Bognor's management team of Jamie Howell (centre, left) and Darin Killpartrick will collect the Ryman South prize. Second in the table, Bognor took 13 points from five games during the month and scored 21 goals while doing so.

Ryman North honours go to Danny Laws of Needham Market, who are top of that division and achieved maximum points from five games during the month.

Redbridge have completed a remarkable hat-trick by winning the Macron Team Performance of the Month in Ryman North. They earned the honour with their 2-1 FA Cup first-round replay success at Southern League high-fliers Oxford City. Their FA Cup exploits had already earned them the awards for August/September and for October.

Hornchurch are the Ryman Premier winners for their 5-0 FA Trophy victory at Conference South club Thurrock on the last Saturday in November. They also took the August/September prize thanks to a 5-2 win at Cray in their opening game of the season.

It has not been an easy start to Ryman League life for last season's Sussex County League champions Crawley Down. They went into their home game against Croydon Athletic on November 26 four points adrift at the foot of Ryman South and with only two wins to their credit. But they romped to a 5-0 victory to show that they are finding their feet at this level and that was judged to be the Performance of the Month in the division. It's the first Ryman League trophy for the Anvils but, they hope, not the last.

ALL THE WEEKEND ACTION

LOWESTOFT defender Adam Smith threw the title chase wide open again when his free-kick gave the Trawlerboys all three points against leaders Billericay in the battle of the top two at Crown Meadow.

The Essex men, previously beaten only once, went into the game with a four-point advantage but that was cut to one when Smith was brought down in the 63rd minute and picked himself up to smash home the free-kick from long range. It was the only goal of a rousing contest watched by 814, the league's biggest crowd of the season.

Third-placed Hornchurch are a point further back after maintaining their amazing away record with a last-gasp 1-0 victory at lowly Leatherhead. It was a more even game than the table might have suggested but Urchins made it nine away wins of out ten when Martin Tuohy headed his 12th league goal of the season in the 90th minute.

Met Police, three points further back in fourth place, continued their impressive form by thrashing Hastings 4-0 at Imber Court. Carl Wilson-Denis and Ty Smith both hit the woodwork before Wilson-Denis opened the scoring on 38 minutes and Jay Lovett headed the second two minutes later.

Zac Attwood hit the bar with a free-kick as Hastings tried to find a way back onto the game before Wilson-Denis struck again on 68 minutes and Ty Smith completed the scoring with an inswinging corner.

Lewes moved up to fifth with a 1-0 victory at Harrow. Harry Harding scored after seven minutes but, despite dominating the game, they failed to find the net again and almost paid the price at the end when Seb Schoburgh's shot was scrambled off their line.

The most action-packed game of the day was at Bury, though few would have guessed it after 60 uneventful minutes. Then a foul by Tom Bullard allowed Ashley-Paul Robinson to put Tooting ahead from the spot. Fortunes were soon reversed: Bullard headed the equaliser on 63 minutes and Robinson was sent off a minute later.

Bullard was then fouled to produce another penalty, converted by Billy Clark in the 74th minute to put Bury ahead. Tooting replied through Kofi Lockhart-Adams in the 80th minute

only for Sam Reed to restore Bury's lead moments later. Finally, in the seventh minute of added time, Tooting keeper Jack Giddens received their second red card and Clark fired in his second penalty to make it 4-2.

There were also six goals at Horsham, where the home side stayed rooted to the bottom of the table after a 5-1 home defeat by Cray. Hornets have managed just a single point from ten home matches and have not won anywhere since taking six points from their first two away games in August. Mark Willy gave Cray a 16th-minute lead with the only goal of the first half and Ray Freeman levelled it immediately after the break. Leigh Bremner put Cray ahead again in the 61st minute, Danny Phillips quickly added another and late goals by Phillips and Tony Dolby, a penalty, turned it into a rout.

All the bottom four clubs were beaten at home, in fact, as once again away wins outnumbered home victories in the division. Leatherhead remain ahead of Horsham only on goal difference, two points behind East Thurrock who were beaten by Sam Clayton's lone 62nd-minute goal for Kingstonian.

A further point ahead are Concord, who slumped to a 2-1 home defeat by Wealdstone when Ryan Tafazolli deflected a Richard Jolly shot into his own net with eight minutes left.

Watford loanee Britt Assombalonga had put Wealdstone ahead on 13 minutes and Tony Stokes replied with a 28th-minute header.

Carshalton chalked up only their second home win of the season, beating ten-man Wingate 3-0. Ahmet Rifat's 35th-minute dismissal left the visitors up against it but it was midway through the second half before substitute Dean McDonald broke the deadlock. Sonny Ayres made it 2-0 12 minutes later and Luke Nolan sealed it with a late third.

The other two games finished 1-1. Aveley gained a handy point at Hendon, for whom Elliott Charles headed the equaliser seven minutes from time. Sean Bonnett-Johnson had put Millers ahead midway through the second half.

Danny Heale gave Canvey an early lead at Margate and they might have gone further ahead before Dean Pooley's 30-yard effort found its way through to level the scores on 72 minutes.

A draw was fair enough, although it took a goalline clearance by John Easterford to deny the prolific Kwesi Appiah a last-minute winner for the hosts.

With 26 goals in the league and FA competitions, Appiah is by a distance the leading scorer in the country at this level or higher.

North

ENFIELD Town are the new leaders after Jon Moore completed a bad week for Grays Athletic with an 89th-minute winner in front of another 400-plus crowd at the Queen Elizabeth II Stadium on Saturday.

Grays were beaten 2-1 at then-leaders Needham Market on the previous Saturday and had three points deducted from their record during the week for a registration error. Having gone into the Needham game trailing the Marketmen only on goal difference, they are now fourth, eight points adrift.

Liam Hope put Enfield ahead with a second-minute penalty but Anthony Ryan made it 1-1 in the 38th minute and the hosts had Leon Osei sent off before half-time.

Grays were unable to profit from their extra man and a second yellow card for Bradley Thomas in the closing stages evened the numbers. Then Moore found the net with a looping shot to send Town to the top.

Needham slipped to second after being held to a 1-1 draw at Brentwood who also took a second-minute lead, Dean Green the marksman. Marketmen missed the chance for a speedy equaliser when Danny Thrower's penalty was saved by Elliot Justham, but Danny Bloomfield squared it three minutes after the interval.

Potters Bar were off the mark even more quickly: Cole Penny put them ahead after 34 seconds against Leiston. But the Suffolk visitors recovered and ran out 3-1 winners, moving up to third place. Leon Ottley-Gooch equalised after 21 minutes and it stayed level until 12 minutes from time, when Joe O'Brien turned the ball into his own net. Rhys Henry clinched it in the last minute.

Tilbury held on to the final play-off spot despite being held to a goalless home draw by Thamesmead but they are only a point ahead of Brentwood and the very much in-form Sudbury, who were 19th at the start of November.

Nathan Clarke headed Sudbury into a 19th-minute lead at Heybridge and Daniel Emmanuel made it 2-0 on the stroke of half-time. Clarke scored again in the fifth minute of added time but it was in his own net: most frustrating for Sudbury, who had completed ten hours without conceding a goal at the 90-minute mark.

Three points behind Sudbury with a game in hand are Harlow, who defeated bottom club Ilford

2-0. Michael Deane gave them the lead after ten minutes and Piers Wixon doubled it midway through the second half. Harlow had Daniel Brown sent off shortly afterwards but Ilford could not profit.

They are now two points adrift of Ware, who doubled their tally of away points with a 1-1 draw at Waltham Forest. Danny Johnson headed Ware in front after 16 minutes and they looked set for their second win of the season until Kayan Kalipha levelled it with six minutes left.

The other three games in the division were all decided by a single goal. Paul Clayton scored after 70 minutes for Romford, who had Abs Seymour sent off shortly afterwards but held on to beat Great Wakering.

Tim Shaw scored in the 87th minute to give Waltham Abbey three home points against Cheshunt and Maldon left it even later at Soham, Leon Antoine netting in the second minute of added time. Maldon had played with ten men since the 25th minute when James Abbott was dismissed, and they had also missed a penalty.

South

DULWICH remained a point ahead of Bognor at the top of Ryman South on Saturday as both clubs won 2-0 at home while their nearest rivals faltered.

Two goals by Ishmail Kamara, after 25 and 61 minutes, were enough for Dulwich to stretch their 100 per cent home record to ten games as they saw off Burgess Hill, who slumped to the foot of the table. It could have been more; Andre Costa and Frankie Sawyer hit the woodwork.

Golden Boot holder Jason Prior moved into the lead in this season's race, taking his league tally to 22 with goals after 35 and 78 minutes for Bognor against Maidstone.

He won the prize with 38 goals last season and is well ahead of that pace, especially as 11 of the 38 came in the last four games. It was a second successive defeat for fourth-placed Stones, who also lost their first two matches of the season but won 12 and drew two of the 14 in between.

Whitehawk remained third but are five points behind Dulwich after their 1-1 draw at Chipstead. Jamahl Hughes hit the Chipstead bar in the first half but it was the hosts who went in front with a Julien Thompson header after 66 minutes. Josh Jones replied four minutes later.

There was a shock for fifth-placed Worthing, who went down 2-0 at Crawley Down. This second successive Saturday victory not only lifted the Anvils off the bottom but out of the relegation zone as well.

They were worthy winners, too. Fraser Logan put them ahead in the 16th minute, Tom Burton added another shortly before half-time, and more might have followed. Rebels' bad day got worse when Ryan McBride was sent off with ten minutes left.

Folkestone moved above Chipstead into sixth place, a point behind Worthing, thanks to Simon Austin's goal three minutes from time which gave them a 2-1 victory at Croydon Athletic.

Stuart King put Folkestone ahead soon after the interval but Darren Smith had a penalty saved by Charlie Mann and it looked as if Mann's effort would be rewarded when George Landais equalised with eight minutes left. Then Austin struck to dump Croydon into the relegation places.

Two goals by Craig Thompson set up Hythe's 3-1 home win over Merstham. He finished off a pass from Brendon Cass midway through the first half, then headed the second on 40 minutes.

Roscoe Dsane hit back immediately but Hythe made sure of the points when James Dryden fired home with eight minutes left.

Walton Casuals saw off visiting Ramsgate by the same margin in a scrappy affair. Glenn Stanley hit the Ramsgate bar during a goalless first half and Lee Cooper opened the scoring seven minutes after the break.

Liam Holden, with a penalty, and Richard Taylor stretched the lead before Ian Pulman's late consolation.

Two teams just above the relegation zone met at Whitstable and the home side came from behind to beat Whyteleafe 2-1.

A header by Fabian Batchelor gave Leafe the lead on the hour but substitute Gary Mickelborough turned things round.

He was brought down for a penalty, converted by John Paul Collier, in the 70th minute and scored the winner himself six minutes later.

Danny Green's header in the third minute of added time earned Corinthian-Casuals a point from a 1-1 home draw with Faversham, who had held the lead since the 24th minute when Danny Hockton headed in a corner.

Sittingbourne were held to a 0-0 home draw by Walton & Hersham. Cedric Abraham did manage to find the net for the hosts but was ruled offside.

There was frustration for Eastbourne Town, who were a couple of minutes away from a 2-1 home win over Godalming when the floodlights failed and the match had to be abandoned.

Nathan Crabb scored twice in the first 18 minutes but G's, who had Damien Smith sent off eight

minutes before the interval, were handed a chance when Luke Denton put through his own net in the 82nd minute.



FA Cup

REDBRIDGE did themselves and the Ryman League proud in the second round of the FA Cup at Crawley on Saturday and the eventual 5-0 defeat was a harsh reflection of their valiant display.

The Motormen came with a will to attack, making their intentions clear by leaving three players on the halfway line when Crawley won their first corner.

Not surprisingly, though, it was the League Two high-fliers, fielding their strongest side, who dominated the early exchanges in front of a crowd of 2,494.

They had six shots at goal in the first 15 minutes, though none of them were on target.

Redbridge began to settle and James Robinson had a couple of half-chances, a shot that was blocked and a header that was too high.

Crawley made the breakthrough on the half-hour when Dan Trenkel's lunge brought down Kyle McFadzean and Matt Tubbs gave Adam Rafis no chance with his penalty, although the Redbridge keeper dived the right way.

Tubbs, always dangerous, made it 2-0 with a scorcher from 22 yards six minutes later and there were fears that it would turn into a rout.

But a series of outstanding saves by Rafis either side of the interval kept Crawley at bay and Motormen then gained the upper hand for a while, aided by some careless moments in the home defence.

One such slip allowed Joe Gardner to take the ball past home goalie Scott Shearer but his composure let him down and he put his shot wide.

Shearer then had to foil Robinson as Motormen pressed for the goal that could have made it a very interesting finish.

It stayed at 2-0 until the 79th minute, when Tubbs killed off the Redbridge challenge with a second penalty after Vince Durrant upended Tyrone Barnett and was, perhaps harshly, shown a red card.

Andy Drury quickly smashed home a fourth and McFadzean further punished a tired visiting side in the fifth minute of injury time. But the standing ovation the Ryman North side received from the main stand at the end was thoroughly deserved.

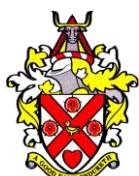

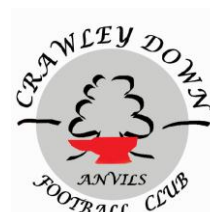
