Ryman Premier

WITH the top four clubs involved in FA Cup action, their closest pursuers had the chance to make up ground in the division's first matches for three weeks on Saturday – and they did.

Kingstonian and **Whitehawk** both climbed four places to take over first and second spot respectively with 3-1 home wins. But it's tight: they and the three teams behind them all have 14 points.

Two goals by Wade Small were the key to Kingstonian's victory over **Lewes**. He opened the scoring after nine minutes and, after a spectacular 20th-minute reply from Anthony Thomas, who lashed home from 35 yards, it was Small who struck again in the 38th minute. Worse was to follow for Lewes before the interval when Ben Godfrey was shown a second yellow card and Dean Lodge clinched it for K's with 14 minutes left.

Whitehawk, in only their third season out of the Sussex County League, climbed to the highest position in their history by seeing off **Wingate** at East Brighton Park. The sides exchanged headed goals, with the visitors taking a 14th-minute lead through Dan Morris and Sam Gargan equalising 11 minutes later. Jed Wallace put Hawks ahead with a superb solo goal shortly before half-time and debutant Romone McCrae added the third, another header, after 75 minutes.

Bognor could have joined the group on 14 points with a home win over **Wealdstone** but a Richard Jolly goal early in the second half was enough for the visitors who moved up to seventh, only two points off the pace. Bognor skipper Kane Wills received a late red card.

Leiston drew for the third time in their four home league games. Gareth Heath put them ahead against **Canvey** in the 40th minute and the islanders made it 1-1 though Kevin Dobinson just after the hour with the hosts appealing for handball.

Ryman North

FORMER England striker and Premiership winner Chris Sutton, 39, could not prevent **Tilbury** climbing to the top of the table with a 3-2 victory at **Wroxham**.

Sutton, most famous for his role as Alan Shearer's strike partner in Blackburn's march to the Premiership title in 1994-95, came off the bench for his debut midway through the second half with the Yachtsmen trailing 1-0. He joined his 16-year-old son Oliver, a goalkeeper who had himself come on as a substitute soon after half-time due to an injury.

Joel Barnett had put Tilbury ahead midway through the first half and, after the arrival of the Sutton family, Danny Francis made it 2-0 with 20 minutes to go. Five minutes later, though, it was 2-2 thanks to a quickfire double by Ben Thompson, and Chris Sutton looked capable of becoming a matchwinner. But Tilbury snatched it when Aaron Waters scored direct from a corner in the 86th minute.

Cheshunt enjoyed a four-goal spree in the last ten minutes of the first half, setting up a 4-2 win at **Soham** which lifted them to second spot. Buster Harradine converted a penalty early in each half for the hosts, but to no avail because of that goal rush provided by Michael Deane, Tony Burke, with another penalty, Courtney White and Jose Espinoza.

A second successive 1-1 away draw cost **Potters Bar** the leadership and they dropped to third place, though still level on points with the sides above them. James Gershfield gave them an early lead at **Sudbury** with his 14th goal of the season, also becoming the first Ryman League player to reach double figures in league matches alone, but Leon Antoine replied six minutes before the interval, having earlier hit the bar. The hosts had Bradley Thomas sent off with 14 minutes left and only a fine save by Fred Howe prevented Gershfield netting a winner.

Fourth-placed **Maldon** moved to within two points of the leading trio with a 3-0 victory at **Waltham Abbey**. Jamie Guy's 20th-minute goal was all that separated the sides until the hour mark, when Frank Everett made it 2-0. James Robinson completed the scoring in added time.

Aveley have yet to win a league game at home but they collected their fourth away victory to take over fifth place. Their 2-1 success at **Chatham** was achieved with first-half goals from Paul Burnett and Jordan Cox. Lee Hales replied shortly after half-time for the Kent club but all their pressure could not produce an equaliser, although Harry Smith hit the bar deep into added time.

Like Cheshunt, **Romford** produced a flurry of goals on their way to a 3-1 win at bottom club **Ware**. Tom Richardson opened the scoring in the 34th minute and within six minutes long-serving Paul Clayton and Nick Reynolds, with a fierce header, had made it 3-0. Robbie Green pulled one back midway through the second half but the damage had been done. Ware had Reece Loudon sent off near the end.

Grays, playing with ten men for more than half the game, were held to their third home draw in five league outings at Rush Green, this time by **Needham Market**. Jake Hall was sent off in the 35th minute and the Marketmen took the lead six minutes into the second half through Jack Wilkinson. Substitute Luke Marshall rescued the depleted home side with ten minutes left.

Two late goals saw **Heybridge** to a 3-1 home victory over **Witham**. Ben Newson put Swifts ahead after 15 minutes with Lewis Godbold replying in the 39th minute. That was it until the 84th minute, when Luke Callander restored the home side's lead, and Newson sealed the points with his 11th of the season in league and cups.

Iford slogged out a goalless draw at home to **Thamesmead** while, a couple of miles to the north, **Redbridge's** game against **Harlow** was called off because of a waterlogged pitch.

Ryman South

Leaders **Folkestone** travelled to **Dulwich**, where they were beaten in last season's play-off semi-final, and the outcome was the same. The outstanding Erhun Oztumer broke the deadlock with a 30-yard curler in the 54th minute and his penalty with 14 minutes left completed a 2-0 Dulwich victory. They move up to third place and, with second-placed Crawley Down having the day off, Folkestone retained pole position.

Dulwich, in fact, were the only side who started the day in the top ten and managed to collect three points. **Walton & Hersham**, who were third, went down 3-2 at **Sittingbourne** for whom Joe Taylor netted a hat-trick. He was the first Brickie to do so for almost four years, since Richard Brady, now manager of Leatherhead, scored three against Chipstead in October 2008.

Less good news for the Brickies was that they finished with nine men for the second successive Saturday. Ashley Ulph was first to go, after only 24 minutes, and Phil Williams put the visitors ahead on 38 minutes. Taylor headed the equaliser for the ten men on the stroke of half-time but Josh Bonnett put Swans ahead again just before the hour mark. Taylor struck twice in the next ten minutes to complete his treble and his side held out despite having Jason Dolby sent off near the end.

Chipstead's good form ended with a 3-0 defeat at **Eastbourne Town**. Richard Greenfield broken the deadlock immediately after half-time and Danny Curd quickly made it 2-0 from a chance provided by Greenfield. Curd nabbed his second with three minutes left.

Herne Bay and **Burgess Hill** drew 1-1 in Kent. It was scoreless for just over an hour and then both goals arrived from headers in the space of five minutes, Omar Burgiel for the Hillians and Calum McGeehan for the hosts.

Bottom club **Hythe** had games in hand over the sides immediately above them and proved they were in a false position by thrashing **Tooting** 5-2, after which losing manager Roberto Forzoni resigned. Ronnie Dolan's third-minute goal gave Hythe an early boost and Dave Cook doubled their lead on 24 minutes, converting the rebound from his own missed penalty. Kai Bichard pulled one back, Dolan made it 3-1 and Sol Pinnock grabbed Tooting's second at the end of the first half. Hythe again went two goals clear through Brendon Cass four minutes after the restart and this time Terrors had no answer. James Dryden added the fifth ten minutes from time.

Tooting finished above only **Horsham** in the Premier last season and the pair find now themselves in the same positions a division lower. Horsham took over the wooden-spoon slot after going down 3-1 at **Faversham**, having taken a second-minute lead through Ryan Marriott. Adrian Stone and Dave Botterill had Faversham ahead by the half-hour and Luke Harvey nabbed their third with a clever chip as the game entered its last quarter.

The table does not make pretty reading for West Sussex, for **Worthing** are 20th after going down 2-1 at home to **Corinthian-Casuals**. It was the first win of the season for Casuals, though they had drawn five of their previous seven games and they only avoided sharing the points for the sixth time thanks to Jamie Byatt's 90th-minute decider. Danny Green had put Casuals ahead after 12 minutes and Scott Kirkwood equalised with a penalty at the same stage of the second half.

Three Bridges have been involved in some high-scoring games during their brief Ryman career; indeed, their first four away matches had produced an average of five goals apiece and they maintained that figure with a 3-2 victory at **Walton Casuals**. Liam Holden's 14th-minute penalty for the home side was saved but they took the lead eight minutes later through Sol Patterson-Bohner. Abu Touray replied moments before the half-time whistle and Ellis Hooper gave Bridges the lead early in the second half only for Sam Robinson to hit back straight away. Joel O'Hara's 73rd-minute goal was decisive.

Whitstable found themselves trailing after eight minutes at **Ramsgate**, for whom Warren Schulz was the marksman with a header, but scored twice in the second half to capture the points. Jake Beecroft levelled matters from long-range soon after the interval and Dane Luchford netted a late winner in goalmouth scramble.

Merstham also took an early lead in their home game with **Leatherhead**, Rob Carter the scorer, and they went on to win 3-1. Mark Nwokeji struck an important blow when he doubled the lead at the end of the first half. Greg Andrews pulled one back with a 75th-minute penalty but soon afterwards it was Merstham who were awarded a spot-kick and Fabio Saraiva made no mistake.

FA Cup

BURY TOWN were convincing winners of the FA Cup clash between the third and second sides in the Ryman Premier table. **Hampton** travelled to Suffolk having conceded only two goals in ten league and cup matches this season, but saw that proud record wrecked as Bury stormed to a 4-0 victory and moved to within 90 minutes of the first round proper.

Sam Reed started the rout after nine minutes and set up the chance for Luke Ingram to double the lead in the 34th minute. Another Reed strike midway through the second half effectively settled the outcome, with Hampton's misery completed by a late effort from Connor Hall.

Also through are **East Thurrock**, bidding to reach the first round for the second successive year. They ended **Maidstone's** high-scoring Cup exploits with a 3-0 victory at Corringham. Sam Higgins set them on their way with a 23rd-minute penalty and Reiss Gilbey made it 2-0 on 35 minutes. Maidstone's hopes of recovery were hit when Alex Flisher was sent off midway through the second half and Kris Newby put the icing on Rocks' cake with two minutes left.

They were the only two all-Ryman ties, and just one club from the league put out 'foreign' opposition. That was **Lowestoft**, for whom a 59th-minute goal by Joe Francis was enough for victory at Southern League side St Albans. There was little to choose between the sides in the first half, during which Lewis Toomey hit the bar for the Saints, but the Trawlerboys raised their game after the break and deserved to go through.

Four more Ryman sides will be in the hat on Monday, and three of them have home advantage in their replays including the Premier's bottom club, **Thurrock**, who did well to draw 1-1 at Welling, fifth in Conference South. Charlie Stimson headed his fifth goal of the season - none have come in the league - to give Thurrock a fourth-minute lead and although Ross Lafayette levelled matters on 33 minutes Welling could do no more. Matt Turpin found the net for Thurrock in the closing stages but a flag was up for offside and the sides will meet again at Ship Lane on Tuesday.

Hendon will also replay at home against Conference South opposition on Tuesday after a 2-2 draw at Eastbourne Borough. Greg Ngoyi fired them ahead just after the interval and struck again to restore their advantage immediately after Chris Shephard's 71st-minute equaliser. Shephard saved the Sussex club with his own second goal five minutes from time and Hendon had Scott Shulton sent off in added time.

Met Police had to settle for a 1-1 draw at Step 5 club Dereham, despite taking an 11th-minute lead when Craig Brown's intended cross landed in the net. Shaun Bammant came off the bench at half-time for the Eastern Counties club and equalised within two minutes, earning his side a trip to Imber Court on Wednesday.

Hastings face a testing replay at Hitchin on Monday after a 2-2 draw at the Pilot Field. Dee Okojie pounced on a poor back-pass to give the Sussex club an 11th-minute lead but John Frendo's free-kick wiped that out within three minutes. Okojie set up the chance for Brad Goldberg to put Hastings back on terms two minutes after the break and Frendo turned goalmaker as he sent Zak Burke through to complete the scoring in the 62nd minute.

Premier leaders **Margate** will be disappointed to have gone down 1-0 at home to lower-division Southern League side Slough. Danny Burnell, who scored four times in an FA Cup tie for Wealdstone two seasons ago, got the goal four minutes before half-time. Margate almost saved it in the closing stages, when Alex Rhodes missed a good chance and a Richard Avery header hit the bar.

Cray took the lead at home to Chelmsford, of Conference South, but were beaten 2-1 as Jamie Slabber headed home twice in four minutes soon after the interval. Chris Saunders had put Cray ahead right at the end of a scrappy first half.

Brentwood were beaten 3-1 by Step 5 club South Park. The Reigate-based Combined Counties League side took the initiative with a second-minute goal by Kieran Lavery and doubled their lead through Chris Smith at the other end of the half. Alex Read put Brentwood back in the game with a close-range header after 48 minutes but Jack Higgins struck for the home side seven minutes later and Blues were unable to respond. It might have been worse, but the crossbar denied Smith his second goal.

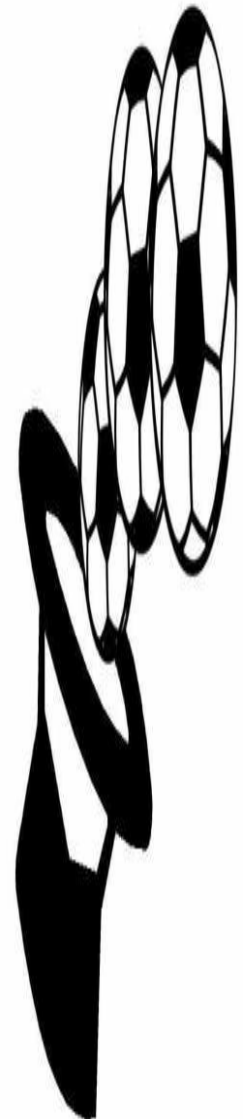
