Ryman Premier

TWO goals in seven minutes by Sam Gargan took **Whitehawk** to the brink of becoming league champions with a 2-0 victory at **Leiston** on Sunday.

Hawks need a single point from their home game against East Thurrock next Saturday to be sure, but they also have a substantial goal-difference advantage over Lowestoft, the only side who can catch them. Lowestoft would, for example, have to win their three remaining matches by an average of four goals each in order to snatch the honours if Hawks are beaten by a single goal.

Leiston did not make it easy for their visitors and, backed by a substantial number of Lowestoft fans in the crowd of 365, they had the better of the first half without creating any clear-cut chances.

The strength of Whitehawk's bench always looked likely to be a factor as they took command playing down the slope after the interval, though Leiston still looked capable of scoring in their increasingly rare counter-attacks.

Hawks brought on Jerahl Hughes, then Michael Malcolm to change their attacking options and they took the lead in the 72nd minute, shortly after Malcolm's arrival. George Wilson handled a cross from the left and Gargan blasted the penalty into the roof of the net. Gargan then doubled the score with a header that crept under the body of home keeper Remi Matthews and Hawks then closed out the game efficiently.

Resolute Lowestoft are refusing to give up the fight and their 2-0 victory at Bognor on Saturday made it seven away points in five days. After the league's longest journey, Lowestoft took the lead on the Sussex coast with a long-range drive from Michael Frew midway through the first half. Keeper Andrew Plummer played his part by saving Terry Dodd's penalty and Erkan Okay made it 2-0 with ten minutes left.

The Trawlerboys travel to third-placed Wealdstone and relegation candidates Wingate to complete a run of five away games in ten days before hosting mid-table Hendon on the last day.

The success at Bognor made sure of a play-off place, at the very least, and two other teams also booked their post-season slots with 2-0 away victories.

Scott McGleish claimed his 20th Premier goal of the season – including three for Whitehawk and 12 for Enfield Town – when Tom Pett's shot came back off a post, putting **Wealdstone** ahead after 18 minutes at relegation-threatened **Carshalton**. Pett himself added the second in the 68th minute.

Concord gained their 2-0 success at **Met Police**, who started the day in fifth place. Nicky Cowley struck in the first minute for the Beachboys and they got their second in the 18th minute, a Steve King header.

The result also guarantees that Concord finish above their Canvey Island neighbours for the first time in their history. Maybe the local authority will now signpost Concord's ground as efficiently as they do Canvey's!

There are seven teams still in contention for the final play-off place but **East Thurrock** are very much in the driving seat, having reclaimed fifth place with - yes! - a 2-0 win, although theirs was on home turf against **Wingate**. The two Sams, Higgins and Collins, got the goals in the game's third quarter. Not only are Rocks at the top of the contending septet, but they have three games to play, more than all except one of the others.

Margate ended their losing run with a 2-2 draw at **Bury** but are three points behind East Thurrock and have only one match left. John Sands put Bury ahead soon after half-time with his 26th league goal of the season, strengthening his grip on the division's Golden Boot.

Dean Pooley responded with his first goal of the season, heading home a free-kick, and then got another one to put Margate ahead with 11 minutes left. But Adam Tann headed an 86th-minute equaliser and the Kent club are almost out of the play-off picture. Bury, too, are hanging on, four points adrift with two games left.

Met Police trail East Thurrock on goal difference but have played a game more, as have **Canvey** who are a point behind them. The islanders put visiting **Hastings** to the sword in the first half but had to wait until the 45th minute for Harrison Chatting's opening goal. Hastings promptly equalised with a goal in added time from Zac Attwood and neither side could break through in the second half as it finished 1-1, a result that hardly suited either side.

Hendon, despite a 3-2 home defeat by **Enfield Town**, are still in with a slight chance. They are level on points with Bury, who lead them only on goals scored. Enfield, now safe from the threat of relegation, were two up in 18 minutes through Joe O'Brien and Tyler Campbell and got a third before the interval through Liam Hope.

Dave Diedhiou reduced the arrears soon after the restart and O'Brien's headed own goal with 13 minutes left made it a nervous ending for the visitors.

Completing the play-off picture are **Kingstonian**, for whom Lewis Taylor scored in the 83rd minute to clinch a 1-0 home win over **Thurrock**, who had skipper Stuart Thurgood sent off near the end. K's are the only other contending side with three matches left, but trail Rocks by six points.

The relegation picture remains confused, with Hastings still at the bottom after their draw but with three matches to play. Carshalton's defeat puts them back in the bottom two, a point above Hastings, and they have only one match left. Wingate and Thurrock are a point ahead of them with two games to go.

One more point ahead are **Lewes**, also with two left, after their crucial 2-0 win at **Harrow**. Nathan Crabb scored twice in 11 minutes either side of half-time.

Cray were yet another side to pick up precious points with a 2-0 victory. Danny Phillips gave them a 62nd-minute lead at home to **Hampton** and Michael Power made sure with a penalty in the closing moments. It was only Cray's third home win of the season and they are four points clear of Carshalton, as are Harrow.

It all means that, with just a week left in the campaign, only four clubs - Leiston, Bognor, Hampton and Enfield - know for sure that they will be in this division next season.

<u>Ryman North</u>

ALREADY champions, **Grays** set what is believed to be a new league record by coming from behind to win 2-1 at **Thamesmead** on Saturday to chalk up their 17th successive league victory.

Thamesmead, in second place, took a fifth-minute lead through Baff Addae and stayed in front until the interval thanks to Rob Budd's penalty save from Jack West. Jared Small equalised ten minutes after the restart and Joao Carlos netted the record-breaking goal with just two minutes left, taking Grays to 99 points with two matches to go. There was still time for Mead skipper Lewis Tozer to get his marching orders.

A James Robinson hat-trick enabled Maldon to reclaim second place and complete an unbeaten season on their own ground, though not until they had twice trailed Tilbury by two goals.

Emiel Aiken put Dockers ahead after six minutes and Danny Francis made it 2-0 midway through the half. Robinson pulled one back soon after the interval but Sam Cutler restored the two-goal margin in the 65th minute.

Robinson then struck twice in as many minutes to make it 3-3, and Maldon finished their home programme with 16 wins and five draws, the only team in the league to remain undefeated in front of their own fans.

When Aveley won 2-0 at **Witham** in early March it left the losers nine points adrift of the play-off places and they had played more games than the sides above them.

Since then Witham have reeled off eight successive wins and seen their rivals falter. So their 1-0 home win over **Needham Market**, earned by Rob Whitnell's early goal, his 23rd in the league, not only lifted them into a play-off slot for the first time but took them up to fourth place.

Aveley slipped back to fifth after going down 3-2 at home to a Potters Bar side including four youth-team players, two of them making their debuts.

Millers looked set to make the most of the situation when Alex Read scored after four minutes. But Josh Hutchinson quickly equalised with a lob and Aryan Tajbakhsh burst through from his own half to put the Scholars ahead after half an hour. One of the youngsters, 17-year-old Liam Magwood, cut in from the left to make it 3-1 after 72 minutes and a late own goal by Lee Close was not enough to deny the visitors.

Aveley are two points behind Witham with a game in hand. **Heybridge** are a point further back and, like Witham, have only two to play after their 1-0 defeat at **Chatham** cost them the top-five place they have held since October. Austin Gacheru got the only goal 20 minutes after half-time and Tim Roberts was outstanding in the home goal as Swifts sought their 100th goal of the season in vain.

Soham maintained their outside chance - they are two points behind Aveley and have only one match left – with a 2-0 victory at **Sudbury**. It was their 14th away league win, more than anyone else in all three divisions apart from Grays, who have 16. The damage was soon done: Robbie Mason took his league tally to 26 by heading the 12th-minute opener and Michael Simpson added the second two minutes later.

Redbridge gave their survival hopes a huge boost by smashing four unanswered goals at **Waltham Abbey**. Jason Dobbs and Danny Hayes scored in the first ten minutes to give them a confidence-boosting start, and Nana Asamoah made it 3-0 in the 64th minute. D'Sean Theobalds completed the rout in added time. It was the first goal of the season for all four marksmen.

The Motormen thought they were home and dry when they heard that Shamir Mullings had given **Harlow** the lead at bottom club **liford** soon after half-time. It was his fourth goal of the season, each one scored for a different club. He had previously netted for Thurrock, Witham and Tilbury.

But the Foxes maintained a slim hope of avoiding the drop with an equaliser from substitute ChiNedu McKenzie and a 75th-minute winner from Steve O'Hara.

The 2-1 victory, only their second home success of the season, keeps llford three points behind Redbridge, but they have only one game left and are 10 behind their rivals in the goal difference column. The Motormen have two to play.

Ten-man Waltham Forest grabbed a point with a late header from Matt Waldron which earned a 2-2 draw at Romford. Aime Blessing and Nick Reynolds put the hosts 2-0 up at the interval, George Lutaaya reduced the arrears and, despite the dismissal of Manny Sackey, Waldron completed the comeback.

Ware scored twice in a minute soon after half-time as they came from behind to beat visiting **Brentwood** 2-1. Ryan Doyle put Blues ahead with a 38th-minute penalty but Liam Foster and Vedat Ezel turned it round.

The other game was a goalless draw at **Cheshunt**, where **Wroxham** had the upper hand but needed a goalline clearance by Andrew Eastaugh to deny Courtney White a winner for the hosts.

Ryman South

IT'S as you were at the top, and that's good news for leaders **Dulwich** who maintained their three-point advantage over Maidstone, now with only two games to play, with a 3-1 victory at **Herne Bay** on Saturday.

Dean Lodge gave Dulwich an early lead with his first goal since moving from Kingstonian and Erkan Oztumer made it 2-0 midway through the second half. There was brief alarm for the visitors when Joe Nelder converted a penalty with five minutes left but Danny Carr, who joins Huddersfield at the end of the season, quickly responded to give Dulwich a 3-1 victory.

Bay, who unexpectedly sacked promotion-winning manager Simon Halsey after their home defeat by Corinthian-Casuals on Thursday, are at least safe from an instant return to the Kent League.

That's because bottom club **Walton Casuals** lost 3-0 at home to **Maidstone**, though it was not as easy as it sounds for the title-chasers. Casuals held out for 78 minutes before Steve Watt headed home a corner to break the deadlock. Ade Olorunda and Michael Phillips added further goals which should ensure that Stones will have the advantage on goal difference if they and Dulwich finish level on points.

Maidstone finish with a visit to Chipstead and a home game against Horsham, two more sides who made sure of avoiding relegation yesterday. Dulwich have two home matches against mid-table opposition, Crawley Down and Burgess Hill.

Faversham made sure of their play-off place with a 4-2 home win over **Merstham**. Adrian Stone scored early and late for Merstham against his old club but, in between, Faversham dominated. Wayne Wilson equalised with a 38th-minute penalty and James Peacock's header put them in front by half-time. Renford Tenyue made it 4-1 with two excellent strikes before Stone got his second.

Hythe, too, are sure of appearing in the play-offs despite being held to a 2-2 home draw by **Worthing**. Jake Hobbs and Dave Cook, with his 25th league goal, twice put them ahead in the first half with Scott Kirkwood replying. And it was Kirkwood who headed a late equaliser to postpone Hythe's celebrations until the other results confirmed their top-five place.

Three teams are left in the hunt for the remaining place, currently occupied by **Folkestone** after their 2-0 win at **Three Bridges**. Phil Stevenson's first-half penalty miss delayed the visitors but Richard Atkins gave them the lead nine minutes after the break and Josh Burchell added the second three minutes later.

They moved up to fifth because **Leatherhead** suffered a shock 1-0 defeat at **Horsham**, another side who secured their place in the league for next season. Tanners missed a host of chances either side of Tony Nwachukwu's 30th-minute penalty and had top scorer Tommy Hutchings sent off with 13 minutes left.

Ramsgate would have taken over fifth spot with a home win over **Corinthian-Casuals**, but Ian Pulman's early penalty miss turned out to be the story of the afternoon as the hosts failed to make the most of their superiority and were held to a 0-0 draw.

So Folkestone are a point ahead of their two rivals but Leatherhead are the only side with a midweek game. They visit Eastbourne on Wednesday and need a win to move above Folkestone. If they fail, Folkestone will probably go into the last day of the season as favourites. They have a home game against Herne Bay while Leatherhead have to host one of the sides above them, Faversham.

Ramsgate visit **Sittingbourne**, who slipped out of play-off contention themselves when they were held to a 2-2 draw at **Tooting**. Sol Pinnock gave the Terrors an early lead which was wiped out by Ollie Gray's header on the stroke of half-time. Joe Taylor's lob put the Brickies on course for the win which have maintained their outside chance of post-season play, only for Pinnock to fire home from 20 yards in the last minute and end their hopes.

When the day started there were still eight clubs who could have found themselves relegated at the end of the season. Now there are just three.

Whitstable's 2-2 draw at Chipstead was enough to see both of them to safety. Micheal Everitt headed in an eighth-minute corner to put the Oystermen ahead but Chips hit back with two goals either side of half-time from Devon Williams. Buster Smissen equalised with 20 minutes left.

Walton & Hersham are not quite safe after their 2-1 defeat at Burgess Hill. Ryan Thomson and Max Miller put the Hillians 2-0 up at half-time, with Harold Odametey replying ten minutes after the restart.

It looks almost all over for Walton Casuals, six points adrift at the bottom with only two games left. Their neighbours can make themselves safe by getting a point from either of their home games, against Herne Bay on Tuesday and Hythe on Saturday. Should they lose both matches, Casuals will have to win at home to Sittingbourne on Wednesday and at Merstham on Saturday as well as making up a gap of ten goals: unlikely, but not impossible.

Three Bridges are also six points ahead of Casuals and they have only one game left, at Whitstable. But their 18goal advantage is surely insurmountable.
