LEAGUE NEWS

CROYDON ATHLETIC FOOTBALL CLUB

The Ryman League has been contacted by Croydon Athletic FC as a result of internal problems following allegations made in a national newspaper regarding the person widely regarded as the owner of the Club.

The Club has been unable to pay the August wages for the players and are faced with a number of other financial claims. At the end of the Club's home match with Concord Rangers yesterday the management team indicated that the side would be unlikely to play together again.

The League has been working closely with the Club during the past week and attended a meeting at the Club last Wednesday with the Chairman and 3 other senior members of the Club.

Croydon Athletic FC is doing all it can to stay in business and are hoping that by publicising their plight they may find someone willing to take over the Club. The League has agreed to a request from the Club to postpone its next 2 League fixtures – away to Tooting & Mitcham United on Tuesday, 7th September and home to Sutton United on 18th September – in order to give the Club time to see if it can survive the difficult position in which it finds itself.

The League and the Club will then reconsider the position to ascertain whether or not the Club can meet its commitments to the League for the remainder of the season.

League Chairman Alan Turvey commented "The League is very sorry that the Club has suffered such a blow. We are concerned to act in the best interests of all parties in this

matter and to make sure that every avenue is explored to see if the Club can continue. We do not want players to play in matches which may not count nor do we want spectators to pay to see matches whose results are then erased from the records."

WEEKEND REVIEW

Premier Division

Sutton United stayed on top of the Premier Division with a 1-0 home win over Billericay on Saturday. Bradley Woods-Garness scored the winner in the 10th minute against his former club in front of 733 fans at Gander Green Lane, pouncing on the rebound from a Richard Jolly shot. Sutton have yet to concede a goal after five matches but Danny Charge almost wrecked that perfect record when he hit the bar.

Kingstonian still trail their Surrey rivals only on goal difference. It looked as if Margate would escape with a well-deserved point from Kingsmeadow, and they would have taken all three but for the heroics of home keeper Rob Tolfrey. Then K's stole victory when Dean

Lodge netted the only goal of the game after 84 minutes.

Lowestoft moved up to third, beating Folkestone 4-1 at Crown Meadow in front of the season's best crowd so far, 831. Danny Bloomfield's double put them 2-0 up in 14 minutes but Matt Halliday's own goal shortly afterwards gave the Kent club hope and they remained in the contest until Lee McGlone made it 3-1 after 72 minutes. Liam Friend then repaid the own-goal favour.

Apart from the leading pair, two teams remain unbeaten. Hastings, who are fourth, found their record in danger when a 57th minute David Knight free-kick sent them behind at Aveley. Kenny Pogue rifled in a long-range equaliser after 73 minutes and Ade Olurunda put the visitors ahead moments later. Fraser Logan completed a 3-1 victory.

Bury, in fifth place, avoided defeat again but had to settle for a point in a goalless affair at Wealdstone. They had goalkeeper Marcus Garnham to thank, especially for saving Danny Burnell's penalty just before half-time.

Aveley are one of five teams yet to win a game. Three of them are from Kent but the other two clubs from the county at last came up with victories.

Laurent Hamici fired a hat-trick as Cray got off the mark in style by thrashing Harrow 5-1. He opened the scoring after five minutes only for a Rhys Coleman own goal to level it five minutes later as he deflected Kwasi Frempong's shot. Lewis Perkins restored Cray's lead midway through the first half and, after Frempong received his marching orders, Hamici nabbed his second after 65 minutes. Chris Saunders claimed the fourth, leaving Hamici to complete his treble and the nap hand in added time. It took his personal tally for the season to five as well and he joined Kingstonian's Bobby Traynor at the top of the division's scorers' list.

Tonbridge broke their victory duck with a 2-0 home win over bottom club Horsham. Sherwin Stanley hit his first goal for the club after 64 minutes and a late penalty by Frannie Collin, after a foul on Sam Jones, made sure of the points.

Maidstone and Hornchurch failed to manage a goal between them at The Homelands.

Carshalton completed an unwanted treble when Luke Pigden was sent off in first-half stoppage time at Hendon. It was the third meeting of the clubs since mid-March and in each of them Carshalton have been down to ten men before the interval. This time they held out until the 82nd minute before Mariusz Serwin gave Hendon a 1-0 win.

It was all gloom at Croydon Athletic, where Concord achieved their maiden Premier Division victory and inflicted Croydon's first defeat. Bertie Brayley put the visitors ahead on the half-hour and second-half strikes by James Lawson and Tony Stokes wrapped up the points. Taylor Sinfield's own goal made the final score 3-1, after which Croydon's management team quit (see separate story).

Two of Tooting's summer signings were on the mark in their 2-0 victory at Canvey. It was all Canvey in the early stages and Alex Rhodes was denied by the bar. Ex-Godalming man Phil Williams scored on the half-hour and after that Tooting dominated. Former Dartford striker Rob Haworth increased their lead in the 66th minute.

Division One North

Goals a minute either side of half-time by Anthony Ryan kept Brentwood on top of Division One North with a 3-1 victory at Cheshunt on Saturday. They are the highest scorers in all three divisions with 12 goals, and Ryan's six goals in all competitions give him a share of the league leadership with Worthing's Terry Dodd. Brentwood got off to a great start with a goal by Joao Carlos after just two minutes. Iain Salt replied midway through the first half but Ryan's express double put the visitors out of reach.

They lead on goal difference from East Thurrock, who recovered from a slow start to beat Redbridge 4-1 at Rookery Hill. Tom Stephen gave the Motormen the lead after seven minutes and they continued to thrive until Neil Richmond equalised in the 34th minute. The second half belonged to Rocks as Max Cornhill, Jimmy Webb and Kye Ruel found the target, leaving Redbridge as the only side in the division without a point.

New boys Needham Market are in third place with nine points, a point behind the leading pair, after their 2-0 victory at Waltham Abbey in which both goals came in the first 25 minutes. Nathan Stone put them ahead after

nine minutes and Craig Parker followed up with his fifth goal of the season.

Enfield Town, Grays and Harlow are also on the nine-point mark after victories on Saturday. A single goal was enough for Enfield and Grays; Adam Wallace netted for Enfield after 51 minutes of a tight game at Ilford while Grays edged out unlucky Leyton with a late Danny Bunce penalty.

Che Stadhart gave Harlow the lead midway through the second half of their home game with Waltham Forest, who replied through Lawrence Yiga with nine minutes left. Stadhart immediately restored Harlow's advantage with his fifth of the season and Sos Yao made it 3-1 in the last minute.

The upset of the day came at Sudbury, where the home side forfeited their 100 per cent record with a crushing 4-0 defeat by Romford. Richard Oxby's free-kick opened the scoring after 17 minutes and Toran Senghore widened the gap early in the second half. Any lingering Sudbury hopes vanished with 15 minutes left with a quickfire Andy Edmunds double.

Potters Bar collected their first points of the season with a 2-1 victory at Tilbury. Ben Boyce struck first for the home side shortly before the half-hour only for Leon Skinner to reply within five minutes. Elvis Balic claimed a late winner.

The first half at Wingate was a tale of two Smiths. Leon, having wasted one easy chance, put the home side ahead after 32 minutes and Nathan replied for Heybridge moments before the break. The second half belonged to Tom English, who scored twice in seven minutes around the hour to give Heybridge a 3-1 victory.

Michael Toner's 18th minute goal gave Ware a half-time lead at Thamesmead but a miskick by visiting keeper Joe Taylor gifted Danny Crouch an equaliser on the hour. Ware then had John Frendo sent off for the second time this season and Thamesmead went on to win 3-1 with a second goal from Crouch and an injury-time clincher from Gabriel Momodu.

Joe Sweeney scored in each half for Maldon in another 3-1 scoreline. Rhys Henry hit their second and visitors Great Wakering had to wait until the 88th minute for Billy Johnson's consolation.

Division One South

Two second-half goals gave Metropolitan Police a 2-0 victory at Faversham on Saturday and the boys in blue now boast the only 100 per cent record in the league. It would have been all over by half-time but for an agile display by Faversham keeper Giga Zulmatashvili who, to the dismay of the announcer, was called in at the last minute after Rob French was injured in the warm-up. He was eventually beaten by a diving header from Steve Noakes after 54 minutes and James Field sealed the points with 15 minutes left. It was Faversham's first defeat as a Ryman League club.

The Met have played only three games and so are in second place, a point behind Burgess Hill with a match in hand. The Hillians took their tally to ten points from four games with a 2-1 victory at Dulwich. Lloyd Cotton put them ahead six minutes after the interval and experienced French full-back Sacha Opinel made it 2-0 direct from a corner with 12 minutes left. Nyren Clunis promptly pulled one back but Hillians held out.

Another Sussex club, Bognor, are third after a 4-1 home win over Sittingbourne. The visitors, who had drawn their first three games, went ahead after only two minutes through Tom Bradbrook but Phil Turner squared it within four minutes and an own goal by Ross Morley gave Rocks a half-time lead. Dean Maynard struck twice after the break to make it convincing.

Three more of the Sussex clubs in the division had reason to celebrate. Eastbourne, rock bottom last season, had drawn their first two matches and they improved their record on Saturday with a 2-1 victory over Walton & Hersham which lifted them into the top half of the table. They fell behind to an Adrian Butler header 13 minutes into the second half but Walton's second headed goal, from David Baker, flew into his own net with 14 minutes left and Sam Crabb hit a superb winner shortly afterwards.

Worthing, meanwhile, looked dead and buried at Ramsgate when Clay Lamont's own goal put the hosts 3-0 up after 62 minutes. Mark Lovell and Paul Axon had scored in the first half-hour as Rams chased their first points of the season. They had to settle for one as Worthing responded to Lamont's mishap with three goals in the next 14 minutes. Tom

Manton opened their account and a Michael Hockett double, the first a penalty, levelled it.

Brighton-based Whitehawk chalked up their first Ryman League victory after trailing three times in a 4-3 thriller at Corinthian-Casuals, a game which included three penalties. The first was converted by Kane Sargeant after Glenn Boosey was brought down in the fourth minute and Casuals held that lead until five minutes after the interval, when Paul Armstrong netted from the spot for Hawks. He did it again ten minutes later, after David Ocquaye had briefly restored Casuals' lead, and Casuals went in front for the third time when Joel Thompson struck in the 76th minute. Josh Jones made it 3-3 with nine minutes left and Jamie Brotherton snatched a last-minute winner.

Casuals are still looking for their first point and the only team below them are the remaining Sussex outfit, Horsham YMCA, whose wretched start to the season – including a 4-0 FA Cup defeat by a team two steps below them - continued with a 3-2 home defeat by Whitstable in which they finished with nine men.

It looked as if it might be YM's day when a corner by Brannon O'Neill found its way untouched into the net after six minutes. Whitstable, who had also lost their first three, equalised in the 27th minute though David Cory only for Eddie Walker to put the hosts ahead again a minute later. Stuart Vahid made it 2-2 on 63 minutes, after which it all went horribly wrong for YM. Tommy Brewer and Gerald Alosa-Amaniampong received second yellow cards in quick succession, the latter offence also giving Whitstable a penalty which Vahid converted for the winner.

Things were altogether quieter at Godalming, where an excellent first-half display by goalie Martin Grant allowed Chipstead to fight out a goalless draw, Godalming's first dropped points.

Chatham also had a perfect record going into Saturday's game but they went down 2-0 at Walton Casuals. It was the 65th minute before Charlie Ide opened the scoring and he added a penalty after Joe Kelly was brought down with seven minutes left.

Top scorer of the day was Merstham's Billy Marshall, who fired a hat-trick as they beat Fleet 5-2 to record their first win of the season in some style. It was Fleet who scored first, an

early penalty by Darren Wheeler, but Marshall equalised midway through the half with the first of three goals in ten minutes. Tony Reid nabbed the second before Marshall made it 3-1. Johnnie Dyer pulled one back on the hour but Marshall completed his treble shortly afterwards and a last-minute goal by Dan Harding completed a good day for the home side.

Whyteleafe drew 1-1 at Leatherhead in the other game. Mark Simmons gave the Tanners the lead after 16 minutes and Freddie Fleming replied for Leafe six minutes before the break.

Ryman Youth League

Newcomers Northwood got their Ryman Youth League career off to a flying start with a 3-0 victory over defending West Division champions Woking. Romaine Walker scored twice and substitute Julian Cole added the third.

Kingstonian won 2-0 at Leatherhead in the Central Division; Walton & Hersham scored a late goal to beat Whyteleafe 2-1 while Chipstead and Carshalton battled out a goalless draw.

There was one match in the South-East section and reigning champions Lewes were held to a 2-2 draw at new boys Whitehawk.

Most matches in the preliminary round of the FA Youth Cup will be played this week but two Ryman Youth League clubs brought their games forward and are already through to the next round. Max Love fired a hat-trick in Horsham's 4-1 win over Chertsey while Thamesmead beat Wingate 5-2 with the help of a Frazer Walker double.
