# Alan Boon Cup

BURY Town will meet East Thurrock United in the final at Staines on March 28 after home wins over Lowestoft and Lewes respectively in the semi-finals on Tuesday. Neither side has ever previously reached the final of the Ryman League's knockout competition.

Lowestoft manager Micky Chapman was taking charge of his 1,000<sup>th</sup> game but it proved not to be such a grand occasion for the Trawlerboys, who fell behind in the third minute when Danny Cunningham converted a penalty for their Suffolk rivals.

Sam Reed added another on the stroke of half-time and that proved to be the end of the scoring as Bury won 2-0.

A goal by Ryan Sammons, his first of the season, earned East Thurrock a 1-0 victory over Lewes. Sammons struck four minutes after the interval and it was enough, even though Kris Newby missed a chance to clinch it from the penalty spot.



WEALDSTONE are through to the last eight of the FA Trophy after a dramatic 1-0 victory over Dartford in their replay at Grosvenor Vale on Tuesday.

The all-important goal for the Ryman Premier side came in the 26<sup>th</sup> minute when Lee Chappell made the most of a chance set up by Richard Jolly. Long-serving defender Chappell is usually good for half a dozen goals a season but he did not open his account for this campaign until Saturday, picking the right time to get back into scoring vein.

Controversy followed in the second half with three red cards in ten minutes, all from separate incidents. First to go was Wealdstone's Chris O'Leary, quickly followed by Dartford's James Rogers. Then Stones went down to nine men as Connor Smith was sent off.

But Stones held out for a win they deserved on the overall run of play and will now visit Cambridge United, eighth in the Conference Premier, on Saturday to bid for a semi-final place. Northwich, of the Northern Premier League, are the only other survivors from outside non-League football's top division.

# Ryman Premier

IT'S been a quiet campaign thus far for Kingstonian, but that could be changing.

They came from behind to beat Margate 2-1 at Kingsmeadow on Monday and climbed three places in the table. They are now eighth and within five points of a play-off spot.

Margate hit the post in the first minute through Adam Burchell and he continued to look the most dangerous player in an even contest.

Tommy Murphy, signed from Horsham last week, put the visitors ahead nine minutes into the second half and twice came close to restoring the lead after Sam Clayton's 72<sup>nd</sup>-minute equaliser.

But K's had the last word, clinching their third successive victory when Ryan Woods struck with six minutes left.

Leatherhead and Wingate may be in the bottom seven, but they produced a match of high quality at Fetcham Grove on Tuesday which finished 2-2 after some excellent attacking football from both sides.

David Laird's lob in the 11th minute gave Wingate a lead which they held until half-time but Tanners struck back with two goals in the first seven minutes of the second half.

Harry Ottaway headed his first goals since returning to the club from Merstham and Kev Terry put Tanners ahead. Leon Smith's volley midway through the half squared matters again.



THERE was no change at the top on Tuesday when the leading pair, Leiston and Enfield Town, both won.

Leiston remain two points ahead thanks to a third-minute goal by Gareth Heath which earned them a 1-0 win at Thamesmead.

Enfield maintained their 100 per cent league record at their new stadium with a 3-0 victory over Chatham and they are now 12 points clear of third-placed Needham Market.

Kes Metitiri turned a Leon Osei cross into his own net on the half-hour for the only goal of the first half.

A fizzer from Rudi Hall made it 2-0 on 67 minutes and, after Osei had hit a post with a late penalty, Dean Pennant completed the scoring in the final minute.

Harlow stay in fourth place, missing the chance to climb above Needham by forfeiting a lead and going down 2-1 at Redbridge, who moved up one place to ninth and kept themselves very much in the play-off hunt.

Danny Brown's 19<sup>th</sup>-minute penalty put Hawks in front but Motormen hit back through Lewis Dark in the 33<sup>rd</sup> minute and Vinnie Durrant six minutes later.

The big game at the bottom brought joy for Great Wakering, whose 2-0 victory at Ware ended a run of 17 league games without a win.

Jack Carlile put them ahead with an 18<sup>th</sup>minute penalty and Billy Johnson added another two minutes after the interval.

Wakering are now three points ahead of bottom club llford and trail Ware only on goal difference.

If they survive it will be largely because they have taken ten of the possible 12 points from their games against their fellow-strugglers.

Soham must be grateful for the six points that separate them from the relegation zone after their 5-2 defeat at Waltham Abbey.

The league's only Cambridgeshire side have taken one point from six games this year and have conceded 13 goals in their last three matches.

It was much closer than the final score suggests, however. Daran Bern, Tom Laxton and Ayrton Coley fired the Abbotts into a 3-0 lead by the 41<sup>st</sup> minute but goals either side of the break by Andy Furnell and Dan Cotton pulled it back to 3-2 two minutes into the second half.

It was not until Bern netted his second in the 89<sup>th</sup> minute that Abbotts made sure of victory, and there was time for Liam Farrell to complete the nap hand.

Ilford remained three points adrift of their relegation rivals as history reversed itself at Cricklefield on Wednesday and they went down 3-2 to Romford.

On Saturday Ilford had fallen behind to Waltham Abbey in the seventh minute, then led 3-1 and eventually won 3-2.

This time it was llford who took the seventhminute lead with a good finish by Jon Glowacki but later found themselves 3-1 down.

The equaliser after 31 minutes was harsh on llford keeper Rob Budd, who pulled off a superb save from Joe Oates only to see Kurt Smith force the loose ball over the line for his first goal since returning from a three-month absence with a broken leg.

Jack Barry volleyed home a corner to put Boro ahead in the 44<sup>th</sup> minute of a first half that was to continue for another 14 minutes thanks to a succession of injuries.

Romford goalie Elliot Anderson did well to deny Daniel Abioye soon after the interval and, from the resultant corner, Rob Carter headed against the bar.

New signing Hussein Isa then put the visitors 3-1 up in the 53rd minute.

Carter reduced the arrears in the 68<sup>th</sup> minute when a Glowacki shot came back off a post but Anderson made several more excellent saves to deny llford a point, though Romford came close to a fourth when Chris Sullivan hit the bar.



MAIDSTONE boosted their promotion prospects with a 4-2 victory at Merstham on Tuesday. Five of the goals came in the closing stages.

It looked as if Stones would be able to take the points with a single 12<sup>th</sup>-minute goal by Graeme Andrews but when Fabio Saravia levelled matters in the 77<sup>th</sup> minute it triggered a goal rush.

Within four minutes Baff Addae and Shaun Welford had given the visitors a 3-1 lead.

But Merstham were not finished and Liam Wright revived their hopes with four minutes left.

Stones, however, had the last word through Alex Flisher.

Maidstone move above Folkestone into fourth place and, indeed, Folkestone are out of the play-off positions altogether after Worthing also overtook them with a 2-0 home win over Chipstead.

Goals came from Steve Davies in the 19<sup>th</sup> minute and Jamie Brotherton ten minutes into the second half.

Dulwich had the chance to move back into second place with a victory at Godalming but they had to settle for staying in third spot, trailing Whitehawk on goal difference after twice forfeiting the lead in a 2-2 draw.

Frankie Sawyer put the visitors ahead after seven minutes and Ryan Lake headed home a corner to equalise in the 16<sup>th</sup> minute.

Dulwich regained the lead immediately after half-time through Ishmael Kamara only for Antonio Simeone to save a point for G's in the  $72^{nd}$  minute.

The other game brought Faversham a 2-1 win at Burgess Hill.

Sam Robinson put the visitors ahead shortly before the interval and Fred Foreman struck for Hillians to level the scores five minutes after the break.

Danny Hockton netted the winner ten minutes from time.
