ALL THE WEEKEND ACTION

Premier

THERE was little change at the top of the Ryman Premier on Saturday, with all the top four winning. Lowestoft thus stayed a point clear after their narrow 2-1 home victory against a Cray side that conceded two penalties and finished with nine men.

Dale Cockrill put the Trawlerboys ahead from the spot in the 25th minute but Tommy Whitnell equalised shortly after half-time. That was followed by a flare-up which led to the dismissal of Allan McLeod. Another penalty in the 71st minute was again converted by Cockrill and any hopes Cray had of rescuing a point were dashed when another disagreement brought a red card for Sam Long.

Hot on Lowestoft's heels are Hornchurch and Billericay, who are now level on points and with identical goal records, though the Blues have a game in hand. Urchins take over second spot in the printed table thanks to their 'AFC' prefix, and thanks to a goal in the fourth minute of added time by Hendon's Isaiah Rankin which restricted Billericay to a 2-1 margin. They struck early, with an 11th-minute Richard Halle penalty quickly followed by a goal for Emeka Onwubiko.

Hornchurch, meanwhile, beat Hastings 3-1 to chalk up their eighth away win in the league, and their seventh in. The game turned their way in a minute midway through the first half, when Martin Tuohy scored and then crossed for Lewis Smith to head home. It was Tuohy's 11th league goal and made him the division's joint-top scorer. Jonathan Hunt, who recently celebrated his 40th birthday, chipped the third in the 71st minute and Zac Attwood fired in a free kick for a late consolation.

Met Police, easily the most successful so far of the four promoted clubs, stayed three points further back by strolling to a 3-0 home win over Tooting. They scored two quick goals at virtually the same time as Hornchurch, Duran Reynolds and Ty Smith the marksmen, and Chris Bourne wrapped it up with a solo effort 11 minutes after the break.

The division's other 11-goal man, Wingate's Leon Smith, failed to add to his total, and no-one else found the target either as they drew 0-0 at Lewes. The Sussex club will be disappointed with the outcome, though the point lifted them two places to fifth.

At the other end of the table, two Essex clubs won at home for the first time this season. Ray Freeman headed Horsham in front after 27 minutes at Aveley, playing their first league game under new boss Lee Hodges. His day improved considerably when Danny Francis equalised in the 72nd minute and Cedric Ngakam headed the winner two minutes

later against a Horsham side now down to ten men after Nicky Humphrey's dismissal.

Concord left it late to break their home duck. Tony Stokes headed the only goal of their game against Harrow with just a minute of normal time to go.

Another Essex club, East Thurrock, are now at the foot of the table. A week after their rather unlucky 3-0 FA Cup defeat by League Two Macclesfield, they crashed 5-2 at Bury. A remarkable first half produced all seven goals, making the rest of the afternoon something of an anti-climax.

Lee Read and John Sands put Bury 2-0 up by the 12th minute and Sam Higgins replied two minutes later. There was a brief lull before Sam Nunn nodded Bury's third on 25 minutes and the rest of the goals followed at regular intervals before half-time. Kye Ruel headed the visitors' second, only for Billy Clark and Sands to put the points beyond their reach.

Rocks hit the bottom because previous table-proppers Leatherhead took a point from a 1-1 draw at Carshalton, also overtaking Horsham as they moved up to 20th place.

Tommy Hutchings put Tanners ahead with a 16th-minute penalty which was, surprisingly, his first league goal of the season. The same was true of Dean Lodge, who replied eight minutes before half-time. A goalline clearance denied Kev Terry a late Tanners winner.

Kwesi Appiah took his league tally into double figures and his overall total to 22 with a dramatic winner for Margate in added time. Kingstonian went down 2-1 despite scoring both the previous goals. Gary MacDonald found his own net from a corner to give Margate an early lead and Bobby Traynor levelled matters with a penalty right on half-time.

Wes Parker's 18th-minute header gave Wealdstone the lead at home to Canvey but they had Peter Dean sent off before the interval and the islanders hit back to win 2-1. Jay Curran equalised on 57 minutes and penalty ace Rob King finished the job with 15 minutes to go.

WILL history repeat itself for Needham Market, who became the first team in the league to reach the 50-goal mark yesterday (Saturday)?

The Ryman South leaders got to the half-century with Duane Wright's 25th-minute opener at Waltham Abbey and they went on to win 4-0. Last season they had an identical total of 53 goals from their first 16 games but faded in the New Year, lost the title to East Thurrock and went out in the play-off semi-finals.

By coincidence this year their main rivals are likely to be Grays, who share East Thurrock's Rookery Hill ground. The crucial difference for the Marketmen, perhaps, is that they do not face the same fixture backlog. Last season they did not play their 16th game until January.

It was 3-0 by half-time on Saturday; Sam Newson knocked in his 19th league goal and 27th in all before Wright connected with his second header of the day. Jose Espinosa made it four in the 76th minute.

Needham were not, however, Suffolk's top scorers away from home. That honour went to Leiston, who scored five unanswered goals at Waltham Forest. Rhys Henry struck early, but it remained 1-0 until soon after half-time when David Head netted the second. Luke Hammond made it three and late efforts from Danny Smy and Nathan Stone completed the rout.

Leiston remain third, two points behind Grays who in turn are a point adrift of the leaders with a game in hand. Joao Carlos put them ahead after 11 minutes only for Robert Magwood to level matters for visiting Potters Bar shortly before half-time. But the Scholars had Dan Adamo sent off, Leon McKenzie headed home to restore Grays' advantage on the hour and David Cowley soon made it 3-1.

Potters Bar, who started the day fifth, dropped back to seventh and were the only team in the top seven to drop points. Enfield Town stayed fourth despite twice falling behind at Chatham.

Lloyd Blackman put the Kent side ahead after 20 minutes and, after Jon Moore levelled matters on the half-hour, Jason Barton quickly gave Chats a well-deserved second lead. The visitors had more of the game after the break, Liam Hope's penalty made it 2-2 on the hour and Daniel Ailey gave them a 3-2 victory with nine minutes left.

Brentwood are back in fifth place after a crushing 5-0 home win over Great Wakering. Ryan Doyle opened the scoring with a deflected shot after 12 minutes and Nick Skelton contributed an own goal shortly before the interval.

Darren Blewitt headed the third on 72 minutes and, like Leiston, Brentwood completed their nap hand with two late goals, both from Lee Blackburn.

Tilbury are back up to sixth, just. They were into added time at Soham when Alex Read hammered the only goal of the game from 25 yards to give Dockers all three points.

Redbridge, facing their FA Cup first-round replay at Oxford City on Tuesday, might have been excused for a below-par performance at Cheshunt.

But their peculiar season continued with a 2-1 win, their fifth away success in the league though they have yet to take more than one point from a home game. James Robinson, who has received much publicity during the cup run as Jimmy Greaves' grandson, scored in each half and Cheshunt's reply from Anthony McDonald came right at the death.

Sudbury made it a clean sweep of away wins for the division's three Suffolk clubs. They were 2-0 victors at Ware thanks to a goal in each half from Rhys Darg and Nathan Clarke.

Ware remain a point ahead of bottom club Ilford, who went down 1-0 at Thamesmead. Lea Dawson was the man on target, heading home after an hour.

Harlow salvaged a 1-1 draw with an 85th-minute strike by James Peagram after Michael Toner had given visiting Heybridge a half-time.



Maldon and Romford turned their scheduled league meeting into a second-round Alan Boon Cup tie and Maldon, with former Gillingham boss Mike Flanagan acting as caretaker manager, cruised through 4-1.

Joe Pearman gave them a half-time lead against his former club. Leon Antoine and Ollie Berquez made it 3-0 before Hyun-Jin Lee pulled one back with ten minutes left. Sos Yao had the last word as Maldon booked themselves a trip to Lowestoft on Tuesday.

THERE was some encouragement yesterday (Saturday) for Maidstone's pursuers at the top of the Ryman South table. Five points clear at the start of play, the leaders were held to a 1-1 home draw by Merstham and needed a goal in added time by Baff Addae to maintain an unbeaten run which has now reached 14 games.

Stones were relieved to escape with even a point after keeper Kelvin Jack was sent off for handling outside his area before half-time and Fabio Saravia put Merstham ahead on the hour.

Dulwich closed the gap to three points, and have a game in hand, after a 1-0 win over Ramsgate which maintained their 100 per cent home record. The goal came from Andre Costa with only three minutes on the clock.

Sussex rivals Bognor and Whitehawk are a point further back. Jason Prior maintained his bid to retain the league's Golden Boot with two headed goals in their 4-0 home win over Eastbourne. He scored after nine and 70 minutes to take his haul to 18 in the league and 21 in all. Strike partner Terry Dodd netted ten minutes after half-time and Kane Wills completed the scoring.

Ben Godfrey headed home a corner in added time at the end of the first half and, although it was all Whitehawk could manage against bottom club Crawley Down, it was enough for three points.

The third Sussex club in the play-off places, Worthing, dropped back to sixth after going down to an early Callum O'Shea goal at Chipstead.

Folkestone took over fifth spot by winning 4-2 at Walton Casuals, who took a tenth-minute lead through Glenn Stanley. Darren Smith's penalty squared it on 24 minutes and Chris Davidson's own

goal put Folkestone ahead on the hour. Lowly Casuals fought back and Williams Adou made it 2-2, but it turned out to be much Adou about nothing as Ryan Moreby and Stuart King settled it.

The most important match at the bottom end of the table saw Whyteleafe travel to Croydon Athletic and it was the visitors who picked up three valuable points thanks to a goal midway through the second half by Scott Simpson.

That lifted them three places to 17th, while the losers inherited 20th spot.

They are a point ahead of Burgess Hill, who themselves earned a useful 1-1 draw at Faversham. Fred Foreman gave the visitors the lead with a free kick in the 38th minute but James Peacock headed home from a corner to level it before the break.

A year ago Walton & Hersham were struggling in 17th place with 18 points from 16 games. This season they are 15th, though with one fewer point, but they are running into some form.

Yesterday they scored twice in the last 12 minutes through Daniel Sintim and Phil Williams to snatch a 3-2 victory at Hythe. Craig Thompson gave Hythe the lead after eight minutes and 76 minutes, though on both occasions Walton hit back straight away. Daniel Morris netted their first equaliser.

And the significance of the statistics? Last season Walton recovered so effectively from their poor start that a home win on the final day would have given them a play-off place.

Whitstable are 19th after a 4-1 defeat at Godalming, where Adam Foulser's headed opener for the hosts was answered by a Stuart Vahid penalty before the break and it stayed that way until the 65th minute, when Darren Wheeler put G's in front again.

Ben Edwards and Ryan Lake, also with a penalty, finished it off.

Sittingbourne were 2-0 winners at Corinthian-Casuals. Jaie Nuttall scored just before the interval and Joe Goldsmith converted a 67th-minute penalty.


