A GOAL by Richard Avery earned Margate a 1-1 draw at Billericay on Saturday and denied the Ryman Premier leaders the chance to open a seven-point gap at the top by Tuesday.

The Essex men, who host Aveley in midweek, had hoped to make the most of two home games in four days while their closest rivals were sidelined.

It looked promising for them when Benson Kpaka fired them ahead after 20 minutes.

But Margate improved after the interval and Avery punished a weak clearance in the 79th minute, leaving Billericay just two points clear of Lowestoft who have a game in hand.

Lewes, who were in fifth place, suffered a shock 2-1 home defeat by lowly Concord.

Paul Booth hit a post for the hosts before Sherwin Stanley put Concord ahead in the 39th minute, his first goal since his switch from Aveley.

Steve King's own goal put Lewes back on terms before the interval but the visitors shook off that disappointment and hit the bar through James Elmes before Tony Stokes nabbed their winner just after the hour mark.

Lewes dropped to seventh place while Concord, though remaining in the bottom four, are now in touch with the teams above them.

Hendon moved back into the play-off places with a comfortable 3-0 victory at Tooting.

Elliott Charles headed home a corner to open the scoring after 37 minutes and Jerome Federico set up two goals in seven second-half minutes.

First he provided the pass for Greg Ngoyi to score and then he had a cross turned into his own net by Terry Lee Fennessy.

Cray moved up to sixth with a 2-0 home win over Bury. The visitors had early chances but it was Cray who took the lead on 34 minutes through Leigh Bremner.

Further Bury pressure followed, only for Cray to double their lead on 58 minutes when Bremner was brought down and Tommy Whitnell scored from the spot. It was enough, although Cray had Chris Saunders sent off with 12 minutes left.

Horsham were seconds away from a draw at Canvey, which would have lifted them off the foot of the table.

But Danny Heale struck in the second minute of added time to give the islanders a 1-0 win.

Leatherhead moved up to 20th place on Sunday with a 3-0 victory at Kingstonian.

They always had the better of things against belowpar hosts.

Vernon Francis gave them the lead after 16 minutes and Tommy Hutchings added another on the stroke of half-time. Francis wrapped it up with 13 minutes left.



RYMAN North leaders Needham Market had a Saturday to forget. They slumped to a 1-0 home defeat at the hands of mid-table Chatham and lost 29-goal striker Sam Newson with a serious knee injury.

It was also a severe personal blow for Newson, who was due to spend this week on trial with League Two Gillingham but is now almost certain to miss out.

The Marketmen failed to score for the fierst time in a league match when they were held to a goalless draw at Harlow in midweek and they found themselves firing blanks again thanks to an outstanding display by Chatham keeper Tim Roberts.

He was rewarded when Lee Hales hit the only goal of the game with ten minutes left and Needham's only consolation was that they remained at the top of the table on goal difference.

That was because Enfield Town were beaten 2-1 at third-placed Leiston, who moved to within two points of the leading pair with a game in hand.

It looked as if it might be Enfield's day when Liam Hope gave them a deserved lead eight minutes after half-time.

The home side raised their game and levelled five minutes later through Rhys Henry. Then Nathan Stone grabbed a 73^{rd} -minute winner.

There were early shocks for fifth-placed Sudbury, who have been in such good form of late.

New signing Ellis Skidmore gave visiting Romford a third-minute lead with a 25-yard shot and scored again, this time from close range, in the eighth minute.

Richard Howell pulled one back nine minutes before half-time, headed another 11 minutes after the break, and it finished 2-2.

Tilbury failed to make the most of Sudbury's slip, staying in sixth place after a 0-0 draw at Maldon, who had lost six of their seven previous home games in the league. They should have won this one, however: Dave Collins and Ollie Berquez both hit the woodwork, and Tilbury keeper James Marrable shone.

Brentwood, in seventh place, also had to settle for a draw and,like Sudbury, they had to come from 2-0 down to claim their point.

FA Cup heroes Redbridge looked on course for their first home win in the league when Lewis Dark gave them a 20th-minute lead and Joe Gardner doubled it shortly before the interval.

Ryan Edgar pulled one back five minutes into the second half and Ted Llewellyn made it 2-2 with ten minutes left.

Harlow are right in the hunt after their 3-1 victory at Thamesmead. Piers Wixon gave them the lead after 25 minutes and scored again at the same stage of the second half.

Chuck Duru reduced the arrears, but a late strike by James Peagram made sure for the Hawks.

They are just ahead of Potters Bar, who won by the same margin at Ware.

Joe O'Brien opened the scoring with a free-kick after 15 minutes and Bradley Harrison made it 2-0 nine minutes after the interval, just when Ware were threatening to get back into the game.

Elvis Balic clinched the points in the closing stages, leaving Ware the slim consolation of a Dan Johnson goal three minutes into added time.

Ware remain 21st but are now only one point ahead of bottom club llford, who drew 2-2 at home to Soham.

It looked if it might be llford's lucky day when Martin Bromwich's own goal gave them an early lead but it all went wrong for them just after the hour when they conceded two penalties in as many minutes.

Dan Cotton converted both to give Soham the lead but they were denied victory when Stephen Opoka scored with ten minutes left.

It could have been a memorable return to Great Wakering for their new player-manager Dan Trenkel but he missed a late chance and they had to settle for a 2-2 home draw with Waltham Forest.

Forest went ahead after three minutes through Courtney White.

Lively winger Julian Okai equalised midway through the half and Michael Pindy put Wakering ahead shortly after the interval. Manu Dagher squared it again in the 72nd minute.

Another new manager, Dave Bricknell, learned the size of his task at Cheshunt as they went down 4-1 at home to Heybridge.

It was 3-0 after only 20 minutes, and it could have been more. Tom Broadhurst, Luke Callander and Solomon Ofori were the marksmen.

Broadhurst scored again in the 63rd minute, with Cheshunt's late reply coming from Jamie Smith.

Grays reclaimed third place from Leiston, whom they visit on Saturday, with a 2-0 home win over Waltham Abbey on Sunday. The top four are covered by two points.

Chances galore came and went at Grays, where the scoreline could easily have been 11-5.

Anthony Ryan eventually opened the scoring in the 53rd minute, converting the rebound from a save by Abbey keeper Richard Hayward, and Danny Bunce headed the second with 15 minutes left.

Rocks had not won at Stompond Lane for 30 years and a determined home side ensured that the run continued into a fourth decade while themselves being unable to break down a Bognor defence that has not conceded a goal for nine hours and 12 minutes.

Dulwich matched Bognor's points total, with a game in hand, by strolling to a 3-0 win at Faversham. Dean Carpenter gave them the lead with an intended cross after ten minutes and they remained in command.

Kevin James set up the second goal for Ishmael Kamara soon after the interval and scored the third himself with ten minutes left.

Dulwich too, have a formidable defence, having conceded only 12 goals in 19 games, the league's best record.

Whitehawk strengthened their grip on third place, five points behind the leading pair, with a 3-0 home win over Corinthian-Casuals.

James Fraser headed them in front after three minutes and they never looked back, although Casuals held them at bay until half-time.

Paul Armstrong scored equally quickly after the break and Fraser struck again in the 62nd minute.

Hawks are now four points clear of Maidstone, who suffered their third successive defeat.

A goalless draw looked certain until Walton Casuals won a penalty in the second minute of added time and Glenn Stanley made the most of it, earning his side their first away victory of the season.

Worthing recaptured their early-season home goalscoring form, trouncing Hythe 5-0 to move to within a point of Maidstone.

Tom Manton gave them an early lead and Tom Lawley struck twice in seven minutes to make it 3-0 by the half-hour.

Ronnie Dolan hit a post for Hythe before Rebels wrapped it up as Mike Huckett and Ryan McBride netted within the space of a minute midway through the second half. Folkestone remained one point behind Worthing thanks to a pair of James Everitt headers in the 43^{rd} and 64^{th} minutes as they beat Chipstead 2-0 in Kent.

At the other end of the table, Burgess Hill moved off the bottom with a last-gasp 3-2 home win over Whitstable.

The sides exchanged goals in each half, with Lloyd Cotton and Tom Bold, from 25 yards, twice giving Hillians the lead only for Stuart Vahid and Damian Abel to reply.

Abel's goal came with five minutes left and looked to have earned the Oystermen a point, but Lekan Bankole headed a late winner.

So Croydon Athletic, whose game at Ramsgate was postponed, finished an unhappy week at the foot of the table.

Crawley Down continued their improvement with a lone-goal victory at Whyteleafe, lifting themselves above their hosts into 19th place.

Tom Burton headed the only goal five minutes after the interval and a post denied Dan August an equaliser.

Sam Tucknott scored twice as Merstham beat Eastbourne Town 3-0 in their mid-table clash.

He fired home from 20 yards after 28 minutes to provide a lead which Roscoe Dsane doubled moments before the half-time whistle.

Two more Dsane efforts were cleared off the line before Tucknott netted his second as time ran out.

Hicham Akhazzan twice hit the bar for Sittingbourne as they drew 0-0 at Godalming, for whom Jamie McClurg also struck the woodwork.



FOUR of the five Ryman League sides involved in the first round of the FA Trophy on Saturday will be in the draw, and three of them are definitely through.

The result of the day came from Premier strugglers East Thurrock, whose form in knockout competition has been so different from their league displays.

Rocks, who reached the first round of the FA Cup, made it to the last 32 of the Trophy with a 2-1 home win over Welling, who are second in Conference South.

Matt Hall put them ahead after four minutes but the Wings hit back strongly and levelled through Andy Pugh on the half-hour.

Sam Higgins restored the home side's lead with a free-kick three minutes later and they managed to hang on for the rest of the game despite heavy pressure.

Carshalton enjoyed themselves at the expense of lowly Conference North side Bishop's Stortford, hitting five unanswered goals at Colston Avenue.

Paul Vines put the Robins ahead after 14 minutes and they took complete command with two goals in the last six minutes of the first half from Luke Nolan and Luke Pigden.

Tom Davis made it four direct from a corner midway through the second half and Billy Crook finished off a fine move to complete the nap hand.

The scoreline was the same at Wealdstone, where Richard Jolly claimed a perfect hat-trick – a header and one with each foot – as local rivals Uxbridge, from the Southern League Central, were put to the sword.

It took 38 minutes for Stones to break through, Jolly heading home Alan Massey's cross, and he struck again three minutes later.

Watford loanee Brett Assombalonga, already a huge crowd favourite, added a 20-yard shot and a header in the space of five minutes just after the hour, leaving Jolly to wrap it up eight minutes from time and complete his second successive Trophy hat-trick.

He has already scored eight goals in the competition and has 22 in all this season.

Hornchurch were once again unable to reproduce their superb away form on their own ground.

They managed only one goal attempt, a header by Martin Tuohy which was well off target, as they were held to a 0-0 draw by Conference South side Farnborough.

The replay will be at Cherrywood Road on Wednesday.

Urchins also had striker Lewis Smith sent off and he will miss their important Ryman Premier game at Billericay on December 27.

The only Ryman side to go out were Lowestoft, and they deserved a better fate at Salisbury despite the convincing 4-1 scoreline.

Michael Frew put the Trawlerboys ahead after ten minutes but a goalkeeping error allowed Dan Fitchett to equalise nine minutes later and Chris Giles headed Salisbury in front after 32 minutes.

The visitors were on top for the rest of the game but failed to take their chances and Fitchett made it a flattering result for the hosts, completing his hattrick with two goals in added time.




