WEEKEND REVIEW

Division One North

THERE were only three games in Division One North on Saturday- but they yielded a harvest of 18 goals, eight of them in a thrilling 4-4 draw at Potters Bar.

Four players each scored twice in that game, including Ahmat Rifat whose goal in the sixth minute of added time allowed visitors Wingate & Finchley to escape with a point.

Leon Smith had put Wingate ahead in the second minute but a Louis Collins double turned it round and Jake Parratt's goal on the stroke of half-time made it 3-1 to the hosts.

There was no more scoring until the 72nd minute, when Rifat pulled one back. Smith made it 3-3 two minutes later but Wingate conceded a penalty moments after that and Parratt converted for what was so nearly the winner.

It was a strange week for Sudbury, beaten 4-0 at home last Saturday, 4-0 away winners in midweek and then crushed 5-1 at Heybridge this Saturday. An 11th-minute goal by Russell Malton, against the club he left only recently, gave Sudbury an advantage which they held until five minutes after half-time.

They were then stunned by two goals in as many minutes, Chris Bryan's free-kick levelling the scores before Nathan Smith headed the hosts into the lead. Jack Mead made it 3-1 in the 70th minute and Swifts wrapped up a commanding second-half display with late goals from Danny Barber, a penalty, and Chris Thomas.

Denny Webb gave Waltham Abbey the lead after 17 minutes at home to Leyton, who levelled through Charlie Hamsher on 32 minutes and went ahead with a goal from Mo Habu seconds after half-time. Kieran Ogunkoya made it 2-2 midway through the half and that was how it finished. Abbey are still searching for a league win but have drawn four of their six games.

Division One South

RAMSGATE were hoping to mount a promotion challenge in Division One South this season but that looked unlikely after they took only one point from their first four matches.

They may be getting back on course after breaking their duck in style by thrashing Whyteleafe 5-0 in Kent on Saturday. Paul Axon set them on their way with a double in the first 20 minutes and Mark Lovell added two of his own either side of the interval.

Joe Taylor struck in the 76th minute to complete the scoring, but not Whyteleafe's misery; Daryl Coleman was sent off in the closing stages.

Leatherhead went to the top of the table with a well-deserved 3-0 victory at Merstham. Greg Hutchings put them ahead after 25 minutes and added another seven minutes after the break. Greg Andrews added the third.

Sittingbourne's astonishing record of derby success against Chatham continued with a 2-0 victory at Central Park. Not since Boxing Day 2003 have Chats avoided defeat against their neighbours.

Laurence Harvey fired the hosts ahead after 12 minutes and their opponents were down to ten men before half-time when Aaron Firth was shown two yellow cards in four minutes. Ryan Golding netted the second early in the second period as Sittingbourne continued their recovery after a poor start to the season. Two wins in five days have lifted them to sixth in the table.

FA Cup

RYMAN League leaders Sutton United have a long tradition of FA Cup giant-killing – but they were on the receiving end on Saturday as they were astonishingly beaten 2-1 at home by Alton Town, who have taken just two points from their first six games in the Step 5 Wessex League.

The Hampshire club have had a long wait to avenge a 1963 FA Amateur Cup quarter-final defeat and not even their most optimistic supporters could have guessed that they would do so in this game, especially after Bradley Woods-Garness gave dominant Sutton a 22nd-minute lead.

Even when Shane Hollamby levelled after 36 minutes it seemed only a minor setback but Sutton could not regain the lead and Johnny Gray headed a stunning winner with 14 minutes left. Both Alton scorers had only left the substitutes' bench because of injuries to other players.

Other Ryman League clubs had more enjoyable afternoons, with four of them sharing 28 goals between them as they banked their £3,000 prize money.

Top scorers were Hornchurch, though few could have imagined that as they struggled through the first half at home to Spartan South Midlands League side Oxhey, who went ahead with a volley from Ian Bywater. A headed equaliser by Rickie Hayles moments before the break was followed by an expressive half-time lecture from manager Jimmy McFarlane and Urchins were transformed.

Jo Flack scored twice in the first nine minutes of the second half and completed his hat-trick midway through the half, the first of four goals in ten minutes. Lewis Smith, Jonathan Hunt and Ross Wall took the score to 7-1 and Hayles scored again in the closing stages. There was still time for a final twist as, deep into injury time, Oxhey's suffering goalkeeper Sam Styles came upfield for a corner and headed home to make the final score 8-2.

Danny Burnell scored four times as Wealdstone demolished Tring Athletic 7-0. He was another player who joined the action only because of an injury. Greg Ngoyi, who fired Wealdstone ahead after two minutes, had to be replaced just after the half-hour and Burnell opened his account within two minutes of entering the field.

He completed his hat-trick by the 64th minute and added another in between two goals from Scott Fitzgerald, the first of them a penalty for an offence committed by Mark Myett, who was sent off.

There were seven goals, too, for Lowestoft and they all came in the first 52 minutes against United Counties League side Desborough. The match kicked off 40 minutes late because Desborough's coach broke down and they must have wished the repairman had stayed at home as Adam Smith's first-minute strike started the rout.

Danny Bloomfield, Andrew Fisk, Stuart Ainsley, Jamie Forshaw and Jamie Godbold piled on the misery for the visitors before half-time and when Forshaw nabbed his second in the 52nd minute a double-figure tally looked certain. The Trawlerboys declared at that point, however, and the visitors managed a consolation goal to go down 7-1.

Needham Market were two up in four minutes and went on to beat Kempston 6-1. Sam Newson and Craig Parker – his seventh goal of the season – were the early marksmen and Newson scored again before half-time. Nathan Stone added another in the 50th minute and Kempston's reply midway through the half provoked two more goals from the home side in the next five minutes as Jon Sparkes and Stone completed the six-hit.

Tonbridge were another Premier Division club to suffer a shock home defeat by Step 5 opposition. Having failed to convert a host of chances, they were stunned by an 86th-minute winner by Joel Greaves for Combined Counties League side Guildford.

Two Premier Division clubs went out to Division One South opponents. Hastings seemed to be cruising at Bognor when Russell Eldridge and Jono Richardson gave them a 2-0 lead before the half-hour mark. But Jason Prior and Phil Turner levelled matters by half-time, and Prior sent the home fans into ecstasy when he pounced on Richardson's careless back-pass to win it in the dying seconds of stoppage time.

It was a day to forget for Premier strugglers Maidstone, who crashed 3-1 at Whitehawk and had two players sent off. Paul Armstrong's own goal gave Stones the lead but Ben Godfrey, who joined Hawks this week from stricken Croydon Athletic, made it 1-1 before the break. Jamahl Hughes gave Hawks the lead midway through the second half and red cards quickly followed for Adam Marsh and James Peacock. The nine men hung on until the 88th minute, when Godfrey clinched it.

The all-Premier clash at Folkestone went the way of the home side, who beat bottom club Horsham 4-2 – an unexpected goal feast for two sides who had each scored only three times in six league matches.

Simon Austin scored twice against his former club and Darren Smith made it 3-0 before Steve Davies replied. Smith hit Folkestone's fourth and Pat Harding grabbed a stoppage-time consolation.

The only other Premier Division club to bow out were Aveley, who went down 2-1 at Hitchin despite a first-minute goal by debutant Kurt Smith. The Zamaretto Central Division leaders swung it with two goals in three minutes midway through the second half.

Two Premier sides had to come from behind. Carshalton were in danger of suffering the same fate as Sutton and Tonbridge as they conceded a goal to Kent League outfit Tunbridge Wells in the first half. Joel Ledgister equalised on the hour and there were sighs of relief all round Colston Avenue when Byron Harrison nabbed a late winner.

Concord fell behind soon after half-time at Hemel Hempstead but were rescued by full-back Danny Glozier in the last 15 minutes. He squared it with a penalty and provided the cross for Tony Stokes to head the decider.

Billericay saw off Division One visitors Tilbury with a 67th-minute goal direct from a corner by Micah Hyde, veteran of 567 games in the Premiership and Football League. By then the hosts had lost Adam Flanagan to a red card, though the numbers were later evened up as Tilbury's Egzon Asilani was dismissed.

Three goals in 16 second-half minutes saw Margate to a 3-0 victory at Hellenic League minnows Binfield. Shaun Welford, Ishmail Kamara and Tommy Osborne were on target.

Canvey beat Step 5 visitors Newport Pagnall 4-1, but it was not as easy as it looks and only a missed penalty denied the visitors a half-time lead and they were quick to reply when Alex Rhodes put Canvey ahead six minutes after the break. Danny Heale netted Canvey's second but Newport would again have hit back straight away but for Chris Moore's goal-line clearance. Newport then lost a man to a red card and further goals from James Rowe and Rhodes settled it. Another dismissal left the visitors with nine men for the closing stages.

Harrow had few problems at Division One North tableproppers Great Woking, winning 4-2. It was 2-0 to the Premier side at half-time through Rocky Baptiste and a Stuart Judd own goal. Troy Hewitt and Clayton Dixon doubled the gap before a spirited Woking side cheered themselves up with late replies from Lewis Sparrow and Joe Gardner.

A Chris Henderson hat-trick earned Bury Town a 3-1 win at Woodford United after they had fallen behind in the ninth minute. Henderson converted penalties in the 32nd and 47th minutes before completing his treble from open play.

The final Premier side in action on Saturday were Tooting, who saw off Walton Casuals 4-1 at Imperial Fields. Rob Haworth opened the scoring and Karl Beckford netted either side of half-time, his second coming from the spot, to put the Terrors in command. Craig Totton pulled one back for Casuals but Tooting had the last word with a stoppage-time goal from Reece Hall.

By a strange coincidence, the four unbeaten sides in Division One South were paired off and it was Met Police and Burgess Hill who survived.

The Police maintained their 100 per cent record for the season with their sixth successive victory, 2-1 at Godalming. Glenn Stanley's penalty for Godalming on the stroke of half-time cancelled out Craig Watkins' opener for the Met and it was anyone's game in the second half. It was the visitors who struck the decisive blow when Craig Brown scored with five minutes left.

Danny Curd's hat-trick fired Burgess Hill through against Eastbourne Town. He scored twice in the first half-hour and added another on 71 minutes. It was the 83rd minute before Sam Crabb opened Eastbourne's account and Ashley Robinson netted moments later to leave Hillians hanging on frantically to their 3-2 lead in the closing stages.

Another all-Division One South tie was at Fleet, where the home side cruised to a 3-1 win over Faversham. Mark Anderson scored the only goal of the first half and Johnnie Dyer added a second-half double, making it seven for the season, before Matt Bourne replied for Faversham, who had Justin Ascheri sent off.

One other Ryman League side succumbed to Step 5 opposition. That was Corinthian-Casuals, for whom a Reggie Savage penalty came too late to avert a 2-1 home defeat by Erith & Belvedere.

Kofi Quartey's 26th-minute goal was all Chipstead needed to progress at Cobham, Ian Pulman's 83rd-minute effort gave Whitstable a 1-0 home win over East Grinstead, who were down to nine men by the end, and a single Lee Blackburn goal in the 40th minute saw Maldon through at One North rivals Ilford.

Walton & Hersham are out, beaten 4-1 at home by Bashley of the Zamaretto Premier. Bernard Asante's 42nd-minute goal pulled it back to 2-1 and gave the Swans what proved to be vain hope for the second half. Indeed, much of that hope vanished before the interval when Ray Powell was sent off.

Brentwood cruised to a 4-0 home win over Aylesbury United. They had to wait until the 40th minute for Ellis Remy's opener, a penalty, but Danny Dafter grabbed another before the break. Anthony Ryan added his seventh of the season and an own goal finished it off.

There were 2-0 wins for Enfield Town, Adam Wallace and Sam Byfield their marksmen at Arleseey, and for Redbridge, who beat London Colney at Oakside thanks to the A-Team of Julian Ashby and Sonny Adams.

East Thurrock took a third-minute lead through Max Cornhill at home to Leighton, who threatened to force a replay with Enzo Silvestri's 80th-minute equaliser. But Kris Newby, who had missed his last two penalties, held his nerve to convert an 84th-minute spot-kick and see Rocks through.

Three ties did go to replays, with late goals denying the Ryman League clubs victory in all three, and FA Cup connoisseurs will be pleased to note that they will be on three different nights.

First up will be Harlow, who travel to the Mile End Stadium tonight (Monday) to face Essex Senior League side Bethnal Green. Sos Yao's 27th-minute penalty looked as if it would be enough for the Ryman side but Bethnal Green equalised in the last minute.

Worthing also went ahead with a penalty, from Callum Saunders in the 66th minute, at former Ryman club Ashford (Middlesex), who made it 1-1 with three minutes left. They meet again at Worthing on Tuesday.

Romford took a 10th-minute lead through Paul Clayton at home to Crawley Green, one of the few

surviving Step 6 clubs, but failed to build on it and saw the visitors earn a well-deserved draw with a late penalty. The replay will be on Wednesday at Barton Rovers.

Hendon, second in the Premier Division, must have feared that they might be following leaders Sutton out of the FA Cup when Division One North side Cheshunt took a 51st-minute lead at Vale Farm on Sunday. Reliable marksman Chris Meikle was the scorer.

Hendon were not behind for long. Belal Aite-Ouakrim equalised five minutes later and by the hour mark Hendon were 3-1 up as Aaron Morgan and Jamie Busby found the target. Morgan added another at the death to make it 4-1.

Laurent Hamici fired his seventh goal of the season in added time to see ten-man Cray through against South Park in another Sunday tie. The dismissal of Chris Saunders after only 15 minutes helped South Park to bridge the three-division gap and they were moments away from forcing a replay when Hamici broke the deadlock in the 92nd minute.

In the third Sunday game, a superb strike by Jason Fontaine gave Division One North side Grays a 1-0 home win over Windsor, of the Zamaretto Premier. Fontaine's dipping shot from 25 yards gave Grays the lead in the 29th minute and it was enough to settle a compelling, end-to-end tie which could have had many more goals.
