East Thurrock United v Macclesfield Town

IT MAY be a cliché to suggest that a game is the biggest in a club's history, but in the case of Ryman Premier club East Thurrock United there can be no doubt about it.

When they run out on to the field at Rookery Hill shortly before 3pm on Saturday, they will be taking part in the first round of the FA Cup for the first time in their history.

Only once before have they even come close: that was in 2003-04 when, as a Division One North club, they held Woking to a 1-1 draw at Corringham in the fourth and final qualifying round but went down 2-0 in the replay.

Such are the vagaries of football that they went out to a club of lower pyramid status, Halstead Town, in the preliminary round a year later and their best since then, until this season, was a defeat at Tamworth in the 2008 third qualifying round.

The gate for that Woking game was 1,215, a club record, and Rocks are confident that they will top that figure on Saturday, with advance ticket sales already past the 500 mark. The game is not all-ticket.

Macclesfield lie 13th in League Two. In their 17 games so far they have scored 19 goals and conceded 17.

Rocks, meanwhile, are 21st in the Ryman Premier, having scored only nine goals in 11 games. So it could be a tight affair, and that increases the chances of a single goal being enough to create a major shock.

East Thurrock have had more than one scare on their way to their big day.

Their run began in the first qualifying round with a 1-0 home win over Bedford Town. Petrit Elbi headed the only goal of a drab match.

The excitement level went up a notch in the next round as Rocks drew 3-3 with Conference South club St Albans City. Kris Newby gave them an early lead but that became a 3-1 deficit before Elbi pulled one back on the stroke of half-time. Kye Ruel equalised early in the second half.

The replay was a triumph for John Coventry's side, who scored three times in 12 minutes early in the second half, Elbi getting two and Newby one. Saints replied late in the game and Rocks won 3-1.

A home game against North Greenford, one step below Rocks in the pyramid and bottom of their division at that, should have been a formality. Instead, it looked like the end of the road as Rocks started the second half facing a 3-0 deficit.

Ruel, Greg Cohen and Sam Higgins came to the rescue, it was another 3-3 draw and Rocks won the replay 3-0. Higgins put them ahead at the end of the first half and also netted the clincher after Reiss Gilbey made it 2-0 on the hour.

The draw for the final qualifying round was not as kind as it might have been, handing Rocks a trip to Conference South club Eastbourne Borough, but they rose to the occasion once more and, after a goalless first half, Higgins and Newby struck.

Eastbourne pulled one back with ten minutes to go but Rocks clung on to that precious 2-1 lead and made club history.

Redbridge v Oxford City

UNLIKE East Thurrock, Redbridge have reached this stage before, though not under that name.

They were still playing under the Ford United banner in 1998 when they had their first taste of glory.

Playing in the old Ryman Division Three, they fought their way through from the preliminary round, surviving three replays along the way, to be handed a dream draw away to Preston North End, then lying fourth in Division Two (the present League One), three places and five points ahead of Manchester City.

It would have taken six promotions for the Motormen to reach the same level and the gap between the sides is thought to have been the greatest in FA Cup history.

Preston, managed by David Moyes, won the tie 3-0, though their third goal did not come until injury time, not long after Ford's Lee Parish had headed against the crossbar, and it was greeted with almost complete silence by the massed Preston fans behind the goal.

Why? Because they had become firm fans of Ford's goalkeeper-chairman Jimmy Chapman. Not the slimmest of men, by his own admission, Chapman had been the target of much mockery when he ran to that end for the second half — until he pulled up his top to reveal a t-shirt bearing the legend "I ate all the pies". After that he could do no wrong.

Ford, by then a Ryman Premier club, reached the first round again in 2003 when their manager was Craig Edwards, now in charge of Premier Division leaders Billericay.

They had to visit Port Vale who were also flying high in the old Division Two, and this was a very different contest. Livewire striker Mervin Abraham gave Ford a 20th-minute lead after breaking clear and they held it until just after the hour, when two goals in four minutes restored the natural order of things.

But the Motormen weren't finished. Indeed, they were inches away from victory. Alex Fiddes equalised and Sammy Cooper hit the bar from long range.

Back at Oakside, a single goal seemed to be enough for Vale until, as time ran out, they conceded a free-kick on the edge of the penalty area and dead-ball specialist Glenn Poole kept the coolest of heads to curl the ball into the net.

Sadly, centre-back Dean Chandler deflected a cross into his own goal during extra time to give Vale a 2-1 win.

This time Redbridge have been drawn at home to Oxford City, who are third in the Southern League's Premier Division. A tough task for the Motormen, who are 18th in Ryman North, but they will hardly be short of confidence after beating Southern League leaders Cambridge City on their own patch in the FA Trophy on Saturday.

Few people who were at Step 6 club Cockfosters for a preliminary round tie on September 3 would have guessed that they were seeing the start of something special.

Redbridge went in level at half-time only thanks to a 43rd-minute free-kick from Vinnie Durrant and snatched a 2-1 victory when substitute Ben Bradbury converted a 79th-minute penalty.

Motormen caused some raised eyebrows a fortnight later, however, when they travelled to Wingate & Finchley, enjoying an excellent start to Ryman Premier life, and beat them every bit as convincingly as the 3-0 margin suggests.

James Robinson, grandson of Jummy Greaves, put them ahead, Dan Trenkel made it 2-0 and another Bradbury penalty completed the scoring.

The second qualifying round brought more Ryman Premier opposition, this time Bury Town at home, and yet another Bradbury penalty, this time in the fourth minute, was enough to see them through to a victory which their opponents agreed they deserved.

A home tie against Step 5 Dunstable followed, and Redbridge were a little lucky to stay in the hunt until the 71st minute, when Nathan Gordon gave them the lead. It was still tight until the 85th minute when Bradbury scored, not from the spot for a change, and Joe Gardner made it 3-0 almost at once.

Now Conference Premier side Ebbsfleet stood between Motormen and the first round. Despite dominating for long periods at Oakside, Fleet failed to break down a determined home defence.

It was still 0-0 in the 77th minute when manager Terry Spillane decided to take off his talisman Bradbury, and two minutes later Ryan Murray's header gave Motormen the lead. Gardner thumped home a second and Redbridge were through.

Premier

LOWESTOFT moved up to third place on Tuesday but were made to work hard for a 1-0 home win over bottom club Horsham.

It was always going to be hard for Horsham, who had to face one of the league's longest journeys in midweek, but they held out until the 57th minute, when Adrian Forbes netted what proved to be the winner.

Two sides just outside the play-off places met at Bromley, where Cray and Canvey fought out a goalless draw. Cray moved up one place to sixth, Canvey climbed from tenth to eighth.

It was the turn of Met Police to move into third place on Wednesday with a 2-1 home win over Kingstonian.

Bobby Traynor put K's ahead in the 38th minute but Ty Smith equalised with a long-range strike two minutes later and Palmer settled it with ten minutes left.



North

NEEDHAM Market are the new leaders, and it was no surprise that Sam Newson was largely responsible. The league's most prolific marksman fired a hat-trick in a 4-0 home win over Ware on Tuesday.

He scored the only goal of the first half in the 34th minute and added a second five minutes after the restart.

Danny Bloomfield headed the third on 74 minutes and Scott Chaplin set up the chance for Newson to complete his treble in added time

With exactly a third of their league programme complete, Needham have scored 45 goals. Newson has claimed 18 of those and now has 26 in all competitions.

It was a tale of two penalties at Brentwood, who moved up to fourth place with a 1-0 home victory over Potters Bar. Tom Pett missed a spot-kick for the visitors with the last kick of the first half and Ryan Doyle won it from the 12-yard mark in the 89th minute.

The result was decided even later at thirdplaced Leiston, where Michael Shinn's goal in the fifth minute of added time earned Sudbury a 1-1 draw. Leiston had led since the 21st minute, when Danny Smy was on target.

Maldon won 2-1 at Thamesmead thanks to an 85th-minute goal by Leon Antoine. It was 1-1 at half-time but the scoreline could have been much higher.

Thamesmead had a penalty saved by Darren Behcet after Chuck Duru gave them a 23rd-minute lead, while Maldon, who equalised on the half-hour through Kevin McLeod, also hit the woodwork three times before the interval.

THIS was the place for goals as the nets bulged no fewer than 39 times in seven midweek games.

Nine of the goals came on Tuesday at Chipstead, where Croydon Athletic were beaten 6-3. An eighth-minute own goal by Croydon's Colin Hartburn started the spree and it was 2-2 by the 24th minute, with James Fray and Tony Cuff equalising for Croydon either side of an Andrew Dalhouse strike for the hosts.

Dalhouse scored again to make it 3-2 at the interval and Anthony Morrison added a fourth soon after the restart. Fray struck again on the hour but a Marcus Elliott double made sure for Chips.

Whitehawk moved into the play-off places by outlasting Sittingbourne 4-3 at East Brighton Park

Hawks took the lead three times, though Joe Gatting and Jamahl Hughes in the first 15 minutes and Sam Gargan just after half-time, and three times the Brickies hit back, with Bryan Glover scoring in the seventh minute and Joe Goldsmith converting penalties either side of the interval.Gatting got his second on 77 minutes to decide the outcome, and Hawks also missed a penalty of their own.

Bottom club Crawley Down were beaten 4-2 at Merstham but must have feared it would be much worse when they trailed 4-0 at half-time.

Goals had come at regular intervals from Liam Wright, debutant Jamie Byatt, signed earlier in the day from Tooting, Harry Ottaway and Roscoe Dsane.

The Anvils managed to avoid further damage and notched a couple of consolation goals through Fraser Logan and Tom Lyons.

Lowly Whyteleafe did well to draw 2-2 at Worthing. Fabian Batchelor gave the visitors an early lead but goals midway through each half by Paul Kennett and Ryan McBride seemed to have swung it, only for Scott Simpson to equalise 11 minutes from time.

Rebels are seventh, four points off the play-off spots but with at least three games in hand on all the sides above them.

Fourth-placed Folkestone went down 3-2 at Ramsgate, for whom Pascal Ebigbo hit the winner 13 minutes from time. He had also opened the scoring in the eighth minute.

James Everitt, who scored four times on Saturday, made it 1-1 in the 22nd minute only for Ian Pulman, another man signed (from Margate) earlier in the day, to restore Rams' lead 11 minutes later.

Simon Austin squared it again in the 68th minute, finding an empty net after home keeper Danny Twyman missed his kick, but Ebigbo had the last word.

Corinthian-Casuals were pushed out of the play-off places by Taser Hassan's late 25yarder which earned visiting Hythe a 1-1 draw after Joel Thompson had put Casuals ahead ten minutes before half-time.

Maidstone went to the top of the table on Wednesday after beating Godalming 4-2 at Central Park.

Alex Waugh was the key man, scoring twice in six minutes either side of the half-hour to wipe out Darren Wheeler's early goal for G's.

Alex Flisher made it 3-1 after 57 minutes but G's were not finished.

Scott Harris reduced the arrears with 16 minutes left and G's then celebrated an apparent equaliser only for the officials to rule that ball had not crossed the line.

Stones' top scorer Shaun Welford made sure of the points in added time, netting his 19th of the season and his tenth in the league.



FA Trophy

WEALDSTONE and Hornchurch were the survivors of the two all-Ryman Premier replays in the FA Trophy tonight (Tuesday).

The prolific Richard Jolly put Stones ahead midway through the first half but visiting Margate drew level with a Kwesi Appiah penalty five minutes into the second half, his 17th goal of the season of which 12 have come in the FA competitions.

Margate then had Dean Pooley sent off for bringing down Jolly and, although the free-kick came to nothing, Stones completed a 2-1 victory when Alex Dyer converted Peter Dean's pass in the 77th minute and they will visit Banbury in the third qualifying round.

A header by Les Thompson after 28 minutes was all Hornchurch needed for their home win over Harrow in a scrappy game.

Harrow rarely threatened until added time. when tall goalkeeper Nick Pope joined the attack for three corners and a free-kick.

The ball was bundled into the net once but the goal was disallowed and Hornchurch earned themselves a trip to neighbours Thurrock, the club for whom Urchins chairman Colin McBride, manager Jim McFarlane and assistant manager John Purdie played a total of 1,239 games.
