#### Ryman South

FANS of **Walton Casuals** were in dreamland as their side, rock-bottom in the table, powered into a 6-1 half-time lead against **Merstham** on Saturday. And they were to be given a rude awakening as the visitors stormed back to capture a point in the league's first 6-6 draw for 26 years.

Casuals were four up in 17 minutes as Blake Goodman, Nana Badu, Danny Fernandez and Craig Lewington all scored their first goals of the season.

The first clouds appeared on their horizon when Mark Nwokeji pulled one back from the penalty spot. Then Fernandez had to take over between the posts from the experienced Chico Ramos.

But the deputy was given a five-goal cushion by Sam Robinson's 27<sup>th</sup>-minute penalty and a goal from Sol Patterson-Bohner three minutes before the interval.

It remained 6-1 until the 63<sup>rd</sup> minute, when Liam Wright managed to pull one back. No alarm bells as yet, but by the time Wright completed a 14-minute hat-trick Casuals were starting to rock. Fabio Saraiva made it 6-5 with an 80<sup>th</sup>-minute penalty and, five minutes later, he levelled matters with the game's fourth spot-kick. It was surely odds-on a Merstham victory now but they had to settle for the single point which had seemed so unlikely after an hour.

The league's last 6-6 draw was on November 3<sup>rd</sup> 1986, a Premier Division game between Dulwich Hamlet and Bognor in front of 246 spectators at the old Champion Hill ground.

John Lawrence was Dulwich's programme editor then (and still is). He recalls: "A greasy surface following heavy rain helped produce an open and attacking game.

"John Crumplin shot Bognor ahead after 14 minutes and Stokley Sawyers equalised on 23. Then came five goals in just seven minutes! Kevin Clements headed Bognor in front on 31 and an own goal by Phil Caulfield [which Bognor credited to their forward Geoff Cooper] made it 1-3. Paul Williams scored twice in a minute to make it 3-3 but Cooper fired home a minute later to put Bognor ahead again.

"After the interval Mick Kennedy (47), Shane Ward (69) and Ileanyi Nwajiobi (80) gave Dulwich a 6-4 lead. But Crumplin on 87 and a Clements header on 89 made it a 6-6 finish."

**Dulwich** were on the wrong end of another goalscoring feat on Saturday as **Burgess Hill**'s Pat Harding added a hat-trick to the four goals he netted at Whitstable on Tuesday, though Hillians had to settle for a 3-3 draw.

Visiting Dulwich went ahead on 23 minutes with a penalty from Erhun Oztumer. Harding struck twice in four minutes, the second another penalty, shortly before the interval only for Lewis Gonsalves to square it in the 45<sup>th</sup> minute. Harding restored Hillians' lead in the 73<sup>rd</sup> minute with his 12<sup>th</sup> league goal only for Oztumer to make it 3-3 two minutes later with a free-kick.

It was a good day for leaders Maidstone. While they had a day off from league action, and knocked Premier side Whitehawk out of the FA Trophy, none of the four teams immediately behind them in the table, including Burgess Hill and Dulwich, could take full advantage.

Second-placed **Hythe** had a golden chance to draw level with Stones on points but had to settle for a 1-1 home draw with **Walton & Hersham** when visiting keeper Sheikh Ceesay saved a Brendon Cass penalty in added time. Graeme Purdy had put Walton ahead midway through the first half and Craig Thompson levelled from 20 yards soon after the break.

**Crawley Down** dropped from fourth to fifth after becoming the latest victims of the **Tooting** revival. George Landais scored on the hour to give the Terrors a 1-0 home win which lifted them into the top half of the table only a fortnight after they had climbed off the bottom.

**Herne Bay** moved up to fourth with a hard-fought 3-2 win over **Folkestone**, who led at half-time with Stuart King's 12<sup>th</sup> league goal of the season. James Campbell's header squared it nine minutes after the break and Rhys Lawson put the home side ahead on 67 minutes only for Richard Atkins to reply straight away. Six minutes were left when Dan Wisker hit the winner.

The two clubs immediately above Walton Casuals met at **Three Bridges** and it was the hosts who took the points thanks to a goal deep into added time from Marcus Elliott which gave them a 3-2 win over **Whitstable** and lifted them above the Oystermen in the table.

James Dryden put Whitstable ahead just before the half-hour but Abu Touray equalised right on half-time (and rushed out of the ground a few minutes later to catch a flight). Elliott gave Bridges a 69<sup>th</sup>-minute lead but they had Joel O'Hara sent off shortly afterwards and the visitors thought they had rescued a point when Damian Abel made it 2-2 in the 87th minute.

After a goalless first half at **Chipstead**, the home side took the lead through Michael Gordon immediately after the restart and doubled it six minutes later with a Luke McShane penalty. **Corinthian-Casuals** responded with two quick goals from Jamie Byatt and Joel Thompson with around 20 minutes left and it finished 2-2.

Scott Kirkwood's 18<sup>th</sup>-minute goal against his former club was all **Worthing** needed for their 1-0 victory at **Eastbourne**. Five of their six league wins have come on the road.

#### Ryman Premier

ONLY one of the top six were in league action on Saturday and Margate made the most of it. A dominant performance gave them a 2-0 victory at Harrow and lifted them from fifth to third, a point behind leaders Hampton.

Tommy Whitnell put them ahead shortly before the interval and Richard Avery added another midway through the second half. Then Harrow defender Michael Barima suffered a bad head injury in an accidental collision and proceedings after that were subdued.

**Lowestoft** moved up to a threatening sixth place, with games in hand on all the sides above them, with a 1-0 victory at **Hendon**. Chris Henderson scored after ten minutes and Hendon rarely looked like hitting back, especially after Dean Cracknell was sent off midway through the first half.

**Concord** romped to a 6-3 home win over **Carshalton**, though after taking an early lead with a Harry Elmes penalty they found themselves trailing by the 20<sup>th</sup> minute as Nathaniel Pinney and Ola Sogbanmu hit back.

Tony Stokes and Jerome Walker restored Concord's lead in the 27<sup>th</sup> minute and they netted at regular intervals in the second half through Stokes, Elmes and Danny Spendlove before Sol Pinnock scored Robins' third at the death.

Hastings player-manager Sean Ray was a hero a week earlier with the equalising goal in their FA Cup win at Bishop's Stortford. Saturday was not so good; he conceded an own goal and a penalty in their 4-0 defeat at Met Police. Three goals came in the first 19 minutes: Jonte Smith volleyed the first, Ray chested the ball past his own keeper and Allan Tait notched the third. Any chance of a comeback vanished four minutes after the break when Ray upended Steve Sutherland and Smith slotted home his 18<sup>th</sup> league and cup goal from the penalty spot.

Lee Reed gave **Bury** a second-minute lead at home to **Lewes**, who replied on the hour through Karl Beckford. A draw was seven minutes away when Dan Hitching struck to give Bury a 2-1 win.

#### Ryman North

IT HAS been a wretched season so far for **Sudbury**, who were among the favourites for Ryman North honours, but they might have finally kick-started their campaign with a 6-1 home win over lowly **Redbridge** on Saturday.

Lee Boylan gave them an early lead, Dave Cowley added another and Rhys Darg's header made it 3-0 after only 15 minutes. Peter Maina netted the fourth on 24 minutes and Boylan struck again soon after half-time. Jacob Cleaver gave the Motormen a little consolation before Maina completed the six-hit in added time.

Leaders **Maldon** were defending the league's only unbeaten record and its only perfect home record, and extended both runs in style by thrashing **Wroxham** 4-0. Billy Sendall put them ahead on 25 minutes when the visitors failed to clear a corner and James Robinson made it 2-0 in the 52<sup>nd</sup> minute. Jamie Guy added two more, taking his league tally into double figures.

**Heybridge**, beaten 3-0 at Wroxham in midweek, reclaimed second place with five unanswered goals at bottom club **Ware**, who finished the game with nine men. All the damage was done when numbers were even, however. Michael Cheek's long-range strike broke the deadlock on 32 minutes and Ben Newson added another before half-time. Solomon Ofori and Luke Callander doubled the lead again early in the second half, with Callander's 13<sup>th</sup> league goal restoring his position as the top scorer in all three divisions. Tom Holdstock made it five before Charlie Moxon and Jamie Gillet were given marching orders. Ware remain four points adrift at the foot of the table.

**Potters Bar** came from behind to win 3-2 at **Witham** and reclaim third spot. A Tom Devaux header gave the hosts a half-time lead but Scholars turned it round within seven minutes of the restart through Josh Urquhart and James Gershfield, his 12<sup>th</sup> in the league. Liam Coles made it 3-1 on 72 minutes and Rob Whitnell gave Witham vain hope with a penalty six minutes from time.

**Aveley** are fourth after a 4-1 home win over **Soham**. Rashid Kamara's third-minute opener for the Millers was answered in the ninth minute by Rob Mason, making Soham the first club in the league to notch 20 away goals. Danny Hopkins restored Aveley's lead midway through the half, Jordan Cox made it 3-1 by the interval and Hopkins scored again in the 65<sup>th</sup> minute.

**Grays** dropped from second to fifth after their 1-1 draw at **Waltham Abbey**, who went ahead through James Peagram in the 62<sup>nd</sup> minute. Jared Small replied with ten minutes left.

**Thamesmead** are a point behind them after their 2-1 home win over struggling **Harlow**. All the goals came in the last 15 minutes of the first half. Ashley Probets put the hosts ahead with a long-range free-kick, Jake Cass replied and Lea Dawson hit the winner. It might have been more: Rob Carter struck the Harlow woodwork twice in the second half.

**Tilbury** are also well in the hunt, two points below the play-off spots. Jack Carlile scored from a 24<sup>th</sup>-minute corner to give the Dockers a 1-0 win at **llford**.

**Needham** maintained the league's best away record, making it five wins out of six on the road with a 3-1 success at **Cheshunt**. Kieran Leabon put them ahead after only four minutes but Cheshunt replied an hour later through Lee Brennan. The Marketmen raised their game and Sam Newson set up goals for Ollie Fenn and Danny Bloomfield in the next ten minutes.

**Waltham Forest** scored three times in the game's second quarter on their way to a 4-2 victory at **Chatham**. Arian Retkoceri, Adrian Clifton and Manu Dagher were the marksmen. Kevin Watson opened Chats' account with a 75<sup>th</sup>-minute penalty but Manny Sackey made it 4-1, also from the spot. Jack Jeffery nabbed Chatham's second deep into added time.

#### FA Trophy

THE crowds continue to pour into Maidstone's new Gallagher Stadium, where Saturday's gate of 1,571 was the highest in the country for any FA Trophy tie.

The majority of them left happy after the Ryman South leaders beat high-flying Premier side Whitehawk 3-2 in the third qualifying round.

Tim Olorunda put Stones ahead moments before half-time but Hawks hit back with two goals in as many minutes from Charlie Walker just after the hour. Tom Mills marked his 100<sup>th</sup> appearance for Maidstone with a stunning 30-yard equaliser in the 76<sup>th</sup> minute and Ian Draycott won it with six minutes left. He may have been lucky: even Maidstone boss Jay Saunders admitted that he expected the goal to be disallowed for an off-the-ball shove.

Maidstone were, in fact, the only Ryman League club to book a place in the first round proper but more will join them. There are two all-Ryman replays and three other clubs have a second chance.

**Leatherhead** fought out a thrilling 4-4 home draw with Conference South side Bath. Jerry Nnamani's second-minute goal gave Tanners a great start and, although Chris Allen quickly replied, Tom Bradbrook restored the home lead in the 14th minute.

Nnamani gifted Sean Canham a goal on 29 minutes and Aaron Brown fired home from long range to put Bath ahead immediately afterwards. Tanners hit back with a Tommy Hutchings free-kick on 56 minutes only to fall behind again when Canham claimed his second 20 minutes from time. Tanners dug deep and were rewarded with a late leveller from Hutchings.

Ryman North side **Brentwood** have a chance to add a second Premier scalp to that of Lewes, whom they beat at the second attempt in the previous round, after a last-minute equaliser gave them a 2-2 draw at **Kingstonian**.

Craig Mullen opened the scoring for K's on 52 minutes and two more goals came in the next nine minutes. Alex Read's lob levelled matters and Tom Hutchinson headed K's back into the lead. That looked likely to be the winner, but Darren Blewitt rescued Blues when he headed home a corner.

Hampton and Leiston must try again to settle their all-Premier tie after an exciting 1-1 draw in Suffolk. Charlie Moone gave Hampton the lead with a 16<sup>th</sup>-minute header, and later hit a post. Leiston levelled through top scorer Gareth Heath two minutes after half-time and they struck the bar twice.

Wealdstone, semi-finalists last season, will be disappointed that they have to travel to Corby, of Conference North, for a replay after a 1-1 draw. Corby had Josh Moreman dismissed with the game only 20 minutes old, but should have gone ahead before half-time. Sam Ives missed a penalty, but made amends with a goal six minutes after the break. Alex Dyer equalised with 17 minutes to go and a post denied Richard Jolly a winner.

**Canvey** were inches away from beating Southern Leaguers Chesham at the first attempt. Louis Dennis, who had given them an early lead, had a header deflected against the bar in the third minute of added time. Chesham had drawn level in the first half through Dave Fotheringham.

**Enfield Town** gave reigning Ryman champions Billericay a real fright before going down 3-2 at New Lodge. A header by Rob Swaine and a shot by Glenn Poole put the hosts two up in only four minutes, and it looked all over when Jay May made it 3-0 on the hour. But two goals in a minute, from Tyler Campbell and Adam Wallace, condemned Billericay to a nervous final 20 minutes.

Red cards damaged the chances of two other Ryman sides facing Conference opposition. **Ramsgate** had James Sherman sent off 24 minutes into their game at Sutton, who were already a goal up through Harry Ottaway and had also missed a penalty. Even so, it was the 82<sup>nd</sup> minute before Kyle Vassell clinched Sutton's 2-0 win.

**Thurrock** put up a brave battle before going down by the same score at home to Conference North leaders Brackley, who went in front three minutes before half-time with a Marvin Robinson header. It was the 84<sup>th</sup> minute before Gary Mulligan added the second, and by then Thurrock were down to ten after Matt Turpin's dismissal.

Two late goals ended **Bognor**'s hopes of holding Conference South side Havant at Nyewood Lane. Steve Ramsey's penalty gave Havant a third-minute lead which was wiped out by James Crane in the 19<sup>th</sup> minute. Tony Taggart quickly restored Havant's lead but Bognor stayed in the game until he notched his second with nine minutes left. Scott Jones wrapped up a 4-1 Havant victory in the last minute.

**Cray**'s bid to reach the last 64 for the first time in their history foundered as they went down 1-0 at home to Welling on Sunday.

The Conference South side had much the better of the first half without managing to score and, ironically, it was during Cray's best spell of the game that they fell behind. Welling gave the ball away, Cray gave it straight back and former Thamesmead forward Theo Fairweather-Johnson supplied the pass for right-back Connor McLaren to fire home.

That was in the 71st minute, and although Leigh Bremner immediately hit a post at the other end it was as close as the Wands would come to saving the day.
