ALL THE ACTION

Premier Division

PREMIER Division leaders Lowestoft were held to a 1-1 home draw by Canvey on Tuesday, but it was the visitors who ended up frustrated at the loss of the league's last 100 per cent away record.

The sides exchanged headed goals in the first half, Rob King putting Canvey ahead and Matt Halliday replying.

The game seemed to have swung towards the islanders on the hour, when Lowestoft keeper Andrew Reynolds was injured and striker Michael Frew took over between the posts.

Worse was to follow for the Trawlerboys when Dale Cockerill felled Jason Hallett and was sent off, leaving Frew to face a penalty from the ultra-reliable King. But the Canvey man struck the ball weakly and Frew earned the acclaim of the vast majority of the 633-strong crowd by diving to his left to save.

Lowestoft still head the table on goal difference from Cray, but only three points separate them from Canvey in eighth place.

Cray moved up two places with a 2-1 home win over Wealdstone. Lewis Perkins, having opened his season's account with an FA Cup hat-trick on Sunday, was on target again after 11 minutes and there was no more scoring until 17 minutes from time, when Jack Clark made it 2-0. Richard Jolly pulled one back six minutes later.

Billericay climbed to third with two unanswered goals against Hastings at New Lodge. Each side had a centre-back on the scoresheet; Sean Ray put through his own net in an unlucky 13th minute and Rob Swaine added the second eight minutes before the interval.

Hornchurch missed the chance to strengthen their position among the front-runners when they went down 1-0 at home to Bury thanks to Daniel Cunningham's tap-in after 20 minutes.

Urchins dominated for long periods but came no closer than a Martin Tuohy header which hit a post and a Lewis Smith shot which did the same thing, in the latter case with the help of a superb full-stretch diversion by Marcus Garnham.

It was all square again at Harrow, who have drawn four of their five home games.

Jamie Delgado put them ahead in the 34th minute and Lee Newman replied for Tooting 12 minutes after the break.

Two headed goals in the first half, by Staforde Palmer and Chris O'Flaherty, had earned Met Police a 2-0 win at Aveley on Monday.

Division 1 North

LEADERS Grays saw their unbeaten record vanish as they slumped to a 3-1 home defeat by Tilbury in their derby on Wednesday.

Jack West gave Dockers a ninth-minute lead and Emiel Aiken added a second on 35 minutes.

Danny Bunce converted a penalty three minutes after the interval to give Grays renewed hope.

But they could not score again and Dockers clinched a well-deserved victory when West scored

again at the death. It was his eighth goal of the season, making him the division's joint-top scorer.

Following Bognor's defeat on Tuesday, Dulwich are now the only unbeaten side in the league.

Ilford had high hopes of their first win of the season when Stephen Opoka finished off great work by Clydie Roberts to give them a tenth-minute lead at home to managerless Great Wakering with his third goal in two games for the club. The visitors drew level on 25 minutes when Ilford keeper Robert Budd made a great save from a deflected Jamie Salmon shot, only to see his defence fail to clear the loose ball and allow Bradley Nobbs to score.

Ilford wasted several simple chances to regain the lead and were punished when Bradley Warner fired home in the 75th minute to give Wakering a 2-1 victory.

Enfield Town had moved up to second place after coming from two goals down to beat Potters Bar 4-2 on Tuesday.

Strikes by Tom Pett and Josh Urquhart doubled Bar's away goals total for the season in the first 16 minutes.

Jon Moore pulled one back on the half-hour and also claimed the equaliser nine minutes into the second half. Adam Wallace put Enfield ahead and Liam Hope wrapped it up with a late penalty.

Chatham's slump continued as they crashed 3-0 at home to Romford, their third defeat in a week. Boro, who moved up to sixth, went ahead with a Kurt Smith goal after 15 minutes and made it 2-0 through Chris Richardson on the stroke of half-time. Smith struck again midway through the second half. Leiston suffered their second defeat of the season, 2-1 at Heybridge who ended a poor run of their own. Russell Pond's 18th-minute opener for Swifts was wiped out by Lee McGlone in the 58th minute but the visitors were level for only a couple of minutes before Tom Broadhurst grabbed the winner.

Needham Market also slipped to their second defeat, 3-2 at home to Soham who recorded their second win. Jose Espinoza, signed last week from Brentwood, put the Marketmen ahead after eight minutes and again after 75, Tom Libatore having levelled matters on the hour. Soham provided the sting in the game's tail with late goals from Matt Robinson and Richard Gammon.

Redbridge carried their FA Cup form into the league with a 3-1 victory at Waltham Abbey. Goals just before and just after the interval by Dan Hopkins and Ben Bradbury put the Motormen in command, and Joe Gardner stretched the lead in the 61st minute. Ayrton Coley managed a late consolation goal for Abbots.

Cheshunt followed up their 0-0 draw at leaders Grays on Sunday with a similar result at Sudbury, and the scoresheet also stayed blank at Ware where Brentwood were the visitors.

Division 1 South

UNBEATEN Dulwich were three points clear at the top of Division One South after beating Merstham 3-1 at Champion Hill on Tuesday while Bognor suffered their first league defeat since March 19, going down by the same score at Corinthian-Casuals.

Sanchez Ming broke the deadlock at Dulwich just before half-time, only for Roscoe Dsane to equalise with a penalty in the 48th minute.

Mu Maan restored Dulwich's lead six minutes later and Frankie Sawyer quickly added his ninth league goal of the season, putting him level with Wingate's Leon Smith at the head of the Golden Boot race.

Saheed Sankoh headed Corinthian-Casuals into a fifth-minute lead against one of his former clubs and Steve Goddard made the most of a fumble by Bognor keeper Craig Stoner to make it 2-0 after 21 minutes.

Jason Prior pulled one back on 36 minutes but Goddard raced clear to restore the two-goal gap before the interval.

Godalming missed the chance to take over second place when they had to settle for a 1-1 draw at Walton Casuals.

The home side took the lead with a Danny Buckle penalty on the hour. Jamie McClurg squared it in the 75^{th} minute.

Walton & Hersham slipped into the relegation zone after their 2-0 defeat at Chipstead, who scored 25 minutes into each half. Julien Thompson and Andrew Dalhouse were the marksmen.

It was the same scoreline at Faversham, where Crawley Down were unable to build on Saturday's maiden Ryman League victory. Aaron Quain gave the Kent side a half-time lead and Tom Hickman doubled it five minutes after the break.

Sittingbourne came from behind to win 2-1 in their deby at Whitstable.

Stuart Vahid scored for the Oystermen on 22 minutes, Colin Richmond equalised on the hour and Hicham Akhazzan won it for the Brickies with 15 minutes left.

Maidstone beat Hythe 2-0 on Wednesday to chalk up their seventh successive league victory and move into second place, two points behind Dulwich.

It was not one of their most convincing performances. They needed a Laurence Harvey own goal to take the lead in the 65th minute and only two minutes were left when James Pinnock made sure.

Folkestone left it even later; James Everitt scored in added time to salvage a 1-1 home draw with Eastbourne, who had taken the lead just before the hour through Matt Geard.

FA Cup

MARGATE striker Kwesi Appiah fired five goals as his side romped to a 6-1 victory at Thamesmead in their second qualifying round replay on Tuesday.

He became the second Ryman League player to notch up a five-goal haul in the competition this season, following Shaun Welford's feat for Maidstone in their 9-0 thrashing of Corinthian.

After Saturday's 0-0 draw, the tie went another halfhour without a breakthrough. Then Craig Cloke and Appiah netted two quick goals.

Theo Fairweather-Johnson put Thamesmead back in the picture ten minutes into the second half but Appiah responded with a four-goal salvo, rounding it off with a last-minute penalty as Gate earned themselves a home tie against Bromley.

Maldon came from behind to beat Whitehawk 2-1 in Essex. Jamahl Hughes netted for Hawks on 18 minutes and they stayed in front until midway through the second half, when James Abbott squared matters. Sos Yao completed the upset with ten minutes left and Maldon now host Hendon.

Three other Ryman teams went through, taking the total who have reached the next round to 13. Perhaps the best victory came from East Thurrock, 3-1 at St Albans.

Petrit Elbi scored twice and made the third for Kris Newby during a blistering 12-minute spell early in the second half, with the hosts replying late in the game. Rocks are now at home to North Greenford, one of the lowest-ranked teams left in the Cup.

Leatherhead, without a Premier Division victory to their credit, shook off their unhappy league form to beat Biggleswade Town 2-1 at Fetcham Grove.

Goals either side of half-time by Chris Boulter and Greg Andrews did the trick, although the Southern League club pulled one back to give Tanners a nervous final half-hour before they clinched a visit to Billericay.

Worthing fell behind just before half-time at Kent League side Beckenham. Darren Budd equalised in the 67th minute and Ryan McBride netted the winner with ten minutes to go. Rebels now entertain Staines.

Concord, who scored twice in added time on Saturday to earn a home replay against Wroxham, were on the receiving end as the Eastern Counties League leaders netted a last-gasp goal to win 2-1. They had taken an early lead, with Anthony Stokes replying in the 54th minute.

Horsham also bowed out, going down 3-2 at home to Burnham. Dane Luchford scored for Hornets in the first minute of the second half after they had turned round 2-0 down.

Burnham then netted their third and although Tony Nwachukwu responded with his tenth goal of the season, a 75th-minute penalty, the visitors held out.
