Cup success as three go through
All the tables and forthcoming fixtures
Respect update and Youth League latest

FA Cup

ON AN excellent Saturday for the Ryman League in the fourth qualifying round of the FA Cup, three clubs went through to the first round proper and a fourth will be in the hat with a home replay to come.

The best performance came from **Hendon**, who reached the first round in 2010 and were beaten at this stage last year. They fell behind at Conference North club Corby when Josh Moreman scored in the eighth minute.

Top marksman Greg Ngoyi, very much in form after a slow start to the season, levelled the scores seven minutes before the interval and Michael Murray struck the winner in the 64th minute.

A stormy ending to the game brought red cards for Elliott Charles and Corby's Carl Piergianni but that could not spoil Hendon's delight. They were to be drawn away to Aldershot Town, a club that was formed in 1992 to play in the old Isthmian Division Three and progressed all the way to League Two, where they are currently 23rd.

Hastings had the luck of the draw, facing Step 5 club Blackfield & Langley at home, and had an early fright before cruising to a 3-0 victory. The minnows missed a penalty after 16 minutes and paid the price when they fell behind two minutes later. Zac Attwood was the marksman after a Sean Ray header had been blocked on the line.

Bradley Goldberg made it 2-0 in the 26th minute to maintain his record of scoring in every round and player-manager Ray made sure with another header soon after half-time.

After that, Hastings' luck deserted them when they were drawn away to Conference North side Bishop's Stortford.

Teenage Crawley loanee Jonte Smith took his FA Cup goal tally into double figures as **Met Police** won 3-0 at South Park to reach the first round without playing a club higher than Step 5.

They, too, had an early scare when Chris Smith hit a post. Howard Newton headed home in a scramble after 16 minutes and Jonte Smith scored at either end of the second half to give his side a chance of facing his parent club in the next round.

Amazingly, that was what happened, and it means that the Met's young hero will be unable to take part in the tie at Imber Court. Players on loan are banned from facing their parent clubs in the FA Cup.

East Thurrock have a second chance after a deflected Kris Newby free-kick eight minutes into added time earned them a 2-2 draw at Conference South club Chelmsford. Sam Higgins gave Rocks a 14th-minute lead but David Bridges equalised just before the interval and when Kenny Clark put City ahead in the 90th minute it looked all over.

But Newby maintained Rocks' hopes of reaching the first round for the second year in a row, though even after his late, late strike Chelmsford twice went close to a winner.

Rocks have a huge incentive to win the replay but so, too, do Chelmsford, with the prize for victory being an all-Essex home tie against Colchester of League One.

Two goals by Sean Marks in the first 15 minutes left **Lowestoft** facing an uphill struggle at Conference Premier Braintree and the dismissal of Jack Defty in the 25th minute made matters worse. But the Trawlerboys pulled one back shortly afterwards through Chris Henderson and would have been level before half-time had Joe Francis been able to convert a penalty.

His kick was saved and Pat O'Connor restored Braintree's two-goal margin early in the second half. Michael Frew gave Lowestoft hope when he made it 3-2 with 12 minutes left but the ten men could not find an equaliser.

Bury Town were reduced to nine men by the second-half dismissals of Luke Ingram and Tom Bullard at Conference South side Dorchester and eventually went down 3-1. Charlie Clough's seventh-minute strike was all that separated the teams until the 88th minute, when Nick Crittenden added another.

Connor Hall gave the short-handed visitors a glimmer of hope in the 94th minute and there was time for another goal. But it came from Ben Watson for the hosts.

Ryman Premier

TABLE-TOPPING **Hampton** retained their unbeaten league record by the skin of their teeth, scoring twice in added time to salvage a 2-2 draw at **Leiston** on Saturday.

They could have taken the lead after 50 minutes but Joel Ledgister fired a penalty against the bar and, although he headed in the rebound, no-one else had touched the ball and it was disallowed.

Emmanuel Osei put Leiston ahead shortly afterwards, the first league goal Hampton had conceded away from home all season. Another followed in the 88th minute from Gareth Heath and the points seemed to be in the bag.

Tom Hickey's header in the first minute of added time lifted the leaders and they snatched a draw when they were awarded another penalty and Gary Holloway made no mistake.

Kingstonian are a point behind Hampton after their 2-1 home win over **Carshalton** in a completely contrasting game: all the goals came in the first nine minutes. Matt Pattison put K's ahead, Danny Mills headed an equaliser and Simon Huckle's 25-yarder restored the home side's advantage. After that no-one came closer to scoring than the division's top scorer, Andre McCollin, who almost stretched the lead with a shot that hit a post.

It was heads-up time for **Lewes**, who beat **Wingate** 3-1 at the Dripping Pan to record their first league victory since August. All their goals came from headers, a pair from Anthony Thomas either side of half-time and a clincher by Chris Breach in the 75th minute, just after the much-travelled Rocky Baptiste had scored his first goal for Wingate.

There were mixed fortunes for Canvey Island's two clubs. **Canvey** themselves dominated their game at **Harrow** and won 3-1. Kevin Dobinson gave them an overdue lead just before half-time but Harrow surprised them with an equaliser from Joakim Ehui four minutes after the break. Two goals in five minutes around the hour mark from Bradley Woods-Garness and Ashley Dumas made sure for Canvey.

Their neighbours, **Concord**, crashed 4-0 at home to **Cray**. Leigh Bremner made the most of a defensive mix-up to give Cray an early lead which they retained thanks to keeper Andy Walker, who turned Sam Cutler's chip on to the bar. Steve King's dismissal after 60 minutes, with manager Danny Cowley also seeing red, was a severe blow to the Beachboys and experienced marksman Paul Vines profited with his first two goals since joining Cray from Carshalton. Laurent Hamici added his first goal of the season.

Thurrock remain bottom despite a creditable 1-1 home draw with **Margate**. Stuart Thurgood's penalty gave Thurrock a 37th-minute minute lead: Tommy Murphy replied early in the second half and Margate had the better of the game after that.

Plenty of entertainment but no goals at **Bognor**, where Carl Walshe hit the woodwork for the home side and both Tyler Campbell and Joe O'Brien did so for visiting **Enfield Town**.

Ryman North

THIS was the place for fun and games on Saturday. The 11 games produced 58 goals, only two teams failed to score and every match saw the net bulge at least three times.

Nine of the goals came at **Sudbury**, where the home fans would have enjoyed Lee Boylan's hat-trick a great deal more if they had not been beaten 6-3 by **Romford**, for whom Ryan Imbert also hit three.

Imbert, in fact, set up the first goal for Paul Clayton midway through the first half before opening his own account shortly afterwards. Boylan netted a penalty and a header to square it before half-time but a volley by Nick Reynolds three minutes after the break put Boro ahead to stay. Imbert and Tom Richardson put them 5-2 up before Boylan completed his treble, and Imbert had the last word.

Wroxham produced the comeback of the day. They were 3-0 down at home to **Thamesmead** at half-time but were on level terms 12 minutes after the restart and completed the turnaround with a Matt Blake goal in added time to win 4-3.

Sean Roberts gave Thamesmead a lead which they stretched in the closing stages of the first half through Ashley Proberts, with a penalty, and Richard Butler. Adam Eastaugh, Ben Thompson and Matt Daniels, also with a penalty, put the Yachtsmen back in the game.

Maldon manager Terry Spillane took his table-topping side to former club **Redbridge** and goals from two of the men who followed him, Billy Sendall and James Robinson, bookended their 4-0 victory. Frankie Everett headed their second moments before half-time and Jamie Guy grabbed the third moments after the restart. The Motormen have lost all five home games and conceded 22 goals.

Second-placed **Potters Bar** trail Maldon on goal difference, though the gap has widened after the Scholars had to settle for a 2-1 win at **Chatham**. Player-manager Kevin Watson headed in a rebound to put Chats ahead in the

21st minute but Liam Hickey deflected a free-kick into his own net to square matters before half-time and Chris Doyle won it with seven minutes left.

Lined up behind the top two are three clubs from the borough of Thurrock (though Grays are at present playing in Romford while Romford themselves groundshare at Thurrock).

Joao Carlos was the star as **Grays** beat visiting **Harlow** 4-1 to move into third place. Tom Davie's goal on the half-hour put Harlow ahead but it all went wrong for them just after the hour, when Hector Mackie was sent off for a foul on Carlos and Harry Agombar scored from the spot. Carlos then fired a ten-minute hat-trick.

Aveley are fourth after chalking up their fifth away win – no-one else in the league has more than three – with a comfortable 4-1 success at bottom club **Ware**, the only side in the league still without a victory. Junior Dadson put the Millers ahead after 15 minutes and a Jordan Cox double early in the second half effectively settled the outcome. Ryan Fleming reduced the arrears on 62 minutes but Aveley were never in danger of letting the game slip and a late goal by Billy Holland wrapped it up.

Tilbury dropped to fifth after going down 4-2 at **Heybridge** despite taking a 17th-minute lead through the prolific Danny Francis. Michael Cheek replied and the outstanding Luke Callander put Swifts in front just before the break. They made sure in the last three minutes of normal time with a goal from Russell Malton and a Cheek penalty. An own goal by Nicky Eyre gave Dockers a little consolation deep into added time.

Cheshunt, who started the day in fourth place, slipped to sixth after being outclassed at **Waltham Abbey**, who romped to a 4-0 victory. Dean Green, Ayrton Coley and Matt Attard made it 3-0 by half-time, and Loren Maxwell added the fourth with 15 minutes left.

Needham Market have yet to win on their own territory but they made it 10 points from four away matches by crushing **Ilford** 6-1 at Cricklefield. Ollie Fenn started the rout after ten minutes and Duane Wright added a second before Warren Mfula gave Ilford some hope. A 34th-minute penalty by James Evans restored the two-goal margin and he made it 4-1 just after the hour, with two headers by Nathan Clarke completing a burst of three goals in nine minutes.

Witham went down 3-2 at **Brentwood** after mounting a late fightback to draw level. Steve Butterworth and Darren Blewitt gave Blues a 2-0 half-time lead which they held until the 76th minute, when Lewis Godbold opened Witham's account. John Watson equalised seven minutes later, only for Brentwood to have the last word through Sam Bantick four minutes into added time.

Soham once again displayed their resilience as they came from behind to win for the third match in succession. Visiting **Waltham Forest** had only themselves to blame for not adding to Corey Whitely's 41st-minute goal and they paid the price when Matt Robinson equalised after 71 minutes and Michael Simpson headed the winner ten minutes later.

Ryman South

THE top two met at **Crawley Down** on Saturday and produced a thriller worthy of the occasion which the table-topping Anvils won by the odd goal in seven.

The formidable Stuart King gave **Folkestone** an eighth-minute lead which Jamie Cade wiped out 20 minutes later. Richard Atkins quickly restored Folkestone's advantage and a Craig Richards header made it 2-2 equally quickly. Luke Blewden put the hosts in front for the first time just before the interval.

King made it 3-3 in the 55th minute, becoming the first player in the division to reach ten league goals, but a Cade penalty put Anvils ahead again eight minutes later and, remarkably, that ended the scoring.

Folkestone slipped from second to sixth in this very tight division – just 11 points separate top and bottom – with second spot being inherited by another Kent coast club, **Herne Bay**. The league debutants continued their good start to Ryman life by coming from behind to beat visiting **Horsham** 2-1. Ryan Marriott gave the visitors a well-deserved lead soon after half-time but the hosts upped their game and were in front by the 65-minute mark thanks to strikes by Rhys Lawson and Dean Grant.

Third place belongs to **Eastbourne Town**, who won the division's second 4-3 cracker. **Walton & Hersham** were two up in 20 minutes at the Saffrons with goals from Gary Frewen and Graeme Purdy, but Sonny Cobbs and Matt Crabb, with a penalty, made it 2-2 before half-time. Purdy put Walton ahead again, in the 55th minute, Ben Austin replied four minutes later and Cobbs got the decider with two minutes left.

Pre-season favourites **Maidstone** are up to fourth and looking good after their 3-1 win at **Merstham**, marred by the fact that they finished with nine men. They were able to cruise after scoring all their goals in the first 34 minutes through Tom Mills, Paul Booth and Shaun Welford. It was Booth's 15th goal of the season in the league and FA competitions.

Merstham were unable to profit from the dismissal of Tim Olorunda, who received a second yellow card in the 58th minute, but managed an 89th-minute consolation when Fabio Saraiva scored from the spot after an offence which earned Stones keeper Charlie Mitten a red card.

Joe Taylor's hat-trick for **Sittingbourne** earlier this month was the club's first for almost four years. They had to wait only two weeks for another as Ryan Golding did all the scoring in their 3-0 home win over **Corinthian-Casuals**, who had goalkeeper Danny Bracken sent off after only 28 minutes. Golding opened his account on 56 minutes and added another 12 minutes later. Shortly afterwards Danny Dudley became the second visitor to be given his marching orders and Golding completed his treble with four minutes left.

The day's fastest starters were **Burgess Hill**. Nicky Wheeler, Pat Harding and Karly Akehurst put them three up in 14 minutes at **Walton Casuals** and they went on to win 5-0. Harding completed a hat-trick by scoring seven minutes before half-time and on the hour.

There were early goals at **Ramsgate**, too, where it was 1-1 after 11 minutes. Ian Pulman put the hosts ahead and Carl Wilson-Dennis replied for **Tooting**. That was it until the 85th minute, when Sol Pinnock struck to give Tooting three well-deserved points. It was their third away win in the league yet they still find themselves at the foot of the table thanks to their failure to take a single point at home.

Leatherhead, relegated with them from the Premier last season, are above them only on goal difference after going down 3-1 at **Dulwich**, one of only four clubs in the league with 100 per cent home records. Dulwich did concede their first home goal, a Tommy Hutchings header after 25 minutes, but had already scored twice themselves. The impressive Erkan Oztumer put them ahead after five minutes and set up the second for Nyren Clunis ten minutes later. The points were not secure until added time, when Oztumer converted a penalty.

Faversham twice came from behind to draw 2-2 at home to **Three Bridges**. Marcus Elliott's early goal for Bridges was answered just before half-time by Wayne Wilson, who drilled in a free-kick. Tim Rivers restored Bridges' lead on the hour and only nine minutes were left when Dave Botterill rescued the hosts.

It was an unlucky 13th minute for **Worthing**, who fell behind to a Nicky Southall penalty for visitors **Whitstable** after Steve Metcalf was sent off for handling a James Morrish shot. Southall missed another penalty four minutes later and the ten men held out until the 83rd minute, when Jake MacKenzie completed a 2-0 win for the Oysterermen.

Hythe were down to ten even earlier in their home game against **Chipstead**. Pat Kingwell was dismissed after ten minutes and Josh Andrew's goal for Chips eight minutes later proved to be the only one.

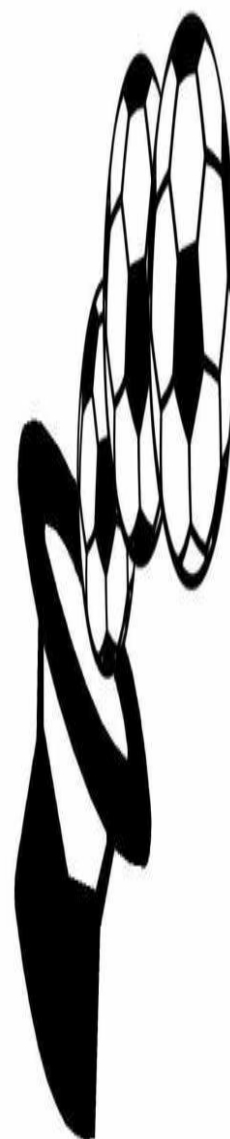

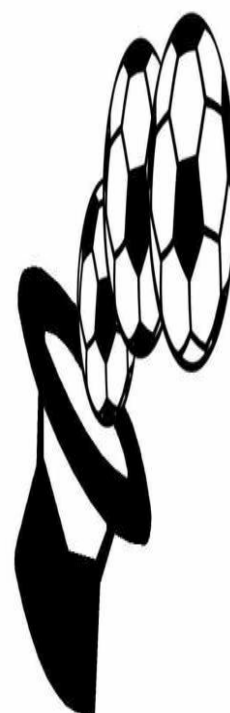

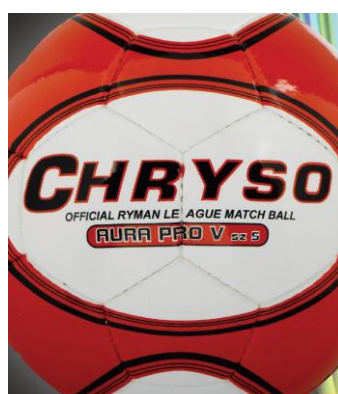
