## **PLAY-OFF SEMI-FINAL REVIEW**

### **Premier Division**

The Premier Division semi-finals offered no chance of a major upset, since all four teams were separated by just three points at the end of a thrilling battle for the play-off places. All of them were seeking promotion to Conference South for the first time.

A superb goal by deadline-day signing Lubo Guentchev earned Lowestoft their 2-1 victory at Bury Town in a Suffolk derby watched by 1,427 at Ram Meadow. Both sides were chasing a second successive promotion and Bury had earned home advantage by finishing third, a single point ahead of their opponents. So a tight contest was always likely.

Lowestoft, though, proved to be worthy winners. Only an outstanding display by Bury goalie Marcus Garnham kept them at bay until the 43<sup>rd</sup> minute, when Adrian Forbes nudged the ball past him and Sam Nunn's attempted clearance flew into his own net. Bury hit back four minutes after the interval. They broke quickly and Sam Reed's cross was converted by Chris Henderson. The winner came after 67 minutes when Guentchev, a deadline-day signing from Hendon, produced a clever piece of skill to outwit the defence and fire past Garnham.

Bury's best chance to reply fell to Kieran Leabon but he was foiled by keeper Andy Reynolds, who has been superb all season for a team that boasted the league's best defensive record.

A double by Harrow Borough's evergreen Rocky Baptiste could not prevent Tonbridge going through, though they needed extra time despite taking a 2-0 lead in the first half.

Chris Piper finished off a knockdown by Adrian Stone to give the Angels a sixth-minute lead and Scott Kinch volleyed the second on 23 minutes to delight the majority of the 1,124 spectators. "It will be down to Rocky," Harrow manager David Howell had tweeted before the game, and his veteran striker did not let him down, rounding keeper Lee Worgan to pull a goal back on 26 minutes and heading the equaliser with 20 minutes left, his 28<sup>th</sup> goal of the season.

Ade Olorunda, a mid-season capture from Hastings, had the last word. With ten minutes left in extra time he fired in a shot that was parried by Nicky Jupp only for Olorunda to follow up and force the ball home.

### **Division One North**

Most observers reckoned that the Division One North play-off final would be between Needham Market and Harlow Town. So much for predictions. Needham were expected to go through after they and eventual champions East Thurrock had dominated the league, while Harlow were the side in form, having ended the regular season with a 16-match unbeaten run.

Brentwood finished fifth, 18 points behind Needham, but travelled to Suffolk with the knowledge that they had been the first side to deny the Marketmen at Bloomfields after they had won their first 12 home matches. It had been a goalless draw that day in February, and it took 44 minutes for the deadlock to be broken on Tuesday. It was Needham who struck with a penalty by Craig Parker, the midfielder's 42<sup>nd</sup> goal in all competitions (including one against Leyton which was removed from the official records after Leyton left the league).

It could have been a crushing blow, but there were several minutes of added time and it was Brentwood who left the field on a high after an equalising penalty by Ryan Doyle which followed a foul on Sos Yao.

The second half belonged to Steve Witherspoon's Blues. Ryan Edgar put them ahead five minutes after the restart and Sos Yao made it 3-1 just after the hour as Brentwood reached a play-off final for the first time, having been beaten in the semi-finals two years ago. Like Wingate, who lost in the semi-finals last season, they have never played in the Premier Division.

Wingate & Finchley themselves ended Harlow's long unbeaten run after a thrilling game which went to extra time before the hosts took control to win 4-2. The game was goalless until the midpoint of the second half, when Leon Smith slotted home his 30<sup>th</sup> league and cup goal of the season, becoming the only Ryman League player to have reached that mark in each of the last two seasons.

Harlow, who finished one point behind their hosts in the table, drew level 11 minutes later through the much-travelled Bertie Brayley. They were well on top for the rest of the 90 minutes, and at the start of extra time, but Wingate survived the pressure and Smith outwitted experienced defender Leo Roget to restore their lead in the 95<sup>th</sup> minute.

David Laird's lob made it 3-1 five minutes later and there was no way back for Harlow, who fell further behind three minutes after the change of ends. Wingate brought on Lewis Jones at that break and he wasted no time in getting his name on the scoresheet. Brayley collected his second with five minutes left but Harlow's season was over.

### **Division One South**

It will be a long summer for Bognor Regis Town and their fans after four cruel days which saw them miss out on the Division One South championship by a single goal and then crash out of the play-offs at the hands of a Dulwich side who finished 31 points behind them in the league table.

Dulwich's shock 3-1 victory earned them a trip to Leatherhead, for whom keeper Chico Ramos was the hero as they won a penalty shoot-out at Whitehawk.

The key moment at Nyewood Lane came on the hour with Bognor trailing 2-1. Ben Johnson hit the underside of the bar and the rebound went in the direction of 44-goal Jason Prior. But it cleared his head by inches and Bognor's best chance of getting back into the game had gone.

Dulwich had taken the lead in the tenth minute when Lewis Gonsalves headed home Ahmed Deen's corner and they went further ahead with another set-piece header, by Gary Drewett from a free-kick, just before the half-hour. Prior missed two or three decent chances in the first half but Rocks got back into the game with a superb free-kick from

Johnson two minutes before the interval (pictured above by Tommy McMillan).

Perhaps still suffering from Saturday's disappointment, they never looked convincing and Dulwich completed what might be the biggest upset in the history of play-offs when Ray Powell forced home a cross from Nyren Clunis with 15 minutes left.

Leatherhead's 35-goal top scorer Greg Andrews was on the bench as they kicked off at Whitehawk where they had been beaten 2-1 on Saturday, a match that decided the venue for the semi-final. The sides rarely showed how they had scored 209 league goals between them. Defences always had the upper hand, with Whitehawk's Stuart Tuck and Leatherhead's Chris Boulter both giving outstanding displays.

The deadlock was broken four minutes after half-time when Mark Simmons felled Karley Akehurst with a misjudged challenge in the edge of the box and Paul Armstrong made no mistake from the spot. A scrambled equaliser by Tommy Hutchings, his 33<sup>rd</sup> goal of the season, put Tanners back on terms midway through the half and, although there were one or two near things at each end after that, the tie always looked likely to go to penalties.

Leatherhead lost a shoot-out to Folkestone in last season's semi-final and they must have feared a repeat when the first kick, by Dan Dean, brought an excellent save from Lloyd Anderson to give Hawks an instant advantage. They held it as Sam Gargan, Josh Jones and Armstrong converted their kicks, with Simmons, Andrews, who had not come on until the last five minutes, and Hutchings replying. Then Ramos turned Darren Budd's kick round his right-hand post and it was all square at 3-3 after four kicks apiece. Kev Terry put Tanners ahead for the first time and Ramos defied Pat Harding to send his teammates and the travelling fans wild.

It was the last action at East Brighton Park until the start of the 2012-13 season. Hawks are spending a year at the Withdean Stadium while they level their sloping pitch and install more than 3,000 seats (surplus to requirements at Withdean after Brighton's departure) round three sides of the ground. They also intend to lay a 3G training pitch. The fourth side of the ground is to be redeveloped as well, but that can be done when Hawks are back in residence.

## **Premier Division**

### **Tonbridge Angels 4**

### **Lowestoft Town 3**

Lewis Taylor fired Tonbridge Angels into Conference South for the first time with a goal 12 minutes from the end of a thrilling Premier Division play-off final watched by 2,411 at Longmead Stadium.

It looked good for the Kent side as they went two up in 22 minutes. Ade Olorunda, who scored the extra-time winner against Harrow in the semi-final, opened the scoring from close range following a corner and Danny Walder doubled the lead with a deflected free-kick.

The Trawlerboys responded on the half-hour when Matt Nolan's cross was headed home by Scott Mitchell but again found themselves two behind nine minutes later, Walder notching his second with a penalty after Curtis Haynes-Brown brought down Olorunda.

Lowestoft pulled it back to 3-2 three minutes after the break when Lubo Guentchev set up the chance for Andrew Cave-Brown. The visitors piled on the pressure and finally drew level with a superb strike from long range by Guentchev in the 75<sup>th</sup> minute.

Three minutes later, though, Taylor burst into the box and his shot went in off a post for what proved to be the winner. Top scorer Frannie Collin almost made it safe when he struck a post but Tonbridge had done enough and Lowestoft's bid for a third promotion in as many years had failed.

## **Division One North**

### **Wingate & Finchley 3**

### **Brentwood Town 2**

Wingate needed extra time to see off Harlow in their semi-final and they again took the full two hours to claim their Premier Division place after forfeiting an early two-goal lead.

Brentwood started nervously and Leon Smith broke clear of their defence in the third minute only to be denied by Hall. Three minutes later, however, Smith got the better of Martyn Stokes on the edge of the box and Hall could only push his low drive into the path of David Laird, who made no mistake. Then Smith made it 2-0 in the 13<sup>th</sup> minute, his 32<sup>nd</sup> goal of

the season, and a delay followed while the net was repaired.

Laird could have made it three when he was sent clear by Smith's header but Hall rescued the visitors again. Brentwood were looking a well-beaten side but they were given a lifeline as the first half ticked into its 51<sup>st</sup> minute. The home defence failed to clear a free-kick and centre-back Darren Blewitt had time to pick his spot from ten yards out.

Any good done by that goal appeared to be undone eight minutes after the interval. Former Wingate man Leon Fisher hit a vicious shot which Wingate keeper Bobby Smith could only parry and as he dived on the loose ball he was caught by the boot of Sos Yao. The forward seemed within his rights to go for the ball, not knowing that he had been flagged offside, but he was shown a red card.

The ten men raised their game but it could have been all over in a remarkable three-minute spell during which striker Smith hit the inside of a post and was twice denied at close range by Hall. Wingate had a narrow escape when Josh Cooper blocked Danny Dafter's effort on the line and Blewitt smashed the loose ball high and wide, but Brentwood came again and Dafter drilled in the equaliser in the 84<sup>th</sup> minute.

Blewitt defended particularly well throughout under the pressure of a early yellow card and it looked as if Brentwood would take the game to penalties before, in the 116<sup>th</sup> minute, Lewis Jones found himself clear, dummied cleverly to leave Hall on the ground and stepped round him to knock in the winner.

Already winners of The Championship Manager Cup, Wingate now aim to complete a treble when they face Premier Division side Hendon in the London Senior Cup final at Tooting on Tuesday.

## **Leatherhead 4**

### **Dulwich Hamlet 3**

### **Division One South**

Dulwich Hamlet's attempt to complete a sensational giantkilling play-off achievement was foiled by Leatherhead hat-trick hero Kev Terry in a breathless final. A Carshalton fan in the crowd of 1,022 commented, "If this is what Division One South is like I can't wait to get relegated"!

The visitors had beaten a Bognor side who finished 31 points ahead of them in Tuesday's semi-final and they went 3-1 up in their attempt to overcome a mere 23-point deficit in the final.

Then came Terry, who opened his account in the 83<sup>rd</sup> minute, equalised six minutes into added time and completed his hat-trick in extra time, ending Leatherhead's 28-year exile from the Premier Division.

It was Dulwich who made the initial breakthrough in the 19<sup>th</sup> minute as a bad back-pass let in Gary Drewett, who started the season with Metropolitan Police and therefore had a chance to play a part in two promotion campaigns. The same was also true of Vernon Francis, who made it 2-0 in the 44<sup>th</sup> minute, only for Tanners to be given the lift they needed when Greg Andrews smashed in a 30-yard rocket for his 36<sup>th</sup> goal of the season in added time.

Drewett popped up again eight minutes after half-time, heading home a free-kick to make it 3-1, and the Dulwich fairytale looked set to take them all the way to the Premier Division.

Terry gave Leatherhead hope when he finished off a pass from Jack Macleod and Dulwich then suffered the agony of seeing a board raised to indicate nine minutes of stoppage time, most of it for an injury to their own Gerry Gonnella who had been stretchered off. It was enough for Tanners and a pass from Greg Hutchings allowed Terry to claim his second, forcing the extra 30 minutes.

His clincher came in the 99<sup>th</sup> minute and, hard through they tried, Dulwich could not respond, although Calvin Morath-Gibbs hit the woodwork in the dying moments.

### **Ryman Youth League**

The highlight of the closing stages of the Ryman Youth League programme was Carshalton's 3-2 home victory over Walton & Hersham in the Central Division.

Walton, the Lucas Fettes Cup winners, were 2-0 up inside two minutes through Jaymo Ellis and Robert Lapersonne but lost out to a Sonny Ayres hat-trick, with the winner coming in the seventh minute of added time.

That left Carshalton needing to win the very last game of the season, at Sutton yesterday (Thursday), to pinch the runners-up spot from Leatherhead. They were out of luck as goals

from Louis John and Jonte Smith gave Sutton a 2-0 win, with Smith's 56<sup>th</sup> minute strike becoming the very last of the Ryman League season.

Sutton's own hopes of finishing second to champions Kingstonian had been ended by a 2-0 defeat at Thamesmead, both goals coming from Arlie Desanges. The U's went on to win 3-0 at Whyteleafe and finish fourth.

Horsham YMCA's revival in the South-East Division came to an abrupt halt as they took only one point from their last three games, this after they had suddenly put together their only five wins of the season.

They went down 4-0 at home to Lewes, whose first two goals came from Max Howell, then drew 2-2 with Welling with the YM goals coming in the first and last minutes, and finished with a 3-1 defeat at Tonbridge after taking the lead. Sam Beale's double saw the Angels home.

By the time of the Welling game, YM knew they had avoided the wooden spoon. It went to Horsham after their 3-1 defeat at Ashford (Kent), for whom Kieran Sanger netted twice.

That Lewes victory left Whitehawk needing to win their last game to overtake them and finish as runners-up behind Burgess Hill. But Hawks crashed 3-0 at Welling thanks to Jack Taylor's hat-trick. The champions, meanwhile, were beaten 2-0 at Tonbridge in their last outing.

Taylor followed up his hat-trick with one of the goals at YMCA and another as Welling wrapped up their season by beating Worthing 4-0. The losers had another game to play and they beat Ashford 3-1, including a pair from Sam Mannings.

Staines completed their championship campaign in the West Division with a 1-0 home win over Barnet (Black) thanks to Aaron Weston's late goal. They finished eight points clear of Woking, who lost by the same score at home to Hampton. Martin Bradshaw got the goal. Hampton also beat Hayes 1-0 with Dan Thompson on target, but lost their chance of taking the runners-up spot when they lost 2-1 at home to Ashford (Middx).

Hampton were to end up in fourth place, overtaken by Northwood who beat Barnet (Amber) 2-0. The Ambers had earlier romped to the biggest victory of the closing fortnight,

hitting five unanswered goals at Fleet. Kelvin Omohegbe netted two of them. Fleet then beat Barnet (Black) 2-0 in a match to decide the wooden spoon. The Blacks were sunk, ironically, by two goals from Cameron Blackie.

### ISTHMIAN VETERANS CUP

Kingstonian claimed the final honour of the Ryman League season with a 2-0 victory at Bognor in the Veterans Cup final at Nyewood Lane on Sunday afternoon.

Eddie Akuamoah put K's ahead on the half-hour and Conrad Kane struck seven minutes later for a K's side whose goalkeeper was Jimmy Glass, always to be remembered for the goal, after a last-ditch dash to join the attack at a corner, that kept Carlisle in the Football League in 1999.

**CLUB GOSSIP**

**HORSHAM FC**

Following several years of substantial losses incurred in their final years at Queen Street and during their Ground Share arrangements with Worthing FC and currently with Horsham YMCA, the Board of Horsham FC Ltd have announced substantial financial cuts in their playing programme for next season.

Chairman Kevin Borrett stated, “Horsham FC can no longer sustain annual financial losses at the level run up over the past six seasons whilst waiting for the new ground to come to fruition. Delays beyond any means of our control have meant that instead of being relocated in our new ground by now as planned for, we have to budget for at least another two season’s ground-sharing and managing our finances accordingly. There is no further room for any losses and by taking action now, we are ensuring the long term survival of Horsham Football Club.

“We are confident that we are getting close to being in a position to submit a Planning Application for the building of the new ground and facilities which will enable us to develop income streams that are unavailable to us whilst we ground share. We are presently constrained by confidentiality agreements regarding the new ground, but I am hopeful that a further statement of our intent can be made public later next week.

“Presently, fixed costs almost exceed all of the Club’s income from matchdays and from our Holbrook investment, to the point that we can no longer sustain the services of a full time Manager. When John Maggs current contract expires at the end of May this year, we regret it will not be renewed.

“John is a professional and has served Horsham magnificently during his eleven years here. His achievements for the club are legendary. The next few seasons are critical and we could no longer provide John with the budget he would need to operate at the levels he is used to and neither can we afford to pay a full time salary. John himself has been aware of this position for some while and he has worked tirelessly to provide a solution to some of the financial issues. Unfortunately even with some additional sponsorship income, we remained well short of a viable target. We are immeasurably grateful to John, supported by his wife Janet, for his work with Horsham FC and I know our Supporters will come out in droves when he holds his Testimonial Match against Div 1 Champions Brighton and Hove Albion in July.

“Horsham Football Club is not just about the Ryman Premier First Team. We have a hugely successful Youth setup here with all of our young Junior teams winning Trophies this season. We will seek a Manager who is prepared to work with our Under 18’s squad to bring them through into the first team as well as senior players but they will have to be prepared to play for the next couple of seasons for little more than expenses. We know how difficult it is going to be, but until we get into a position where we can afford to pay more to players then it has to be the case. It will be an extreme challenge but we have to be prepared to fight.

“Once we are relocated and we build our income, then we can develop further. There are many Clubs out there who are feeling the financial pinch who, like us will have to compete with a shortfall of resources available to them. We are not a club with a wealthy benefactor and have to live within our means. We can only use the money we have and rely on our magnificent supporters and sponsors, to all of whom we are extremely grateful but we must go out and seek further sponsorship. Running a Football Club is a very expensive business just in travel to away matches at this level and as a for instance we would appeal to anyone who operates a Coach Company

willing to provide us with transport next season. It is now time to consolidate, regroup and for that we ask our Supporters to get behind us to help see us through this difficult time."
