Premier Division

LOWESTOFT Town are the new leaders of the Premier Division, and many who tipped them for the title will be wondering if they will remain there until the end of April.

The Trawlerboys took over in style on Saturday with a 4-1 victory at Carshalton, becoming the top scorers in all three divisions with 22 goals in the process.

Matt Nolan gave them the lead after 26 minutes and an own goal by Justyn Roberts made it 2-0 immediately after the interval. Joe Francis quickly added a third.

A Tom Davis free-kick reduced the arrears, which at least ended Robins' unhappy record of being the only team in the league without a home goal, but Francis struck again to wrap up the scoring by the 62nd minute.

The other significant games at the top were all decided by a single goal. Canvey moved into second place thanks to Danny Heale's 60th-minute winner at Leatherhead.

That was harsh on Tanners, whose caretaker manager Mick Simmons was pleased with a performance that should have produced their second point of the season, if not more. They found Canvey keeper James Russell in top form as his side maintained their 100 per cent away record.

The Premier Division's last unbeaten record went as previous leaders Hendon lost to a Bobby Traynor penalty at Kingstonian.

Dave Diedhou's handling offence allowed Traynor to clinch a welcome win for K's in the 78th minute and it might be remembered that a victory over Hendon was the beginning of Kingstonian's run to the play-offs two seasons ago after a nightmare start.

A penalty also provided the only goal at Lewes, where Paul Booth's 37th-minute conversion, after Christian Nanetti was tripped, was enough to account for Cray. The winners edged up to fourth place while Cray dropped from second to fifth.

Anyone who doubted Leon Smith's ability to repeat his Division One scoring feats for Wingate after their promotion surely has their answer by now.

Smith took his league tally to eight, best in the Premier, with a double in his side's 3-2 home win over Horsham.

His early goal was answered by a fine equaliser from Ray Freeman but Smith was on the spot to restore the advantage when Mark Henty's shot came back off a post and Marc Weatherstone made it 3-1 at half-time. Russell Eldridge pulled one back four minutes into the second half and only some fine goalkeeping by Bobby Smith denied Hornets a share of the spoils.

Chris Wild made a fairytale comeback for Billericay at East Thurrock.

Lucky to escape more serious injury when a hotel balcony collapsed under him during a preseason tour, Wild returned to action as a substitute on the hour and headed home a corner four minutes later to give his side a 2-1 victory.

Kris Newby had given Rocks the lead with a penalty, his first goal since returning to the club, only for Dave Knight to level matters in added time at the end of the first half.

Another game decided by a single goal was at Bury. Tom Bullard netted on the stroke of half-time to leave Aveley still searching for their first league win.

So, too, are Concord, who went down 3-0 at home to Met Police.

If Concord had gained confidence for their FA Cup win at Hornchurch a week earlier, it was severely dented by Dan Gwyther's first-minute strike for the Met.

The dangerous Staforde Palmer wrapped it up with two goals in five minutes midway through the second half.

Hornchurch themselves took a 64th-minute lead through Lewis Smith in a hard-fought game against Wealdstone, who made it 1-1 six minutes later when Richard Jolly turned in a cross from David Hicks.

There was a quick exchange, too, and the same result at Harrow when Ross Sutton netted for visiting Hastings after 70 minutes and Jon-Jo Bates replied six minutes later.

A Kiernan Hughes-Mason double gave inconsistent Tooting the points at Margate.

His 14th-minute opener stood up until just after the hour, when Richard Avery struck from long range, and Hughes-Mason then finished off good work by Andrew McCollin in the 71st minute.

That made it a total of five wins and only four defeats for away sides in the division as the curious bias in favour of day-trippers continued.

Division One North

GRAYS Athletic came from behind to win 2-1 at Brentwood on Saturday to open up a three-point gap at the top.

Ryan Doyle gave the hosts the lead with a penalty just before half-time but Louis Dennis turned things round after the break.

His shot was parried for Joe Sweeney to nab the equaliser and Dennis himself headed the winner in the 62nd minute.

A goal deep into added time restored Chatham to second spot as they edged out visitors Waltham Abbey 2-1.

An own goal by Chris Davis gave the Abbots the lead midway through the first half. Joe Fuller accepted a simple chance to level it four minutes before the interval and it looked as if that would be that until Lee Hales fired home a last-gasp free-kick.

Harlow, who were second, slipped to sixth place after their 2-0 defeat at Waltham Forest, who moved up to third.

The first half looked certain to end scoreless until Josh Bonnett struck right on the whistle, and Joel Palmer added the second on 69 minutes as Forest, who have not finished in the top half of the table since 2007, continued their impressive early form.

Leiston conceded a home Ryman League goal for the first time but it could not prevent them marching to a 4-1 victory over Maldon.

Gareth Heath netted an early penalty for the hosts after a foul on Danny Smy and Billy Burgess squared it just before the break.

Joe Jefford's header restored Leiston's lead in the 66th minute but, although they were well on top, it was the 90th minute before another Jefford header sealed victory. Smy then notched a fourth deep into added time.

That lifted Leiston to fourth, and Thamesmead are fifth after their 2-0 success at Sudbury. A Lewis Tozer header and a deflected shot by Theo Fairweather-Johnson completed the scoring by just after the half-hour mark. Sudbury dominated the second half but could come no closer than a Dave Wareham freekick which hit a post.

Heybridge had drawn all three games at home and won all three away, but Redbridge ended Swifts' unbeaten record with a 3-0 victory at Scraley Road.

It was their second away win by that margin on successive Saturdays after their shock FA Cup victory at Wingate. After almost an hour without a goal, a superb strike by Ben Bradbury put the Motormen in front and further goals followed from Dan Trenkel and Ryan Murray.

A goal down and a player down when Anton Agdomar was sent off after 20 minutes, Potters Bar rallied to beat visiting Tilbury 3-2. Dockers had taken a fifth-minute lead through Emiel Aiken but a scrambled equaliser by Tom Pett lifted the hosts and Fabion Simms put them ahead before the interval. James Gershfield added a third on 85 minutes and Jack West's reply was too little and too late.

Two sides with only a single point apiece clashed at Wodson Park and it was Ware who got their season moving with a 2-1 victory over llford.

It started to go wrong for the visitors when Aji Otalunbosun was dismissed for handball in the 34th minute and Ricci Crace converted the penalty. The ten men levelled matters with a Richard Simpson header on 65 minutes but it took Ware just three minutes to regain the lead with another header, by Lewis Taylor.

The other three games in the division all finished 1-1. Sam Newson's eighth league goal of the season gave Needham Market a 20th-minute lead at Romford but Chuck Duru replied in the 34th.

Soham were grateful to Tom Libatore for a last-minute equaliser at Great Wakering, who should have seen it coming: Soham have drawn all four of their away games. Rovers were on top for much of an entertaining game but could not add to a 62nd-minute goal from Bradley Nobbs.

Cheshunt were visitors to their own ground to face temporary tenants Enfield Town and took the lead midway through the first half with a goal from Chris Sargent. Adam Wallace squared it with 17 minutes left.

Division One South

THE last 100 per cent record in the Ryman League has gone. After winning their first six games, Dulwich were held to a 1-1 draw at Whitehawk on Saturday.

Although Hawks were generally on top,it was Dulwich who took the lead with a 34th-minute penalty by Junior Kadi. Sam Gargan replied before half-time and Dulwich keeper James Tedder ensured there was no further scoring. The visitors had Ray Powell sent off in the closing stages.

The south London club retained the leadership by the slender margin of a single goal from Bognor – the same margin, of course, by which the Rocks missed automatic promotion last season.

Bognor themselves marched to a 4-0 win at Whyteleafe, who paid the price for their inability to deal with Ben Johnson's corners. They led to headed goals by Jason Prior and Tim Bond in the first 25 minutes and a shot by Luke Nightingale midway through the second half. Terry Dodd completed the scoring at the end

Worthing, who had scored at least four times in each of their previous home games, looked on course for a repeat when Jamie Brotherton and Billy Franks put them 2-0 up against Ramsgate after only 18 minutes. But that turned out to be the final score and only a defiant show by home goalie Alan Mansfield denied Rams a comeback.

Worthing moved back into third place, three points behind the leading duo and a point ahead of four teams on the 15-point mark.

That quartet is headed by Godalming, who won 4-0 at Crawley Down to leave the hosts still pointless and now five adrift at the foot of the table. But there were hopeful signs for the Anvils during a goalless first half. It was only when Scott Harris put the visitors ahead after 55 minutes that they started to control the game and further goals followed in the closing stages from Ben Edwards, Harris again and Jon Palmer.

Next in the table are Maidstone, who lost their first two league games and have since won five on the trot as well as chalking up two ninegoal FA Cup romps.

Their menacing climb up the table continued with victory at Chipstead, though it was not their most convincing display and the outcome might have been different if Chipstead's Billy Harding had not been sent off in the 40th minute. Sam Bewick netted the decisive goal three minutes later.

Folkestone are stuck on 15 points after going down 2-0 at Sittingbourne. Both goals came from Joe Goldsmith, a 57th-minute penalty after a foul on Ryan Golding and a last-minute clincher.

Completing the 15-point group are Corinthian-Casuals after they beat their Walton namesakes by the odd goal in three at Tolworth. They had to do it the hard way, falling behind to a Charlie Ide penalty after 18 minutes and then going down to ten men just before the half-hour when Jason Turley said too much to the referee.

But the hosts overcame that handicap to draw level with a Joel Thompson header in the 40th minute and took the lead four minutes after the break through Kane Sargeant, who missed a late chance to make it more convincing from the penalty spot.

Burgess Hill were celebrating after their first victory of the season, 3-2 at Hythe. Jones Awuah put them ahead moments before half-time and it was 3-0 by the 56th minute as Lloyd Cotton and George Hayward struck. It was not all over; Dave Cook pulled one back on 73 minutes and converted a penalty three minutes later. But Hillians hung on to that much-needed win.

Croydon Athletic had to settle for a home point against Merstham despite being two up in 12 minutes. Goals by Peter Afolayan and David Graves raised Rams fans' hopes of an afternoon to remember but they failed to take further chances and suffered as Dan Harding and Fabio Savaraia made it 2-2 in the second half

All square, too, at Walton & Hersham, who must have expected three points against Eastbourne when Phil Williams broke the deadlock on 79 minutes, only for Sam Crabb to make it 1-1 in added time.

Whitstable's season has been the opposite of Maidstone's. Buoyant after opening with two victories, they remain stuck on six points after seven matches.

Their latest defeat came at home to neighbours Faversham. The first half was even but Ashley Brown headed home five minutes after the interval and Aaron Quain made it 2-0 with ten minutes left.
