All the Play-off Action

Ryman Premier

A LATE goal by Leon Gordon completed **Concord Rangers**' five-year rise from the Essex Senior League to Conference South on Monday. The Beachboys from Canvey Island stunned the majority of a 2,490 crowd with a 2-1 victory in the play-off final at **Lowestoft Town**.

The Trawlerboys were appearing in the final for the third successive year but it was the first time they had enjoyed home advantage and they went into the game as firm favourites.

Concord, though, have a never-say-die spirit about them and, after surviving some early pressure, they took a tenth-minute lead when redoubtable defender Steve King headed home a cross from Ben Greenhalgh.

Lowestoft squared matters 11 minutes later through Scott Mitchell, who met Dan Gleeson's centre with an excellent glancing header.

After that it was, for the most part, a Concord rearguard action, though they gave an outstanding defensive display and were rarely seriously troubled.

Manager Danny Cowley said that he began to feel it was his side's day when it was still all square after 70 minutes, and he was to be proved right.

In the 85th minute it was Greenhalgh who again provided a superb cross and this time it was Leon Gordon who met it with his head to give the Beachboys the edge.

There had been a number of delays because of injuries and Concord had to defend their lines through seven agonising added minutes before the celebrations could begin.

The Beachboys were 16th in the table at the end of October but climbed into the top five over the next month and were there or thereabouts for the rest of the season.

A fourth-place finish gave them a semi-final at Wealdstone, where they forced extra time with a last-minute goal and went on to win 2-1.

They become the sixth former Essex Senior League club to have achieved Conference status, following in the steps of their neighbours Canvey Island, Redbridge, Thurrock, Billericay Town and Hornchurch. Another, East Thurrock United, lost narrowly to Lowestoft in their play-off semi-final last week.

The Trawlerboys have actually spent less time in the Ryman League than their conquerors. This was only their fourth season: they won the North division title at the first attempt while Concord, in their second season, finished runners-up and won the play-offs.

Ryman North

GOALKEEPER Robert Budd was the hero with two shoot-out saves as **Thamesmead Town** achieved Ryman Premier status for the first time in their history on Sunday.

They beat hosts **Maldon & Tiptree** 4-1 on penalties after fighting back from 2-0 down to earn a 2-2 draw in the Ryman North play-off final and make it a bitter end to the season for the Essex club, who at one stage topped the table by 15 points.

It was all Maldon from the start and they were two up inside 12 minutes. Ollie Berquez turned in James Robinson's cross to make it 1-0 in the ninth minute and the lead was quickly doubled when Lee Boylan tapped in from Joe Gardner's centre.

The league runners-up continued to dominate with their flowing football but the turning-point of the match came just before the half-hour mark, when Michael Toner missed an open goal provided by Boylan.

A third goal would surely have ended the contest. Instead, almost immediately, a Maldon free-kick was cleared, Mead broke quickly and top scorer Stuart Zanone rifled an unstoppable shot past Joe Wright to put his side back in the game.

Better was to follow for the visitors in the 40th minute, when Berquez fouled Rob Carter and Chris Edwards levelled the scores with a confident penalty.

The second half was scrappy, with both sides looking afraid to concede a decisive goal. Thamesmead had a header cleared off the line from a corner in added time and, later still, Budd pulled off a good save from Jamie Guy at the other end.

It was the same story in extra time, though Edwards almost won it with the very last kick of the match, a 25-yard free-kick which Wright managed to push wide at full stretch.

So to penalties, with Thamesmead first up. James Donovan, Baff Addae and Tyrus Gordon-Young all netted for the visitors but it was a different story for Maldon. They entrusted their first three kicks to their three substitutes and, after Guy had scored, Kevin McLeod and Ben Bowditch were both denied by Budd. That gave Edwards the chance to win the match and he made no mistake.

Ryman South

TWO first-half headers by Ade Olorunda set **Maidstone United** on course for a return to the Ryman Premier with a 3-0 home victory over **Faversham Town** in Saturday's play-off final.

Faversham never looked likely to repeat their 2-1 league victory on the same ground three weeks earlier as Stones dominated proceedings from start to finish in front of 2,226 fans, the fourth successive 2,000-plus attendance at the Gallagher Stadium.

Olorunda climbed high to power home his first goal from Michael Phillips' right-wing cross in the 11th minute and he got his second from almost the same spot. That was in the 35th minute, when Alex Flisher launched a long throw from the left and Olorunda met it at the near post.

Stones missed a hatful of further chances in the first half while the visitors had only one clear opening. It fell to Danny Hockton but he took too long to pull the trigger.

The pattern continued after the break and substitute Alex Brown made sure midway through the half. He had been on the pitch for only four minutes when he pounced on Olorunda's knockdown to clip home the third goal.

So Maidstone's first season back in their home town after a long, long exile ended in triumph as they returned to the top division after a two-year absence.

The average gate is more than five times as high as it was in their relegation season, when they were based 25 miles away at Ashford, and they should be well equipped for the challenge. But they can progress no further until the Conference remove their ban on artificial pitches.




