ALL THE ACTION

Premier

RYMAN Premier defences were demob-happy on Saturday, when the 11 matches on the season's final day produced an average of exactly five goals each.

It was also much ado about nothing for, apart from two swaps of mid-table places, everyone ended up precisely where they had been at kick-off time.

That means that Wednesday's play-off semi-finals will be Hornchurch v Bury and Lowestoft v Wealdstone.

Lowestoft needed a victory at champions Billericay to have a chance of the runners-up spot and they achieved it in style, winning 4-1 in front of a New Lodge crowd of 1,145.

An early exchange of goals saw Michael Frew put the Trawlerboys ahead only for Dale Cockrill's headed own goal to level it. Lubo Guentchev's longrange shot restored Lowestoft's advantage just before the half-hour, Cockrill reset his sights to make it 3-1 in the 58th minute and Frew broke clear to add his second.

It was all in vain; Hornchurch – the only other team to win at New Lodge this season - held on to second place on goal difference, three points behind the champions, with a 2-1 home win over relegated Leatherhead.

Carl Rook, making his first start for Urchins, put them ahead after 19 minutes. Although sure to finish 19th, Tanners needed points to give them a better record than the sides finishing in that position in the Southern and Northern Premier Leagues in case there are reprieves available in the summer.

Greg Andrews gave them hope when he equalised two minutes before half-time but Leon McKenzie restored the Hornchurch lead immediately after the restart and that was enough, leaving Tanners third in line for any vacancy that may arise at this level.

Wealdstone's fine end-of-season run continued with a 3-1 victory over Concord which sealed fourth place and a trip to Lowestoft on Wednesday.

It took Alex Dyer less than 25 seconds to put them ahead but Steve King levelled matters with a looping header in the 11th minute.

Cometh the hour (or in this case the 50th minute), cometh the man. It was, inevitably, Richard Jolly who restored Stones' lead with his 48th goal of the season and his 32nd in the league, clinching the Golden Boot – though only just, as we shall see. Scott Fitzgerald made sure with 13 minutes left.

Bury pair John Sands and Billy Clark both hit hattricks in a 7-1 romp at Tooting which made sure that two Suffolk clubs will be involved in the play-offs. The Terrors terrified few opponents this season, conceding 116 goals on their way back to Ryman South.

Sands started the rout with two goals in three minutes, the 18th and 20th, and Clark went one better with two in two minutes just after Hassan Ibrahim had fired home from long range for the home side on the half-hour.

It was three for Sands after an hour and three for Clark 12 minutes later, this one a penalty, before Kieron Leabon nodded in the seventh.

A crowd of 1,038 turned up at the Dripping Pan to see whether Lewes could make the play-offs and they watched a 4-2 home win over Harrow. But the Rooks needed Bury or Wealdstone to slip, and so they remained in sixth place.

Jon-Jo Bates put Harrow ahead in the second minute but Lewes responded with headed goals from Paul Booth and Chris Breach before half-time and another soon after it from Nathan Crabb. Booth made it 4-1 with a penalty and Danny Leech notched Harrow's second.

Hendon needed a big win to have any chance of making the play-offs and they certainly got it, matching Bury with a 7-1 victory at another relegated club, Aveley. But it was all in vain and they stayed in seventh place.

The only goal of the first half was a penalty by Greg Ngoyi in the 36th minute, awarded by Nolan Wilde. He was then injured and assistant Paul Howard took over the whistle, awarding a penalty of his own after 50 minutes which Scott Shulton converted.

The floodgates then opened as Isaiah Rankin fired a seven-minute hat-trick and Elliott Charles made it 6-0 by the midpoint of the half.

Kayan Kalipha missed a penalty for Aveley but Liam Thomas did pull one back before Elliott Godfrey notched Hendon's seventh in added time.

They were the only games to affect the significant positions, but East Thurrock's 5-2 win at Kingstonian lifted them above their hosts into tenth place and also featured a valiant effort by Sam Higgins to land the Golden Boot.

Starting the day three goals behind Jolly, Higgins scored twice in the first half, after Bobby Traynor had put K's ahead. Ben Wood and Kye Ruel made it 4-1 after the break.

Traynor, the top scorer in his division for the past three seasons, has not contended this time but he reduced the arrears with his 17th league goal. Higgins completed his hat-trick with seven minutes left, his 40th goal in all competitions, but by then Jolly had taken his haul to 32 and Higgins could not score a fourth to match him.

Canvey also scored five, in their case with no reply from visiting Margate: a fine send-off for defender Steve Ward, playing the last game of his 12-year stay with the islanders.

Kevin Dobinson put them ahead after three minutes and it was 3-0 by half-time thanks to Rob King and Jason Hallett. Dobinson scored again after 73 minutes and Steve Sheehan completed the rout.

Wingate were the only other side to move up the table, taking over 13th place from Concord with a 2-1 home win over Carshalton. Tony Burke gave them a half-time lead, Paul Vines equalised from the spot and Leon Smith settled it with a late solo effort.

It was a satisfactory Premier debut campaign for Wingate, as it was for Met Police who finished 12th after their 2-0 win at Hastings. Mu Maan and Staforde Palmer scored midway through the second half.

Cray gave a rare start to Michael Power and he rewarded them with two goals in the first ten minutes against bottom club Horsham.

A massacre threatened, but it was the 85th minute before Tony Dolby scored the third goal and Horsham's six-year stay in the Premier ended on a cheerful note as Wayne Clarke fired home from long range in the last minute to make it 3-1.



IT'S up for grabs now, as a famous commentary once said. In this case it's the Ryman North title, which remains undecided after leaders Leiston had their home game against Potters Bar called off on Saturday and again on Sunday because of a waterlogged pitch. They will try again tomorrow (Tuesday) night.

Leiston need to win after Enfield Town took over at the top, two points clear, with a 3-0 victory at Grays, who had already clinched their play-off spot.

After a tight, scoreless first half the game swung Enfield's way when Grays defender Bradley Thomas was shown his second yellow card in the 52nd minute. Liam Hope converted the resultant penalty for his 26th league goal of the season and he will be the division's top scorer barring something extraordinary in the rearranged matches.

Further goals in the last eight minutes from Tyler Campbell and Walid Matata ensured that Leiston cannot afford to slip up.

Grays were one of three teams who were sure of a play-off spot and started the day on the same points total, chasing third place and a home semi-final.

It went to Tilbury, who won a 4-3 thriller at Thamesmead. Rikki Cable gave the hosts the lead after little more than 30 seconds but Tom Wraight soon equalised and Gary Henty gave Dockers a half-time lead.

Cable completed his hat-trick with two goals in the first six minutes after the break, the second of them

direct from a corner. Aaron Matthews put Dockers back on terms after an hour and Paul King headed the winner with 13 minutes left.

Tilbury will be at home to Needham Market, who went down 2-1 at home to Brentwood. Martyn Stokes opened the scoring shortly before the interval and Abs Seymour doubled the lead midway through the second half.

Bradley Barber pulled one back with an 83rd-minute free-kick, Needham's 104th goal of the season. But it was not enough to save them, and they also conceded the honour of being the league's top scorers to Bognor.

The relegation battle has also gone into overtime after Ware's home game against Waltham Forest was postponed.

Ware are now two points adrift at the foot of the table after Great Wakering, already relegated, beat Romford 2-0 with late goals for Ashley Hawkins and Dan Trenkel.

Ilford, though, are the team in Ware's sights. They went down 2-1 at home to Harlow, who went ahead through Danny Elmes in the 28th minute and doubled their lead with an own goal by Gbenga Sonuga just after half-time.

Abdul Jeetoo's reply in the 87thminute did not affect the result but makes Ware's task a little harder. Three points behind the Foxes, they need to win by a three-goal margin to escape the drop.

Tom Holdstock and Callander put Heybridge 2-0 up at Sudbury before Chris Bryan replied.

Callander scored again right on half-time, converting the rebound after his penalty was saved, and scored his third with six minutes left to complete a 4-1 win.

Jack Daveney's goal in the 40th minute gave Waltham Abbey a 1-0 victory at Cheshunt.

Adam Flanagan and Sos Yao, with a penalty, earned Maldon a 2-1 home win over Soham, who had taken the lead in the 50th minute through Jack Paxman.

Redbridge's home game against Chatham was another victim of the weather.



IT WAS tight at the top when the Ryman South action kicked off on Saturday but the situation was straightforward enough for Whitehawk.

A home win over Chipstead would clinch the title for the ambitious Brighton club in only their second season since moving up from the Sussex County League.

Playing into the strong wind and heavy rain, Hawks started nervously but began to relax when Joe Keehan gave them a 28th-minute lead with a 20-yard volley, a shot he did remarkably well to keep low in such conditions.

His pass enabled James Fraser to make it 2-0 three minutes before half-time and there was never likely to be any way back for Chipstead against the wind.

Sam Gargan headed the third goal midway through the second half and Lee Newman made it 4-0 in the 81st minute.

Dulwich started the day one point behind but found themselves on the wrong end of the day's shock result, a 1-0 defeat at Burgess Hill who thus escaped the relegation noose.

Tyrone Berry scored the vital goal with just 12 minutes left, giving Hillians their second successive victory.

A draw would not have been enough for them, because Whyteleafe won 2-0 at home to Whitstable and thought they were heading for survival until news arrived of Berry's goal.

They struggled in the first half but took the lead in the 50th minute when lan Selley scored direct from a corner and doubled it two minutes later through Omar Folkes. Hopes were high, but it was not to be and Leafe depart from the league after a 28-year stay.

Back at the top end of the table, Bognor overtook Dulwich to finish as runners-up, wiping out a 2-0 half-time deficit to win 4-2 at Maidstone. Their final goal tally of 105 is the league's best.

Stones needed a victory and a Godalming defeat to reach the play-offs themselves, and they were 2-0 up at the interval after Shaun Welford scored early and late in the half.

It all changed after the break, when Maidstone were perhaps disheartened by the news of Godalming's 3-0 lead. Terry Dodd pulled one back on 58 minutes, Ben Johnson equalised five minutes later and Dodd put Rocks ahead on 72 minutes. Steve Harper added the fourth.

So Stones will remain in this division when they make their long-awaited return to their home town next season.

Bognor, denied automatic promotion by a single goal last season, will be at home to Godalming in their play-off semi-final on Tuesday while Dulwich entertain Folkestone, who had no game yesterday but were already safe in fourth place.

Godalming are the in-form side going into the playoffs, having booked their place with five straight wins in April topped off with a 4-2 victory over Eastbourne yesterday.

They needed only a point but were soon on course for three as Dan Read netted twice in the game's first quarter.

Jamie McClurg added another just before the break and Scott Harris made it 4-0 soon after half-time.

With their play-off place secure, G's relaxed in the latter stages and the visitors pulled two goals back through Danny Curd and Joe Summerbell.

Sittingbourne will look back with gratitude to the afternoon of January 7, when they beat eventual champions Whitehawk 2-0. It proved to be their only post-November victory and a 4-0 defeat at Walton & Hersham yesterday meant that they finished only two points away from relegation after taking only one point from their last eight games.

Swans, by contrast, have dropped only two points in April and hauled themselves into a mid-table position, so the result was no great surprise.

Jason Henry scored after seven minutes and three more goals came in the last 20 minutes, after Brickies had lost keeper Adam Woodward to injury. Graeme Purdy struck twice, either side of a goal by Harry Smart.

Faversham, another side finishing the season poorly, took an early lead through James Peacock and held it until the stroke of half-time, when Danny Green equalised for visiting Corinthian-Casuals. Glenn Boosey and Ross Defoe scored two in two minutes just after the hour and Casuals won 3-1.

Casuals, the Walton variety, also won 3-1 away from home, aided by the fact that Ramsgate defender Tom Hickman was sent off for handball after only three minutes. Sol Patterson-Bohner converted the penalty. Danny Fernandez and Sean Bradley made it 3-0 by half-time, with Ian Pulman replying in the 75th minute.

Dave Cook's 86th-minute goal earned Hythe a 1-1 draw at Merstham, who had taken the lead six minutes before the interval through Joe Holland.

Gabriel Odunaike's header in the 65th minute gave Crawley Down a 1-0 victory at Worthing, who were on course for the play-offs at the end of March but lost five of their last six, the exception a win over Bognor which ultimately denied their fierce rivals the title.

The Anvils finished 16th in their debut season, a position they would certainly have accepted after eight games when they did not have a point to their credit.

Play-off preview

PREMIER (WEDNESDAY)

AFC HORNCHURCH v BURY TOWN

HORNCHURCH, as the second-placed finishers, must start this semi-final as favourites.

Bury Town, having beaten Hornchurch twice in the league, must start this semi-final as favourites.

Well, you choose. Bury won 1-0 at Hornchurch Stadium in October thanks to a 20th-minute goal from Dan Cunningham and nicked the return match in January 2-1 with a breakaway goal by John Sands deep into added time.

Bury collected 76 points and finished third in the table last season, their first as a Ryman club after transferring from the Southern League.

This season they have scored 20 more goals, conceded just six more, and ended up two places lower with only 75 points.

They were beaten 2-1 at home by Lowestoft in the play-off semi-finals, watched by 1,427, and the chance of a return bout with their Suffolk rivals will be a huge incentive for them on Wednesday.

Hornchurch last contested the play-offs in 2007-08, when they finished fourth and lost 3-1 at Football League-bound Wimbledon in their semi-final.

A year later they were sixth, losing a showdown clash - effectively a play-off quarter-final - at Sutton United on the last day of the season.

They rely heavily for their goals on Martin Tuohy (27) and Lewis Smith (16), who have scored 43 of their 68 in the league. No-one else has more than four.

Bury, on the other hand, have eight players with more than four league goals and six with at least nine. Leading the way are Lee Smith (14), Sands (12) and Sam Reed (11).

Hornchurch's away record is far better than their home one and they have had troubles under their own lights. They managed only two goals and two points from their first six Tuesday night games at home, though their seventh and last produced a 3-0 win over Margate. Anyway, this semi-final is on a Wednesday.

Bury have won their last four away games but have gone four home games without a success.

LOWESTOFT TOWN v WEALDSTONE

LOWESTOFT will be keen to go one better than last year, when they lost 4-3 at Tonbridge in the play-off final after finishing fourth in the league.

Their Crown Meadow ground, the most easterly football pitch in Britain, consistently attracts the league's best crowds.

They finally accepted promotion to the Ryman League in 2009, having for many years settled for a less demanding life in the Eastern Counties League, and have made a huge impact at the higher level.

They won Division One North by a street at the first attempt and finished fourth in their Premier debut season before going one better this year.

Wealdstone have experienced all the ups and downs football has to offer in the comparatively recent past.

The club that brought Stuart Pearce and Vinnie Jones to the fore were the first to perform the non-league double, FA Trophy winners and Conference champions, in 1985 but sold their ground a few years later and drifted from groundshare to groundshare, the last of them with Ruislip Manor whose ground they were to take over to end their wanderings.

They had joined the Isthmian League as a Division Three club in 1995 and reached the Premier

Division by the 'back door' in 2004 when, having finished seventh in Division One North, they were able to fill one of the vacancies left by clubs joining the new Conference South by beating Dulwich, seventh in the South, in a play-off match that went to penalties.

This will be their first regular play-off appearance but they have shown their aptitude for knockout football by reaching the semi-finals of the FA Trophy.

That left them with a backlog of league fixtures and they were in the bottom half of the table at the start of April, when they had eight games left to play. Seven wins and a draw catapulted them up to fourth place.

Their star striker Richard Jolly also completed the London marathon during the month but had enough energy to score his 32nd league goal of the season on Saturday, clinching the league's Golden Boot, He has scored 48 in all competitions and will be keen to reach the half-century.

Lowestoft's goals have been more spread out. Chris Henderson, who scored against them for Bury in last season's play-off semi-final, leads the way with 12.

Henderson netted the winner as Lowestoft beat Stones 2-1 at Crown Meadow at the end of January, having drawn 0-0 at Grosvenor Vale in October.

NORTH

TILBURY v NEEDHAM MARKET (TUESDAY)

TILBURY have been the surprise packet in this division. Unfancied by anyone except manager Paul Vaughan at the start of the season, they won their first two league games, drew the next two and lost the next three.

But after that they were consistently around the play-off places and enjoyed a crucial spell of form in early March, playing four matches in 11 days and winning the lot.

Alex Read scored ten (3, 2, 3, 2) of their 16 goals in those games on his way to a season's total of 24.

A home defeat by Sudbury halted the run but after that Dockers won five and drew one of their last six to finish third, 16 places higher than in 2011. It will be their first experience of play-off football.

Needham Market finished runners-up to East Thurrock last season, their first in the league, but were beaten 3-1 at home by Brentwood in their play-off semi-final.

Many wondered if they could repeat, especially given the loss of Craig Parker and his 33 league goals from midfield. He joined Chelmsford in the summer.

They were devastating at times in the early part of the season, winning 7-0 at home to Potters Bar on opening day, and repeating the scoreline against Great Wakering in September. Their Octoberfest was at Cheshunt. 8-1 this time.

But Sam Newson, who had 21 league goals by the end of November, then suffered a nasty injury which kept him out for several weeks and cost him a trial at League Two Gillingham, and he has scored only once, a penalty, since his return.

The Marketmen led the table when he was hurt but finish the season at least 13 points off the pace.

With momentum often so important in play-off games, they have won only one of their last five outings.

They did, however, take four league points off Tilbury with a 4-1 home win in October and a 1-1 draw at Chadfields in mid-February.

LEISTON or ENFIELD TOWN v GRAYS ATHLETIC (THURSDAY)

GRAYS had their last play-off experience in the 2005-06 season, and then they were chasing a Football League place as a Conference Premier club.

They lost a thrilling semi-final 5-4 on aggregate to Halifax, consoling themselves with a second successive FA Trophy triumph (in which their second goal came from Glenn Poole who, six years later, was on target for Billericay in their Ryman League title-clinching game last week).

After that, off-field problems afflicted them and they had to drop out of the Conference, ending up last season in Ryman Division One North and sharing East Thurrock's ground after their own was sold for development.

Next season they hope to be playing at the former Ford ground in Romford, once used by Ford United (now Redbridge) and Romford but disused for some time, while a planned new stadium in Grays itself gets off the drawing board.

This season they started with seven wins and a draw but failed to maintain that consistency until a run of six wins in March put them firmly back in the play-off picture.

Their opponents will not be known until Leiston play their postponed final league match at home to Potters Bar.

Last season's Eastern Counties League champions have maintained the fine reputation of Suffolk clubs since that county became Ryman League 'territory'. If they fail to win the title it will, naturally, be their first experience of play-offs.

Enfield joined the league in 2006 and qualified for the play-offs at the first attempt, losing 4-2 at home to Sudbury in their semi-final.

That was followed by two seasons when they finished in the bottom half of the table, but they were back in the play-offs in 2010 and this time reached the final with a 3-2 win at Wingate only to go down 3-1 at Concord in the final. Last season they missed out by one point.

SOUTH (TUESDAY)

BOGNOR REGIS TOWN

v GODALMING TOWN

Last season's South play-offs provided some of the season's most exciting football, including a final which may well have been the game of the season.

Dulwich, leading 3-1 with time running out, succumbed to a late Kev Terry hat-trick for Leatherhead.

Before that Dulwich had ignited a national debate about the justice of play-offs with a 3-1 semi-final win at Bognor, who had finished 31 points ahead of them in the league.

Both teams are back this year and Bognor will not want to be caught napping this time after finishing as runners-up for the second successive season.

Last season it was heartbreak all the way as they failed to get the win they needed at Chatham on the final day and lost the title to Met Police by a single goal.

This season they at least knew that their final-day fate was not in their own hands and they did well to come back from 2-0 down to win 4-2 at Maidstone while knowing that Whitehawk were well on course for the win they needed to take the crown.

Bognor might not have needed the play-offs if they had hung on to lethal striker Jason Prior, who had 24 goals under his belt before he departed for Wimbledon, after a two-week trial at Newcastle, only to end the season with a broken leg sustained in a League Two clash with Crawley.

But Rocks have four other players with doublefigure tallies, led by Terry Dodd with 19, and still find the net on a regular basis. They lost only one of their last eight games.

So did Godalming: better, in fact. They lost only one of their last ten and won their last five to enter the play-offs on a real high.

They qualified in 2010, too, losing the final 2-1 at Folkestone after a 2-1 extra-time win at Worthing.

Dan Read and Scott Harris, with 16 league goals apiece, are their chief marksmen: Read has scored twice in three of the last four games.

Bognor won the league meetings 6-0 and 4-2; how much that will matter come play-off time remains to be seen.

DULWICH HAMLET

v FOLKESTONE INVICTA

AS mentioned above, Folkestone won these playoffs two years ago which obviously means that they returned from the Premier after only one season.

They had struggled for goals even during their promotion campaign so it was no great shock that they finished bottom of the higher division, scoring fewer goals than anyone else.

They have certainly solved that problem this season thanks largely to the arrival of Stuart King from Kent League football.

He has appeared in only 25 games but scored 24 goals.

Folkestone's post-Christmas form was patchy, to say the least, but they won their last six to make sure of fourth place.

Many neutrals will be backing Dulwich simply because of the superb example they have set with their behaviour. They went into their last two games without a single caution for dissent and with no penalty points against their bench, giving them a grand total of zero in the Respect tables.

They also have committed fewer general disciplinary offences than any other team in the league, giving the lie to those who claim that sportsmanship awards are only for losers.

Dulwich attribute their excellent record to the fact that so many of their players have come up through the junior ranks and have learnt the club's standards.

Their late-season form took them into the play-off finals, and to the verge of the final, last season.

They continued in the same vein this time before having to settle for third place in a three-way battle for the title.

A 2-0 home defeat by Whitehawk earlier this month turned out to be the decider.

They beat Folkestone 5-2 at home and 3-1 away in the league, but, as with Bognor's domination of Godalming, it will count for nothing this week.
