DARREN THOMPSON -Apprentice at Luton Town, left to join Vauxhall Conference side Wycombe Wanderers. Signed from ICIS Premier Hitchin Town in February 1997. Was an ever present in the Hitchin Town team that won the ICIS Division 1 Championship in the 1992-93 season.

JASON REED - The highest goalscorer in Bedford Town history, now in his 6th season with the Eagles, previously with Harlow Town and Hitchin Town. Very strong striker who always figures in the Leagues Top Scorer Charts. Supporters Player of the Year 1996-97.

DANNY NICHOLLS - Scored the winner on his home debut in the last minute after signing in December 1997, from Potton United. Previously had 2 years at Witney in the Beazer Homes Southern Division. Signed by Mick Foster for Buckingham Town and has also played for Marlow, where he picked up a knee injury and at Wootton Blue Cross, where he was a prolific goalscorer. Also played 3 games for Bedford Town in an earlier spell for the club.



DAVE HYATT - Goalkeeper, age 30. In his third spell at Epsom having first signed at the start of season 1990/91 and to date has made 165 first team appearances.
