GOOD FRIDAY

THERE were only two games but they packed in a whole season's worth of drama and produced the perfect finish to keep the title race bubbling in the build-up to the big game between Hornchurch and Billericay on Monday.

Billericay kicked off their home game against Carshalton, a side much better away than on their own turf, with a four-point lead over Hornchurch, who themselves were visiting a Tooting side without a win in ten games and without a point in seven.

It was Billericay who had the flying start when a cross by Sam Lechmere was turned into his own net by Kieran Murphy with three minutes on the clock.

The Blues continued to have the upper hand until the closing stages of the first half, when Luke Pigden and Ola Sogbanmu went close for the Robins.

But it was the hosts who almost grabbed a crucial second goal on the stroke of half-time as a Dave Collis shot crashed against the bar.

Hornchurch, meanwhile, were applying plenty of pressure at Tooting without anything to show for it, although a Lewis Smith header was turned on to a post by former Urchin keeper Darren Behcet moments before the break.

Billy Crook missed a sitter for Carshalton early in the second half but they conjured up an equaliser in the 74th minute when Sogbanmu set up the chance for Sonny Ayres to score.

The news quickly reached Tooting, but the delight of the visiting fans soon turned to gloom as Jerome Walker put in a low cross for Connor French to give the Terrors a shock 75th-minute lead.

Both title contenders piled on the pressure and it was Urchins who were rewarded.

Tooting had not kept a clean sheet since April 16 last year and their hopes of ending that dismal run were shattered when Martin Tuohy fired home from a tight angle to level the scores on 83 minutes.

Carshalton keeper Nick Hamann was performing wonders at New Lodge, making superb saves from Jay May and Rob Swaine.

Then Hornchurch were awarded a 87th-minute penalty when Lewis Smith was upended by Jordan Binns.

Tuohy duly sent Behcet the wrong way for his 30th goal of the season and his 27th in the league, making him once again the leader of the golden boot race.

There was almost a further twist as Billericay's Glenn Poole struck a post with a 30-yard free-kick in the 89th minute but it finished 1-1 there and, with Hornchurch holding on to their 2-1 lead, Billericay's advantage was down to two points and both teams now had their fate in their own hands with four games to go.

SATURDAY

WITH neither of the title contenders in action, attention focused on the battle for play-off places.

Bury and Wealdstone emerged as the day's big winners as promotion nerves seemed to afflict all the other contenders.

Bury moved seven points clear in fourth place with a hard-earned 1-0 victory at Met Police, whose own hopes suffered a severe setback.

John Sands scored the all-important goal after only eight minutes. He also had a shot cleared off the line and hit the bar. The Met had Jake Gallagher dismissed nine minutes before half-time but came close to snatching a point with a strong finish.

It lifted Bury to within two points of Lowestoft, who have a game in hand, before Monday's Suffolk derby at Bury and it seems certain that the pair will clash again in the play-off semi-finals, with only home advantage to be decided.

Even that may be a dubious benefit: Bury were at home in last season's semi-final but the Trawlerboys won 2-1.

Chris Henderson, who scored Bury's goal in that game, was Lowestoft's hero on Saturday, netting both goals in their 2-2 draw with relegation-threatened Leatherhead.

He opened the scoring on 34 minutes but the Trawlerboys were stunned by two goals in quick succession soon after half-time. Greg Andrews equalised with a penalty after a foul on Harry Ottaway, who then put his side ahead.

There were only eight minutes left when Henderson levelled matters again and Tanners keeper Chico Ramos pulled two fine saves as the home side went all out for a late winner.

Wealdstone moved to within two points of fifthplaced Cray with a game in hand – they also have a far better goal difference than any of the other contenders for fifth place - after a convincing second-half performance earned them a 4-1 home win over Kingstonian.

K's, desperate for three points to stay in the hunt themselves, had lan Gayle sent off after 25 minutes and fell behind to Lee Chappell's 20-yard drive in the 38th minute.

The visitors drew level briefly when Bobby Traynor converted a 53rd-minute penalty but Richard Jolly's volley quickly restored Stones' lead and made him

once again the league's joint-top scorer with 27 goals. It was his 43rd in all competitions.

Stones dominated after that, with Tom Pett hitting a post before goals from Peter Dean and Connor Smith wrapped up the points.

Cray themselves hung on to fifth spot despite going down 2-1 at home to Harrow, who enhanced their survival prospects greatly with their second away win in four days.

It all went wrong for Cray after Tommy Whitnell gave them a 28th-minute lead from the spot. Tristan Toney equalised four minutes after the break and Danny Buckle put Harrow ahead with 14 minutes left.

Whitnell then had another penalty saved by Jamie Jackson and a second yellow card for Sam Long completed a wretched second half for the Wands.

Lewes moved up to sixth, level on points with Cray, but will rue two dropped points from a 0-0 draw at Aveley, for whom the result confirmed relegation even though they moved up a place to 20th.

Aveley keeper Paul McCartney was his side's hero, denying Steve Robinson, Ian Draycott and Paul Booth.

Hendon dropped to seventh after slumping to a 3-0 home defeat at the hands of Margate. They tried to rally after Tommy Murphy lobbed an early goal; Casey Maclaren hit the bar and then won a penalty, only to see Simon Overland save Elliott Godfrey's weak kick.

Margate took command after that and Murphy hit a post before the interval, then doubled the lead in the 68th minute. Tom Bradbrook notched the third in added time.

Canvey were another side who would have moved into the top five with a win, but they went down 3-2 at home to Wingate. It was harder work for the visitors than it should have been after the islanders had John Easterford sent off as early as the fifth minute.

David Laird hit the bar with the resulting penalty but made amends with the opening goal shortly afterwards. Leon Smith's 21st league goal immediately after half-time doubled the lead.

But the ten men were level by the 53rd minute with strikes from Jay Curran and Dean Mason, and they might have gone ahead before Laird's perfect chip provided Wingate's winner 12 minutes from time.

Concord's challenge also faltered with a 1-1 draw at Hastings. Josh Jirbandey put the hosts ahead early in the second half but Tony Stokes responded two minutes later with his 24th goal of the season.

It was an invaluable point for Hastings, keeping them three points ahead of Leatherhead in the battle to avoid the fourth relegation place.

Horsham, long since down, were thrashed 5-1 by East Thurrock to make it 16 home defeats in 19 games. The Hornets held out until the last minute of the first half, when Kye Ruel broke the deadlock.

Sam Higgins ended Horsham's resistance with a second goal two minutes after the restart and, after Matt Hall made it 3-0, Higgins headed his 23rd league goal and 32nd in all.

Charlie Farmer managed a consolation effort for the hosts before Kris Newby completed the nap hand with the last kick of the game.

EASTER MONDAY

BILLERICAY maintained their two-point advantage at the top of the table with a goalless draw in their showdown at title rivals Hornchurch.

A four-figure crowd saw a game dominated by defences.

Hornchurch were restricted to one real goal attempt, a first-half header by Rickie Hayles which was easily saved by Dale Brightly.

Jay May and Courtney White wasted good chances for the leaders, and Glenn Poole had a late chip headed off the line by Joe Anderson. Billericay also found the net in added time at the end of each half, with headers by Rob Swaine and Junior Luke, but both efforts were disallowed.

Billericay look to have the easier run-in, meeting mid-table sides East Thurrock at home and Margate away before entertaining Lowestoft on the final Saturday.

Hornchurch face trips to play-off contenders Wealdstone and in-form Harrow, finishing with a home game against Leatherhead, who are making a strong bid to avoid relegation.

Lowestoft are six points behind Hornchurch with a game in hand after a dramatic 3-2 victory at nineman Bury.

Sam Reed put Bury ahead in the second minute but they had Tom Bullard sent off in the 24th minute after conceding a penalty from which Dean Sinclair made it 1-1.

Sam Nunn restored Bury's lead five minutes later, however, with Sam Gaughran replying seven minutes into the second half.

Dan Cunningham's dismissal in the 84th minute gave Lowestoft a two-man advantage which Lubo Guentchev turned into three points deep into added time.

Bury are now five points behind Lowestoft and four points ahead of Cray, with both clubs having a match in hand.

Cray retained their hold on fifth place with a 3-1 victory at Margate.

Sam Long atoned for his dismissal on Saturday with a 33^{rd} -minute opener but Margate were level almost at once through John Beales.

James Darvill put Cray ahead again midway through the second half and a Tommy Whitnell penalty made sure of full points.

Two points still cover the four leading playoff contenders, though Cray have played one fewer

game than the other three. But Wealdstone, three points further back and not in league action today, have two games in hand on Cray and three on the rest.

They were not in league action today and must have been disappointed that none of their immediate rivals dropped points.

Lewes remain behind Cray, whom they visit on Saturday, only on goal difference after a 2-1 win over Hastings. Nathan Crabb scored in the 12th minute, getting the slightest of touches to Harry Harding's free-kick, and Max Howell made it 2-0 late in the first half. The visitors pulled one back through Scott Manning with seven minutes left but could not avert a defeat which sees them slip into the relegation zone.

Hendon are a point behind after shaking off Saturday's 3-0 home defeat by Margate to hit five unanswered goals at Wingate. Four came in the first 33 minutes, all from corners, with strikes by Isaiah Rankin and Casey Maclaren followed by two in four minutes from Dave Diedhiou.

To make matters worse still for the home side, David Laird was sent off in the 35th minute. But they avoided further damage until the 89th minute, when Carl McCluskey completed the nap hand.

Next in line are Canvey, a point behind Hendon, after they won 2-1 at island rivals Concord, virtually ending their play-off hopes in the process. Canvey scored in the third minute of each half through Ashley Dumas and Danny Heale.

John Easterford, sent off after just five minutes on Saturday, lasted the distance this time and must have had mixed feelings about it after his 90th-minute own goal provided the Beachboys' consolation.

Kingstonian maintained their mathematical chances of reaching the play-offs with a 2-1 home win over Met Police. Allan Tait gave them a ninth-minute lead and also netted the late winner after Aaron Goode's 74th-minute own goal brought the Met level.

East Thurrock made it nine goals for the weekend by coming from behind to beat relegated Aveley 4-1. Jack Stevenson put the visitors ahead midway through the first half but Spencer Harrison, a Miller until recently, equalised five minutes later.

Sam Higgins put Rocks ahead with a penalty soon after half-time, his $33^{\rm rd}$ league and cup goal, and further strikes soon followed from Kye Ruel and Ben Wood.

Tooting are officially relegated after going down 3-0 at Carshalton, for whom Paul Vines fired a hat-trick. He scored in the 17th, 55th and 64th minutes.

But Leatherhead are out of the bottom four, moving above Hastings with a 2-1 home win over Horsham. Tommy Hutchings set Tanners on their way in the 10th minute only for Ray Freeman to level it ten minutes before half-time. A Mark Simmons penalty midway through the second half condemned Hornets to their 30th defeat in 39 games.



SATURDAY

The circumstances were not quite as dramatic, but Ilford goalie Rob Budd may have earned a place in his club's folklore after netting the only goal of their home game against Potters Bar.

Budd's free-kick from his own penalty area in the 75th minute beat his opposite number Matt Bennett and gave his side a five-point cushion in the relegation battle.

Leaders Leiston suffered their first defeat since October 26 when they were beaten 3-1 at Tilbury, a result that gave a huge boost to Tilbury's play-off challenge.

Neil Calver's foul on Emile Aiken in the 27th minute earned him a booking and allowed Alex Read to fire Dockers ahead from the spot, making himself the division's top scorer with 22 league goals in the process.

The offence proved doubly costly for Leiston when Calver was booked again shortly before the interval, leaving his side to play the whole second half with ten men.

Nevertheless, they drew level on the hour when a shot by Michael Brothers eluded the grasp of home keeper James Marrable.

Jack West restored Dockers' lead in the 80th minute, his first goal since his return from Heybridge, and as Leiston threw men forward in added time Read broke away unchallenged to clinch a well-deserved victory.

Enfield Town closed the gap at the top to five points with a 1-0 victory at third-placed Needham Market. Veteran Bryan Hammatt, who had already hit the bar, netted his first goal of the season eight minutes after half-time.

A fierce shot by Lee Flynn in the 75th minute enabled Grays to stay in fourth place with a 1-1 home draw against Chatham, who had taken a surprise lead when Lloyd Blackman chipped the ball over stranded keeper Tony Tucker in the 56th minute.

Sudbury moved into sixth place, four points adrift, by beating and overtaking Harlow. Their 1-0 win in Essex owed much to keeper Danny Gay and was secured by Russell Pond's 35th-minute goal.

Redbridge kept their hopes alive with a 2-1 home win over Great Wakering. Joe Gardner put the Motormen ahead on the half-hour but Michael Toner missed a penalty just before the break and Wakering drew level on the hour through Jay Nash.

James Robinson hit the winner ten minutes later, a major blow to Wakering and their player-manager

Dan Trenkel, who was part of the Redbridge side that enjoyed that remarkable FA Cup run earlier in the season.

Thanks to Budd, Wakering were left five points behind Ilford and only one ahead of bottom club Ware, who kept their remote survival hopes alive with a 2-1 victory at Thamesmead.

Two goals in the first eight minutes of the second half, a Jordan Gill penalty and a Lewis Rolfe shot, did the trick although James Donovan's header reduced the arrears on 70 minutes and Rolfe was sent off near the end.

Ryan Wade, back at Cheshunt after a spell with Redbridge, scored twice in their 3-1 home win over Romford. His goals came after 31 and 47 minutes, and an own goal by Matt Toms midway through the second half wrapped up the points. Joe Oates netted a late Boro consolation.

Maldon chalked up their third successive win and continued their climb towards the top half of the table, netting three unanswered goals at home to Waltham Forest.

Joe Pearman opened the scoring on the hour, Ross Wall added a second and Leon Antoine wrapped it up at the end.

An 88th-minute goal by Neil Andrews gave Soham a 1-1 home draw with Heybridge, who had gone ahead in the 63rd minute through Tyler Corlett.

The result was the same at Waltham Abbey, where Steve Cawley's penalty gave the hosts a 14th-minute lead and Brentwood replied on the stroke of half-time through Lee Blackburn.

EASTER MONDAY

LEISTON will clinch the title if they win at Maldon on Saturday, having beaten Needham Market 3-0 to go seven points clear at the top.

The all-Suffolk battle remained scoreless until the 57th minute, when Gareth Heath found the target. Marketmen stayed in contention until six minutes from time, when Leon Ottley-Gooch made it 2-0, and Heath added a late penalty.

Second-placed Enfield, having made up three points on Saturday, handed two of them back in a 1-1 home draw with Waltham Abbey. And they were relieved to manage even a point after Loren Maxwell gave the Abbotts an 89th-minute lead. There was just enough time for Walid Matata to reply.

Needham remain third but now lead Tilbury only on goal difference after the Dockers grabbed a last-gasp winner at Great Wakering.

Alex Read, the division's top scorer, netted his 24th league goal from the penalty spot in the 13th minute only for Jay Nash to reply for Wakering seven minutes later. That was it until the fourth minute of added time, when Emiel Aiken sealed a 2-1 win and sent Wakering to the foot of the table.

Grays should have made it a triple tie on points for third place after Joao Carlos scored twice soon after half-time at Romford. But Jack Barry pulled one back in the 80th minute and Kurt Smith made it 2-2 two minutes later.

So Grays dropped to fifth place and are only two points ahead of Sudbury, who enjoyed a comfortable 4-1 home win over Soham. That included a hat-trick for James Baker which took his league tally to 23, just one behind Read.

He opened the scoring in the 17th minute and Chris Bryan added another before the interval.

Dubi Ogbonna reduced the arrears with a penalty in the 68th minute but Soham immediately conceded a spot-kick at the other end and Baker obliged before completing his treble with 11 minutes left.

Two points further back are Redbridge, who maintained their play-off hopes with a 7-2 romp at Waltham Forest.

James Robinson, Joe Gardner and Mitchell Das, with a penalty, put them 3-0 up before Nicolas Bondon gave Forest a glimmer of hope on the stroke of half-time.

It was short-lived, for Gardner scored twice in the first eight minutes after the break. Dominic Okianu got Forest's second but Robinson responded with his own second before Eddie Hart completed the rout.

Harlow slumped to their second 1-0 defeat of the weekend to slip six points behind Grays and almost out of the picture. Jordan Gill's 33rd-minute penalty earned Ware their second Easter victory and they are off the foot of the table.

They remain six points adrift of possible safety, however, thanks to Ilford's 3-1 away success over Brentwood in a game played at Redbridge because of a problem with Brentwood's own ground.

Much improved of late, Ilford scored twice in the closing stages of the first half through Johnathan Glowacki and Rob Carter.

Martyn Stokes pulled one back six minutes after the interval but Carter struck again on the hour to lift llford into 19th place, above Soham on goal difference.

Thamesmead won 2-1 at Chatham, taking the lead with a David Noel goal five minutes after half-time only to lose it to an instant equaliser from Brad Potter. Jack Hopkins nabbed the winner in the 70th minute

Heybridge won the battle of Maldon on home turf thanks to a 32nd-minute goal by Luke Callander and a penalty save which denied Ollie Berquez a Maldon leveller.

Cheshunt's Ryan Wade made no mistake in a similar situation. His 73rd-minute penalty gave Cheshunt a 1-1 draw at Potters Bar, for whom Josh Urquhart had provided a lead just after the break.



SATURDAY

MOST of the promotion-chasers were in top form. The odd team out were Worthing, who forfeited a half-time lead and went down 2-1 at Merstham.

Ryan McBride scored a 27th-minute opener for the Rebels, but Roscoe Dsane levelled matters with a 69th-minute penalty and then rounded keeper Alan Mansfield to net the winner six minutes from time.

Worthing hung on to fifth place but on goal difference from Maidstone, who had no game, and Godalming, who romped to a 4-0 home win over Corinthian-Casuals.

Dan Read's header gave G's an early lead and Darren Wheeler's lob made it 2-0 on the half-hour. Scott Harris added the third in the 71st minute and Jon Palmer completed a good afternoon for the hosts as time ran out.

The top four marched on, led by Dulwich who were 3-0 home winners over Chipstead. Ishmail Kamara headed home a free-kick to give them the lead on 27 minutes.

Chips, needing points to maintain their play-off challenge, then held out until the last six minutes when Ryan James made it 2-0 and Kamara headed his second.

Bognor remained two points behind with a game in hand after beating Sittingbourne 4-2 in Sussex, though they had a real scare along the way.

It all seemed straightforward enough when Sonny Cobbs opened the scoring in the 11th minute, Terry Dodd added another on the half-hour and Ben Johnson made it 3-0 just before the break.

The Brickies suffered a further blow soon after the interval when keeper Adam Woodward was injured and replaced by midfielder Calum McGeehan.

Bognor failed to take advantage, though, and found themselves in trouble as Elie Kayembe and Rob Lyall pulled it back to 3-2 with 13 minutes left.

A clash between Bognor's Stuart Axten and the visitors' Bradley Spice led to a red card for each man in the closing stages, and Rocks finally made sure of victory through Ashley Robinson in added time

Whitehawk made sure they can finish no lower than third with a 3-0 victory at Ramsgate to remain three points behind Bognor. Paul Armstrong put them ahead in the 11th minute and Jamahl Hughes added another in the 24th minute.

Ian Pulman hit the bar as Rams tried to rally before Hughes wrapped it up ten minutes from time.

Folkestone came from behind to beat visitors Crawley Down 4-1 and give themselves a six-point cushion in fourth place. Tom Burton netted for the Anvils after 16 minutes but the hosts were level eight minutes later as Darren Marsden made the most of a loose ball.

Darren Smith's volley just before the break put Folkestone ahead, Marsden claimed his second in the 73rd minute and James Everitt headed the fourth shortly afterwards.

It was Whyteleafe's day at the other end of the table. They powered off the bottom with a 4-0 win at Burgess Hill, who replaced them in the sole relegation place.

Three goals in the last 11 minutes of the first half settled the issue, two from Omar Folkes sandwiching one by Chris Sessegnon. Ian Selley put the icing on the cake for Leafe with a 75th-minute free-kick.

There were 1-0 home wins for Eastbourne and Walton Casuals. Danny Curd's 75th-minute goal saw off Whitstable at Eastbourne, the bar denying Stuart Vahid a late equaliser, while Nathan Avery's 54th-minute header accounted for Hythe at Walton.

Faversham took an eight-minute lead through Dave Botterill's free-kick but went down 2-1 at home to Walton & Hersham. Harry Smart equalised on 33 minutes, also with a free-kick, and Graeme Purdy grabbed the winner five minutes from time.

EASTER MONDAY

THERE'S nothing Worthing like more than putting one over on neighbours Bognor and that was what they did. Bognor travelled to Woodside Road needing a win to return to the top of the table but went down 1-0 to a 78th-minute goal by Ryan McBride.

Worthing might even have been able to forgive the fact that McBride was sent off for the third time this season a few minutes later.

The result means that Dulwich, who had a day off, stay two points clear of Bognor at the top and both sides now have three games left. Whitehawk will also be two points off the pace if they win their home game against Eastbourne tonight (Tuesday).

Four teams are contending for the other two play-off places and they all won, with Folkestone maintaining their advantage in fourth place by winning 2-0 at Hythe.

Aiming to avenge an 8-0 Boxing Day massacre, Hythe held out until midway through the second half, when Darren Marsden and Josh Burchell scored in quick succession.

Three clubs are six points behind Folkestone, all with a game in hand, with Worthing heading the trio on goal difference.

Then come Godalming, whose 2-1 victory at Chipstead effectively ended the hosts' slim hopes of getting into the play-off mix.

Here, too, it was scoreless until the mid-point of the second half, when Dan Read put G's ahead. Luke Coleman soon made it 1-1 but Read struck again with ten minutes left.

Just behind G's are Maidstone, for whom Baff Addae scored the only goal of their visit to Corinthian-Casuals in the 24th minute.

Merstham chalked up their fifth successive victory to move up to seventh place but they have left their run too late: they are seven points short of the playoff spots with only two games left.

They twice fell behind at Whyteleafe, for whom Ian Selley netted after 32 and 57 minutes, the latter a penalty.

Dean Gunner equalised just before the interval, Adam Moriarty did the same in the 73rd minute and Liam Wright sealed a 3-2 win with seven minutes left.

Leafe had Adam Broomhead sent off when it was 1-1, though Merstham missed the resulting penalty.

So Whyteleafe remain in danger at the foot of the table, leading bottom club Burgess Hill only on goal difference.

But Hillians, beaten 4-0 at home by their relegation rivals on Saturday, have a doomed air about them, having lost their last six games with goal figures of 1-26.

Their latest thrashing was at Crawley Down, for whom Tom Burton hit a nine-minute hat-trick either side of half-time in a 5-0 victory.

Fraser Logan scored early in the game and a late own goal completed the rout.

Sittingbourne, not quite out of the woods, came from 2-0 down to pick up a useful home point against Faversham and move six points clear of the bottom two.

James Peacock opened the scoring on 34 minutes and Dave Botterill added another before the break. Elie Kayembe pulled one back in the 58th minute and Joe Nwoko made it 2-2 eight minutes later.

Graeme Purdy fired a hat-trick as Walton & Hersham beat neighbouring Casuals 4-1.

His opener, a 27th-minute penalty, brought a quick reply from Mike Corbett.

An own goal restored the lead on the hour and Purdy netted twice in the last couple of minutes to clinch it.

The other game, between Whitstable and Ramsgate, finished scoreless.


