horsham YMCA. His blushes were spared shortly afterwards, in the 71st minute, when Hicham Akhazzan scored the only goal of the afternoon. The end is surely nigh for YM, 14 points adrift with only 18 more available to them. To add to their difficulties, Stefane Cox, signed this week from Dulwich, was sent off in the closing stages.

The other game was a goalless draw between Godalming and Faversham. The Kent club have drawn 15 of their 36 games, the highest total in the league. They came closest to a winner, a Dave Botterill shot that was cleared off the line by Stuart Harte.

Ryman Youth League

Kingstonian clinched the championship of the Ryman Youth League's Central Division without taking the field this week.

Second-placed Leatherhead, the only side who could have caught them, travelled to next-to-bottom Sutton on Wednesday and found themselves on the wrong end of an 8-0 hammering. Sutton's lowly position admittedly owed much to the fact that they had played fewer games than most but it was still an impressive performance, especially in the second half.

Ben King netted the first goal of his hat-trick in the 28th minute and Lewis Wilson made it 2-0 with a penalty six minutes after the interval. The game was into its final quarter before King got the third. Jonte Smith added another and Tanners then had a man sent off, helping the hosts to double their score in the last 15 minutes through Bane Dundavan, Ted Howard, Michael Bello and, finally, King.

There was one other game in the division, in which Whyteleafe beat Walton & Hersham with a second-half goal by Chris Webster.

Lewes suffered their first defeat of the season in the South-East Division. Jack Funnell scored after 17 minutes to give home side Tonbridge the points.

That cost them a possible return to the top of the table and second-placed Burgess Hill also failed to overtake leaders Whitehawk when they were held to a 2-2 draw at Worthing.
