success of our fourth team in that season meant their promotion to a higher and stronger division of their League. And so, where their League commitments were concerned, all four of our elevens put up wonderful performances. Our congratulations are extended to all concerned !

It is also worthy of note and worthy, too, of our congratulations that during 1962-63, between them, six of our players earned twenty-six International honours for themselves and our club. In addition, four of those players earned national honours by taking part in the England Amateur XI versus England Professional Youth XI game staged here at Plough Lane.

During the summer, our enclosure has not, by any means, been an oasis of quietness or idleness. On the contrary—although the work of renovation and improvement which has been carried out may not be apparent to many of our supporters. The roof of our headquarters, which was thirty years old, has been completely replaced, and the car park and other areas behind the North Stand have been resurfaced with tarmac. This latter work entailed the removal of the old surface to a depth of over 12 inches and the installation of an improved drainage system. This, we hope, will avoid the appearance of the miniature lakes and consequent hectic water-splashes hitherto inevitable with rainy weather.

The Headquarters building has also been given a new look by the replacement of the old windows with those of a more modern design and by building a more imposing main door and portico. The Club Room, too, has been redecorated.

At the time of going to Press, work is in full swing on all these projects, and we hope they will have been completed in time for our first game. Should our hopes be not entirely realised, however, we trust our friends will excuse any temporary inconveniences which may arise.
