ALL THE ACTION

FA Trophy

WEALDSTONE became the first Ryman League team for eight years to reach the FA Trophy semi-finals as two more goals from the prolific Richard Jolly earned them a 2-1 victory at Conference Premier club Cambridge United on Saturday.

The last Ryman League club to reach the last four were Canvey in 2004, when they went on to be losing finalists. That was the last season before the Conference expanded to three divisions and since then Boreham Wood, as a Southern League team in 2006, had been the only non-Conference team to survive the quarter-finals.

Stones, of course, have history in the FA Trophy, having won it in 1985 when they also lifted the Conference (then known as the Gola League) title, becoming the first team to perform that double.

A few years later they lost their ground and had to rebuild their on-field fortunes after joining the old Isthmian Division Three in 1995.

They are joined in Monday's semi-final draw by three Conference Premier clubs: Luton, Newport and York.

Jolly's double took his total in the competition to a round dozen and his overall tally for the season to 34.

He stunned the home side by handing Wealdstone the lead with just four minutes on the clock, firing home from close range when Lee Chappell headed down a cross from Kurtney Brooks.

Cambridge stormed back and Stones did well to hang on to their lead until half-time. The home side's best chance fell to Liam Hughes, whose volley was tipped over the bar by keeper Jonathan North.

After the interval North again foiled Hughes and Luke Berry missed a clear chance to equalise. It seemed that the pressure would have to pay off but instead, in the 69th minute, Wealdstone who doubled their lead.

Brooks crossed to the near post and Jolly, as ever, was in the right place to turn the ball into the net, to the delight and disbelief of the 376 visiting fans in the crowd of 2,034.

Cambridge responded almost at once. Sean Cronin conceded a free-kick just outside the box and James Jennings found the corner of the net with his free-kick.

Somehow Stones survived another 20 minutes of non-stop Cambridge attacks. Jennings thought he had saved the tie in the 90th minute with another

free-kick but this time North tipped the ball over the bar.

The visitors had to suffer through four agonising minutes of added time but, despite forcing two corners, Cambridge were unable to trouble North again and Stones were able to celebrate in style.



FAST-STARTING Billericay maintained their five-point lead in the Ryman Premier on Saturday with a 3-1 home win over play-off contenders Cray.

Courtney White headed them into a 13th-minute lead and struck again ten minutes later. Chris Wild then made it 3-0 after only 27 minutes.

Chris Saunders pulled one back in the 35th minute and Cray had the upper hand for the rest of the game without being able to further reduce the arrears.

Second-placed Hornchurch, who have two games in hand, maintained their challenge with a 2-0 victory at in-form Kingstonian, their 12th away win of the season.

Martin Tuohy drilled home the opener from Leon McKenzie's pass in the seventh minute and added the second with a stunning volley just after the hour.

That took him to 19 league goals, level with Wealdstone's Richard Jolly and now three behind former Margate striker Kwesi Appiah, still the division's top scorer.

Lowestoft were beaten 1-0 at Hendon and can no longer catch the top two by winning their games in hand.

A tight game was settled in the 82nd minute when visiting defender Sam Gaughran headed the ball past keeper Andy Reynolds and Isaiah Rankin accepted the gift with glee.

Hendon moved into fourth place, above Cray who themselves are now just one point above Bury, who have a game in hand, after the Alan Boon Cup finalists won 3-2 at Margate.

Lee Smith's header gave Bury a seventh-minute lead which was wiped out by Craig Cloke's penalty on the half-hour. Then came a quick exchange of goals shortly before the interval, with John Sands restoring Bury's advantage only for Richard Avery to reply.

Sands struck again on 64 minutes and this time there was no response from the home side.

It was a bad day for the four clubs in the relegation places. Hastings, just above the drop zone, had the day off and must have feared that the sides above

them would close the gap. But although all four had moments of hope, they ended up pointless.

Leatherhead were the only side who could have overtaken Hastings and they were given an early lift when Billy Manners gave them a seventh-minute lead at Concord.

The Essex club, chasing a sixth successive league win, dominated the rest of the game but when Tony Stokes missed a 65th-minute penalty it began to look as if it would not be their day. Shortly afterwards, however, substitute Sherwin Stanley equalised with his first touch and he went on to set up an 83rd-minute winner for Stokes.

Tooting stayed on level terms with visitors Canvey for an hour but then John Easterford scrambled in the only goal of the game to give the islanders the points.

Aveley, with a much-changed team under new manager Justin Gardner, were a little unlucky to go down 2-1 at home to Wingate.

One of the newcomers, Ajibola Olatunbosun, headed into his own net to give Wingate the lead six minutes before half-time.

Two more new signings, Michael Begg and Billy Holland, hit the woodwork either side of half-time but Holland's effort led to the equaliser as Danny Francis slotted home the rebound. Wingate, though, claimed the points with a lob from Leon Smith with 12 minutes left.

Bottom club Horsham took the lead at Met Police with a goal on the half-hour by Daniel Morris. But it was soon to be business as usual for the Hornets, who have only 11 points so far and banked six of them from their first two away games of the season.

They were ahead for only seven minutes before Staforde Palmer's header made it 1-1, and Ryan James put the Met ahead immediately after the interval. Late long-range strikes by Jack Macleod and Chris Bourne wrapped up a 4-1 victory as Horsham's winless run reached 27 matches.

Lewes and East Thurrock met in Sussex four days after East Thurrock won their Alan Boon Cup semi-final clash and this time the honours were shared in a 2-2 draw.

Lewes will be more satisfied with the outcome, having played with ten men from the 13th minute when Jack Walder received his second yellow card.

By then Lewes were ahead thanks to an early goal by Paul Booth. The visitors had to wait until the 53rd minute for Greg Cohen's leveller and went ahead through Matt Hall, a university student at nearby Eastbourne, in the 71st minute.

New Lewes signing Billy Medlock came off the bench to save a point with seven minutes left.

A goal in each half by Laurent Hamici gave Carshalton a 2-1 win at Harrow, who remain dangerously close to the relegation zone. Rob Wollaston put the hosts ahead in the 17th minute

but Hamici headed the equaliser in the 39th minute and grabbed the winner with 20 minutes left.

Michael Brothers set the ball rolling with a first-minute goal for leaders Leiston against visiting Romford and went on to complete a hat-trick by the 21st minute.

Then, across the county, Needham's Lee McGlone took over, with a 24th-minute goal that set him on the way to a 14-minute hat-trick against bottom club Ilford.

Leiston were hanging on by the end of their game. Kurt Smith threatened to outdo both Suffolk men by scoring twice in a minute soon after half-time but the hosts held on to win 3-2.

Needham went 4-0 up through Duane Wright in the 49th minute but failed to add to it. Ilford hit back with a Rob Carter header 12 minutes from time and made it 4-2 with a last-gasp strike from Sunday Olanipekun.

Leiston remain two points clear of Enfield Town, who won 2-1 at Waltham Forest. It took an hour for Town to go ahead through Leon Osei and Liam Hope netted his 20th goal of the season eight minutes later. Forest had Elton Sackey sent off but pulled a goal back three minutes from time, Arian Retkoceri converting the rebound after Joel Palmer's penalty was saved.

Needham strengthened their grip on third place as the two sides behind them, Grays and Harlow, fought out a 1-1 draw.

David Cowley, who recently returned to Harlow after a spell at Grays, put the Hawks ahead with a third-minute free-kick and they stayed in front until 13 minutes from the end, when Craig Pope headed home a corner.

Tilbury moved up to sixth with a 2-0 win at Ware. The damage was done in the first 12 minutes by Alex Read, with a penalty, and Gary Henty.

Brentwood slipped back to seventh after a second-half penalty miss by Ryan Doyle cost them victory at Potters Bar. Fabion Simms put the hosts ahead after 11 minutes and Ryan Edgar made it 1-1 nine minutes before the interval. Brentwood dominated after that but failed to take their chances.

Sudbury also dropped two points in a 2-2 home draw with Great Wakering, who slipped to the foot of the table a week earlier. The shock must have done them good, for they have collected four points from two away games since then.

Dan Williams put Wakering ahead in the 20th minute but Sudbury recovered to lead by half-time thanks to a goal from Danny Charge and a header by James Smith.

Wakering squared it when Ryan Henshaw was sent off midway through the second half and player-manager Dan Trenkel lashed home the resultant free-kick.

Redbridge are right in the thick of the play-off race after their 3-2 home win over struggling Soham. Mitchell Das gave them an early lead and, after Andy Coleman replied, Joe Ellul's header put the Motormen 2-1 up after 22 minutes.

Ellul struck again with 18 minutes to go but a late header by Dubi Ogbonna gave Soham vain hope of stealing a point.

There was plenty of action, as usual, at Waltham Abbey whose 30 games this season have produced 127 goals. This time they went down 3-2 at home to Thamesmead after taking the lead eight minutes before half-time through Louis Bristow.

Theo Fairweather-Johnson turned it round with two goals in the first 11 minutes of the second half but Abbots though they had saved a point when Tim Shaw squared it in the 87th minute. Then David Noel was brought down in added time and Ashley Probets won it from the spot.

Garry Tilley's 19th-minute goal was all Chatham needed for victory at Heybridge. Lee Hales had the chance to double the lead four minutes later but missed a penalty. It could have been costly, but plenty of Heybridge pressure led to nothing better than a shot by Luke Callander which hit a post.

The other game, between Cheshunt and Maldon, finished goalless. Josh Hutchinson hit the bar for the home side.



YOU have to feel sorry for Whyteleafe, who must have thought they had revived their Ryman South survival hopes with a 3-0 home win over Corinthian-Casuals on Saturday: their first league victory since September 10.

Then they found that the two sides above them, Burgess Hill and Whitstable, had both scored last-minute winners, and Leafe remain a daunting nine points adrift.

Fred Fleming's fifth-minute goal gave Leafe, and new manager Steve Griffin, an excellent start. Their prospects improved when Casuals had Jamie Byatt sent off. Elliot Mitchell made it 2-0 in the 58th minute and Reggie Savage wrapped it up with ten minutes left.

So far so good, but then came the news from elsewhere, in particular the major shock at fifth-placed Worthing, who lost their unbeaten home record when Stuart Vahid converted a Dale Skelton corner to give Whitstable a 2-1 victory.

Skelton had put them ahead after six minutes and Worthing struggled to get back on terms. Ryan McBride had a penalty saved by Dave King on the

hour but Rebels were awarded another spot-kick ten minutes later and this time Paul Kennett made no mistake. Then Vahid had the last word.

Dan Clarke's ninth-minute header gave Burgess Hill an early lead but visiting Merstham equalised on the stroke of half-time through Liam Wright, who then put them ahead with 20 minutes left.

Kenny Pogue levelled it again five minutes later and Pat Harding grabbed the last-ditch winner.

At the top of the table, Bognor – now the only side in the league unbeaten at home – maintained their six-point advantage with a 4-2 win at Godalming which featured three penalties in quick succession.

Darren Wheeler gave G's the lead from the spot in the 38th minute only for Ashley Robinson to respond with penalties in the last minute of the first half and the first minute of the second.

After that the action was more conventional. Steve Harper headed Bognor's third on 55 minutes and also netted a late clincher after Warren Harris put G's back in the game with 20 minutes left.

Whitehawk remained in second place with an untidy 3-1 home win over Walton & Hersham. Sam Gargan volleyed Hawks ahead on 27 minutes only for Graeme Purdy to make it 1-1 right on half-time.

Lee Newman restored Hawks' lead on 72 minutes and Josh Jones made sure ten minutes later.

Dulwich remain level on points with Whitehawk after an Ishmael Kamara double earned them a 2-0 victory at Walton Casuals.

He headed the opener on 24 minutes and got his second from a corner with 20 minutes left.

The top three have pulled clear of the other three main play-off contenders, who were all beaten.

Maidstone stay fourth despite letting the lead slip in a 3-1 home defeat by Faversham.

Alex Flisher broke the deadlock on 52 minutes but goals by Danny Hockton and Nicky Humphrey within 11 minutes and James Peacock added another in the 74th minute.

Worthing remain fifth despite their defeat because Folkestone also went down at home, 3-2 against Ramsgate who moved into seventh place, though they are still nine points behind their victims.

Bradley Dack put Ramsgate ahead after 16 minutes and, after James Everitt equalised at the end of the first half, Joe Taylor put Rams in front immediately after the restart.

Stuart King made it 2-2 in the 52nd minute with his 18th league goal of the season and he is the leading contender for the division's Golden Boot, though he needs another six to match the departed Jason Prior's total for Bognor.

Folkestone looked set for the draw they needed to move back into the top five but then came another of the division's late winners when Tom Chapman

struck during ten minutes of time added for an injury to referee Ollie Jackson.

The scoreline was the same at Chipstead, where Matt Geard's double gave Eastbourne the points. Sam Crabb put the visitors ahead after 15 minutes and Geard added another two minutes before the break.

Chipstead dominated the second half and eventually pulled one back in the 80th minute through Matt York. But Geard restored the two-goal margin before Bruce Hogg got a second for Chips in the last minute.

Jamie Cade fired his second hat-trick in Crawley Down's last three home games as the Anvils romped to a 5-1 home win over Sittingbourne.

The visitors had not played since January 24 and the rust showed as Tom Burton and Cade struck in the first 18 minutes.

Anthony Hogg quickly pulled one back, only for Luke Blewden to make it 3-1 in the 25th minute.

Cade nabbed his second goal on 57 minutes and completed his personal treble with six minutes to go.

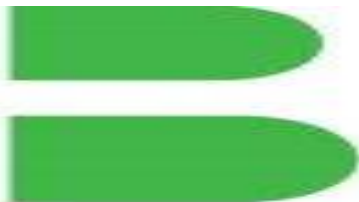
