Ryman Premier

THE division's last unbeaten record vanished on Monday as **Wealdstone** wiped out a 2-0 half-time deficit to defeat table-topping **Hampton** 3-2 at Grosvenor Vale.

The Beavers looked set to open a four-point gap at the top after Joel Ledgister put them ahead in the 24th minute and Tom Hickey added another eight minutes later.

Peter Dean started the Stones comeback three minutes after the interval and Sean Cronin made it 2-2 in the 58th minute.

Then, with a minute left, Richard Jolly finished off a through ball to give Stones all three points. A red card for Gary Holloway completed a bad 45 minutes for the visitors, though they remained on top while Wealdstone moved up to fourth, two points off the pace.

Ryman North

A LONG-RANGE drive by skipper Adrian Clifton set **Waltham Forest** on their way to a crushing 6-1 victory at **Needham Market** on Tuesday. It was their first away win of the season and left the Marketmen still looking for their first success at home.

Clifton's strike came after 12 minutes and Forest doubled their lead 12 minutes later when Rhys Barber turned the ball into his own net. Nathan Clarke immediately pulled one back but Needham suffered another blow when Corey Whitely made it 3-1 five minutes before the break.

A Joel Palmer double made it five before the hour mark and Manu Dagher completed the six-hit with 18 minutes still left to play.

The other game in the division brought a welcome point for out-of-form **Sudbury**, who drew 1-1 at home to Thamesmead. Robbie Martin put Sudbury ahead in the 58th minute and **Thamesmead** replied with a James Smith own goal. That left them 11 minutes to come up with a winning goal that would have lifted them into the play-off spots, but it was not to be.

Ryman South

A CROWD of 1,623 at the Gallagher Stadium on Tuesday saw **Maidstone** power to the top of the Ryman South table with a 3-0 win over **Chipstead**. Stones are two points clear and have one or two games in hand on everyone else in the top half.

Alex Flisher's sixth-minute goal gave Stones a good start and Ian Draycott doubled the lead on the stroke of half-time. It was Draycott, too, who made sure of the points with his second goal after 73 minutes.

Hythe moved up to third place with two unanswered goals at **Dulwich**, the first home defeat for the South London club who dropped out of the top five. Craig Thompson broke the deadlock after 62 minutes and Nick Barnes added the second with five minutes left.

Horsham were also unbeaten at home despite being 20th in the table but their record vanished, too, as **Ramsgate**, who were 19th, pulled off a 2-0 victory in Sussex. James Sherman, in the 37th minute, and Dean Hill, in the 69th, were the marksmen.

Leatherhead stormed into a three-goal lead after half an hour of their home game with **Eastbourne**, with Tom Bradbrook adding a pair to Mark Simmons' opener. But it was still a nervous finish for the Tanners after John Lansdale pulled one back on the hour and Kenny Pogue made it 3-2 with ten minutes left.

Walton Casuals remain at the foot of the table despite taking a point from a 1-1 draw at **Sittingbourne**, who missed a chance to move into the top five. They were on course to do so when Nick Davis scored after 14 minutes but Sam Robinson squared it four minutes before the interval.

It was the same scoreline at **Walton & Hersham**, where Ryan Philpott put **Folkestone** ahead just before the half-hour and Gary Frewen levelled matters 16 minutes from time.

FA Trophy

THERE was no shortage of action in Tuesday's FA Trophy replays but only one upset. That was at **Lewes**, where the Premier side were beaten 3-0 by **Brentwood**, 17th in Ryman North.

Brentwood had led three times on Saturday before having to settle for a 3-3 draw, but they did not slip up at the Dripping Pan after Greg Cohen had put them ahead with a seventh-minute penalty. Another Cohen penalty in the 64th minute left Lewes in deep trouble and it was all over when Alex Read added a 73rd-minute strike to his hat-trick in the first game. Blues earned themselves a trip to Kingstonian in the third qualifying round.

A goalless first half at Imber Court gave little hint of what was to come in the clash between **Met Police** and Premier rivals **Leiston**. Jordan Bird put the home side ahead five minutes after the break, only for Rhys Henry to square it two minutes later.

The game finally caught fire in the 70th minute when Allan Tait put the Met 2-1 up. Three minutes later they were behind thanks to goals from Gareth Heath and Luke Hammond, and then Tait made it 3-3 in the 78th minute. Leiston, though, had the last word when Emmanuel Osei's goal in the 87th minute gave them a 4-3 victory and left the Met to concentrate on Saturday's home tie with Crawley in the FA Cup. Leiston will be at home to Premier leaders Hampton in the next round.

The other all-Premier replay, the local derby between **Thurrock** and **East Thurrock**, also produced seven goals and in this one it was the hosts who came out on top, earning themselves another home tie against Brackley. A Sam Collins double put East Thurrock 2-0 up at the interval but Leroy Griffiths reduced the arrears on 58 minutes and Charlie Stimson equalised in the 71st minute.

It went to extra time and Marc Gorbell restored Rocks' lead in the 99th minute, only for Thurrock defender Matt Turpin to score twice in the last five minutes to see his side to a 4-3 win. It was another high-scoring Tuesday heartbreaker for East Thurrock, who went out of the FA Cup on penalties to Chelmsford after a 4-4 draw a week ago.

Both Ryman sides involved in replays against Southern League clubs came from behind to win, making the final score 5-1 in the clashes between the two leagues.

An own goal gave **Canvey** a fifth-minute lead at home to Uxbridge, who hit back to go 2-1 up soon after half-time. Louie Dennis squared it on the hour and two Rob King penalties in the 71st and 78th minutes saw Canvey through 4-2. They host Chesham in the next round.

Cray fell behind early in each half at Arlesey but Paul Vines equalised on each occasion, forcing the game into an extra 30 minutes which Arlesey could have done without as they prepare for their FA Cup visit to Coventry on Saturday. A penalty shoot-out was only two minutes away when Laurent Hamici struck to give Cray a 3-2 win and an attractive home derby against Welling.

There was only one goal in a scrappy affair at **Grays**. It came from James Fraser a minute after half-time and saw **Whitehawk** through to the third qualifying round, in which they will visit Maidstone.

Wingate had crashed to a 3-0 defeat in their replay at Hitchin on Monday despite keeping prolific marksman John Frendo off the scoresheet. Frendo was aiming to equal a Hitchin club record by scoring for the ninth successive game.

Instead, it was Zak Burke who proved too hot for Wingate to handle. He claimed all three goals, in the 20th, 52nd and 76th minutes.
