# The History of Cheshunt Football Club

Cheshunt Football Club was founded in the 1800s and met with some considerable success before fading in the early 1930s and disappearing altogether. In 1946 Crossbrook Sports FC was formed and the following year adopted the name of the famous old club, led by the late Roy Bailey our former President and local sports editor. Cheshunt Football Club successfully applied for membership of the London League.

In their first season they finished runners-up in Division One and won the Herts Charity Shield, Herts Junior Cup and two other local competitions. The London Division One title was won in each of the following two seasons; though their best achievement was reaching the Herts Senior Cup Final in 1949. Their continued success gained them admission to the London Premier League for the 1949-50 season when they immediately proved their capabilities by winning the championship at the first attempt. In the same season Cheshunt reached the quarterfinal of the FA Amateur Cup and the final of the Herts Senior Cup.

In the next few years they joined the Delphian League but returned to the London League, then help found the Aelolian League before joining the Spartan League in 1962. They became league champions at the first attempt and then finished fifth in their last season of that competition before moving on once more seeking a higher grade of football they moved to the Athenian League and were runners-up in Division Two in 1966 and Division One Champions two years later.

We spent five years in achieving respectable mid-table positions (8th, 9th, 4th, 8th and 8th) before many of the clubs quit the Athenian League to form the Second Division of the Isthmian League. Cheshunt remained and they attained runners-up spot in 1973/74 before capturing the league title in 1975/76.

They were invited to join the Isthmian League in 1977 and gained promotion to Division One as runners-up to Worthing in 1982. During the 1981/82 season they also reached the last eight of the FA Vase before losing to Blue Star in a replay on Wearside.

Just two years later the side was relegated and in 1986/87 the withdrawal of sponsorship just before the start of the season saw the management and teams resigns. The club, fielding only youth players, finished bottom of Division Two North, being relegated back to the Spartan League and was only narrowly saved from folding altogether.

Over the next few years Cheshunt were always struggling to finish in Over the next few years Cheshunt were always struggling to finish in the top three to enable them to seek re-election to the Isthmian (Diadora) League but never quite made it, finishing fourth on three occasions. Their only success in this period was winning the Herts Senior Centenary Trophy in season 1991/92, although they were losing finalists in the Spartan League Cup in 1989/90. However, 1992/93 saw the revival of Cheshunt's fortunes, winning the Spartan League Cup and, more importantly, have a tremendous end of season run which saw them finish third in the League behind Brimsdown Rovers and Corinthian Casuals, neither of whom sought Diadora Football League status. Cheshunt therefore took their opportunity and, after carrying out the necessary ground improvements, was duly elected to the Diadora Football League.

In early 1998, after a dreadful start to the 1997/98 season, Tom Loizou took over as first team manager. Unfortunately, this was too late to make up any places and Cheshunt was relegated to Division Three. The season ended on a high, however, when we won the Roy Bailey Memorial Trophy, defeating Hertford Town 3-1. This momentum continued into season 1998/99, when promotion back to the Second Division was achieved at the first attempt. Additionally, we became the first side to retain the Roy Bailey Memorial Trophy, defeating Ware 3-1 in the final.

This trophy was retained in 1999/2000 with a splendid 4-1 victory over Hoddesdon Town in the Final; this was a fitting climax to a season of league consolidation. The 2000/2001 season saw Cheshunt finish in the lower half of Ryman Division Two.

Last season was momentous for the club, On the pitch they finished above the relegation placed but found them selves sent down due to not reaching the grading requirements, The also reached the Roy Bailey Memorial Trophy final win in the competition for the 5<sup>th</sup> time. Off the pitch the club suffered the tragedy of losing Managers son Kurtis Townsend who died in and accident travelling to the away game at Barton Rovers, the incident also saws three other players seriously injured.

This season has seen a change in manager with Andy Leese bring in a number of new players to re-enforce the successful capture of the Division Two Championship. The have reached the final of the Herts Senior Cup going down to Berkhampstead and the Final of the Associate members Trophy. In other cup exploits this season they have claimed some impressive scalps, Aldershot, Stevenage, Bishops Stortford.

The club has already achieved success this season with manager Andy Leese collecting the Ryman League Manager of the Month award three times, Keeper Russell Ling collecting the Safe Hand award twice, and The Under 15's and Under 14's lead by managers Andy Cook and Dave Russell winning their respective Herts County Cups and the under 10s winning their league title.

Russell Ling -GK- Russell joined this season, He has previous experience at Ryman level playing with Harlow and Bishops Stortford. He also spent a few years at Potters Bar Town. In the Potters Bar side which reached the FA Vase Quarter final in 1997. Age 41. Loves eating pies and can often be found eating during the game Nickname "Rusty Ring"

David Lovell - GK - Joined this season from Aylesbury United, (bit sick now they have had a goo trophy run) loves shouting complete rubbish likes to play the long ball. Age 12 can't legally drive drink or have?

Matt Allen - Defender - Matt has plenty of experience at this level, having played for Hertford Town and Northwood; he also had brief spells with Potters bar Town and Sawbridgeworth. Age 39. Tends to play anywhere he can stand in, as he can't find a role for himself. Newly wed and so still very much in love. # LEYTON F.C. (Founded 1868)

LONDON'S OLDEST SENIOR FOOTBALL CLUB

A trip to the Football Association's new office in Soho Square, will reveal that the first record of The Lilywhite's existence was in the F.A. manual of 1870, where the following entry is made:

- Founded: 1868 Members: 40
- Ground: Opposite The Lion & Key Public House
- Distance from station: under two miles
- Honourable Secretary: W. Comerford
  - Colours: White with Blue cap & White Stockings

**Delving into local history,** it is pretty certain that The Reverend Morgan Lloyd can be credited with a major hand in the club's formation, as by acquiring land at the back of The Lion & Key, he made it available to the young men of his parish to create a football pitch on the site, thus forming Leyton Football Club.

With the F.A. Cup not commencing till 1871 and with league's not organised until the 1880's, Leyton's earliest years were spent playing friendlies. Rules in these days allowed sides to play with odd numbered teams with roughly ten players being accepted as the norm.. The top sides of this era were mainly Old Boy teams from The Public Schools, as football had been played there since around 1840, also teams of the army were very competitive, with The Royal Engineers being the Manchester United of their day.

The club's first competitive match was played on the 14th. November 1874, whereupon they travelled to face Southall in the first round of The F.A. Cup, alas, although drawing 0-0, The Lilywhites were knocked out a fortnight later, losing the replay 5-0. The next few seasons saw Leyton fair little better in this competition, but in 1879 worse news was to arrive as their ground was taken back so The Grange Park Congregational Church could be built( a church still stands on this site today), so now homeless the club took the decision to disband.

In 1889 with soccer growing in popularity, a few founder members decided to resurrect the club, but as football teams were now numerous in the area, many had already got the name Leyton within their title, so as a home had been found behind Matlock Parade (which still can be found between Bakers Avenue and Boundary Road off Hoe Street), it was agreed to compete as the Matlock Swifts. The team soon began to collect its first silverware with the Walthamstow Charity Cup (1892) and The Leyton & District Championship in both 1893 & 1894. However,

although successful on the field, the club became fairly nomadic, leaving Matlock Parade after two seasons, they played in Lea Bridge Road (possibly The Hare and Hounds) in 1891/92, Churchfields 1892/3 and the Leyton Recreation Ground (Abbots Park) 1893/94.

Proving too strong for local football, The Lilywhites were elevated to The South Essex League in 1894/95, whereupon they were up rooted once again, taking up residence at The Army Sports Ground (The County Ground), now having been granted senior status, the club reverted to Leyton F.C.

The club soon established itself at this higher level. being crowned Champions in 1895/96 and 1896/97 the latter season also saw the club place The Essex Senior Cup in their cabinet (a trophy they have won on eight occasions to date). 1897/98 saw the club move once again, as a ground was found at William Cashford's Farm in Hainault Road., they also changed leagues entering The London League, but although finishing runner up in their second season, they swiftly returned to The South Essex League being crowned champions in 1898/99.

The 1901/02 campaign saw the club shift home yet again, moving to The Hare and Hounds where they remained until 1904/05, during this stay they won The London Senior Cup in 1903. The season 1904/05 saw the club take a monumental step, as by being elected to division two of The Southern League, they turned professional. Finding their feet almost immediately, Leyton gained promotion to division one, finishing runners up in their second campaign, and as they were now to rub shoulders with such sides as West Ham United, Tottenham Hotspur and Millwall, Leyton Borough

Council allowed them to move To Osborne Road (now known as Brisbane Road home of Leyton Orient).

Alas, although enjoying a few successful seasons with a highest finish of seventh and reaching the third round of the F.A. Cup in 1909/10 being eventually beaten by Leicester, the financial burden eventually took its toll, so when finishing bottom at the end of the 1911/12, and faced with a second division made up of mainly welsh sides, the decision to disband for a second time was taken.

After the Great War, Leyton reformed for the 1919/20 season as amateurs, competing in both The Middlesex and South Essex Leagues, playing their games at The Hare and Hounds. After only a couple of years they progressed again to The London League, returning to The Army Ground in 1922/23. It was here that the club most definitely began its strongest period, as they were crowned champions three years running from 1924 till 1926.

1926/27, Leyton gained national fame by lifting the F.A. Amateur Cup for the first time, beating Barking Town in the final at Millwall 3-1. A year later, the club repeated the feat, this time seeing off Cockfield 3-2 at Middlesborough. Alas, when a record breaking third attempt was made (with the club now returned to The Army Sports Ground), The Lilvwhites fell at the final hurdle losing the final to neighbours llford 3-1at Highbury. Although missing out on this great feat, the club did'nt end the season empty handed, having entered the Athenian League for the first time they won the championship ( a league Leyton would remain in until 1981/82). However documented, even the most ardent Lilywhite supporter would have to agree that the club rarely reached the heights of the 1920's although they finished runners up in the Amateur Cup a further three times in 1934, 1936

and 1952, the latter being played in front of a 100,000 Wembley crowd against Walthamstow Avenue. Venue wise, Leyton had to suffer one last move, as the local council wanted a professional club in the Borough, Clapton Orient were invited to change their name and take up residence at Osborne Road, with the Lilywhites eventually settling where they can be found today at The Hare and Hounds.

Although one or two county cups were won, Leyton's next championship did not arrive until 1965, with the title being retained the following year. Alas, like a lot of clubs of the day, Leyton came very close to closure due to financial difficulties. So in 1975, Wingate, a Jewish club from Finchley amalgamated with the Lilywhites to form Leyton-Wingate F.C. The club with now firm backing, began to reap the benefits on the field with the league title being obtained in 1976/77, with the club finishing runners up the following year.

After winning the title again (without losing a game, a league record), Leyton-Wingate were accepted into The Isthmian League for the 1982/83 season. The club soon progressed, winning Division Two North in 1984/85, this campaign also saw The Lilywhites reach Round One of The F.A. Cup for the first time since 1953, going down 2-0 to Swansea City at The Vetch Field. 1986/87, saw the club promoted as runners up to the premier division, they remained until 1991/92, when they were relegated having finished bottom. It was now that Wingate announced that they wished to return to their north London roots, so the club reverted back to Leyton F.C.

After three successful seasons Leyton lifted the Essex Senior League Championship and also won the inaugural Final of the Gordon Brasted Memorial Trophy also reaching the final of the A.O.F. League Cup Final. With the Championship and ground grading secured Leyton gained promotion to the Ryman League Div 2 for season 02/03

Presently, under its new go ahead board of directors, The club is going from strength to strength both on and off the field, and all connected are convinced that the glory days are again only just round the corner.
