ALL THE ACTION

LOWESTOFT lost ground in the three-way battle for the Ryman Premier title when they were held to a 2-2 home draw by relegation-threatened Tooting yesterday (Saturday).

The Trawlerboys, with manager Micky Chapman taking charge of his 999th game, looked set for a comfortable afternoon when Rob Eagle put them ahead in the seventh minute but they were stunned by two goals in six minutes around the half-hour mark as Bertie Brayley and Charlie Stimson fired the Terrors into a shock lead.

Tooting keeper Darren Behcet was outstanding, though he was three times rescued by the woodwork, and his side almost hung on to three precious points, but they were denied two of them by Chris Henderson's equaliser five minutes from time.

Henderson then had two chances to win it, but he hit the bar and was then denied by the pick of Behcet's saves.

The point was not enough to lift Tooting out of 20th place and they are now four points adrift of safety thanks to Hastings' 2-1 win at Horsham.

Leaders Billericay maintained their five-point advantage with an important 2-0 derby win at Canvey.

Rob Swaine, their central defender and top scorer, headed his 13th goal of the season after four minutes and Glenn Poole made sure with a 72nd-minute penalty after a foul by Ashley Dumas.

Martin Tuohy returned from a three-match suspension to score the decisive goal for second-placed Hornchurch in their 1-0 home win over Lewes. It was his 20th of the season and came in the 33rd minute after he intercepted a wayward back-pass from Max Hustwick.

Michael Spencer cleared a Jack Walder header off the line to preserve the lead and maintain Urchins' strong position. They have two games in hand on the leaders while Lowestoft, now seven points back, have three extra games to play.

Cray strengthened their grip on fourth place with a 2-1 home victory over Met Police, who were without three of their first-choice defenders.

Alex Bentley broke the deadlock two minutes after half-time and Lewis Perkins headed another five minutes later.

The Met, in danger of slipping out of the play-off race, replied in the 79th minute through Ryan James.

Hendon's defence was once again impenetrable away from home, where they have kept 12 clean sheets in 16 matches, ten of which they have won.

The tenth arrived late thanks to a single goal by Isaiah Rankin three minutes from time at Leatherhead, who now lead Tooting only on goal difference. Mu Maan, back from Met Police, came closest for Tanners, hitting the bar in the first half.

Bury are sixth, three points behind Hendon but with two games in hand, after their 2-2 home draw against Harrow.

Jon-Jo Bates netted seven minutes before half-time for the visitors but Bury hit back with a Sam Nunn header in the 62nd minute and took the lead through Lee Smith with 12 minutes left. Michael Barima had the last word with an 85th-minute leveller and that made it a fair result.

Wealdstone are up to eighth after their 5-2 home victory over an Aveley side seemingly doomed to relegation, but they made hard work of it.

Richard Jolly had already had one strike disallowed before he put Stones ahead after five minutes but debutant Troy Powell-Quarry replied in the 20th minute.

Lee Chappell restored the home side's lead in the 32nd minute as they dominated the game, only for Spencer Harrison to square it again on the hour.

Stones finally went ahead to stay when experienced defender Kevin Mully, another Aveley debutant, planted a diving header into his own net in the 67th minute. Scott Fitzgerald made it 4-2 and Jolly wrapped it up with his 32nd goal of the season.

It was his 19th in the league, putting him two clear of Tuohy in the race for the division's golden boot – assuming, of course, that they can pass the 22 goals netted by Margate's Kwesi Appiah before his move to Crystal Palace.

Millers are now 12 points adrift in the relegation zone but still seven points ahead of bottom club Horsham, who suffered their 13th home defeat as Sussex rivals Hastings gained valuable ground in the race to stay up.

Calum McGeehan put Hornets ahead in the fourth minute but dreams of a first victory since August were shattered as Tamer Tuna equalised on the half-hour and Danny Ellis headed the winner just before the interval.

There were 2-0 away wins for two sides still nursing outside hopes of reaching the play-offs.

Bashiru Alimi put Kingstonian ahead with a penalty on the half-hour at Wingate and Aaron Goode added another shortly before the break. Tony Burke hit the bar as Wingate tried to find a way back.

Harry Elmes gave the division's in-form side, Concord, a 17th-minute lead at Carshalton and, after Dean McDonald had struck the bar for the home side, Sherwin Stanley added the second on 65 minutes. Robins had Justyn Roberts sent off in the closing stages.

East Thurrock went one better, beating Margate 3-0 at Rookery Hill to partially avenge a 5-0 defeat in Kent. Two goals in the last five minutes of the first half did the damage, both set up by Sam Higgins for Sam Collins and Greg Cohen. Kris Newby completed the scoring with a 70th-minute penalty.



IT IS turning into a two-horse race for the Ryman North title after Leiston's 4-0 victory at Great Wakering yesterday (Saturday) kept them two points ahead of Enfield Town, who are now nine points clear of third-placed Needham Market.

Rhys Henry gave Leiston the lead after 17 minutes and the remaining goals followed in a six-minute burst either side of half-time. Michael Brothers and Henry made it 3-0 at the interval and Daniel Ottley-Gooch struck soon after the restart.

Wakering had Ashley Hawkins sent off and completed a bad day by finding that they had been dumped at the foot of the table.

Enfield looked set for a 1-0 home victory over Heybridge after Liam Hope converted a 19th-minute penalty. Then Luke Callander's 82nd-minute equaliser produced a swift reaction: Michael Ewang restored Town's lead a minute later and Hope made it 3-1.

Leiston and Enfield will doubtless be uncomfortably aware that the team which loses out in these straight fights for the title very rarely goes on to gain promotion via the play-offs.

Indeed, that was Needham's fate last season after East Thurrock had outlasted them in the title race. The Marketmen crashed out of the play-offs at the semi-final stage.

They will be relieved to have gained a point from a 1-1 draw at Tilbury yesterday. Emiel Aiken put Dockers ahead with a 20-yard drive in the 13th minute and a red card for Duane Wright reduced the visitors to ten men before half-time.

But Bradley Barber levelled matters in the 61st minute, snapping up the rebound after a Sam Newson shot was parried.

Needham are now only one point ahead of Harlow, who have a game in hand. The Hawks came out on top in the day's highest-scoring game, beating visitors Cheshunt 5-3.

It was 1-1 after only 11 minutes, with Josh Hutchinson replying to Mark Taylor's opener for the

hosts. Harlow then took command. Dave Cowley, returning to the club from Grays, restored their lead on 28 minutes, Danny Brown's penalty made it 3-1 at the break and Jeff Hammond notched the fourth immediately after the restart.

Cheshunt netted the other three goals but, alas for them, one was an own goal by Dan Roles. Either side of it, Kevin Ashwood and Chris Sargent kept the Ambers' distant hopes alive.

That was not the only five-goal haul among the play-off contenders. Grays remained fifth with a 5-1 win at Thamesmead and Brentwood moved up to sixth with a home victory over Waltham Forest by the same margin.

Grays took control with goals by Paul Olima in the 33rd minute and Nathan Gordon, a new arrival from Redbridge, three minutes later.

An Ashley Probets penalty shortly after the interval gave Thamesmead hope but Joao Carlos restored the two-goal margin in the 55th minute. Olima headed his second and Anthony Ryan completed the nap hand.

It was the same scoring sequence at Brentwood. Ryan Doyle's 27th minute strike was the only goal of the first half and Ryan Edgar doubled the lead four minutes after the break.

Jamie Moore replied midway through the half but Danny Dafter immediately headed home a corner to make it 3-1 and Forest's hopes vanished when Antone Douglas was sent off after conceding a penalty in the 74th minute which Doyle converted. Robert Rees notched the late fifth.

Sudbury trail Brentwood on goal difference – both clubs moved above Tilbury – after taking the points at Chatham with three unanswered goals. James Baker scored the first after 17 minutes, following up after his penalty was saved. Nathan Clarke headed another on 38 minutes and there was then a long wait for Dave Wareham's goal in added time.

Potters Bar Town moved into the play-off race by romping to a 4-0 victory at Romford. After a goalless first half, Rob Magwood put the Scholars in front on 48 minutes and James Gershfield's shot was helped over the line by defender Paul Kavanagh's seven minutes later. Gershfield scored from the spot after another seven minutes and completed a hat-trick with ten minutes left.

Redbridge, though, lost vital ground when their half-time lead at Maldon turned into a 3-1 defeat. Ryan Wade's 20th-minute strike gave the Motormen a promising start but an own goal by Ryan Murray soon after the interval squared it and by the hour mark Ross Wall and Ollie Berquez had wrapped it up.

Wakering are on the bottom after victories for the two teams who have been disputing last place all season. Ilford edged ahead of Wakering on goal difference after coming from behind to beat visitors Waltham Abbey 3-2, only their third win of the campaign.

Adam Bolle netted a seventh-minute opener for the Abbots but Rob Carter equalised ten minutes before the break, then put Ilford ahead in the 58th minute.

Loui Hazlewood made it 3-1 nine minutes later and Ayrton Coley's reply came with only a couple of minutes left.

Ware, the only team in the league without an away win, ended that record in style and moved three points clear of the bottom two as a hat-trick by Wingate loanee Lewis Jones powered them to a 4-1 victory at Soham.

Liam Foster's eighth-minute goal for Ware brought an instant reply from Scott Carter but the rest of the game belonged to Jones.

He was on target after 22, 58 and 88 minutes as Ware scored four times in a league game away from home for the first time in three years and a week.



THE least surprising Ryman South result yesterday (Saturday) came at Bognor, who moved six points clear at the top by thrashing Walton Casuals 6-1.

The sides had met twice earlier in the season at Walton, in the league and Alan Boon Cup, and Bognor won both matches 5-0.

If the visitors were expecting the worst, it was soon clear that they would not be disappointed as Steve Harper and Ashley Robinson, with a penalty, scored in the first 11 minutes.

Casuals then held out until the 53rd minute, when Osa Obamwonyi scored, and by the 65th minute it was 5-0 again thanks to Robinson and Ben Johnson.

Terry Dodd made it six in the 83rd minute but Casuals at least averted a third whitewash thanks to an 89th-minute effort by Carl Wilson-Denis, newly signed from Met Police.

Whitehawk reclaimed second spot with an equally emphatic performance, hitting five unanswered goals at Whitstable.

The first two were penalties at either end of the first half, both converted by Paul Armstrong.

Joe Keehan made it 3-0 on the hour, after which Sam Gargan and Josh Jones completed the scoring by the 75th minute.

Hawks moved above Dulwich, who were held to a scoreless home draw by Maidstone. The home side had the edge, with Frankie Sawyer hitting a post, but could have no real complaints.

After winning their first ten home games they have taken only three points from the next four.

Folkestone, in fourth place, shook off an eighth-minute goal by Faversham's Danny Hockton and stormed to a 4-1 away victory.

Their cause was helped by the dismissal of Matt Bourne midway through the first half.

Stuart King levelled it with a 38th-minute penalty and Frankie Chappell put the 11 men ahead with 20 minutes left. James Everitt secured the points in the 84th minute, leaving King to put the icing on the cake with his 20th goal of the season.

Maidstone hung on to fifth place by a matter of moments. Worthing would have moved above them by winning at Eastbourne but were foiled by Nathan Crabb, whose 89th-minute goal salvaged a 2-2 draw.

A Steve Elliott own goal gave Rebels a half-time lead which was wiped out by Danny Curd's header 11 minutes after the restart. Jamie Brotherton put Worthing ahead again with 19 minutes to go and it was almost enough.

Chipstead and Godalming have hopes of climbing into play-off contention by winning games in hand but both suffered setbacks.

Chipstead fell behind after 47 minutes at Corinthian-Casuals, Paul Honey scoring with a wind-assisted corner, but escaped with a 1-1 draw thanks to a 76th-minute strike from 30 yards by Bruce Hogg.

Godalming, meanwhile, went down to a lone Roscoe Dsane goal at Merstham. It came after 20 minutes and G's could not respond even though Merstham's ex-G James Evans was sent off ten minutes before half-time. Dan Read came closest to an equaliser, heading against the bar.

Hythe came from behind to chalk up a 3-1 home win over Crawley Down, for whom Luke Blewden netted after 25 minutes. Nick Reeves replied with a volley two minutes after the interval, a header by Pat Kingwell put Hythe in front midway through the half and Brendon Cass made sure with another header in the 75th minute.

A Joe Taylor double saw Ramsgate to victory over visiting Burgess Hill by the odd goal in five. Gillingham loanee Bradley Dack, an early substitute for the injured Steve O'Brien, opened the scoring just before the half-hour mark but Hillians drew level though Kenny Pogue six minutes after the interval.

Taylor's header restored Margate's advantage in the 59th minute and although Hillians replied again through Pat Harding in the 64th minute, Taylor fired the winner two minutes later.

Whyteleafe, nine points adrift in 21st place, were given a glimmer of hope when Reggie Savage gave them a 36th-minute lead from the penalty spot at Walton & Hersham.

But Leafe conceded a penalty two minutes later and Greg Andrews made no mistake. Graeme Purdy's goal after 54 minutes provided a 2-1 Swans success.
