# ALL THE HOLIDAY ACTION

TIMES have been tough for Tooting in recent weeks as they have slid into the Ryman Premier relegation places. But they lived up to their nickname of Terrors once again on Saturday with a shock 4-2 home victory over leaders Billericay.

Reece Hall fired them ahead after 19 minutes but Billericay soon restored order. Jerrome Sobers equalised two minutes later and Neil Cousins put the table-toppers ahead on 32 minutes.

The second half, however, belonged to the Terrors. Hall squared matters again on 53 minutes and Bertie Brayley put the hosts in front nine minutes later. Jay May was unlucky not to make it 3-3 when his long-range shot hit the bar but Tooting made sure of the points through Ronnie Fletcher with eight minutes left.

It was not enough to lift Tooting out of the bottom four but it was a severe blow to Billericay, who dropped to third after their main rivals enjoyed 2-1 away wins.

Lowestoft are back on top after their success at bottom club Horsham, a much closer result than might have been expected. Hornets, who have only one point to show for 12 home games, restricted the Trawlerboys to a pair of penalties, converted by Joe Francis in the eighth and 78<sup>th</sup> minutes.

Ray Freeman's 90th-minute reply led to a hectic spell of added time but all Horsham had to show for their late effort was a pair of red cards shown to Williams Peauroux and Seny Diedhiou.

Hornchurch were also boosted by a penalty at Wingate, Martin Tuohy netting from the spot after only five minutes. Wingate, in poor form of late, hit back with a Marc Weatherstone header six minutes before half-time but Lewis Smith's goal soon after the break proved to be the winner for Hornchurch, who need only a draw at home to Harrow on Tuesday to take over at the top.

Lewes remain fourth despite going down 1-0 at Wealdstone, where Scott Fitzgerald's goal after seven minutes ended the scoring. Lewes

went close as they upped their game in the closing stages, and Richard Jolly hit a post for Stones in added time.

Met Police, who started the day in fifth spot, slipped out of the play-off places after going down 1-0 at home to Hendon. The goal came early here, too, from the experienced Darren Currie who netted his first Hendon goal in the 11th minute.

Those two results, and wins for five of the next six teams in the table, have thrown the play-off race wide open. Cray have made the most immediate progress, taking over fifth spot with a 2-1 victory at Canvey. Rob Whitnell's penalty gave Cray the lead midway through the first half, Alex Rhodes levelled with a free-kick four minutes later and Jack Clark headed the winner just before the break.

Cray are three points clear of the Met, Bury and Hendon. Bury maintained their challenge with a goal midway through each half to beat visiting Carshalton 2-0. Lee Reed and Danny Cunningham were the marksmen.

Two points behind, with games in hand on most of the sides above them, are Margate, who chalked up another of the day's four 1-0 wins. They were at home to much-improved Concord and it was no surprise that the only goal, in the 74<sup>th</sup> minute, came from Kwesi Appiah, his 33<sup>rd</sup> of the season and 21<sup>st</sup> in the league.

At the other end of the table, Aveley's troubles deepened as they were beaten 2-1 at Hastings, who started the day 18<sup>th</sup> but moved up a couple of places in their effort to stay clear of the danger zone. Lee Carey's free-kick gave Hastings the lead after 28 minutes but Aveley replied five minutes later when a goalkeeping error allowed Paul Shave's cross to find the net.

The winner came from Kenny Pogue three minutes after the interval and a fiery game ended with both sides reduced to ten men after Jordan Woodley and Aveley's Abs Thompson were dismissed in added time.

Aveley are seven points adrift of safety in 21<sup>st</sup> place and Leatherhead dropped back to 20<sup>th</sup> after their recent good run ended with a 3-0 defeat at East Thurrock, who are putting their own relegation fears well behind them.

After a scoreless first half, Sam Higgins put Rocks ahead in the 55<sup>th</sup> minute and headed his second two minutes later. Another header, from Kris Newby, completed a rush of three goals in 15 minutes.

Harrow are just one point above Tooting after an unlucky defeat at Kingstonian. The game looked certain to finish goalless, especially when a late header from Bashiru Alimi hit the Harrow bar, but Gary MacDonald volleyed the winner deep into added time.

EMIGRATING Enfield Town midfielder Jon Moore will leave for Australia with happy memories after his last game in England brought a crushing 5-0 victory at Romford on Saturday and returned Town to the top of Ryman North.

He played a major role himself, scoring the opening goal on 27 minutes. Neil Johnston added another before the interval and Dave Ottley's own goal six minutes after the break effectively settled the outcome. Rudi Hall made it four with a 79<sup>th</sup>-minute penalty and Walid Matata nabbed the fifth.

Town are back on top because previous leaders Leiston were held to a 1-1 home draw by Ware, who dropped to the foot of the table a week earlier but are now four points clear of Ilford and only two behind Great Wakering as their survival prospects rapidly improve.

They had some luck at Leiston; having put the hosts ahead on 21 minutes, Gareth Heath had a penalty saved by Rhys Madden before the interval. That gave Ware some encouragement for the second half and their spirited efforts were rewarded when Ryan Mattos equalised with two minutes left.

It was a similar story for Grays at Cheshunt, where Leon McKenzie gave them an early lead and Danny Bunce wasted a chance to make it 2-0 from the spot. Like Ware, that helped Cheshunt raise their game after the interval but, unlike Ware, they could not break through and Grays held on to their 1-0 lead.

They are up to third, ahead of Needham Market whose struggles continued as two late goals condemned them to a 3-2 defeat at Redbridge.

Joe Gardner scored for the Motormen after only two minutes but Needham rallied to take the lead with a 20-yard effort from Scott Chaplin on the stroke of half-time after Angelo

Harrop's penalty had levelled matters in the 24<sup>th</sup> minute.

Harrop was sent off soon after the interval but the Motormen could not profit from their one-man advantage before it disappeared in the 70<sup>th</sup> minute, when Matt Turpin received a straight red card.

Needham were on the verge of a welcome victory when Michael Toner made it 2-2 in the 86<sup>th</sup> minute and Gardner headed the winner two minutes later.

One piece of good news for Needham is that star striker Sam Newson has started running again after his knee injury and they hope to have him back in action by the end of the month.

It was a bad day for Sudbury, who started it in fifth place and finished it in eighth after a 5-1 thrashing at inconsistent Potters Bar. Two James Gershfield penalties in the first 25 minutes put the skids under Sudbury and Elvis Balic made it 3-0 on the half-hour.

James Baker gave the visitors a little hope with a goal midway through the second half but it was all over when Gershfield completed his hat-trick in the 83<sup>rd</sup> minute. Matt Clifford completed the rout in the sixth minute of added time.

Three Essex clubs moved above Sudbury in what has now become a desperate struggle for the important places. Tilbury reclaimed fifth spot as Harry Cook's 12-minute hat-trick sent Ilford crashing to a 4-1 defeat. Bradley Barnes put Dockers ahead after 15 minutes but Ilford were still in with a chance of their second away point of the season until Cook began his spree in the 65<sup>th</sup> minute. If it was any consolation to Ilford, Lee Hazlewood's 79<sup>th</sup>-minute goal was the best of the game.

Brentwood breezed to a 3-0 home win over Chatham and took over sixth spot. Steve Butterworth did the damage in the last six minutes of the first half, scoring one goal and making another for Dean Green. Ryan Doyle wrapped it up with a deflected goal in added time.

Right on Brentwood's heels are Harlow after their 3-1 success at Soham. Michael Deane scored after 13 and 67 minutes for Harlow, who were much the better side.

Mark Taylor's free-kick made it 3-0 before Michael Simpson managed the lone reply.

Several other clubs are still well in the picture, including Heybridge who chalked up a 2-0



victory at Waltham Forest. Ryan Malin headed the opener after 14 minutes and Luke Callander made almost sure with nine minutes to go, though it might have been a nervous finish for the visitors had Gaz Dauti not been denied a reply by a post.

Maldon maintained their steady climb out of trouble thanks to Sos Yao, whose 34<sup>th</sup>-minute goal was enough to account for visiting Thamesmead. It might have been more comfortable, but Ollie Berquez hit a post with a penalty in the 57<sup>th</sup> minute.



IT WAS a strange Saturday for the leading clubs in Ryman South. The top six have broken well away from the pack but they all had problems.

Bognor and Folkestone both had to settle for draws after leading 2-0, Maidstone needed a last-minute equaliser to get a point and Whitehawk were deservedly beaten by a Sittingbourne side who have been in miserable form. Even the two sides who won left it late.

Worthing took 74 minutes to make the breakthrough at Whyteleafe and then it was a scrambled effort by Glen Woodburn.

Darren Budd made it 2-0 as Worthing stayed sixth but extended their lead over seventh-placed Chipstead to eight points.

Dulwich are back in second spot after their 3-1 win at Eastbourne but they needed goals in the last five minutes by Calvin Morath-Gibbs and Andre Costa to break the deadlock. Frankie Sawyer had given them a 27<sup>th</sup>-minute lead which was wiped out by Scott Kirkwood soon after the break.

Leaders Bognor seemed to have adjusted well to life without Jason Prior, currently on a two-week trial at Newcastle, as they took a 2-0 half-time lead at home to Ramsgate.

James Crane put them ahead after only six minutes and new signing Ashley Robinson volleyed a debut goal in the 44<sup>th</sup> minute.

A deflected shot by Ben Laslett five minutes after the break gave Rams new hope and they snatched a point at the death when Joe Taylor scored from close range.

Folkestone will be even more puzzled to have let their 2-0 lead slip at Burgess Hill, who were down to nine men when they drew level. Goals in the space of 11 minutes either side of half-

time from Darren Marsden and Stuart King put Folkestone in command.

It also took their season's tally to 55, one more than they scored in the whole of the 2009-10 season when they won promotion from this division.

Then came a brief and eventful appearance by Hillians substitute Max Miller, who scored almost as soon as he entered the action and was sent off a few minutes later, joining teammate Marc Munday in the dressing room. Despite the two-man handicap, Hillians snatched a vital point in their battle to stay up when Fred Foreman scored in the 81<sup>st</sup> minute.

Whitehawk must have been confident when they travelled to Sittingbourne, who had gone six games without a win and scored in only one of them.

The Brickies, though, handed out a warning when Joe Nwoko hit the bar shortly before the end of a scoreless first half and it was Nwoko who broke the deadlock in the 58<sup>th</sup> minute.

Bryan Glover's deflected free-kick 12 minutes from time completed a 2-0 victory which knocked Hawks down from second to fourth in the table.

Maidstone looked doomed when Scott Harris put hosts Godalming 1-0 up with only seven minutes left. Fair reward for G's, who had hit the woodwork twice. But Stones saved a point with a last-minute effort from Baff Addae.

Crawley Down maintained their surge up the table by crushing visitors Walton Casuals 6-1. All was not quite as it seems, though. Casuals completely dominated the first half but somehow found themselves 3-1 down.

The Anvils made the most of their rare opportunities with superbly-taken goals by Luke Blewden in the seventh minute and Jamie Cade in the 42<sup>nd</sup>.

In between, Danny Fernandez curled in a free-kick to make it 1-1 after 25 minutes. But Casuals were to suffer a demoralising blow in added time at the end of the half when keeper Gareth Williams punched a corner into his own net.

It was a different story after the break as the rampant hosts threatened to run riot.

Tom Burton made it 4-1 in the 65<sup>th</sup> minute and they hit the bar twice before Cade completed his hat-trick with a goal in the 82<sup>nd</sup> minute and a penalty three minutes later.

Anvils even found the net for a seventh time but Gabriel Odunaike was denied by an offside flag.

Another club in the lower reaches of the table to enjoy themselves were Walton & Hersham, who thrashed Whitstable 5-0 having gone into the game as the division's lowest scorers with just 19 goals in 24 games.

George Benner's own goal in the 16<sup>th</sup> minute was quickly followed by a Phil Williams strike and then it was over to Graeme Purdy.

He made it 3-0 in the 28<sup>th</sup> minute, scored again moments before half-time and completed his hat-trick with 19 minutes left.

Hythe met Corinthian-Casuals for the third time this season and for the third time it finished 1-1.

Dave Hodges put Casuals ahead soon after the interval and Brendon Cass replied for the hosts with a penalty after he had been fouled midway through the half.

In the other game, Faversham's Adrian Stone gave his side the lead at Merstham ten minutes after half-time only for the hosts to strike twice in the last ten minutes, both from outside the box.

Fabio Saravia's free-kick made it 1-1 and Omar Folkes lashed the winner.
