ALL THE ACTION

CONGRATULATIONS to Billericay Town, who clinched their first Ryman League title with a week to spare after a 2-2 draw at Margate on Saturday.

The Essex club have been members of the league since 1979; their previous best finish was in 2005 when they were runners-up, six points behind Yeading.

Nerves were showing as they conceded a penalty early in each half at Margate to find themselves 2-0 down, but a Glenn Poole spot-kick with 15 minutes left put them back in the game and centre-back Rob Swaine levelled it five minutes from time with his 14th goal of the season.

Margate's first penalty was converted by Dan Stubbs after six minutes and although Dale Brightly saved his second in the 50th minute Stubbs followed up to net the rebound.

Billericay had been on top, however, and they were eventually rewarded when Poole put them back in the game and Swaine crashed in a header to trigger the celebrations among the massed travelling fans.

As it happened, the comeback was not needed; Billericay would have been champions in any case as their two remaining challengers were both beaten.

Second-placed Hornchurch dominated proceedings but went down 1-0 at Harrow, where Jon-Jo Bates scored midway through the second half, pouncing on a miskick by keeper Joe Woolley.

Urchins had skipper Elliott Styles sent off near the end, ruling him out of the play-off final if they reach it.

Lowestoft paid the price for not having a substitute goalkeeper on the bench. Andy Reynolds suffered an early injury and forward Michael Frew had to take over, helping visiting Hastings to a 3-1 victory, only the second home defeat of the season for the Trawlerboys.

Josh Jirbandey gave Hastings a half-time lead which was wiped out by Chris Henderson shortly after the restart. Bradley Goldberg restored the Sussex club's lead in the 53rd minute and Frew returned to the attack, with defender Matt Halliday taking over between the posts.

It was in vain: Bailo Camara added a third goal in the 76th minute and visiting keeper Matt Armstrong-Ford was defiant at the other end.

Despite the defeats, Hornchurch and Lowestoft will have home advantage in the play-off semi-finals.

But those two results were much more crucial at the other end of the table, for Harrow and Hastings are both now safe from the drop.

Leatherhead, promoted only last season, are doomed to the fourth relegation place after their 2-0 home defeat by Kingstonian, for whom Bobby Traynor and Ryan Woods scored in the last 17 minutes. Tanners had come close to taking the lead when Tommy Hutchings hit the bar.

The battle for the other two play-off places remains wide open, though Bury need only a point from their last game to be secure. They missed the chance to clinch their spot when they were held to a 1-1 home draw by Cray, who are still in contention themselves.

Lee Smith put Bury ahead in the 36th minute but Lewis Perkins produced an instant reply and there were few chances after that.

Bury are two points ahead of Lewes, who held on to the other play-off slot by the skin of their teeth when Harry Harding netted a 90th-minute penalty to give them a 3-2 victory at Concord. Had he missed, they would have finished the day in eighth place and virtually out of the promotion picture.

Before that, Nathan Crabb had given Lewes the lead early in each half, with Kurt Robinson and Karl Beckford equalising for the Beachboys.

Wealdstone are a point behind Lewes but have a game in hand, a visit to Margate on Tuesday. They fell behind in the 28th minute

at Met Police when Sam Hurrell fired home from long range. Alex Dyer replied seven minutes later and the deciding goal nine minutes into the second half came, naturally, from Richard Jolly, his 47th goal of the season and his 31st in the league.

Jolly, who is running in the London Marathon today, is three goals ahead of East Thurrock's Sam Higgins and should finish the season as the league's top scorer, though Higgins also has two games left.

Bury, Lewes and Stones are clear favourites for the remaining play-off places, but three other clubs are still in with a chance.

Hendon demolished relegated Tooting 5-0, set on their way by two early goals by deadline signing Scott Shulton. They are level on points with Wealdstone but have played a game more and have a much worse goal difference.

Isaiah Rankin made it 3-0 midway through the second half, following up his own penalty miss, and late efforts from Greg Ngoyi and Carl McCluskey took Tooting's goals-against tally to 109.

Canvey, one point further back, can only hope that the teams above them slip up. They had a fright of their own, falling behind to a tenth-minute Ryan Marriott goal at bottom club Horsham and then having midfielder Matt Game sent off.

It was the 70th minute before Jay Curran replied and Jason Hallett netted five minutes later to give Canvey a 2-1 win and leave the Hornets with just five points to show for their 21 home games.

The final contenders are Cray, five points behind Lewes but with two matches left. They host Lowestoft on Tuesday, when the visitors will also be seeking points in their bid to overtake Hornchurch for the runners-up spot.

Only two matches had no impact at either end of the table, one of them a goalless draw at Carshalton, where visitors Aveley had the minor pleasure of moving above Tooting into 20th place.

Wingate won 2-1 at East Thurrock in the other fixture, taking a fourth-minute lead when home keeper Jamie Riley's miskick turned Matt Hall's backpass into an own goal.

Leon Smith added another in the 37th minute and Higgins pulled one back with a penalty ten minutes after the break.



LEISTON were moments away from the Ryman North title on Saturday. But the race will go to the last day of the season after Liam Hope kept his cool to convert a 90th-minute penalty and give Enfield Town a 1-0 victory over the leaders.

Four points clear when play started, Leiston needed only a draw and came so close to getting it. But, to the delight of the vast majority of a 600-plus crowd at Donkey Lane, a foul on Adam Wallace allowed Hope to net his 25th goal of the season and trim the gap to one point. It also took him one goal clear in the battle for the division's golden boot.

Leiston must still be favourites. They entertain mid-table Potters Bar next Saturday while Enfield visit Grays, who need a win to have a chance of a home play-off semi-final.

They were one of three teams to clinch the remaining play-off spots. All three are on 77 points and they all had to wait until the second half for their goals.

Needham Market reclaimed third place with a 2-0 win at Chatham. Lee McGlone put them ahead in the 54th minute and, after Chatham more than once went close to an equaliser, Angelo Harrop added a late second.

Nathan Gordon's 55th-minute goal earned Grays their 1-0 success at Waltham Abbey which lifted them into fourth place.

Tilbury, who dropped two places to fifth, cut it very fine. Needing only a draw to book their semi-final spot, they found themselves trailing to a Leon Antoine goal at half-time and had to wait until the 88th minute for Tom Webb's leveller.

That goal ended Redbridge's play-off challenge.

Joe Bricknell fired in a free-kick after 14 minutes to give the Motormen a 1-0 win at Brentwood but they needed some help from the sides above them and find themselves four points adrift with only one match left.

Sudbury also had a remote chance of a play-off place but the other results meant that their 1-0 defeat at Romford made no difference.

Both sides missed first-half penalties, Kurt Smith for Boro and Chris Bryan for Sudbury, and Romford pinched all three points with an 87th-minute volley by Jamie Dicks.

At the other end of the table, Soham are safe after their 2-0 home victory over Ilford. Dubi Ogbonna gave them an early lead with a close-range shot and Jon Brown raced clear to make sure in the last minute.

Ilford are 20th, three points ahead of Ware who went down 2-1 at ten-man Potters Bar. Rob Magwood was sent off just before half-time but the Scholars came out on top with James Gershfield netting either side of Jon Stevenson's equaliser for Ware, who had Dave Bastian dismissed near the end.

Next Saturday Ilford, who also have a three-goal advantage, are at home to Harlow while Ware host Waltham Forest.

Bottom club Great Wakering, already relegated, gave themselves a chance of avoiding the wooden spoon.

An 89th-minute goal by Ashley Hawkins, his second of the game, gave them a 2-1 victory at Waltham Forest and moved them to within a point of Ware. Joel Palmer had made it 1-1 at half-time after Hawkins opened the scoring.

Harlow beat Thamesmead 3-2 thanks to a Daniel Elmes double in the closing stages of the first half. Reece Dobson had put Harlow ahead with Theo Fairweather-Johnson replying. Ashley Probets converted a penalty for the visitors soon after half-time but that ended the scoring.

Cheshunt took an 18th-minute lead through Ryan Wade at Heybridge, who replied through Tom Broadhurst on the hour.

It looked as if it would finish like that, but Anthony McDonald's 88th-minute header put Cheshunt ahead again and Sam Bantick made it 3-1.

A home win over Chipstead will take the trophy to East Brighton Park.

Bognor, pipped for top spot on the final day of last season, now look likely to miss out again.

The only side in the league with an unbeaten home record, they went into Saturday's game as leaders and surely expected to see off visitors Walton & Hersham.

It was not to be so easy. Bognor were lucky not to fall behind in the first half, when Jason Henry twice hit a post, but snatched the lead through Terry Dodd just before the break.

They could not extend their advantage and paid a heavy price when it was third time lucky for Henry, who converted a cross from Phil Williams to make it 1-1 with 14 minutes left and dump the Rocks into third place.

Hawks, meanwhile, took the lead at almost the same moment as Bognor when Paul Armstrong netted at Corinthian-Casuals. But they did not let it slip, running out 3-0 winners with further strikes by James Fraser and Karley Akehurst.

They are a point ahead of Dulwich, who in turn lead Bognor by a point after a 3-1 home win over Faversham.

Adrian Stone put the visitors ahead after six minutes and it took Dulwich a long time to recover. Kevin James levelled the scores in the 52nd minute and Omarr Lawson eventually put Dulwich ahead with 16 minutes left. James struck again well into added time.

Next week Dulwich visit relegation-threatened Burgess Hill while Bognor go to Maidstone, who must win to have a chance of making the play-offs.

Folkestone are the first side in the league to complete their programme and they did it in fine style with a 4-1 win at Chipstead which secured their play-off place. They will finish fourth.

Frankie Chappell put them ahead seven minutes before half-time and Stuart King hit a second-half hat-trick. Andrew Dalhouse scored for Chips, bringing it back to 2-1, but there was no stopping King. His third goal came in the 90th minute and was his 24th in the league, bringing him level with former Bognor striker Jason Prior – who suffered a

broken leg playing for Wimbledon last week – at the top of the division's scorers.

They look certain to share the golden boot, though Maidstone's Shaun Welford netted his 21st of the season to put his side ahead at Walton Casuals. It was to no avail as Casuals claimed a shock 3-2 victory. Josh Gallagher equalised and Nathan Abery put Casuals ahead a minute before the break.

Maidstone hit back seven minutes after the interval, when Jon Boswell conceded a penalty and was red-carded. Baff Addae converted the penalty to make it 2-2 and Stones must have been confident. But Abery grabbed his second five minutes later and that proved to be that.

Stones dropped out of the play-off places and it looks as if they will still be in this division when they make their long-awaited return to their home town next season.

Godalming continued their fine recent form with a 3-1 win at Sittingbourne and moved into fifth place. A single point from their home game against mid-table Eastbourne will be enough to keep them there even if Stones beat Bognor.

G's dominated the first half and took charge with goals from Adam Foulser and Dan Read in the space of four minutes shortly before the break. Hicham Akhazzan hit the bar as the Brickies tried to recover before Read clinched it with his second goal in the

66th minute. Elie Kayembe's free-kick provided late consolation for the home side.

No-one else is in the picture: Worthing's hopes vanished with a 3-1 defeat at Hythe.

Trailing to an early Dave Cook strike, Rebels levelled on the stroke of half-time through top scorer Ryan McBride but fell behind again when Brendon Cass netted two minutes after the restart. James Dryden finished it off.

It's an intriguing situation at the bottom, where Pat Harding's 68th-minute goal was enough to give Burgess Hill a priceless victory at Whitstable.

Hillians are off the bottom and two points ahead of Whyteleafe, who were held to a 1-1 draw at Crawley Down. Reggie Savage's 14th-minute goal gave Leafe a half-time lead and things looked promising for them.

Luke Blewden equalised for the Anvils after 55 minutes and the news from Whitstable completed an unhappy second half for the Surrey side. All is not lost for them: they host Whitstable next week while, as already mentioned, Hillians face a tough game against Dulwich.

There was only one 'meaningless' game in the division and it ended 1-1 at Eastbourne, where Roscoe Dsane gave Merstham a 52nd-minute lead which was wiped out 14 minutes later by Matt Ferdinando.

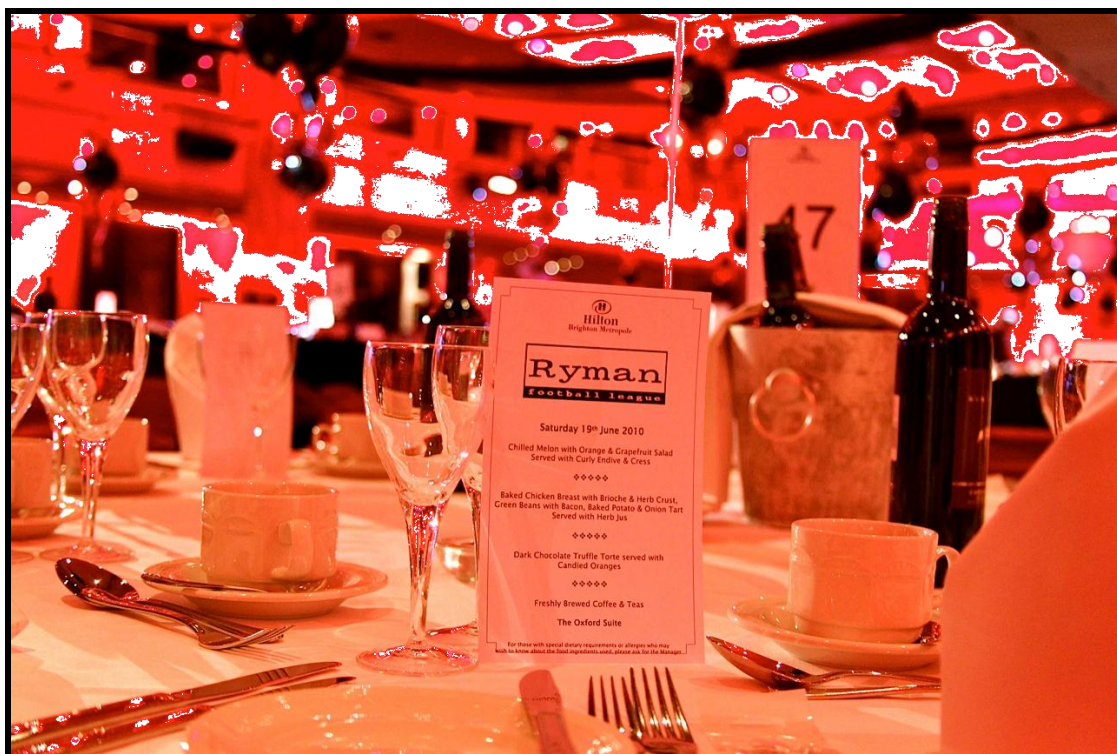

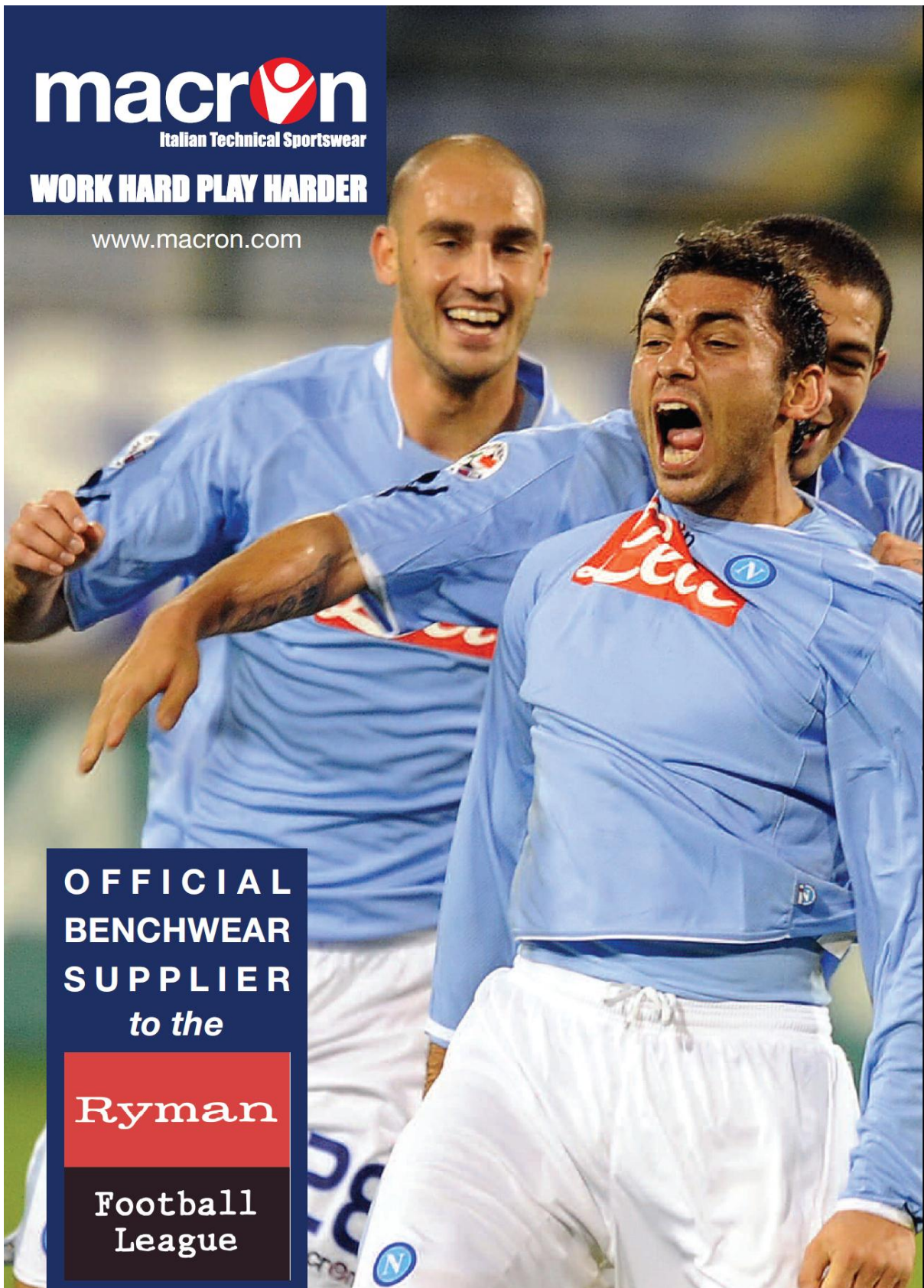

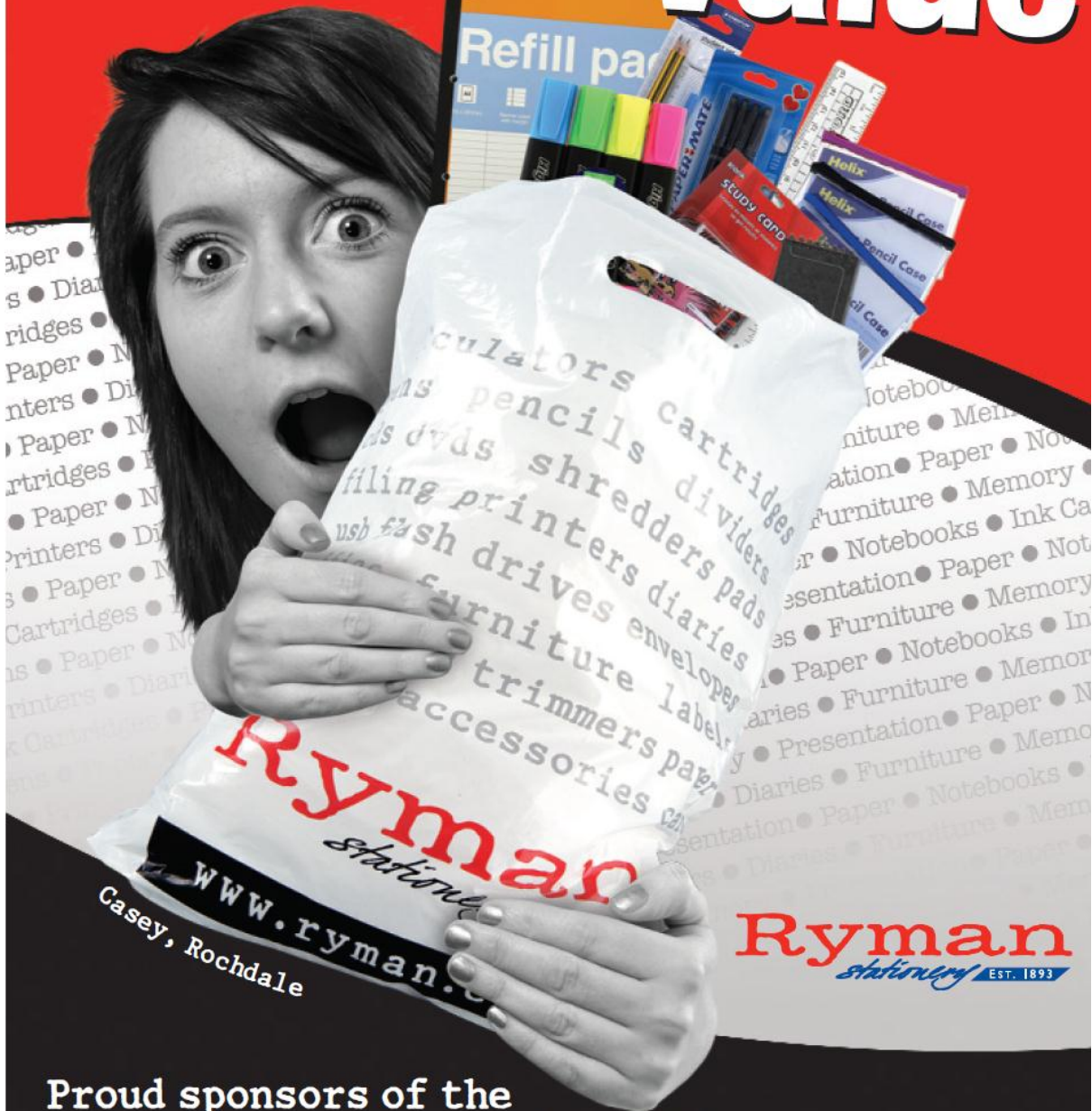
