Leighton Town, who were known at one time as Leighton United, were mainly involved in local leagues in their early days, being winners of the Leighton & District League on several occasions. Leighton were one of the original members of the South Midlands League in 1922, at that time it was known as the Bedfordshire County League They were also members of the Spartan League and remained in this league from 1922/23 until 1951/2, their only successes being the Spartan League Division Two title in 1923/24 and 1927/28. They were Bedfordshire Senior Cup winners in 1926/27. The main honours and trophies eluded the club for nearly forty years and it took until the swinging sixties before Leighton

became a major force.

In 1965/66, Leighton finished bottom of the South Midlands League Premier Division but were re-elected: at the end of the following season the Premier Division Championship sat in the Leighton boardroom. The club then re-joined the Spartan League in 1967/68. Leighton proceeded to consolidate their league success by winning the Bedfordshire Senior Cup for three successive seasons in 1968 to 1970. Unfortunately, some of the successful plavers moved on to other clubs and Leighton's fortunes again declined. A move to the United Counties League proved disastrous and, after two seasons, the club re-joined the South Midlands League The mould of infrequent success was once again broken when the First team won the South Midlands League Challenge Trophy and then the O'Brien Premier Division One Cup, both for the first time in the club's history. The 1991/92 season is arguably the club's best ever, the South Midlands Premier Division title which had eluded the club for so long was won and with it a place in the Isthmian League. The Reserves won the Reserve Division One title and the Youth Team won the Under 18's County Cup. In 1992/93 the club's success continued when they won the Bedfordshire Senior Cup for the first time since 1970. The club missed out on promotion by a single point. The 1993/94 season was disappointing as far as the First team was concerned, but the Reserves and Under 18's both brought "hardware" back to the Boardroom The 1994/95 season was good for the First team finishing in a respectable 7th. position, . and winning the Buckingham Charity Cup by beating Buckingham Town 2-1. The Reserves won the South Midlands Reserve Division One, retaining the Challenge Trophy and completed a treble by winning the Floodlit Cup. The Youth Team won the Chiltern Youth League, Division One title and E.A.S.Y. Cup for the first time, and also won the Beds. Youth Cup. Last season, although narrowly missing out on the Division Three title to Horsham, they won promotion to Division Two of the ICIS League, the highest level that the club has ever played. This was a great success, and with it they retained the Buckingham Charity Cup. The Reserves settled in well in their first season in the Suburban League and the Youth side have moved up to the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League. This season the First team have also reached the Bedfordshire Senior Cup Final where they play Luton Town and the Reserves also reached the Final of the Bedfordshire Intermediate Cup. The Youth Team have recently won the Brian Hitchings Cup with a 1.0 victory over Stevenage Borough.

Gavin Jaggard: (Forward) Age 17. Has graduated through the Youth and Reserve teams this season. Previously had spells with both Birmingham City and Wycombe Wanderers and is considered to be a great long term prospect. **Paul Firth:** (Defender) Age 29. Has played for the Club for over ten years. Solid back four player. Captained the side that won cups and promotion to the Isthmian League in the early 90's. Julian Old: (Defender/Sweeper) Age 18. Another who has come through the Youth and Reserve set up this year. Captain of the Youth Team who won the Brian Hitchings Cup recently and is an excellent future prospect. Lee Campbell: (Defender) Age 20. Forward Walsall Town apprentice who re-joined the Club from Tring Town. Played for the Youth Team in 1994. . Another exciting prospect. Steve Root: (Goalkeeper) Age 19. Joined Town after eight years with a local . youth team. Has excelled when called upon to replace James Heeps. A regular with the reserves and an outstanding club man. James Heeps: (Goalkeeper) 25. Joined the club in 1995 from Cheltenham . Town. Strong lad who played for a while for Swansea City. Injuries ended his • . short League career. Ken Hollis: (Defender) Age 33. Has now played for Town for five years having • joined the club when they were promoted to the Isthmian League. Previously with Milton Keynes Borough, he can play anywhere in the back four - known as "Mr. Dependable". Mark Andrews: (Midfield) Age 23. Current Captain who has been with Leighton Town for over three years. Can also play full-back, but is generally an exciting attacking player. Nick Sweetman: (Midfield) Age 22. Another youngster with immense potential. Had spells at Leyton Orient and Hendon before joining Town last year. Steve Norman: (Centre-forward/midfield) Age 28. "Mr. Loyalty and Consistency". Enjoying a Testimonial season this season having been with the Club since he was a 15 year old. Probably the Club's all time record goalscorer at Youth, Reserve and First team level. The ideal player who is a Manager's Dream. **Bradley Anderson:** (Centre-forward) Age 22. Is in his second spell with Leighton Town. The ICIS League "Golden Boot Award" winner last season. He has had spells with Hendon, St. Albans City, Hitchin Town and Boreham Wood. Not only scores goals, but works hard to create opportunities for others. Mark Barnard: (Midfielder) Age 28. Previously with Hitchin Town, Harrow Borough, St. Albans and Chesham United. has taken a long time to shake off an injury this season - but now returning to his hard working and competitive best. Can play at the back or even up front. Has a good habit of scoring vital . goals. Craig Johnstone: (Midfield) Age 28. Another with various clubs experience having played for St. Albans, Harrow Borough and Staines Town. A very creative midfielder and captain of last year's promotion side. Leads by example and is a great motivater and encourager of the many young players in the side. Steve Shea: (Centre-back) Age 30. In his third spell with the Club having played for Chesham and Hitchin Town recently. Exceptional defender both on the ground and in the air. Fondly remembered for a hat-trick last season against Tring Town.

Wealdstone Football Club were founded in 1899 and began life in the Willesden & District League. They were league champions in 1904/05 and 1912/13 before the Club closed down for the duration of the First World War from 1914/18. After the war the club joined the London and Middlesex Senior Leagues.

They moved to Lower Mead in 1922/23 when they joined the Spartan League. It was during this time that they won an FA Amateur Cup tie against The

12th. London Regiment (The Rangers) 22-0 their biggest ever triumph. In 1928 Wealdstone were accepted into the Athenian League replacing Summerstown. In the 1929/30 season they won both the Middlesex Senior and Charity Cups for the first time. Since that time they have won the Senior Cup a further ten times and the Charity Cup another eight times.

In December 1944 they suffered their heaviest defeat so far losing 14-0 to Edgware Town in a London Senior Cup tie. In October 1946 they were involved in the first televised football match with the BBC showing part of their Athenian League match at Barnet. Wealdstone also took part in the first two "live" FA Cup ties ever to be seen by viewers when the whole of their matches with Edgware Town and Colchester United were televised by the BBC in November 1949. In 1951/52 Wealdstone won the Athenian League and went on to join the Isthmian League for the first time twelve years later in 1964. They won the Amateur Cup for the only time two years later in 1966 with a very local 3-1 win over Hendon at Wembley.

In 1971 the Club turned professional, joining the Southern League. They won the First Division (South) in 1973/4 and were promoted to the Premier Division where they spent five season before becoming a founder member of the Alliance Premier League (Now Football Conference). They played in Europe in 1977/78 in the Anglo Italian Semi-Pro Tournament. In 1980/81 they were relegated for the first time in the club's history, losing their Alliance Premier League place, but they returned at the first attempt the following year winning all five trophies on offer in the Southern League. In 1984/85 they were the first club to achieve the non-league "double" winning the Conference, then named the Gola League and the FA Trophy in the same season. Since then the club has been relegated on two further occasions and in 1991

Since then the club has been relegated on two lutther occasions and in 1991
had to sell their Lower Mead home in order to stay in existence. Since that time
Wealdstone have entered into a very costly ground share with Watford for the
91/2 and 92/3 seasons and then much more reasonable deals with both
Yeading and now Edgware Town. Wealdstone resigned from the Southern
League to rejoin the Isthmian ranks for the 1995/96 season and have been
promoted to Division Two for the forthcoming 1997/98 season.

Albion, Wycombe Wanderers and Woking. Bryan Hammatt: (Forward) Age 24. Started last season at Northwood before transferring to Wembley. Joined Wealdstone in August 1996 and has also played for Enfield, Boreham Wood, Hertford Town and Cheshunt. **Terry Hibbert:** (Defender) Age 21. Joined the Stones in November 1995 from Brook House F.C. of the London Spartan League. Has also played for Chelsea Juniors and Yeading Under 18's Paul McKay: (Defender/Midfield) Age 26. Signed at the end of January 1997 also from Harrow Borough where he made several first team appearances this season. Has also played for Slough Town and Enfield. . Roy Marshall: (Midfield/Defender) Age 33. Signed in October 1995 having previously played for Hayes, Uxbridge and Hillingdon Borough. John Massey: (Defender) Age 28. Signed for Wealdstone in August 1996 . having played for Cheshunt and Stansted last season. Previous clubs include Saffron Walden, Basildon and Tilbury and as a youngster was with West Ham. . Fergus Moore: (Defender) Age 25. Joined the club in August 1995 from Uxbridge where he won a London Challenge Cup Winners medal. Previous . clubs include Yeading, Staines Town and Brentford. . Tony Smith: (Midfield/Defender) Age 28. Joined in September 1995 having • been with Harrow Borough before that. He has also played for Enfield and Chalfont St. Peter. . Dominic Sterling: (Defender) Age 20. Joined the Stones in October 1996 having started the season with Wimbledon. Chris Walton: (Midfield) Age 34. Joined in July 1995. Was voted Supporters and Players "Player of the Season" last season. before joining Wealdstone he was with Ruislip Manor and previously played for Hayes, Kingstonian, Feltham and Hanwell Town. Ian Waugh: (Defender) Age 28. Now in his second spell with the Stones • having signed at the end of November 1995. During the 1990/91 season he • played fifteen times for the Championship winning Suburban League Reserve . team and also made seven first team appearances. Before joining the Stones . last November he was with Hayes. . Lawrence Yaku: (Forward). Age 22. Signed in January 1997 after some impressive performances in friendly matches this season. James Bush: (Goalkeeper) Age 18. Joined Wealdstone in August 1996 after playing in some of the pre-season friendly fixtures. Paul Sheldrick: (Forward) Age 23. Joined in August 1995 and was the leading scorer last season with 36 goals despite the fact that he was regularly named as substitute. Previously with Yeading, he has also played for Fulham and Kingstonian. **Stuart Miller:** (Forward) Age 24. The club's last signing before the transfer deadline, joining from Epsom & Ewell where he was a regular first teamer.
