ALL THE ACTION

JUST IN time: that was Harrison Chatting as Billericay maintained their seven-point lead in the Ryman Premier table on Saturday.

Chatting's strike in added time earned Craig Edwards' side a 1-0 win over in-form Lewes at New Lodge just when it seemed that they would let two precious points slip.

Second-placed Hornchurch still have a game in hand but victory in that, and over Billericay when they meet on Easter Monday, would still not be enough to close the gap.

Urchins themselves won 3-0 at relegated Horsham: the 14th away win for Hornchurch, the 15th home defeat for the hosts.

Martin Tuohy opened the scoring nine minutes before half-time with his 22nd league goal of the season, Lewis Smith made the most of a defensive error just after the hour and Leon McKenzie broke his Hornchurch duck with 13 minutes left.

Horsham had the chance for some consolation when they were awarded an 88th-minute penalty but Joe Woolley was equal to Wayne Clark's kick.

Lowestoft remained three points further back, with another game in hand, by coming from behind to see off Margate 2-1 in Suffolk.

Tommy Murphy struck an early blow in the sixth minute and Margate stayed in front until the dying moments of the first half, when Sam Gaughran levelled it.

Substitute Joe Francis hit the winner with 13 minutes left.

To complete the 'same as before' scene, Bury stayed three points behind the Trawlerboys with a lone-goal victory at Hastings.

Billy Clark converted Connor Hall's cross for the winner in the 75th minute and Bury moved five points ahead of fifth-placed Cray, who enjoyed a good free Saturday as the two teams who could have overtaken them failed to do so. Lewes were one, Hendon the other.

Hendon did, however, reclaim sixth place from the Sussex club after a 1-1 home draw with Carshalton.

Young Woking loanee Ola Sogbanmu opened his account for the Robins after 17 minutes. Jamie Busby replied with a 28th-minute penalty but Hendon's hopes of victory were hit when Kevin Maclaren was sent off soon after half-time.

Kingstonian moved to within three points of Cray, though they have played one more game, with a 2-0 win at Canvey.

Bobby Traynor's 25th-minute penalty was all that separated the sides until Ian Gayle headed the clincher with ten minutes left.

Met Police are a point further back after their 2-0 home win over Wingate.

There were plenty of chances at both ends before Eddie Smith broke the deadlock on 70 minutes and Staforde Palmer made sure seven minutes later.

Concord kept their distant play-off hopes alive, and moved above island rivals Canvey, with a crushing 6-0 victory at Tooting.

The Terrors, now surely doomed to relegation, were three down in 11 minutes as Harry Elmes, Reece Harris and Tony Stokes found the target.

Elmes struck again 11 minutes after half-time and Stokes notched his 30th goal of the season, his 23rd in the league, shortly afterwards.

He then missed a penalty after an offence for which Ronnie Fletcher was sent off, and it was left to Ashley Miller to complete the rout near the end.

Wealdstone complete the play-off hopefuls but lost ground when they were held to a 2-2 home draw by East Thurrock.

The visitors were actually 2-0 up at half-time thanks to a Joe Keith free-kick and a Sam Higgins header but lost Sam Collins to a red card early in the second half.

Richard Jolly started the comeback in the 64th minute as he netted his 40th goal of the season and his 24th in the league, staying one ahead of Stokes – thanks to that missed penalty - in the race for the golden boot.

Alex Dyer squared it with eight minutes left, leaving Stones six points behind Cray with two games in hand.

Aveley maintained their mathematical survival chances with a 3-2 home win over Harrow.

The visitors found themselves two down in 27 minutes after Daniel Francis netted twice but pulled one back through Danny Buckle shortly before half-time.

Buckle then hit a post, but the equaliser came in the 56th minute from sub Simeon Akinola. It was an Aveley sub who had the last word, however, as debutant Kayan Kalipha restored their lead with 16 minutes left.

Leatherhead set the cat among the pigeons at both ends of the table with a 2-1 victory over Cray at Bromley on Sunday.

They welcomed back Greg Andrews after his recent return to goalscoring form with Walton & Hersham and he might have scored three times in the first three minutes.

It was an accurate Andrews free-kick which allowed Harry Ottaway to head the opener after 12 minutes and a mistake by the home side enabled Tommy Hutchings to make it 2-0 with a cool finish in the 24th minute.

Cray finally got back into the game in the 85th minute with a far-post header by James Darvill.

Ottaway responded with a header that hit the underside of the bar; Then Tanners keeper Chico Ramos was tested by a Darvill shot that turned almost at right angles as it hit the bumpy surface, but grabbed the ball when it was halfway across the line.

Tanners had another chance to clinch it when Ottaway broke clear only to finish with a weak shot, and they held on even though the announced five minutes of added time turned out to be almost ten.

So Leatherhead's hopes of escaping relegation were much improved. They are now within three points of 18th-placed Harrow.

Cray, meanwhile, missed the chance to put some distance between themselves and the other contenders for fifth place. The seven teams behind Cray will all now feel that their play-off hopes are very much alive.

LEISTON moved closer to taking the Ryman North title at the first attempt yesterday (Saturday), scoring twice in the last four minutes to snatch a 3-2 victory at Ilford and

open up a seven-point gap at the top with six games to play.

Ilford, just two points above the relegation zone, snatched a shock lead on the half-hour through Loui Hazlewood. Stuart Boardley levelled the scores after 54 minutes, only for a Blake Saker own goal to restore Ilford's advantage with ten minutes left.

Sheridan Driver put Leiston back on terms in the 87th minute and Gareth Heath converted a last-minute penalty to bring the title closer. It also made Leiston the first team in the division to be sure of at least a play-off spot. Second-placed Enfield Town left themselves with much to do if they are to win automatic promotion after slipping to a 2-0 defeat at Maldon.

The damage was done by Junior Luke's fierce shot on the half-hour and Sos Yao's strike with 20 minutes left.

Needham Market moved closer to booking their play-off place with a 1-0 home win over Waltham Forest.

The visit of the out-of-touch Londoners seemed an ideal opportunity for the Marketmen to score the four goals they needed to reach the century.

But they were unable to add to Duane Wright's fifth-minute header, with top marksman Sam Newson remaining scoreless since November.

Grays moved up to fourth as early and late goals gave them a 2-0 home win over Heybridge. James Bunn scored five minutes after the start and Joe Sweeney struck five minutes from the end.

Local rivals Tilbury suffered a major setback with a 1-0 home defeat by Sudbury. James Baker's penalty after 32 minutes was enough to settle it, with a goalline clearance denying Sam West an equaliser.

Tilbury stay in the final play-off spot but Sudbury are just a point behind them and Harlow one point further back after they also won with a lone goal. Getro Kilapi headed the winner after 17 minutes and this third successive defeat against play-off rivals has surely ended Brentwood's hopes.

The other remaining contenders are Redbridge, whose 2-1 home win over bottom club Ware keeps them four points behind Tilbury.

The Motormen's domination finally paid off when James Robinson netted on the hour and

set up the second for Mitchell Das five minutes later.

Sonny Silenti managed a last-gasp reply for Ware but it was slim consolation as they remain six points short of safety with games fast running out.

The other team in deep trouble at the bottom are Great Wakering, two points behind Ilford, and they did nothing to improve their survival prospects as they crashed to a 4-0 defeat at Thamesmead.

Rikki Cable did much of the damage, setting up an eighth-minute goal for Theo Fairweather-Johnson and scoring himself two minutes before the break.

Ashley Proberts converted a penalty soon after half-time and Cable nabbed his second near the end.

That result came as a relief to Soham, who could still be vulnerable if the bottom three find some form. They remain seven points above Wakering after failing to make the most of Dan Cotton's third-minute goal.

Visitors Romford levelled through Kurt Smith just before the break and clinched a 2-1 victory with a late strike by Jack Barry.

Cheshunt, though, virtually ensured their survival with a 1-0 home win over Chatham. Top scorer Josh Hutchinson netted from Sam Ruff's cross in the 54th minute.

Potters Bar, play-off contenders until recently, suffered their third defeat in four games, going down 3-0 at local rivals Waltham Abbey.

Tom Laxton opened the scoring after ten minutes and Steve Cawley struck twice in three minutes midway through the second half, both from Louis Bristow free-kicks.



VETERAN midfielder Ian Selley revived Whyteleafe's Ryman South survival hopes on Saturday with the goal that earned them a shock 1-0 victory at Folkestone.

Selley, who played over 40 Premiership games for Arsenal and was in the starting line-up for their 1993 FA Cup semi-final win over Spurs, is on loan to Leafe from Kingstonian.

Now aged 37, he scored, fittingly enough, in the 37th minute to lift the bottom club to within four points of Burgess Hill.

It was another major blow to Folkestone's play-off bid as they, and top scorer Stuart King in particular, suffered a second Saturday to forget.

Sent off in the previous week's 5-0 defeat at Walton & Hersham, King this time had an 18th-minute penalty saved by Paul Smith, hit a post and had a late goal disallowed.

Burgess Hill, meanwhile, find themselves in increased danger of the sole relegation place after going down 1-0 at home to Corinthian-Casuals.

Rob Stevenson scored after 22 minutes and the bar denied Tyrone Berry an equaliser in the closing stages.

Hillians still have that four-point cushion but have a tougher run-in than Leafe, whom they host in a potentially decisive Easter Saturday fixture.

There was no change at the top end of the table, where Bognor and Dulwich both made quite sure of play-off places, at least, with home victories.

Bognor slightly increased their goal-difference advantage – they also have a game in hand – with three unanswered goals against Hythe.

Harvey Whyte, on loan from Havant, headed the opener on 27 minutes. The last time the name Whyte appeared on a Bognor scoresheet was in 1986 when his father Dallas, who made over 100 appearances for the Rocks, netted his last goal for them.

James Crane tucked the ball into an empty net in the 54th minute and Kane Wills wrapped it up 13 minutes later.

Dulwich's first-half pressure went unrewarded until moments before the interval, when Ishmail Kamara put them ahead against Sittingbourne. Sol Pinnock added the second midway through the second half.

Whitehawk remained three points behind the leaders, with a game in hand on Dulwich, with a 2-1 victory at Faversham.

James Fraser broke the deadlock in the 40th minute and Sam Fisk made it 2-0 ten minutes after the break.

Dave Botterill replied with a 64th-minute penalty but Hawks held out to remain in the thick of the title race.

Worthing moved into fourth place, albeit a distant one, thanks to Steve Metcalf's eighth-

minute goal which was enough for a 1-0 win at Walton Casuals.

Folkestone stay fifth, despite their defeat, ahead of Maidstone who had no game.

That was because Godalming, having roared into the race by winning five of their previous six outings, missed the chance to move into the top five by going down 2-1 at home to Walton & Hersham.

They fell behind to a Warren Harris goal two minutes before half-time. But G's failed to capitalise and, after Graeme Purdy scrambled an equaliser with ten minutes left, Jason Henry scored the winner in added time.

With the sides ahead of them unable to take a firm grip on the play-off race, Chipstead brought themselves back into contention with a thumping 4-1 win at Ramsgate.

Matt York's second-minute free-kick set them on their way and Bruce Hogg added another just before the interval.

Luke Coleman scored against his former club to make it 3-0 in the 56th minute and, after Ian Pulman missed a penalty for the hosts, Coleman struck again with 12 minutes left.

Pascal Ebigo managed a late consolation for Rams.

Whitstable's five-match winning streak ended with a 3-2 defeat at Merstham but for some time they looked on course to extend it as they hit back from an early goal for the hosts by James Evans.

Jake Beecroft and Stuart Vahid put the Oystermen ahead by half-time.

Fabio Saravia levelled it again with a 73rd-minute penalty, after which it became ten-a-side with the dismissals of James Fray and Whitstable's Laurence Harvey.

Merstham stole maximum points in added time when George Benner diverted Roscoe Dsane's cross into his own net.

Eastbourne mastered a poor playing surface at Crawley Down well enough to win 2-1.

Danny Curd opened the scoring on 15 minutes and Ross Treleaven added a second 20 minutes after the break.

Fraser Logan pulled one back with an 80th-minute penalty but that was all the Anvils could manage.
