#### ALL THE HOLIDAY ACTION

#### MONDAY

THERE was another twist at the top of the table when Hornchurch were the only side in the top five to win. They bounced back impressively from Saturday's 4-1 defeat at Canvey to beat secondplaced Lowestoft 3-0 at Bridge Avenue.

Urchins gained the upper hand after a shaky start and went ahead when Martin Tuohy converted a 25<sup>th</sup>-minute penalty.

Lewis Smith added the second on 63 minutes with the help of a deflection and left-back Joe Anderson found the net from 25 yards with 14 minutes left to complete an impressive display.

Leaders Billericay came from behind to draw 1-1 at Bury. Sam Reed put Bury ahead on 19 minutes and Joey May levelled it nine minutes before the break, making the Essex club the first in the division to reach the 50-goal mark.

Billericay edged a point clear of Lowestoft, who have two games in hand. Hornchurch have played one fewer than the leaders and are a further point back.

Lewes, in fourth place, have found goals more elusive than any of the other top sides and they paid the price for that as they were held to a 1-1 home draw by bottom club Horsham in front of a four-figure crowd at the Dripping Pan.

Harry Harding put Rooks ahead nine minutes before the break but they were unable to score again and Kery Kedze equalised in the fourth minute of added time, at last taking Horsham's points total into double figures.

Met Police drew 1-1 at Leatherhead to hang on to fifth place. Both goals came in the last ten minutes of the first half, with Craig Brown replying to Tommy Hutchings' opener for the Tanners, who remain in the bottom four.

Cray now trail the Met only on goal difference thanks to an 89<sup>th</sup>-minute goal by Leigh Bremner which earned them a 3-2 win at Carshalton.

The Wands needed a lift after two 4-2 home defeats in the past week and it came when Tommy Whitnell put them ahead in the seventh minute.

They were unable to build on that, however, and goals either side of the interval by Billy Crook and Cray old boy Laurent Hamici gave the hosts a 2-1 lead. Whitnell made it 2-2 after 71 minutes and Bremner's late goal inflicted Carshalton's seventh home defeat.

For once, though, home teams fared considerably better than away sides in a division where that has rarely been the case this season.

The only other away success went to Wealdstone, who hit five unanswered goals at Wingate. Scott Fitzgerald opened the scoring midway through the first half and then missed a penalty.

The exciting Britt Assombalonga netted twice in five minutes either side of the interval, a marvellous solo effort followed by a simple tap-in, and Richard Jolly headed two more in the 75<sup>th</sup> and 78<sup>th</sup> minutes, taking his season's haul to 27, 16 of them in the league.

Stones could well make a run at a play-off place in the second half of the season, as could Margate who saw off struggling Hastings 4-1. The prolific Kwesi Appiah became the first Ryman League player to reach 30 goals in all competitions when he opened the scoring in the second minute and he was on target again in the eighth minute.

Zac Attwood reduced the arrears on the hour but Appiah responded three minutes later, completing a hat-trick and becoming the first player to reach 20 Premier goals. Tom Bradbrook added the fourth in the 73<sup>rd</sup> minute.

Another hat-trick man was Concord's Harry Elmes, all his goals coming between the 20<sup>th</sup> and 44<sup>th</sup> minutes in a 3-0 home win over Aveley. It was the second hat-trick of the weekend for the Beachboys, following Tony Stokes' treble at Cray on Saturday.

Concord are one of several clubs at the wrong end of the table who have run into a rich vein of form, and their improvement had left Harrow on the brink of the relegation zone.

Harrow responded with a remarkable 4-2 home win over Hendon – remarkable because Hendon had previously conceded only three goals in 11 away games. So Danny Buckle's fourth-minute strike for the home side was something of a surprise in itself. Greg Nyogi equalised after 20 minutes and Elliott Charles put Hendon ahead moments before half-time.

On the season's form so far that should have been enough to clinch three points, but Harrow fought back in spirited fashion. Buckle made it 2-2 midway through the half and the comeback was completed by goals in the last five minutes from Wayne Walters and Michael Barima.

East Thurrock, another of the sides rapidly climbing out of danger, beat Canvey 2-1 thanks to a pair of goals right at the end of the first half, from Kris Newby, a penalty, and Sam Higgins. Alex Rhodes replied on the hour.

Tooting's problems mounted with a 2-1 defeat at Kingstonian. Ronnie Fletcher's 15<sup>th</sup>-minute own goal put K's ahead but Charlie Stimson levelled matters in the 27<sup>th</sup> minute and the game was heading for a draw until Stuart Duff struck with eight minutes left.

#### NEW YEAR'S EVE

THE year ended on a high note for joint leaders Billericay and Lowestoft. Both won while their five closest pursuers all dropped points.

A second-minute header by Richard Halle set Billericay on their way to a 3-0 home win over a Harrow side suddenly looking nervously over their shoulders at the relegation zone.

Halle struck again in the 55<sup>th</sup> minute and central defender Rob Swaine made sure with 12 minutes left, cementing his position as the club's top scorer with 11 league and cup goals.

Lowestoft trailed their Essex rivals by four goals after settling for a 2-0 win at home to Wingate. Scott Mitchell opened the scoring with a longrange drive in the eighth minute and Lubo Guentchev netted the second 11 minutes after the break.

Third-placed Hornchurch were left four points adrift after their run of nine successive away league wins came to a crashing halt with a 4-1 defeat at Canvey.

All seemed well for the Urchins when Martin Tuohy gave them a 25th-minute lead with his 14<sup>th</sup> league goal and they continued to have the upper hand until Tuohy was sent off in the 63<sup>rd</sup> minute, which means that he will miss their FA Trophy tie at Grimsby on January 14.

Canvey were level within two minutes through Kevin Dobinson, Jason Hallett put them ahead in the 75<sup>th</sup> minute and late goals by Jay Curran and Bradley Woods-Garness made it something of a rout.

Hornchurch stayed third while the two teams behind them, Metropolitan Police and Lewes, battled out a goalless draw at Imber Court. Eddie Smith hit the Lewes bar from 25 yards as the Met started strongly without being able to break through.

It was not a good week for Cray, though they remained sixth. Beaten 4-2 at home by Margate on Tuesday, they suffered an identical fate at the hands of improving Concord yesterday as Tony Stokes fired a hat-trick.

A superb solo goal by Harry Elmes gave the Beachboys the lead after 15 minutes. Tommy Whitnell levelled it with a penalty five minutes later but Concord regained the lead with a Stokes penalty six minutes after that.

Stokes completed his treble with goals in the 51<sup>st</sup> and 75<sup>th</sup> minutes, both set up by Elmes, before Leigh Bremner gave Cray some consolation five minutes from time.

Completing the tale of woe for the chasing group, Hendon went down 4-3 at home to Bury, who are now just one point behind them. Much of the excitement came at the end of each half.

Danny Cunningham put the visitors ahead from the spot on the half-hour and Roscoe Hipperson made it 2-0 eight minutes later. Both goalscorers departed with injuries before Greg Ngoyi pulled one back in the 45<sup>th</sup> minute and still had time to equalise before the break.

Bury regained the lead when Kieran Leabon netted early in the second half and they stayed in front until the second minute of added time. A header by Elliott Charles appeared to have saved a point for the hosts, but Bury had other ideas and Billy Clark grabbed a 94<sup>th</sup>-minute winner.

There was plenty of excitement at the other end of the table as well. East Thurrock escaped from the relegation zone by coming from behind to win 2-1 at Hastings. Zac Attwood scored for the home side after nine minutes, Kris Newby headed the equaliser on the hour and a Matt Whitehead own goal completed the turnaround six minutes later.

Rocks were replaced in the bottom four by Tooting, who dropped to 20<sup>th</sup> after a thumping 4-1 home defeat by Leatherhead, who climbed above them on goal difference. It was a good week for Tanners, who won by the same margin at Horsham on Boxing Day.

Charlie Stimson gave Tooting the lead after 15 minutes but Colin Richmond equalised three minutes later and Tommy Hutchings fired home from outside the box to put the Tanners in front nine minutes before the interval.

Billy Manners added the third after 56 minutes and Hutchings got his second midway through the half. Tooting scorer Stimson finished the afternoon between the posts after Darren Behcet suffered a head injury.

There was one piece of good news for Tooting: Lyn Catchpole, their head of safety and stewarding, was awarded the MBE in the New Year Honours list for her work with the UK Border Agency. Aveley, in 21<sup>st</sup> place, went down 3-1 at home to Margate. Tom Bradbrook headed the Kent side into an early lead but Millers equalised with a long-range strike by Jake Cass in the 20<sup>th</sup> minute.

The home side had the upper hand after that and had a goal disallowed for a tight offside decision, but fell behind again in the 57<sup>th</sup> minute when the division's top scorer Kwesi Appiah, subdued until then, burst through the defence and rounded keeper Dave McCartney to score his 17th league goal and 29<sup>th</sup> in all.

Millers had chances to draw level again before Margate clinched it in the fourth minute of added time.

It may well have been the last Ryman League goal of 2011 and, if so, it was one to savour.

Craig Cloke took a free-kick on the touchline, right on halfway, spotted McCartney off his line and lofted the ball over him.

The midtable clash between Wealdstone and Carshalton ended in a 1-1 draw.

Scott Fitzgerald converted a penalty for Stones on 34 minutes and Paul Vines replied just after the hour.



#### MONDAY

LEISTON remained a point clear at the top of the table. Visiting Soham held them at bay until Danny Smy struck midway through the second half. Gareth Heath added the second in a 2-0 win.

Second-placed Enfield Town went one better, beating Redbridge 3-0 in front of another impressive crowd at the Queen Elizabeth II Stadium.

Jon Moore opened the scoring after four minutes, Neil Johnston got the seond soon after the interval and a Leon Osei free-kick wrapped it up.

The attendance of 498 would have been the division's best of the season had it not been topped by the 517 who turned up at Sudbury to watch their important game against Needham Market.

A single goal by Danny Emmanuel in the 31st minute was enough to inflict Needham's third defeat of the holiday week, though they remain third in the table.

Grays moved closer to them with their 1-0 success at Great Wakering, Kenny Beaney providing the all-important goal after 50 minutes.

Sudbury are back in fifth spot, having dropped two places to seventh on Saturday. Tilbury slipped back out of the play-off places with a 3-0 defeat at Chatham. Lloyd Blackman was the first to strike after 13 minutes and Garry Tilley netted in the last minute of each half.

Brentwood moved up to seventh despite being held to a 1-1 home draw by lowly Maldon. Dean Green converted a penalty for Blues in the 28<sup>th</sup> minute but Joe Pearman saved Maldon with 15 minutes to go.

Harlow dropped two places to eighth after a 2-0 defeat at Potters Bar. The goals came in a threeminute spell either side of the interval from James Gershfield and Tom Pett.

Chris Bryan, who scored four times for Heybridge at Needham on Saturday, put them ahead after 17 minutes at home to Waltham Abbey.

Adam Bolle turned it round with two goals in 15 second-half minutes and Bryan then missed a penalty.

Swifts still squared it with a Ryan Malins strike – the 100<sup>th</sup> goal of the season in Abbotts games - only for Dan Harvey to give the visitors a 3-2 win with nine minutes left.

Lea Dawson's 72<sup>nd</sup>-minute goal gave Thamesmead a 1-0 win at Romford and Ware moved off the foot of the table with their second win of the season, thanks to a lone Ryan Mattos effort in added time which saw off Cheshunt.

#### **NEW YEAR'S EVE**

HEYBRIDGE striker Chris Bryan made it a week to forget for Needham Market as he fired four first-half goals to lead his side to a 4-3 victory at Bloomfields.

Needham had conceded just seven goals in their ten home games before meeting Leiston on Boxing Day, and after a scoreless first half in that game no-one could have imagined that the Marketmen would let in nine more in their next 90 minutes of football.

But Leiston finished the game 5-0 winners and Bryan took over where they left off.

He opened his account on 22 minutes, converted a penalty shortly afterwards and completed his hat-trick eight minutes before the break. Bradley Barber pulled one back for Needham before Bryan got his fourth in added time.

The hosts dominated the second half but it was the 82<sup>nd</sup> minute before Deakan Napier reduced the arrears with a 25-yarder.

Danny Bloomfield grabbed a third, but by then the game was into added time and Heybridge had banked three points to keep their play-off hopes alive.

It was very much Leiston's week, and they ended it on top of the table after collecting six points while all their rivals faltered.

On Saturday they were 2-0 winners at Cheshunt. Gareth Heath fired in off the bar to give them a 32<sup>nd</sup>-minute lead and Rhys Henry added the second soon after the break.

Overnight leaders Enfield Town were beaten 2-1 at Tilbury, who themselves moved back into a play-off place.

There was a quick exchange of goals just before the half-hour, with Alex Read's opener for the Dockers being answered by Walid Matata. A couple of Enfield efforts were scrambled off the line before Joe Nightingill got the winner with 12 minutes left.

It was a six-point week for Tilbury, as it was for Harlow who moved into sixth place with a 3-0 home victory over Chatham.

Piers Wixon missed a penalty for the Hawks in a goalless first half but Jeff Hammond, recently signed from Waltham Forest, broke the deadlock with two goals before the hour mark and Michael Deane wrapped it up in the 69<sup>th</sup> minute.

Sudbury dropped from fifth to seventh after a goalless draw at Ilford, who lifted themselves off the foot of the table.

The dismissal of Sudbury skipper Sam Clarke in the 52<sup>nd</sup> minute dented their hopes of victory and only fine goalkeeping by Danny Gay denied Ilford their second win of the season.

Ilford edged above Ware, who went down 3-2 at Waltham Abbey on Friday. Tim Shaw gave the Abbotts a half-time lead which was extended by substitutes Daran Bern and Loren Maxwell, who both scored soon after entering the action.

Two goals in as many minutes by Kieran Weekes and Ryan Mattos left Ware with 18 minutes to save the game, but the task was beyond them.

The bottom two had eight points, six points behind Great Wakering who in turn found themselves eight points adrift of Maldon after their 3-2 defeat there on Saturday.

Wakering had Nick Skelton sent off on the halfhour and were hit by two Freddie Ladapo strikes either side of half-time.

The ten men fought back and quickfire goals by Julian Okai and Ashley Hawkins made it 2-2 by the hour mark, but Maldon had the last word when Ross Wall fired home in the 88<sup>th</sup> minute.

Brentwood maintained their promotion bid with a 1-0 win at Thamesmead that could have been

more convincing. Well on top for most of the game, Blues had to settle for a 25<sup>th</sup>-minute goal by Danny Dafter.

Redbridge, having waited until Boxing Day for a home league win, added another by thumping Romford 3-0.

Ryan Wade's free-kick provided a seventhminute opener and Joe Gardner struck twice in six minutes at the start of the game's final quarter.



#### MONDAY

THE big all-Sussex clash in Ryman South proved to be a convincing victory for Whitehawk, who beat leaders Bognor 3-0 at East Brighton Park to move into second place, two points behind their victims.

Craig Richards and James Fraser, both former Bognor players, scored in the last ten minutes of the first half and Kyle Vassell added the third in the 55<sup>th</sup> minute.

Jason Prior, whose move to Eastleigh is now definitely off as he awaits his trial at Newcastle United, hit a post with his best effort. Rocks had James Crane sent off with 15 minutes left.

Folkestone are up to third thanks to an 87<sup>th</sup>minute goal by Josh Burchell which gave them a 1-0 victory at Whitstable, while Dulwich slipped from second to fourth after a 1-1 draw at Corinthian-Casuals.

Kevin James put Dulwich ahead five minutes before the interval but Dave Hodges saved Casuals with eight minutes left.

Maidstone maintained their return to form by winning 3-0 at landlords Sittingbourne.

Alex Waugh gave them the lead in the 32<sup>nd</sup> minute and Brickies suffered a further blow when Bryan Glover was sent off in the 62<sup>nd</sup> minute.

Sam Groombridge, who switched Bourne Park clubs last month, put his new side 2-0 up in the 71<sup>st</sup> minute and Shaun Welford quickly made it three.

Worthing stayed in the hunt with a 2-1 home win over Burgess Hill. Mike Huckett, in the 31st minute, and Jamie Brotherton, in the 54<sup>th</sup>, put them 2-0 up.

Pat Harding pulled one back on the hour but Hillians could not find an equaliser.

Only one club in the bottom nine managed even a point. That was Walton & Hersham, who fought out a 1-1 home draw with Merstham. The visitors were given a 13<sup>th</sup>-minute lead by Liam Wright and Jerome Maledon replied at the end of the first half.

All five goals came in a 25-minute spell in the second half as Hythe beat Ramsgate 3-2. Kane Rice started the rush when he put the home side ahead in the 50<sup>th</sup> minute.

Rams levelled through Ian Pulman in the 61<sup>st</sup> minute and took the lead through Gareth Cornhill three minutes later.

Dave Cook made it 2-2 with a penalty in the 69<sup>th</sup> minute and Brendon Cass netted the decider.

Marcus Cassius, recently signed on a threemonth loan from Erith & Belvedere, opened his account for Chipstead eight minutes into their home game against Walton Casuals and it proved to be the afternoon's only goal.

Godalming took the points at Whyteleafe by the odd goal in three.

Adam Foulser gave G's the lead after 24 minutes and Dan Read doubled it ten minutes into the second half. Leafe's reply came from Danny Dudley with nine minutes left.

#### NEW YEAR'S EVE

THE last 100 per cent home record in the league vanished when upwardly-mobile Crawley Down held Dulwich to a 1-1 draw at Champion Hill.

With Bognor sidelined for the day, Dulwich had the chance to halve the six-point gap at the top but fell behind after 27 minutes when Luke Blewden pounced on a defensive error.

Ishmail Kamara levelled matters on the stroke of half-time and neither side could find a way through again, although there were chances at both ends with Dulwich looking the more likely to score.

They remained second but were joined on the 48-point mark by Whitehawk and Folkestone.

Substitute Sam Gargan earned Hawks a 2-0 victory at Walton Casuals. He came on after 51 minutes and scored twice in his first ten minutes of action.

Casuals will consider themselves unlucky: Alfie Arthur headed against a post and a quick counter-attack from the rebound led to Gargan's second.

Folkestone, who treated their fans to an 8-0 win over Hythe on Boxing Day, rammed in four more against Corinthian-Casuals, though this was not such a one-sided affair and finished 4-2.

Darren Smith gave Folkestone a 12<sup>th</sup>-minute lead which Saheed Sankoh quickly wiped out.

A Stuart King penalty put Folkestone ahead again three minutes after half-time and further goals from Josh Burchell and James Everitt wrapped up the points before Sankoh netted his second with a late penalty.

Maidstone reclaimed fifth place by cruising to a 4-0 home win over Whitstable. Sam Bewick's 27<sup>th</sup>-minute free-kick was the only goal of the first half and the Oystermen almost drew level when Stuart Vahid hit the bar.

Stones were always on top, though, and it was no great surprise when Alex Waugh made it 2-0 after 69 minutes.

Late goals by James Pinnock and Ellis Green made quite sure.

Maidstone moved above Worthing, who went down 1-0 at Godalming. A ninth-minute goal by Scott Harris was enough to decide the outcome, though Worthing missed a host of chances including a penalty which Mike Huckett fired against the bar.

Hythe bounced back strongly from their Boxing Day nightmare with a 3-1 victory at Faversham. Nick Reeves gave their confidence a lift with a fourth-minute free-kick.

Dave Cook netted twice, the first a penalty, either side of Danny Hockton's header for Faversham and the scoring was complete by the 32<sup>nd</sup> minute.

A second-half fightback by Sittingbourne came to nothing as they went down 3-2 at Ramsgate.

The Brickies went into the match on a four-game scoreless streak and their cause looked hopeless when Rams took a 3-0 half-time lead.

Ian Pulman scored after three minutes and headed another on 25 minutes, with Steve O'Brien notching the third just before the break.

Sittingbourne's goal drought was finally ended on the hour by Joe Goldsmith and Joe Nwoko pulled another one back with 14 minutes left.

The Brickies pressed for an equaliser but failed, and they had Jonathan Hogg sent off near the end.

Burgess Hill escaped from the relegation places with a 1-0 home win over Walton & Hersham. Fred Foreman's penalty three minutes before half-time earned them the precious points, although the visitors dominated throughout.

Hillians were replaced in the bottom two by Whyteleafe, who had gone down to a lone goal by Steve Elliott at Eastbourne on Friday.

The other Friday game was a 1-1 draw: it began with a first-minute goal by Alim Sesay for Merstham and ended with a last-minute leveller by Russell Bedford for visiting Chipstead.




