Premier

BILLERICAY need two points from their last two games – and effectively just one, thanks to their goal difference – to clinch their first Ryman League championship.

They moved to the brink of the title by beating East Thurrock 1-0 at New Lodge on Saturday despite playing most of the game with ten men, while rivals Hornchurch went down 2-1 at Wealdstone.

Blues striker Jay May departed midway through the first half after receiving his second yellow card but the ten men took the lead on the stroke of half-time with a close-range strike by Harrison Chatting.

Rocks tried hard to get back into the game but Billericay held out, though they finished the game with nine men and midfielder Dave Collis between the posts after keeper Dale Brightly was sent off in added time.

Hornchurch's title hopes all but vanished at Wealdstone, who went ahead after 27 minutes when Scott Fitzgerald headed home a corner.

Tom Pett has received rave reviews since joining Stones from Potters Bar and he doubled the lead with a brilliant solo effort on 40 minutes, his first goal for the club.

Urchins, with 15 away wins under their belts, pulled one back in the 57th minute, Lewis Smith's 20th goal of the season.

But all their efforts to draw level were frustrated, notably when Jonathan Hunt's 90th-minute effort hit the underside of the bar and came out.

Lowestoft clinched their play-off place with a 3-2 home win over Carshalton, though they had to wait until the 91st minute for Michael Frew's decider.

They are three points behind Hornchurch with a game in hand but a much inferior goal difference.

Rob Eagle put the Trawlerboys ahead after three minutes and he did it again immediately after Paul Vines levelled matters in the 18th minute.

Sonny Ayres made it 2-2 early in the second half and when Nathan Stone was sent off shortly afterwards Lowestoft's hopes of victory looked slim.

But Frew's long-range rocket did the job and the Robins had Craig Tanner sent off before the end.

Bury are almost certain to finish fourth after their 2-1 victory at relegated Aveley.

Billy Clark's seventh-minute opener for the visitors was answered by Kayan Kalipha in the 19th minute and Bury had to wait until the 71st minute for the headed winner from John Sands.

Lewes moved into the fifth play-off place with a lone-goal success at Cray, evicting their hosts who drop three places to eighth.

Cray had most of the play but could not reply to lan Draycott's 22nd-minute header.

Four teams remain in contention for the play-off spot now occupied by the Sussex club. Hendon are a point behind them after a 2-1 home win over Kingstonian, whose last hopes vanished.

Saheed Sankoh put K's ahead after seven minutes but Hendon were level within 90 seconds through Carl McCluskey. They had to wait until the 81st minute for their winner from substitute Jack Mazzone.

A point further back are Canvey thanks to their 3-1 home win over a Leatherhead side who sank deeper into relegation trouble.

Elliot Thompson raised the Tanners' survival hopes with a 33rd-minute goal but Canvey equalised shortly before half-time when Ashley Dumas scored direct from a corner for the second game in a row.

Tanners, already without Greg Andrews through suspension, were left short of firepower when Tommy Hutchings was forced to miss the second half through injury. Dan Dean headed into his own net to give Canvey the lead on the hour and Leon Gordon made sure.

Cray are next in the queue behind Canvey, now three points behind Lewes but with a game in hand and a superior goal difference.

Wealdstone, though are the only side with their fate in their own hands. They are four points behind Lewes but have two matches in hand and will finish fifth, at worst, if they win their four remaining fixtures.

Hastings gave a huge boost to their survival hopes with a 3-1 home win over Harrow, their first success in six outings and Harrow's first defeat in four.

Zac Attwood broke the deadlock four minutes after half-time and struck again in the 70th minute. Jon-Jo Bates quickly put Harrow back in contention but a fine strike by Bradley Goldberg clinched it for the hosts.

They are now level on points with Harrow, trailing them by two goals, and both are three points ahead of 19th-placed Leatherhead with all three teams having two matches left. It might yet be important that Tanners have a better goal difference than the two sides above them.

Rock-bottom Horsham conceded their 100th goal of the season in their 2-1 home defeat by Wingate, who themselves made quite sure of survival in the Premier debut season.

David Laird opened the scoring on 47 minutes and also claimed the ton-up goal on the hour. Horsham pulled one back with a Dan Morris penalty in the 65th minute but could not avert their 17th home defeat.

The other Premier debutants, Met Police, have had a satisfactory season through a poor recent run has ended their play-off hopes.

They moved back into the top half of the table with a 3-0 home win over Concord, who also dropped out of the play-off picture. Jake Gallagher put the Met ahead on 14 minutes, Staforde Palmer lobbed the second seven minutes later and Gallagher wrapped it up in added time.

The other game saw relegated Tooting collect their first point in ten games and edge above Aveley into 20th place. Matt Bodkin's free-kick put visiting Margate ahead on the half-hour and Lee



Hall replied from long range soon after the break.

LEISTON missed their first chance to clinch the title in their debut season as they went down 3-1 at Maldon on Saturday.

They need at least a draw at nearest rivals Enfield Town this coming weekend if they are to prevent the race going into the final Saturday.

Joe Pearman put Maldon ahead on nine minutes and Leiston struggled to find a way through the home defence until David Head equalised five minutes after half-time.

The Suffolk side must have been confident at that stage but it was not to be. Sos Yao restored Maldon's lead in the 72nd minute and Ross Wall made sure.

The odds are still against Enfield, who are four points behind after their crushing 5-0 derby victory at Cheshunt.

Liam Hope's 14th-minute penalty was the only goal of the first half and he converted another spot-kick two minutes after the break.

That was his 24th league goal, putting him level with Tilbury's Alex Read and Sudbury's James Baker in the race for the division's golden boot.

Walid Matata made it 3-0 midway through the half, igniting a burst of three goals in 11 minutes. Adam Wallace and Bryan Hammatt completed the rout.

Tilbury stepped up to third place and need one point to book a play-off spot after edging out Potters Bar at Chadfields. Joe Nightingill scored the only goal on the hour.

Dockers moved above Needham Market, whose decline continued when they were held to a 3-3 home draw by Romford.

Danny Bloomfield gave the Marketmen a second-minute lead but they wasted chances after that and Joe Bingham's 25-yarder levelled it shortly before half-time.

Needham regained the lead on 55 minutes and became the first team in the league to reach the 100-goal mark. The goal came from the penalty spot and, perhaps fittingly, it was scored by top marksman Sam Newson, his first since November. He had not regained his lethal form after missing several weeks through injury.

When Duane Wright made it 3-1 in the 73rd minute it seemed that Needham had secured the win which would have made sure of a play-off spot. But two goals in as many minutes from Kurt Smith and Paul Clayton squared it.

Grays now trail Needham only on goal difference after a 2-0 home win over Brentwood.

Joao Carlos struck after five minutes and Danny Charge added another on the half-hour.

A clash between Jake Hall and Brentwood's Darren Blewitt brought red cards for both men and there was no further scoring.

Two other sides retain play-off hopes but they are now distant.

Redbridge are four points adrift after two late goals wrapped up a 3-1 home win over Heybridge, who had taken the lead through Solomon Ofori in the third minute.

Mitchell Das made it 1-1 with a 14th-minute penalty but there was no further scoring until the 88th minute, when Ryan Murray put the Motormen ahead. Das added another.

Sudbury are a further point back with their promotion hopes virtually ended by a 2-1 defeat at Thamesmead after Baker had given them a 17th-minute lead with that 24th goal.

That looked likely to settle a game of few chances, but Danny Kerrigan equalised in the 71st minute and Chuck Duru completed the comeback with seven minutes left.

Harlow's lingering play-off hopes were killed off by visiting Waltham Forest, who came from 2-0 down to snatch a 3-2 victory with a goal by Joel Palmer in the fourth minute of added time.

Beaten 7-2 at home in their previous outing, Forest looked set for another hiding as Piers Wixon, with a penalty, and Daniel Elmes put the Hawks 2-0 up in the first half-hour.

But Forest fought back so well that they were level five minutes later thanks to goals from Jamie Moore and Chris Taylor, and in the end they deserved their victory.

At the other end of the table, Great Wakering are doomed to relegation after their 3-3 draw at Soham.

It was a cruel blow for player-manager Dan Trenkel, doubly so because his 66th-minute goal looked certain to keep his side alive until Dan Cotton netted a last-minute penalty.

Michael Simpson put Soham ahead on 21 minutes but Wakering were level moments later through Ashley Hawkins and Billy Johnson put them ahead before the interval.

Simpson made it 2-2 shortly after the restart but Trenkel thought he had won it before the dramatic conclusion.

The other relegation place is still up for grabs after Ware's 2-1 victory at Ilford, where defeat would have sent them down.

That looked likely when Rob Carter broke the deadlock by heading llford into a 75th-minute lead.

Ware still trailed with four minutes left, but they kept themselves alive when Lewis Rolfe made it 1-1 and Elliot King hit the winner in added time.

Ware's Aime Blessing was sent off but they had to be pleased with a win which leaves them three points behind Ilford and four behind Soham.

A 25-yard drive by Lewis Bristow just after the hour was enough to give Waltham Abbey a 1-0 home win over Chatham in the day's other fixture.



TWO well-taken early goals by Whitehawk striker James Fraser changed the picture in the title race on Saturday.

Fraser put Hawks 2-0 up in 16 minutes at leaders Dulwich and a fine rearguard action masterminded by Sami El-Abd ensured that it was the final score, despite heavy pressure by the hosts.

So Hawks moved a point above Dulwich – but the chief beneficiaries of Fraser's double were Bognor, whose 4-1 home victory over Whyteleafe took them back to the top of the table, ahead of Hawks on goal difference.

Ashley Robinson put Rocks ahead midway through the first half but Leafe, desperate for points in the survival battle, replied on the half-hour through Omar Folkes.

Their hopes of a precious draw were shattered after the interval. Terry Dodd converted a cross from Ben Johnson in the 50th minute and was then brought down for a penalty which Robinson netted in the 61st minute.

Dan Beck added the fourth, Bognor's 100th league goal of the season, and after missing out so narrowly a year ago the Rocks know that victories in their last two games will take them up. Anything less, and they could find themselves in the play-offs again.

Folkestone need one point to be sure of their play-off spot, though they will have to get it at Chipstead this coming weekend as that is their only remaining fixture.

They beat Hythe 8-0 earlier in the season and threatened to do something similar as they powered into an early 3-0 lead against Sittingbourne.

The Brickies were stunned by a James Everitt header less than 20 seconds into the game and, after he grabbed his second in the 16th minute, Stuart King wasted no time in adding a third.

It could have been 4-0 shortly afterwards but Adam Woodward saved King's penalty and Folkestone's momentum was lost.

Josh Burchell got their fourth soon after half-time but it was the Brickies who had the last word with a Calum McGeehan consolation on the hour.

Maidstone are back in fifth place after cruising to a 3-0 home win over Chipstead.

They were 2-0 up in 19 minutes through Shaun Welford and Sam Bewick but had to wait until the 90th minute for their third, from Alex Waugh.

That late strike was more than icing on the cake: without it, Godalming would now be fifth after thumping Crawley Down 5-2.

Jamie McClurg's powerful drive put G's ahead after eight minutes and a Darren Wheeler penalty made it 2-0 on the half-hour.

Hassan Nyang pulled one back but two goals in the first three minutes of the second half, from Warren and Scott Harris, put the game beyond the Anvils.

They did reduce the arrears with a close-range strike by Belahcen El-Assarir but Warren Harris quickly restored the three-goal margin.

Worthing, who started the day in fifth place, now find themselves three points adrift after going down 4-3 at Ramsgate.

With long-serving Jim Ward moving upstairs to the general manager's post, it was the first game in charge for new Rams boss Tim Dixon and it was certainly a lively one.

The first half was all Ramsgate. Aaron Quain got a touch to Gareth Cornhill's free-kick to give them an eighth-minute lead and Ian Pulman made it 2-0 in the 28th minute.

It looked all over for Worthing two minutes later when Glen Woodburn was sent off and Warren Schulz converted the resultant penalty.

Luke Gedling reduced the arrears in the 72nd minute and Rebels glimpsed an unexpected point when Mike Huckett pulled it back to 3-2 with eight minutes left.

Rams were given breathing space by Michael Yianni's 89th-minute goal and they needed it, for there was still time for Hackett to convert a penalty.

Burgess Hill remain at the foot of the table after going down 2-0 at home to Hythe, their seventh successive defeat. Dave Cook did the damage with headed goals at either end of the first half, but missed out on a hat-trick when he fired a late penalty wide.

With only one team going down, it's a straight fight between Hillians and Whyteleafe, who are level on 24 points though Whyteleafe are 22 goals better off.

Sittingbourne are six points ahead of the pair with two games to go but their own goal difference means they are effectively out of danger.

Whitstable may hold the key; they host Hillians this Saturday and travel to Whyteleafe on the final day.

They go into those games on the back of a 2-0 win at Faversham, both goals coming in the last 20 minutes.

Marc Cumberbatch headed them in front and James Morrish made sure.

Josh Bonnett scored his first goals for Walton & Hersham since his New Year's Eve move from Waltham Forest, setting them on their way to a 3-1 victory at Eastbourne.

His double came in five minutes around the halfhour mark, and Jason Henry added a third soon after the interval.

Danny Curd pulled one back and then hit the bar as the hosts tried to rally.

Jamie Byatt's goal on the hour was enough to give Corinthian-Casuals a 1-0 victory at their Walton namesakes.
