

Midweek Update – Season 2012/13 No.27 22nd February 2013

Ryman Premier

A FOUR-GOAL salvo for Peter Dean led **Wealdstone** to a 6-1 home victory over **Lewes** on Monday. It strengthened their grip on second place and brought them within seven points of leaders Whitehawk with a game in hand. The stage was set for Richard Jolly to take the goalscoring spotlight on his return from honeymoon and, after Dean had opened the scoring in the tenth minute, Jolly duly netted the second on the half-hour mark.

Then it turned into a rout as Dean grabbed two more either side of a Lee Chappell strike. Steve Brinkhurst replied on the stroke of half-time, but the second half was only three minutes old when Dean completed the night's scoring with his fourth.

So the last 42 minutes were goalless, continuing the strange pattern of recent high-scoring matches in the Premier. Kingstonian's 9-3 win over Cray two Saturdays earlier was scoreless after half an hour, and all the goals in Leiston's 5-4 victory over East Thurrock last Saturday came in the first hour.

A last-minute strike by David Bryant on Tuesday was **East Thurrock**'s eighth goal in two Ryman Premier games – and it earned them their only point from those matches. They twice fought back to level terms after falling two goals behind at Leiston on Saturday only to end up on the wrong end of a 5-4 result. And this time they again found themselves 2-0 down at home to **Bognor**, hit back to lead 3-2 but eventually needed that last-gasp effort from Bryant to salvage a 4-4 draw.

Dan Thompson and Oliver Pearce scored in the space of seven minutes either side of the half-hour mark to give Bognor the edge in the battle of the Rocks, but it was level by half-time thanks to Reiss Gilbey and Kye Ruel. Bryant put the Essex Rocks ahead in the 71st minute but late efforts from Harvey Whyte and Thompson seemed to have stolen it for their Sussex counterparts. Then Bryant struck again.

Whitehawk opened up a 11-point gap at the top with a 2-0 home victory over Kingstonian in a fixture that had been abandoned because of floodlight failure earlier in the season with K's in a winning position.

Hawks made the most of their good fortune to come out on top in the rematch with a double from Danny Mills, his first in the 62nd minute and the clincher in added time. That defeat cost K's their place in the top five.

They were overtaken by **Lowestoft**, who netted two unanswered goals to see off visiting **Canvey**. Lee Smith converted a 73rd-minute penalty to break the deadlock and top scorer Jack Defty made sure with three minutes to go.

Hendon maintained their impressive recent form, coming out on top by the odd goal in three at Bury. Junior Morias scored early and Kevin Maclaren late for the Londoners, with Craig Parker's reply not coming until the third minute of added time.

Carshalton stayed in the bottom two after going down 2-1 at home to **Wingate**, who put some daylight between themselves and the relegation places.

Ahmet Rifat and Andre Scarlett scored late in the first half to put the visitors in charge. Nathaniel Pinney continued his free-scoring form with a reply six minutes after the break but Robins could do no more.

They are now just one point ahead of bottom club **Thurrock**, who finally reached the halfway mark in their programme as they drew 0-0 at home to **Hampton**.

Two recent signings were the key men as **Met Police** moved to within two points of the Ryman Premier play-off places with a 1-0 home win over **Margate** on Wednesday. Former Sutton man Tom Kavanagh, who joined the Met earlier in the day, marked his debut with the only goal of the game, aided by a deflection, in the 66th minute.

It was not such a good night for Margate's Joe Vines, who joined them from Cray last week. He was sent off after receiving his second yellow card shortly after the goal, and the ten men could find no way back.

Thurrock stayed rooted to the foot of the table after a 3-0 home defeat by **Leiston** on Thursday. The hosts had the chance to move up three places and, although they failed to do so, they have plenty more games in hand on everyone above them.

Ritchie Jones brought done Nathan Stone to concede the 14th-minute penalty with which Gareth Heath put Leiston ahead.

Thurrock had a fair share of the game but conceded a soft goal 90 seconds after the interval, a simple near-post header by David Head from a corner. Emmanuel Osei broke from halfway to make it three in the 57th minute, following up after David Hughes turned his initial shot on to a post.

It was a harsh scoreline for the home side, who were twice foiled by the woodwork in their search for a consolation goal. Matt Turpin and Danny Green hit the same post in the space of a couple of minutes.

Ryman North

A PENALTY by Danny Bunce earned **Grays** a 1-0 victory at **Aveley** on Monday and lifted them from fifth to second in the Ryman North table. It had been 26 years since these local rivals met in a league match, and it turned out to be a hard-fought, sometimes ill-tempered affair with few chances.

Bunce was on target after 29 minutes and Aveley only rarely threatened to reply until a late series of attacks during which they hit a post. By then they were down to ten men after 21-goal top scorer Jordan Cox received his second yellow card in the 58th minute.

Goals were in short supply in the five matches on Tuesday. Only six were scored, all by home teams, and half of them by **Witham** who maintained their outside play-off hopes by beating **Waltham Abbey** 3-0. Daniel Lopes opened the scoring a minute before half-time and nabbed his second just before the hour. Danny Emmanuel made it three with 11 minutes left.

Brentwood's hopes of getting into play-off contention with their mountain of games in hand suffered a setback at **Cheshunt**, where they went down to a 78th-minute goal by Corey Whitely.

Leon Antoine's 18th-minute strike was enough for **Sudbury** against **Waltham Forest** and Ware put five points between themselves and bottom club Ilford as Elliot King's 74th minute goal saw off Tilbury.

There was no scoring at all at **Needham Market**, who are now the only team in the league without a home win after they were held by **Wroxham**. They have drawn seven and lost seven on their own patch.

Maldon stretched their lead to 13 points by thrashing **Brentwood** 5-1 on Thursday, a further blow to Brentwood's hopes of playing a part in the promotion race.

Chris Bryan and Lee Boylan put Maldon two up inside 15 minutes and Joe Gardner added a third before the interval. Boylan stretched it to 4-0 with a 55th-minute penalty, Maldon's 50th home goal of the season, and, after Ross Wall pulled one back, Jamie Guy completed the nap hand in the last minute.

<u>Ryman South</u>

A GOAL just before half-time by James Peacock was enough to give third-placed **Faversham** a 1-0 win at home to **Leatherhead** on Tuesday and lifted them to within three points of leaders Maidstone.

Leatherhead remain fourth but are now six points behind Faversham and only just ahead of a group of teams chasing a play-off spot.

Crawley Down moved back into fifth place, one of three teams trailing the Tanners by a single point, with a 3-2 home win over **Chipstead**. Luke Blewden gave the Anvils an early lead which Craig Richards doubled moments before the interval.

Chips rallied with two goals in three minutes midway through the second half, Jason Goodchild and Joe Nwoko the men on target, but Blewden struck again with nine minutes left to settle it.

Sittingbourne were held to a 1-1 home draw by **Whitstable** and slipped back to sixth because they have scored two fewer goals than the Anvils. Nick Treadwell put the hosts ahead just after half-time, injuring himself in the process, and Danny Williams replied in the 69th minute.

Hythe are seventh, level on points with the two sides above them, after Ronnie Dolan's 74th-minute goal earned a 1-0 home win over bottom club **Three Bridges**, who are now ten points adrift.

That's because **Walton Casuals**, in 21st place, chalked up their first home win of the season at the 15th attempt, beating **Horsham** 3-1. Their previous efforts on home turf had produced four draws and 10 defeats.

Kwabena Agyei put them ahead after 26 minutes but it looked as if it would be the same old story when Scott Harris equalised just four minutes later. Mu Mann emerged as the Casuals hero, scoring two minutes before the interval and again immediately after it.

Back at the top end of the table, **Folkestone** would have moved into fifth place, and maybe even fourth, with a victory at **Merstham**. But it was the hosts who scored in the fourth minute of added time to win 2-1. Joe Holland gave Merstham a 17th-minute lead which they held until eight minutes from the end of normal time, when Josh Burchell levelled it. Then Adrian Stone, just signed from Hastings, popped up with the late, late winner.

Note, by the way, that the six games produced five home wins and a draw, a real rarity in a division where visiting teams have had much the better of things all season.
