BANSTEAD ATHLETIC

Five years after their formation in 1944, Banstead gained senior status and joined the Surrey Senior League, it proved to be a wise move, for during the fifties, the club experienced a "golden decade". In their first season in the league they were runners-up to Leatherhead, playing on the Tattenham Way Recreation Ground.

For the start of the 1950/51 season the club moved into its present home at Merland Rise, a move they celebrated by winning the league championship with top scorer Harry Clark getting 81 goals ! They repeated the performance for the next three seasons as well and by the end of the 50's had five

championships and four runners-up positions in the record books. They were also winners of the Surrey County Cup six times.

A barren period was experienced in the early sixties, until, under the management of Gordon Taylor (the club's present Secretary) they again won the league title.

Owing to only having a short term lease the club were unable to gain the necessary finance to enhance the facilities which restricted their ambitions to play at a higher level.

Upon the necessary promises of a long term lease in 1965 the club joined the Spartan League, but during nine seasons in the competition, the best they achieved was 5th.

In 1975/76 the league became the London Spartan League and Banstead finished runners-up in 1977/78. A year later they joined the Athenian League and won the League Cup in 1980/81. The following season they successfully defended the trophy and were back again in the Final for a third time in 1982/83, losing to Chalfont St. Peter.

With the demise of the Athenian League, the club joined the Isthmian League and in their first season finished ninth in Division Two South.

Towards the end of the season 1989/90 the club faced closure due to the resignation of the Chairman and his family directors over differences with the local council on ground leasing. Fortunately, the then Reserve team manager, Terry Molloy rescued the club by negotiating a settlement with the previous chairman and the council to become the new owner and Chairman of Banstead Athletic. Terry has worked hard improving facilities at Merland Rise with the installation of new floodlights and upgrading of clubhouse facilities. Despite the uncertainty of the Club's future Manager Bobby Knock and most of his players stayed at the club and they reached 11th. position in season 1990/91 to ensure that the club played in the newly restructured Division Two. At the end of the 1991/92 season Mr. Knock stood down as Manager and the club appointed Bob Mapleson and Micky Sorenson as joint Managers. In their first season in charge (1992/93) Banstead had their best ever run in a major cup competition when they reached the FA Vase quarter finals only being beaten 1-0 by the eventual winners, Bridlington Town.

Banstead Athletic have "ground shared" Merland Rise with near neighbours Epsom & Ewell since 1993/94. Banstead have had to carry out considerable ground improvements to acquire a "C" grading and with Epsom's assistance this was achieved at a cost of around £40,000. The transformation was such that they were awarded a Lucozade Sport Club Award for the most improved ground in the South.

League and Cup success has eluded the Club over the last two seasons which has seen them finish in ninth and prior to this season a best ever spot of eighth last year. Good runs in the Carlsberg Cup (semi-finalists) and Surrey Senior Cup were achieved. Tonight the club will hope to make up for the disappointment of losing out on a promotion spot last weekend. A promotion they could have taken up with their newly acquired "B" grading.

CANVEY ISLAND

Canvey Island is a small island situated on the north bank of the Thames Estuary about 35 miles east of London. With a population of 40,000 it boasts one of the few Senior non-league grounds in Britain which is below sea level.

The football club was formed in 1926 and consists of first, reserve and youth sides plus six different age groups of boys teams. Their most famous player was Peter Taylor, who played for Canvey as a 17 year old before moving on to Southend and then Spurs where he found

fame as an England player.

The club lost all their records in the floods of 1953 which cost so many Islanders their lives, but they recovered well and moved through intermediate to senior status as they entered the Parthenon League in 1957, winning the title the following year. They quickly progressed to the Metropolitan League where they won the cup and league double in both 1968 and 1969. Joining the Essex Senior League in 1974 they finished runners-up in 1979 and won the league cup the following year. They also won the Essex Senior League title for the first time in 1987, but mounting debts caused them to totally re-organise the club just after the start of the 1991/92 season.

The team manager is now local business man Jeff King, himself a former Canvey player. He is ably assisted by Paul Delea, one of the most successful coaches in non-league football. Following a period of consolidation in their first season when they finished fifth in the league, the team achieved their best results to date in the following year, winning both the league title and league cup and reaching the semi-finals of the F.A. Challenge Vase, where the home leg was watched by a previous club record 3250 with Canvey beating Tiverton 1-0, but conceding defeat after losing the first leg 2-0.

The season 1993/94 saw them promoted to the Isthmian League, where they immediately won promotion to Division Two.

They have now again achieved promotion this season as Champions of Division Two, and already have a "B" graded ground which will enable them to play in Division One next season.

It has been a memorable season, with the highlight being a magnificent FA Cup run which saw them beat Hednesford from the Vauxhall Conference before eventually going out to Brighton & Hove Albion in the First Round. This after holding Brighton 2-2 in the home tie which was watched by 3,500 spectators, and a further 7,000 watched the replay at Brighton, where Canvey eventually went out 3-1. Also another fine FA Vase run saw them reach the quarter-final of the competition, this has further improved their financial position and given them a good foundation for the higher level of football which awaits them next season.

• **Jon Keely** (Goalkeeper) Recent signing to the club, his previous clubs include Stockport County, Brighton & Hove Albion and Chelmsford City.

• **Kevin Lee** (Captain). Age 33, Kevin is in his third season at the club where he is an outstanding player. His previous clubs include Heybridge Swifts and Chelmsford City.

• **Chris Blakebrough** (Midfield). 27 year old who signed during last season. He has previously played for Clapton, Dagenham & Redbridge, Purfleet and Hornchurch.

• **Eddie Martin** (Defender) New signing this season, Eddie played for Dagenham before the merger with Redbridge Forest, and moved on to Carshalton Athletic. He has also played for Chelmsford City.

• **Steve Porter** (Central Defender) This is 27 year old Steve's second season at Park Lane, He was previously with Bromley, Carshalton and Dagenham & Redbridge.

• **Wayne Joscelyne** (Defender/Midfield). Youngster, still only 18 recently signed from West Ham United.

• **Alan Harding** (Midfield) Played in the Essex Senior League with Southend Manor and Bowers United before joining Canvey Island this season. He is 23.

• **Tony Pizzey** Better known at the club as "Torino Ton," this is 30 year old Tony's third season with the club. He has previously assisted both Purfleet and Aveley and is

currently the Players "Player of the Year".

• **Garry Britnell** (Midfield) Now aged 30, Garry was captain of Canvey Island at 19 years of age before moving on to play for Chelmsford City, Dartford and Enfield. He returned to Park Lane last season.

• **Glenn Pennyfather** Midfielder aged 32, Glenn played a lot of his football in the Endsleigh League at Southend United, Crystal Palace, Ipswich Town and Bristol City.

• **Alan Brett** Another player who is returning to one of his former clubs. Alan aged 27 is a versatile attacking player who, as well as Purfleet as also played "just up the road" at Aveley and Hornchurch.

• **Andy Jones** 25 year old Andy is in his fourth season at Park Lane. His attacking role at clubs has also seen him give service to Basildon United, Purfleet and Wealdstone. He is the club's penalty kick taker.

• **Richard Cherry** Much travelled forward who started his Isthmian career at Grays Athletic. He was the subject of a five figure transfer which took him to Redbridge Forest, and was subsequently transferred to Enfield. he has also played for Kingstonian, Bromley and Purfleet.

• **Steve Warner** Forward who started this season playing for promotion rivals Collier Row, he moved to Canvey Island recently.

• **Steve Munday** who plays in midfield also joined Canvey recently from Collier Row.

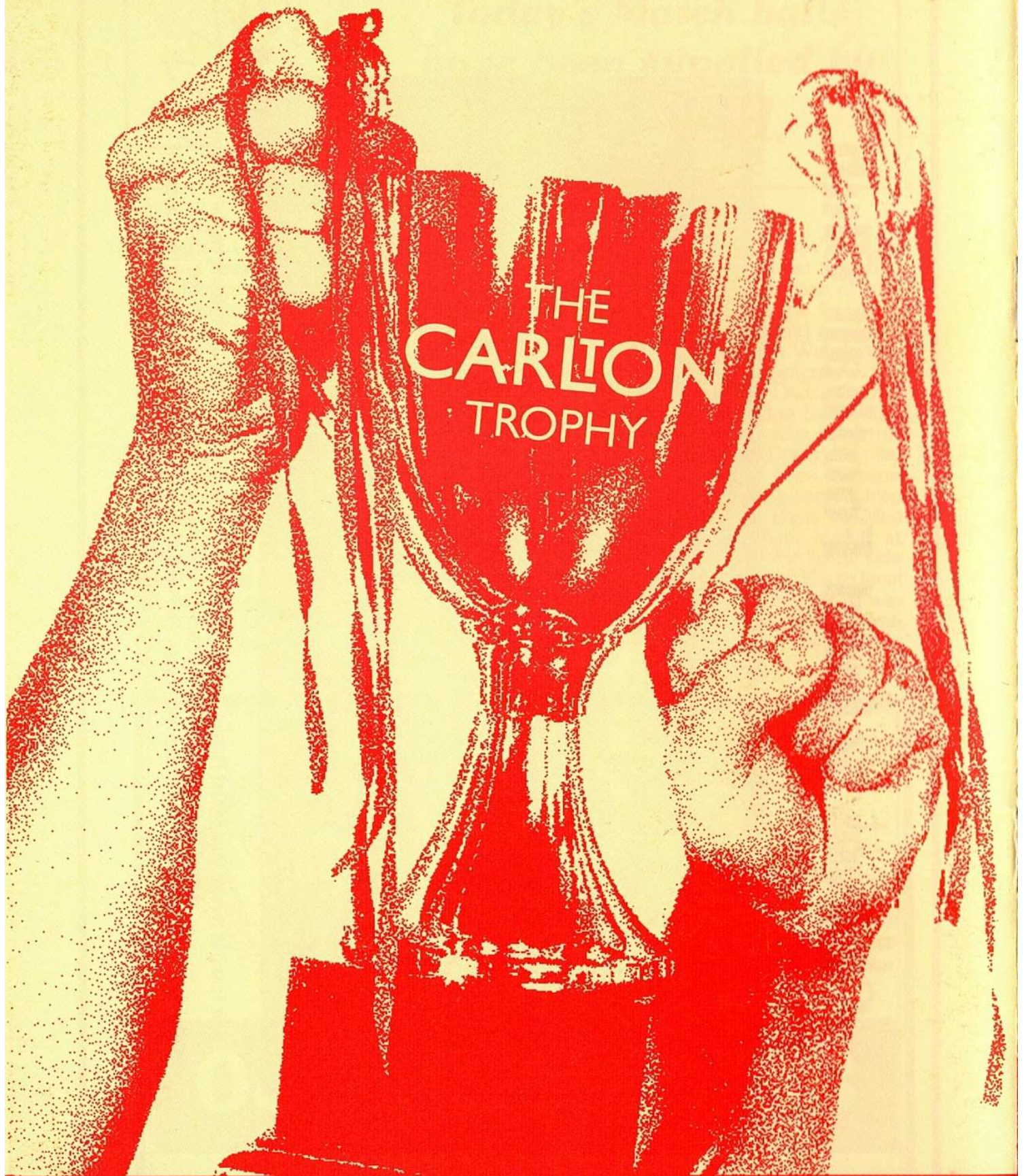
