#### Leatherhead Hit Record Eleven!!

Three club records were smashed as Leatherhead romped to an 11-0 Division One South victory at Horsham YMCA on Saturday.

It was their record away victory, their biggest win in Ryman League football and the first time nine different players had scored for Tanners in one game. The only men to find the net twice were Greg Andrews and John Boswell.

YMCA played with ten men for the last 79 minutes after the dismissal of Tommy Brewer but they were already 2-0 down. Tommy Hutchings started the rout in the very first minute with his eighth goal of the season and Kev Terry added another in the seventh minute. A penalty in the 24<sup>th</sup> minute enabled Greg Andrews to become the first player this season to take his league tally into double

figures and Chris Boulter made it 4-0 on the half-hour.

The ten men avoided further damage before half-time but they conceded a goal in the first minute of the second half, just as they had in the first. Rob Hill was the scorer this time and Andrews made it six two minutes later. Dan Dean, Boswell and Jack McLeod added three more by the hour mark and the all-time league record, a 15-1 victory by llford over future partners Leytonstone in 1935-36, was coming under threat.

But there was a 14-minute wait for the tenth goal, netted by Boswell, and Tanners added only one more, Marc Elston scoring in the 85th minute.

It was the highest score in the Ryman League since Hendon's 11-1 victory over Leyton, also away from home, in a Premier Division game on 15<sup>th</sup> December, 2007, and the biggest victory for almost ten years, since Lewes crushed Chalfont St Peter 13-0 in Division Three on 7<sup>th</sup> November 2000. There was a higher aggregate earlier that season when Thame beat Barton 11-3.

YMCA almost reached double figures themselves last Boxing Day when they hit nine unanswered goals at home to Eastbourne. And Sussex County League team Littlehampton know what it is like to be on the wrong end of a Gorings Mead goal spree. YMCA beat them by an incredible 22-1 during the 2002-03 season.

Saturday was a day that all Horsham football fans will want to forget. The town club, who are YMCA's tenants at Gorings Mead, were

beaten 6-1 in their Premier Division game at Margate.

#### **Premier Division**

A hat-trick by Margate's Shaun Welford was the highlight of a restricted seven-match Premier Division programme on Saturday.

Darren Marsden opened the scoring for the Kent club after eight minutes of their home game with Horsham and Welford, who had set up the chance, netted his own first on 21 minutes. Ben Andrews pulled one back for Horsham before half-time but that was as good as it would get for them. Jay Saunders made it 3-1 soon after half-time and Welford struck twice in three minutes, the first a penalty, before turning creator again for a late goal by Dean Grant. The 6-1 victory lifted Margate into the top half of the table while Horsham could console themselves with the thought that they had fared considerably better than their Gorings Mead landlords.

Not for the first time this season, it was a hard day for Premier Division forwards. Margate were a shining exception, for none of the other 13 clubs in action scored more than once.

Tonbridge, who had banged in seven against Hornchurch seven days earlier, had to wait until the 75<sup>th</sup> minute for the Frannie Collin freekick which went in off the bar to see off embattled visitors Croydon Athletic, while Folkestone's matchwinner at Cray came a minute later from Darren Smith.

The big top-of-the-table clash at Lowestoft, watched by a crowd of 1,265, failed to produce a single goal, though it yielded nine yellow cards and one red, shown to Sutton's Craig Dundas for a wild challenge just after the hour.

The other three games finished 1-1. Orlando Smith's penalty gave Aveley an early lead at bottom club Maidstone. Danny Hockton replied in the 33<sup>rd</sup> minute but was later sent off.

A fierce shot by Walid Matata put Billericay ahead after just over a minute of their Essex derby at Hornchurch, who eventually levelled with a scrambled effort from recently-introduced substitute Tommy Black in the 78<sup>th</sup> minute.

Barry Stevens returned from injury to give Tooting a 58<sup>th</sup> minute lead at home to Hastings, who equalised 12 minutes later with

a Michael Phillips penalty after Ade Olorunda had been tripped.

#### **Division One North**

Thamesmead moved up to second place in Division One North with an impressive 2-0 victory at East Thurrock, who started the day in third place. Both goals came in the space of four minutes just before the half-hour mark, with Raphael Momodu setting up the chances for Marcus Perona and Andy Constable.

Leon Hunter, a midweek signing from Hornchurch, marked his debut for Harlow with the goal a minute after the interval which brought them a 1-0 home win over in-form Wingate and lifted them to fourth spot.

Maldon were the day's top scorers in the division, hitting five unanswered goals at bottom club Redbridge who still have only a single point to their credit. Lawrence Yiga, Jack Haverson and Paul King scored in the first half, with Paul Shave and Ade Osifuwa completing the nap hand.

The side above Redbridge, Waltham Forest, were denied their first win of the season by a 72<sup>nd</sup> minute equaliser by Manzi Mbala for visitors Romford. Ade Cole had given Forest a 32<sup>nd</sup> minute lead in a rehearsal for next week's FA Trophy tie.

Great Wakering recorded their second win of the season, 2-1 at home to Heybridge. Luca Frankis put them ahead after 54 minutes only for Swifts to strike back at once through Tom English. The turning point came when Heybridge's Ricky Griggs was sent off; Bradley Walsh chipped the winner soon afterwards.

Tilbury beat Leyton 3-0, though it looked as if they would have to settle for Nathan Gordon's eighth-minute effort. Then Michael Toner and Paul Tiffen stretched the margin in the last five minutes.

Draw specialists Waltham Abbey shared the points for the sixth time when an 89<sup>th</sup> minute penalty by Darrell Cox earned visiting Cheshunt a 1-1 draw. Emmanuel Osei had broken a scoreless deadlock 12 minutes earlier.

Ware made short work of Grays in the second half at Wodson Park. Matthew Mitchell opened the scoring with a 55<sup>th</sup> minute penalty and Gazmend Dauti added another in the 69<sup>th</sup>

minute. Any Grays hopes disappeared when Jerome Ingram was sent off with eight minutes left and a late goal by Sam Ruff made it 3-0.

Sudbury's stuttering start to the season continued when they were held to a 1-1 home draw by Ilford. Chuck Duru put the Foxes ahead after 12 minutes and Sudbury had to wait until the 71<sup>st</sup> minute for Lee Townrow's equaliser.

#### **Division One South**

Apart from Leatherhead's exploits, recorded elsewhere, the goalscoring honours in Division One South must go to Fleet's Johnnie Dyer. His second-half double gave them a 2-1 home win over Ramsgate, who had taken the lead shortly before the interval through Liam Quinn. Dyer scored all eight Fleet goals in the past week and now has 16 for the season.

While Leatherhead displaced Met Police, who were in FA Cup action, from the top of the table there was a substantial reshuffle immediately behind them.

Bognor moved up to third with a 2-0 home win over Dulwich, who dropped two places to seventh. The goals, by Ben Johnson and a Michael Birmingham penalty, came in a seven-minute spell during the first half.

Godalming's first win under their new management team lifted them to fourth spot. They beat Chatham 2-0 with second-half goals from Damian Matthews and Richard Shittu.

Sittingbourne are also into the play-off places. They conceded a ninth-minute goal to Danny Oakins for visiting Whyteleafe but levelled on the stroke of half-time through Tom Bradbrook and clinched a 2-1 victory with a late goal from Billy Manners.

Burgess Hill slipped from third to sixth after going down 2-1 at Chipstead. Ray Freeman did the damage, scoring twice in the first 15 minutes of the second half. Ronnie Green replied with 12 minutes to go but there was no escape for Hillians.

It was a bad day for Faversham, who finished with nine men as they were beaten by a fourthminute Alfie Arthur goal for visiting Walton Casuals. Damien Abel was sent off just after half-time and Jake Leberl followed him in the 76<sup>th</sup> minute.

All the action came early at Walton & Hersham as they beat Whitstable 3-1 to record their first success under new boss Chuck Martini. Martin Grant gave them a 15<sup>th</sup> minute lead, Josh Webb – one of the men who followed Martini from Godalming – added another two minutes later and Grant got his second on 24 minutes, with Richard Yianni replying moments later.

Peter Cooper hit the bar for Eastbourne before an 84<sup>th</sup> minute goal by Anthony Myers gave visitors Merstham a 1-0 victory.

And finally, spare a thought for bottom club Corinthian-Casuals. A first win of the season was within their grasp when Joel Thompson gave them a 70<sup>th</sup> minute lead at home to Worthing but they were denied when Callum Saunders made it 1-1 in added time.

#### **FA Cup**

Carshalton Athletic produced the Ryman League's best performance in Saturday's FA Cup third qualifying round, beating high-flying Conference South side Braintree 4-1 at Colston Avenue. The star of the show was Byron Harrison, whose hat-trick included two goals after his side were reduced to ten men.

Brad Quinton's penalty had given Braintree a fifth-minute lead. Chris Henry replied in the 20<sup>th</sup> minute and Harrison struck seven minutes before the break. A red card for Tommy Williams soon after the interval seemed to offer Braintree a lifeline but there was no stopping Harrison, who struck in the 71<sup>st</sup> and 80<sup>th</sup> minutes to see Robins through to the final qualifying round. He must be a strong candidate for the FA Cup's golden boot award; seven of his season's 12 goals have been scored in the competition.

Harrow also ejected Conference South opposition, beating visitors Hampton & Richmond Borough 2-1. Rocky Baptiste was their hero, scoring with a header and a lob in the first 18 minutes to set the visitors a task that proved beyond them. They pulled one back through Leon Yarney in the 63<sup>rd</sup> minute but that was all and they had Nathan Collier sent off in added time.

It was not the only game in which there was action in added time. Four of the other contests between Ryman and Conference South clubs produced goals after the 90-minute mark and three of them set up replays.

Division One North club Brentwood were moments away from a memorable home victory over Woking as they clung on to Dean Green's fourth-minute strike, despite the 58<sup>th</sup> minute dismissal of Ryan Doyle, only to foiled by Joe McNerney's free-kick as time ran out.

Bury and Canvey, on the other hand, saved themselves at the death. Mark Coulson snatched a 2-2 draw for Bury, also with a free-kick, at home to Staines. A Leroy Griffiths penalty had given the visitors an early lead and, after Kieran Leabon replied midway through the first half, Mark Charles-Smith restored Staines' lead before the interval.

Rob King's 93<sup>rd</sup> minute penalty rescued Canvey, who had taken a ninth-minute lead at home to Dartford through Danny Heale. They held it until the 70<sup>th</sup> minute, when Ryan Hayes equalised from the spot, and an Elliot Bradbrook header seven minutes later looked to have seen last season's Ryman League champions through until substitute Jason Hallett was brought down and King kept his nerve.

The other late goal came from Boreham Wood, clinching their 3-1 home win over Enfield Town. It took 63 minutes for Luke Garrard to put the Conference South club ahead and veteran Bryan Hammatt soon hit back for the Division One side. Joe Benjamin restored Wood's lead in the 79<sup>th</sup> minute and Lee Allinson wrapped it up in added time.

In the other two matches involving Conference South opposition, Kingstonian fought out a 0-0 draw at St Albans – Dean Hamlin came closest, hitting a Saints post - but Needham Market went down 1-0 to home to Ebbsfleet, the goal coming from Tom Phipp in the 57<sup>th</sup> minute.

There were two more post-90 minute red cards, one in each of the all-Ryman ties. Hendon's Jamie Busby went for a slightly early bath at Whitehawk but his side held on to win 2-1. Their prolific strikers Belal Aite-Ouakrim, after 14 minutes, and Aaron Morgan, shortly after he had been introduced at half-time, took their joint tally to 16. Hawks were briefly level thanks to Paul Armstrong's 38<sup>th</sup> minute penalty.

Wealdstone and Metropolitan Police will have to try again after their 1-1 draw at Imber Court.

The visitors went ahead with a 19<sup>th</sup> minute effort from Sean Cronin, whose penalty was saved by Mo Maan two minutes later. Maan's long clearance was headed home by Craig Watkins, his tenth goal of the season, in the 55<sup>th</sup> minute and a handball in added time by Wealdstone's experienced recent signing Kieron Forbes denied the Met a chance of a winner, earning Forbes a red card.

Just one Ryman club were drawn against Step 5 opposition and Concord also had home advantage against Kent League side Hythe. But, in one of the day's biggest shocks, Hythe deservedly went through with a lone 52<sup>nd</sup> minute goal by Dave Cook, a deflected freekick.

#### Ryman Youth League

Five Ryman Youth League clubs have reached the third qualifying round of the FA Youth Cup and Hampton could make it six if they win a postponed tie against Wealdstone.

Leatherhead needed penalties to book their place after a 3-3 draw at Worthing, who trailed twice in normal time but took the lead early in the extra session through George Murphy, his second goal of the game. Adam Camplin saved Tanners with a 116<sup>th</sup> minute strike and they went on to win the shoot-out 5-4.

Sussex representation is at an end, for Burgess Hill went down 4-1 at RYL colleagues Woking. That tie also required extra time after Woking had come from behind, with an Adam Bicknell double finally putting them in command.

Darren Bryan netted twice, again in extra time, to give Carshalton a 3-1 win over VCD, and an 83<sup>rd</sup> minute leveller by Matt Harden saved Tonbridge at Chipstead. It finished 2-2 after 30 bonus minutes and, like Leatherhead, Tonbridge went through 5-4 on spot-kicks.

The only RYL winners to avoid extra time were Northwood, who beat Clapton 1-0 with a 21<sup>st</sup> minute goal by Julian Cole.

Kingstonian lead the Central Division table. After a 1-1 draw at Carshalton last week, they pulled off a 3-2 victory at Leyton with Matt Robinson netting twice.

Two other games in this division were 1-1 draws with the visitors scoring late goals. Kristian Childs maintained Sutton's unbeaten record at Walton & Hersham while James

Cottee's late effort threatened to win it for Metropolitan Police at Whyteleafe, only for Terry Ruff to reply in the last minute.

Whitehawk went to the top of the South-East division thanks to Tom Pinnock's 42<sup>nd</sup> minute goal which gave them a 1-0 win at Horsham. The other three games in this section were postponed after heavy rain.

The two matches in the West division produced away successes for Hayes and Staines, who have both won three out of three. Liam Devine's 76<sup>th</sup> minute goal saw Staines through 2-1 at Ashford (Mx) while Callum Chickah's first-half double helped Hayes shake off an early Barnet (Amber) goal by Jamal Akua Lowe and storm to a 5-2 victory.

# FA TROPHY – SECOND ROUND QUALIFYING DRAW

The draw for the Second Round Qualifying of the FA Trophy will be made on Monday, 18<sup>th</sup> October at Wembley Stadium. The details of the draw for matches involving Ryman Football League clubs will be published on the League website as soon as possible.

Matches are to be played on Saturday, 30<sup>th</sup> October 2010.

### **DOUBLE FIGURES**

Leatherhead's 11-0 victory at Horsham YMCA on Saturday was the 60<sup>th</sup> double-figure score in Isthmian League history and the 25<sup>th</sup> instance of 11 or more goals.

The record is held by Ilford, who beat Leytonstone 15-1 in 1935-36. There have been two instances of 14 goals, both against the unfortunate Croydon FC in 1993-94 when they were beaten 14-0 at Berkhamsted and at home by Staines on their way to conceding a record 198 goals during the season. They also lost 10-0 at Boreham Wood.

St Albans and Lewes have both scored 13, llford and London Caledonians 12.

Tanners became the 11<sup>th</sup> team to reach double figures away from home; only Staines, as above, have scored more than 11. Oddly enough, the last three double-figure tallies have all been by visiting clubs.

Clapton were the first team to reach the tengoal mark and, indeed, went one better when they beat Shepherd's Bush 11-0 in 1909-10. They have been involved in more double-figure scores than anyone else, ten in all, though they were on the receiving end of the other nine.

Ilford have taken part in eight such games, five for and three against. They are the only side to hit double figures twice in a season, in 1936-37, though they have never done it since, and are also the only side to be on both ends of such a scoreline in the same campaign, in 1926-27 when they beat Leytonstone 10-0 and lost 10-2 to Wimbledon, both at home. It was the first of four double-figure scores by the Dons; the others were all 11s.

Current league members with double-figure scores: Ilford 5, Dulwich 3, Hendon 2, Met Police 2, Sutton 2 (both 11s), Canvey, East Thurrock, Kingstonian, Leatherhead, Leyton (as Leyton-Wingate), Tilbury, Wealdstone, Whyteleafe.

Matches in the league's cup competitions are not included above. There have been two instances, though - surprisingly, perhaps - the League Cup has never yielded a ten-goal feat. Carshalton trounced Worthing 13-0 in the Full Members Cup in 1990-91 and Barton beat Southwick 10-2 in the Associate Members Cup the following season.

## **CLUB GOSSIP**

#### **HENDON FC**

Hendon Football Club supporters will mark Hendon's attempt to reach the FA Trophy Final in 2011 by doing a sponsored walk to their first tie from under the Bobby Moore Statue at Wembley Stadium.

The Greens, who share with Wembley Football Club at Vale Farm, have been given an away tie, but the journey is not too daunting, to Harrow Borough's Earlsmead Stadium. The walkers plan to set off at 11.30 on Saturday, 16<sup>th</sup> October and they are hoping for good weather for their five-mile jaunt. The Swan Inn, Sudbury, has kindly offered to act as resting point on the walk.

Hendon Football Club Supporters Trust, who took control of the club earlier this season, have conducted a number of sponsored walks over the past few years and two supporters, Paul McGreal and his then fiancée (now wife) Jacqui went many thousands of steps further by walking over 500 miles during the 2008–09 season.

As well as raising funds for Hendon Football Club Supporters Trust, a local charity – Rays of Sunshine – will also benefit. Rays of Sunshine Children's Charity was formed in 2004 to help children who are living with serious or life-limiting illnesses between the ages of 3-18 across the United Kingdom. It does this by granting children's wishes however impossible the wish may seem, and by helping hospitals, hospices and specialist schools improve their facilities.

#### MAIDSTONE UNITED FC

Paul Bowden-Brown has retired as chairman of Maidstone United Football Club after almost 20 years at the helm.

Shareholder Oliver Ash and local businessman Terry Casey took full control of the club on Friday, 8<sup>th</sup> October from outgoing chairman Bowden-Brown. They will own the club 50-50 and direct it as a trio together with Bill Williams, who becomes chief executive.

For now, the moment belongs to Bowden-Brown – the man who rescued Maidstone United from the abyss back in 1992. During his tenure, the club went from the lowest division of the Kent County League to the Ryman League Premier Division and he secured planning permission for a new stadium at James Whatman Way, just on the outskirts of the town centre.

Bowden-Brown said, "It is a time of great emotion for me and my family. There's happiness when I look back at what I, with the help of others, have achieved but sadness that the one thing which has been constant in our lives for many years will no longer be there.

"This takeover comes at the right time for the club and myself. I feel I have taken things as far as I can and I wish my successors all the very best. Although I wasn't able to fulfil my ultimate ambition – to bring The Stones home, I feel I have put in place the foundations to enable Oliver and his team to complete that journey.

"Since 1992 we have climbed from the Fourth Division of the Kent County League to the Ryman Premier Division, secured a site for a new stadium, gained planning permission, developed the club from one team to more than thirty, won countless accolades and much more.

"I would like to thank everyone who has supported me over the years. From those who helped turn the old training ground at London Road into our new home after we reformed to those who put in countless hours behind the scenes to make this club what it is today. And a special thanks to the fans. I'll never forget the back-to-back championships we celebrated at Sevenoaks and Walton and that night outside Maidstone Town Hall when we gained planning permission.

"There are many more moments to look back on and countless people to thank. I have been proud to serve as chairman but here's to the future and I hope it is a great future for this great club."

Maidstone United Football Club is now under new ownership. Shareholder Oliver Ash and local businessman Terry Casey took full control of the club on Friday, 8<sup>th</sup> October from outgoing chairman Paul Bowden-Brown. They will own the club 50-50 and direct it as a trio together with Bill Williams, who becomes chief executive.

Ash and Casey met several months ago and have decided to work together to ensure the club's survival and long-term growth, which includes delivering the new stadium by the end of next year. The new owners' priority is to bring financial stability back to the club before taking the challenge to Maidstone's residents and business community to bring The Stones home after an absence of more than 20 years.

Ash, who originally bought a 25% stake in the club in February 2008 and invested £120,000, said, "It is an honour for me to take charge at Maidstone United and in particular to do so together with Terry Casey and Bill Williams. We all share the same ambition, which is to get the club playing (and winning) at our own ground as soon as possible.

"At the same time I cannot forget that we are taking over from Paul Bowden-Brown, who has been totally dedicated to the club over many years. He has been synonymous with Maidstone United. He ensured its survival when needed and then took it forward with passion. Now however it's up to us to try and rebuild again."

Casey, who has been a life-long supporter, added, "I believe strongly that the only way for the club to survive and prosper is to return to play at our new ground in Maidstone as quickly as possible. To achieve that target the club will, in addition to our own financial contributions, need to attract new investment. We are confident we can attract good people to join us as partners to help make that ambition a reality."

The new owners will elaborate on the details of this project over the next few weeks. Already they are working on new designs and costings for the ground at James Whatman Way and acknowledge they will have to pay off as much inherited debt as possible in order to make the business a more attractive proposition for new investors.

In the next few weeks, they will produce a business plan demonstrating how, with a new ground in the town, the club can be run efficiently and successfully on and off the field. They will then market this plan to potential new investors. The objective is to get the new ground up and running at the latest by the end

of 2011.

Ash added, "Terry, Bill and I want to put the club on a solid footing once again. The only way to achieve this will be to get back playing in the town. We are confident we will be able to attract further investment in our project and indeed some people have already come forward.

"The club is lucky to have fantastic supporters and we believe the supporters have to get involved directly in its future. We are intending to reduce our shareholdings in due course to bring new people on board, supporters and local business people with ideas, passion and, of course, some capital. As soon as possible we must get to a situation where the club's regular income matches its costs."

With this in mind it is intended to put in place a new commercial plan to attract partners and sponsors back to the club and also to increase transparency so that the club's website becomes a real market-place of information.

Casey added, "It's up to the supporters to continue to show their support for these initiatives. We need them to come along in great numbers, not only when we open the new ground but also now, over the next few months, when we are still at Ashford and it remains tough on the field. We are going to have to invest a lot of money so we need an increase in support to alleviate and share the burden."

The owners will announce the make-up of an executive management committee that will be running the club on a day-to-day basis next week.
