ALL THE HOLIDAY ACTION

THE highest Ryman Premier crowd of the season assembled at Lowestoft on Boxing Day, where 1,066 spectators saw their 2-1 victory over – no, not Hastings, but Suffolk rivals Bury.

The Trawlerboys had to work hard for the victory that put them level on points with leaders Billericay and still with a game in hand, going ahead only after Bury had been reduced to nine men.

Sam Reed scored for the visitors midway through the first half and they held the lead until nine minutes after the break, when Dale Cockrill equalised from the penalty spot.

It all went very wrong for Bury after that. Tom Bullard was sent off on the hour, Reed was denied his second goal by a post and Craig Nurse was shown a red card in the 77th minute.

The two-man handicap proved too great for Bury and Scott Mitchell netted the 84th-minute winner.

Lewes moved into third place though they, too, left it late. Michael Malcolm headed the only goal of their game at Hastings in the 86th minute, but they should have had the points in the bag much earlier.

Harry Harding headed against a post shortly before half-time but, for all their pressure, Rooks had to wait until they had a numerical advantage. Zac Attwood received his second yellow card shortly before Malcolm's decider. A crowd of 689 watched this one.

There were more at Canvey, where 763 turned up for the island derby against Concord and saw the visitors win 2-0. Both goals came in the first half from the Elmes cousins. James scored from long range after 25 minutes and Harry headed home after 40. New signing Bradley Woods-Garress came closest for Canvey.

Wealdstone's game against Harrow attracted their highest crowd for more than 20 years, with 876 seeing Stones romp to a 4-0 win.

An own goal by Dan Leech set the hosts on their way after 20 minutes and Richard Jolly added another just after the half-hour.

Britt Asombalunga made it 3-0 on 78 minutes, the sixth goal for the Watford man during his loan spell at Grosvenor Vale, and Jolly wrapped it up in added time, volleying his 25th goal of the season and his 14th in the league, making him the joint-top scorer in the division.

Tooting made it a good start for new manager Kenny Brown, moving out of the relegation zone

after beating visitors Carshalton 4-3 in a thrilling match of fluctuating fortunes.

The hosts were first to show, taking the lead through Henry Marcel after 18 minutes and doubling it after 33, when the much-travelled Bertie Brayley opened his account for, on a quick count, his 19th club.

Paul Vines pulled one back for the Robins before half-time, Sonny Ayres equalised six minutes after the break and another Ayres strike put Carshalton ahead midway through the half.

Another recent signing, former Croydon Athletic man Jamie England, made it 3-3 with a free-kick in the 73rd minute and another of his free-kicks was turned in by Charlie Stimson to win it for the Terrors with ten minutes left. Robins suffered one further blow when Tom Davis was sent off.

Leatherhead improved their survival hopes, nailing Horsham even more firmly to the foot of the table with a 4-1 victory at Gorings Mead.

Kev Terry put Tanners ahead on 20 minutes and Horsham replied four minutes later through George Landais, another ex-Croydon man, only to find themselves behind again within a minute when Vernon Francis netted.

Billy Manners gave Leatherhead some breathing space in the 35th minute and Tommy Hutchings completed the scoring with 11 minutes left. Tanners moved up to 19th while Horsham, for whom this was the tenth home defeat in 11 outings, are now ten points adrift of safety and without a win since August.

Recent Wingate signing Matt Mitchell headed home a corner to open his account for them at Hendon, eight minutes into his second game since his move from Harlow. Greg Ngoyi made it 1-1 in the 68th minute and that was the final score. Wingate forward Murat Karagul was sent off with 12 minutes left.

The Premier attendance record for the season was broken for the second day in succession when 1,106 turned up at Billericay today (Tuesday) to see the leaders take on neighbours and title rivals Hornchurch.

It was a hard-fought game, as expected, and it was Urchins who extended their amazing away record with a 1-0 victory. Tommy Black converted a Michael Spencer cross on the hour to give Hornchurch their tenth win in 11 league games on the road.

Few teams at any level, surely, have reached double figures before the turn of the year and they have a chance to make it 11 when they visit Canvey on Saturday.

The result lifted Urchins back into third place, one point behind Billericay and Lowestoft and a single point ahead of Lewes.

There were two other Premier games on Tuesday and they, too, resulted in away victories. No fewer than 15 of the division's 22 clubs have more wins on the road than on their own turf.

Sam Higgins fired a quickfire hat-trick as East Thurrock won 3-0 at Aveley and climbed to 19th place, one point adrift of safety with games in hand on everyone else in the division.

Higgins opened the scoring in the fifth minute, struck again two minutes later and completed his treble as early as the 16th minute. Aveley drop to 21st.

Margate moved up four places to 10th with a 4-2 victory in an exciting game at Cray. It got off to a hectic start; Jack Clark gave Cray a third-minute lead but Curtis Robinson replied in the 11th minute and Kwesi Appiah put Margate ahead a minute later. It was his 15th league goal, taking him clear of Richard Jolly at the top of the division's scoring list.

Lewis Perkins made it 2-2 on the stroke of half-time but Appiah struck again in the 51st minute, his 28th goal in all competitions, and Dan Stubbs added the fourth with 15 minutes left.

IT WAS Leiston's Boxing Day in Ryman North. They produced a sizzling second-half display at leaders Needham Market, powering to a 5-0 victory after a goalless first half.

The other sides in the top five managed one point between them and although Enfield Town's 2-2 draw at Waltham Abbey was enough to take them back to the top, Leiston moved up to third and are two points behind the new leaders with a game in hand.

Gareth Heath started the rout at Needham in the 49th minute and Leiston took a firmer grip when Danny Smy made it 2-0 three minutes later.

Luke Hammond's strike on 63 minutes effectively clinched the points but there was more to come, with Smy nabbing his second in the 78th minute and Rhys Henry completing the nap hand with a deflected shot two minutes after that.

Enfield were twice behind in their match. Daran Bern's 35th-minute opener for the Abbots was answered by Liam Hope a minute before the break.

The hosts regained the lead through Luke Webster in the 64th minute but Adam Wallace struck with 15 minutes left to put Town on top. Michael Ewang almost won it for them with a shot that hit the bar.

A second-half double by Abs Seymour gave Romford a 2-1 victory at Grays, who slipped back to fourth place. With Romford goalie Lamar Johnson in outstanding form, it was scoreless until Bradley

Thomas put Grays ahead with a free-kick in the 62nd minute.

Their delight at breaking through was soon over as Seymour replied three minutes later and he then scored the winner in the 77th minute. Romford's Jahmel Heywood was shown a second yellow card but Grays could not hit back.

Sudbury, in fifth place, went down 3-1 at Soham for whom Danny Cotton converted a seventh-minute penalty and scored again in the 21st minute. Scott Carter added a third early in the second half and although Ryan Henshaw pulled one back on 64 minutes Sudbury's task was too great.

The chasing pack are now hot on their heels, led by Tilbury who came from behind to chalk up a 3-1 home win over struggling Great Wakering.

Daniel Williams put Wakering ahead in the 32nd minute but the league's leakiest defence conceded an equaliser to Tom Webb almost straight from the restart. Bradley Barnes put Dockers ahead before the break and Alex Read clinched the points with 15 minutes left. Emiel Aiken set up all three home goals.

Next come Harlow, who whipped next-to-bottom Ware 4-0. All the goals came in the middle third, with Piers Wixon opening the scoring with a 30th-minute penalty and James Peagram completing it on the hour. In between came headed goals from Peagram in the 35th minute and Getro Kilapi seven minutes into the second half.

Just behind the Hawks are Brentwood, who laboured to a 1-0 win at Ilford. They dominated the first half without taking their chances, Tyler Campbell coming closest with a shot that hit a post.

The breakthrough eventually came in the 64th minute, when Dean Green's cross left Emmanuel Osei with a simple task, but Ilford raised their game and they were a little unlucky not to have gained the point which would have lifted them off the foot of the table.

FA Cup heroes Redbridge at last won a home league game, their first since March 22 and only their second since December 11 last year. They did it convincingly, too, beating Waltham Forest 4-1.

Ryan Murray punished a defensive error to put them ahead after only five minutes and a deflected shot by Daniel Hopkins doubled the lead three minutes before half-time.

There was time for Courtney White to reduce the arrears before the interval with a neat back-heel and he scored again with a fierce volley in the 73rd minute. Alas for him, it was at the wrong end. Ryan Wade added a late fourth after a fine run by Shane Wyllie.

The Maldon derby ended all square, with visiting Heybridge twice taking the lead before settling for a 2-2 draw. Tom Broadhurst opened the scoring for Swifts on 18 minutes, Ross Wall equalised seven minutes later and an Ian Cousins own goal restored

Heybridge's lead on the half-hour. That was that until the 85th minute, when Billy Coyne's goal earned Maldon a point.

The outcome was settled even later at Cheshunt, where Kevin Ashwood's 89th-minute goal gave them a 2-1 victory over Potters Bar. Sam Ruff put Cheshunt ahead late in the first half and James Gershfield levelled matters midway through the second period.

Thamesmead chalked up a 2-0 home win over Chatham in the only Tuesday game. David Noel put them ahead a minute before the interval and Theo Fairweather-Johnson scored the second after 70 minutes.



FOLKESTONE met Hythe in Ryman League football for the first time on Boxing Day and a crowd of 1,018 assembled to see what was expected to be a tight game between sides lying fourth and eighth in the Ryman South table.

It proved to be nothing of the sort: not that the majority of the fans were complaining as the hosts rammed in eight unanswered goals.

Even so, Hythe may feel they got off lightly: it was 5-0 at half-time, 7-0 after 52 minutes and the eighth goal arrived with 20 minutes left.

Stuart King put Folkestone ahead after ten minutes but there was no hint of what was to come. The floodgates opened, however, when James Everitt headed the second in the 32nd minute. King struck twice more to complete a first-half hat-trick and Josh Vincent claimed the fifth just before the break.

King took his personal tally to four with a lob in the 50th minute and Everitt struck again two minutes later. As it happened, the worst was over for Hythe, though Micheal Everitt was to add his name to the scoresheet.

There was an even bigger crowd at Bognor, where the attendance of 1,279 for the Sussex derby was the league's highest of the season.

They saw only one goal, scored by Steve Harper in the 62nd minute after a Jason Prior effort had been blocked. Mike Hockett missed the chance to equalise from the penalty spot, lifting the ball over the bar, and Bognor held out to open up a six-point lead in the table despite having Jon Marzetti dismissed in the closing stages.

Second-placed Dulwich did not play and, despite Folkestone's spree, Whitehawk remain ahead of them on goal difference, holding on to third spot with a late rally to win 3-2 at Eastbourne.

Hawks took a first-minute lead through Josh Jones but Steve May levelled the scores on 20 minutes and Nathan Crabb put Eastbourne in front just before the interval. It was the 83rd minute before Jamahl Hughes made it 2-2 and Ben Godfrey headed the winner three minutes later.

Maidstone ended their five-match losing streak, though visiting Corinthian-Casuals threatened to extend it after Saheed Sankoh put them ahead on the half-hour.

Graeme Andrews eventually replied in the 70th minute and Alex Waugh punished a poor clearance by Casuals keeper Adam Peck with six minutes left to give Stones a very welcome 2-1 victory which put them level on points with fifth-placed Worthing.

There is then a six-point gap to Chipstead, in seventh place. They were also victims of a late winner, at Godalming where an 87th-minute strike by Scott Harris was the only goal of the game.

Crawley Down continued their revival in style, hitting five unanswered goals at Burgess Hill. The Anvils are now on 22 points, which is 22 more than they had at the start of October.

Luke Blewden opened their account on 27 minutes, the only goal of the first half. Tom Burton doubled the lead on the hour and Jamie Cade doubled it again with goals in the 68th and 85th minute. Fraser Logan finished the job in added time.

Hillians slipped back into the bottom two, below Whyteleafe who drew 1-1 at Merstham despite the 15th-minute dismissal of Fabian Batchelor. Kwabena Agyei put the ten men ahead eight minutes before the interval and Louis Hollingsworth, signed from Horsham just before Christmas, headed the equaliser soon after the break. Fred Fleming almost won it for Whyteleafe, heading against the bar.

The battle of Walton went the way of Walton Casuals, who had home advantage against Walton & Hersham and won 2-0. Alfie Arthur put them ahead after ten minutes and Glenn Stanley, who was transferred across town earlier in the season, hit the second just after the hour mark.

Both sides finished with ten men. Swans had Stuart Derry dismissed and that was followed by a second yellow for Casuals' Richard Taylor.

There was one afternoon game on Tuesday and it produced three important points for Whitstable, who moved five points clear of the relegation zone with their 2-1 success at Ramsgate.

Lewis Heard put the Oystermen ahead after seven minutes and Damien Abel nabbed the second with 20 minutes left. Ian Pulman scored a predictable goal for Rams against his old club but by then it was the 87th minute.

Sittingbourne's run of three successive goalless draws ended on Tuesday night, but not in the way they would have wanted as Two goals apiece from Aaron Quain and Adrian Stone sent them crashing to a 4-0 defeat at Faversham, who moved into the top half of the table.

Quain made the breakthrough ten minutes before half-time, Stone made it 2-0 soon after the interval and the same pair struck again in the last eight minutes.

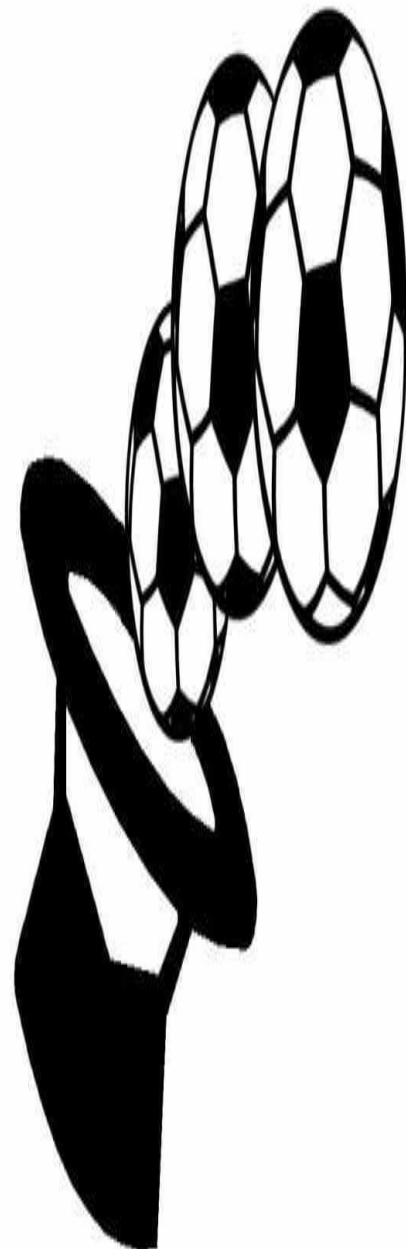
