ALL THE WEEKEND ACTION

Premier Division

A LAST-MINUTE goal by Harrison Chatting lifted Billericay to the top of the Premier Division table on Saturday.

The Essex club, who have crept up almost unnoticed, won 1-0 at Met Police, who had to play with ten men for three-quarters of the game after Elliot Taylor was sent off for pulling back Dave Knight.

It was still not easy for Billericay, who were indebted to keeper Nicky Morgan for a fine save from Joe Sheldon, but Chatting emerged as the last-gasp hero when he intercepted a pass on halfway and raced clear to score.

Craig Edwards' men are a point clear in a leading group as congested as the M25 in rush hour. The top seven are covered by just two points.

Lowestoft, who were top, slipped back to second after being held to a 0-0 draw at Wealdstone. Peter Dean missed a golden chance to win it for Stones in the closing stages.

Early-season table-toppers Hendon are back up to third after their 2-0 victory at Hastings. It was a one-sided game, but the Greens had to wait until the 74th minute before defender Michael Peacock headed home a corner to break the deadlock. Elliott Charles added the second three minutes later.

Also a point behind the leaders are Lewes, who made the most of a bright start to win 2-1 at Canvey. Michael Malcolm scored twice in the first 20 minutes to put the visitors in control. Alex Rhodes gave Canvey hope with 16 minutes left but Lewes held out despite missing a chance to clinch it when Paul Booth's penalty was saved by James Russell.

Three teams are a further point back, headed by Cray who started the day in second place but went down 4-2 in an action-packed game at Kingstonian.

It was the third successive win for K's, who seem to have put their poor start to the season well behind them.

Jack Clark put Cray ahead after six minutes, Simon Huckle responded four minutes later and Cray went ahead again just before the half-hour through Chris Saunders. The game turned on its head when Gary MacDonald equalised in the 57th minute and Ali Chabaan put K's ahead within seconds of the restart. Allan Tait wrapped it up 12 minutes from time.

Behind Cray on goal difference are Hornchurch, whose fifth away victory in six attempts came

courtesy of a lone Lewis Smith goal 18 minutes into their game at East Thurrock.

Bury complete the top seven thanks to a 2-1 home success over bottom club Leatherhead. Danny Cunningham scored early in each half for Bury, while Greg Andrews converted a penalty in the 32nd minute to put Tanners on terms for a while. They are still without a league win and are four points adrift.

Concord, though, are off the mark. Their first win came in convincing style, 3-0 at Horsham who have yet to collect a home point after six attempts.

The return of Tony Stokes from injury has given Concord the lift they needed and it was he who put them ahead in the fourth minute, adding another around the 20-minute mark. Harry Elmes got the third midway through the second half and Concord climbed to 20th place, overtaking their hosts.

Aveley moved out of the bottom four, replaced by East Thurrock, after beating Tooting 2-1 in south London. Millers dominated the first half but had to settle for a single goal, headed home by Sherwin Stanley in the 32nd minute after Daryl Robson's header came back off the bar.

Danny Francis added an overdue second in the 78th minute but Millers almost paid the penalty for a host of missed chances when Lee Newman replied for Terrors in the closing stages and Andy McCollin almost snatched an equaliser.

The final game in the division was at Margate and yes, it was an away win. Kwesi Appiah hit a post for the hosts before Paul Vines netted the only goal in the 69th minute to give Carshalton the points.

That meant that seven of the day's ten Premier Division games were won by the visitors, and there have now been 55 away victories in the section compared with just 39 occasions when the home side have come out on top.

Only Leatherhead have yet to win away while no fewer than seven teams are still seeking their first success on home turf.

Division One South

THERE was only one game in Division One South on Saturday because of the FA Trophy and it was Hythe who made the most of the chance to steal a three-point march on the rest of the division by beating Croydon Athletic 2-1 in Kent.

They should really have settled it by half-time but, for all their possession, they were unable to

add to a 17th-minute goal by Brendon Cass and found themselves back on level terms just before the break.

Jon Cartledge was the marksman, pouncing when Hythe keeper Paul Egan could only parry Jamie England's free-kick.

The second half was more even but it was Hythe who grabbed the winner in the 79th minute when skipper Dave Cook headed home from a corner for his seventh league goal of the season and eighth in all.

Alan Boon Cup

Two Division One South clubs who had byes in the FA Trophy played their first round tie in the Alan Boon Cup, as the League Cup is now known, and it was Dulwich who maintained their unbeaten record against Ryman opposition, though they needed to win a penalty shoot-out 4-2 to see off visitors Godalming.

Junior Kadi gave Dulwich a half-time lead but it looked as if G's might have snatched it when Gavin Smith's second goal put them ahead with eight minutes left.

Peter Adeniyi swiftly made it 2-2, however, and the match became the first in the competition to go straight to penalties after 90 minutes, a new rule introduced this season. Dulwich converted their first four kicks while Darren Wheeler and George Short missed out for the visitors.

FA Trophy

WHITEHAWK must feel they have spent most of the week on a coach. Their 100-mile journey from Brighton to Maldon on Tuesday ended in an FA Cup replay defeat but their 135-mile trip home from Soham on Saturday was made in a rather happier mood after the Division One South side powered to a 7-1 victory over their hosts from the North section.

Josh Jones put Hawks ahead after three minutes, James Fraser made it 2-0 at half-time and further strikes from Sam Gargan and Ben Godfrey put them out of reach before Richard Gammon netted for the home side on 66 minutes. Hawks completed the rout with three goals in the last eight minutes from Callum Saunders, Matthew Daniels and Fraser.

Needham Market restored the balance for the North division as they travelled south, also around 135 miles, to thump Ramsgate 7-2 in Kent. Rams actually scored first through Joseph Afusi in the 15th minute but Jose Espinosa fired an instant equaliser and it was all Needham after that. Sam Newson scored twice in five minutes, taking his tally to 11 for the season, Bradley Barber made it 4-1 at the interval and it was six by the 51st minute as Gavin Johnson and Angelo Harrop piled on the pain.

Duane Wright completed Needham's third seven-goal haul of the season in the 75th minute before Gareth Cornhill scored Ramsgate's second with a penalty in added time.

Altogether there were six Division One North v South clashes and honours were even, with each division winning three times.

Thamesmead were indebted to their substitutes for their 3-2 home victory over Whitstable. Trailing at half-time to a Peter Hawkins goal, Thamesmead levelled five minutes into the second half though Theo Fairweather-Johnson. Bradley Killick stepped off the bench to score with his first touch in the 64th minute, then set up the chance for fellow-sub David Noel to make it 3-1. James Simmons reduced the arrears with seven minutes left.

Enfield Town came from a goal down to go through 2-1 at Walton & Hersham. Kenny Ojukwu netted a seventh-minute opener for the Swans but Leon Osei replied with a free-kick on the half-hour and Rudi Hall converted a second-half penalty to decide it.

Eastbourne Town beat visitors Chatham 4-3 with two late goals. Chatham were two up in 13 minutes through Jon Pilbeam and Garry Tilley and, although Matt Geard pulled one back before half-time, Tilley struck again in the 55th minute. Sam Crabb closed the gap on 66 minutes and also netted the equaliser with eight minutes left, setting the stage for Luke Denton to head the winner.

Chipstead were the other winners from the South. Marcus Elliott's sixth-minute strike was all they needed for victory at Ware.

Three games pitted sides from Division One South against each other and the stars of this show were Crawley Down. The bottom club could perhaps have been excused for giving up hope in their tie at high-flying Worthing when Jamie Brotherton put the hosts ahead with just 11 seconds on the clock, especially as the Anvils had kicked off.

It was not to be so easy for Rebels. Luke Blewden equalised in the 12th minute and, after Ryan McBride restored Worthing's lead with a header, the Anvils made it 2-2 at the interval through Gabriel Odunaiké. Hassan Nyang then fired the visitors in front soon after half-time but Tom Manton replied shortly afterwards. It was the Anvils who could have won it, but Fraser Logan's penalty was saved and it finished 3-3.

Walton Casuals and Faversham must also try again after Danny Buckle's penalty in the third minute of added time earned Casuals a 2-2 home draw. Damian Abel put the visitors ahead after 21 minutes but Mark Nicholls soon levelled matters. Abel's second in the 74th-minute almost won it for the Kent side.

Burgess Hill saw off Corinthian-Casuals at Leylands Park with three unanswered second-half goals. Jones Awuah headed the opener after 50 minutes, with Tyrone Berry and George Hayward adding late goals as the visitors threw men forward.

On to Division One North, where there were five intra-divisional battles on Saturday.

Redbridge chalked up their seventh successive away victory, 3-2 at local rivals Ilford. Ben Bradbury headed the Motormen into an early lead but the bottom club hit back with a double strike, a Stephen Opoka penalty ten minutes after half-time and a close-range shot by Sam Adejokun three minutes later. Redbridge responded with a Glen Golby header on the hour and Dan Trenkel nabbed the winner nine minutes later.

Leaders Grays fell behind to a fifth-minute Tim Shaw goal at Waltham Abbey but earned a replay with a header by Junior Baker soon after the interval.

Nine men of Potters Bar pulled off a 1-0 home victory over Heybridge. James Gershfield and Josh Urquhart were sent off in the first half but a penalty by Tom Pett ten minutes after the break gave Bar a shock lead. Heybridge then lost half their numerical advantage when Danny Barber was dismissed in the 63rd minute and they were unable to reply.

There were plenty of chances at both ends at Brentwood but the hosts got the only goal. Emmanuel Osei scored three minutes after half-time to account for Leiston.

Great Wakering, twice on the wrong end of seven-goal hidings this season, suffered a 6-1 pasting at Sudbury, who are below them in the table.

James Baker's ninth-minute goal for the hosts was answered by Jamie Salmon nine minutes later. Then Sudbury took charge, with Nathan Clarke scoring twice before the interval, either side of a Ryan Henshaw strike. Robbie Martin added the fifth and Dave Wareham wrapped it up from the spot.

That leaves six ties in which Southern League clubs provided the opposition and only two Ryman League teams survived, both aided by late goals.

Scott Simpson was the hat-trick hero as Whyteleafe produced a rousing finish to see off North Greenford 4-3, having trailed 3-1 with only 12 minutes left.

There was no scoring at all until the 56th minute, when the visitors went ahead. Simpson quickly

equalised, but a Zac Joseph double put Greenford on top. Leafe hit back with two goals in a minute from Stephane Gnamore and Simpson before Simpson kept his cool to convert an 88th-minute penalty.

An own goal by Jerry Nnanami looked to have accounted for Sittingbourne, but they will travel to Northwood for a replay thanks to a 93rd-minute equaliser from Hicham Akhazzan.

Shaun Welford's 14th goal of the season gave Maidstone an early lead at Ashford (Middx) but two goals soon after half-time set Ashford on their way to a 3-1 win.

A goal in each half by Matt Hayes gave AFC Hayes a 2-1 home win over Cheshunt, who drew level through Kevin Ashwood in the 55th minute but conceded the winner eight minutes from time.

Romford were beaten 4-1 at Bedfont, having briefly drawn level in the first half through Kurt Smith, and Bognor suffered their second defeat of the week when they went down 1-0 at home to Mangotsfield.

First-half goals by Billy Melton and Josh Bonnett saw Waltham Forest through with a 2-1 home win over Tilbury on Sunday.

Melton struck after 13 minutes, working himself a shooting opportunity and finding the bottom corner of the net from 20 yards.

Another Melton shot, this one mishit, was intercepted by Josh Bonnett and fired into the net from close range to make it 2-0 five minutes before the interval.

Tilbury pulled one back 20 minutes into the second half when recently-arrived substitute Harry Cook did well to volley home an awkwardly-dropping ball. Dockers applied plenty of pressure after that but Forest defended well to keep them at bay.

With no replay needed, Forest will have played on only two grounds between August 23 and October 19, a run of 14 games including ten home fixtures and two away matches against landlords Ilford, in the league and FA Cup.

They have visited Cheshunt in the league and are due back there again to face temporary tenants Enfield Town in the Alan Boon Cup in the final game of the sequence.

To add to the oddness, their next scheduled game was also away to Enfield, in the league on October 22, but would have been played on a different ground since it was planned to be Enfield's first outing at their new home. But the match has been postponed as it clashes with the next round of the Trophy.
