TWENTY FIVE HEROES; that was the expression widely heard as the players and officials left the field after 90 minutes of gruelling, highly skilful football played in torrential rain. Had the game been halted no one would have complained but the players revelled in the difficult conditions well earning the ovation that greeted them at the finish. The high spot of the game was Danny Lakey's headed goal in the thirteenth minute of the second half making the score 3 each. Earlier Sutton had taken the lead with goals from Pritchard and Mellows only for Dave Hyde to reduce the arrears just before half-time. Reduced to ten men Sutton scored again on the resumption, then followed a period of Hendon pressure during which we scored through Danny Lakey (2), Dave Hyde and two own goals.

HENDON 3; MAIDSTONE 1 (A)

This was not one of our best performances, no doubt due to the poor resistance put up by the home side. Before their best gate of the season the Maidstone defence had no answer to the methodical play of our boys, even though we appeared to be strolling through the game. Goals came through Danny Lakey and Jimmy Quail before Fred Pudney scored a good third goal just before the interval. Our lads held back in the second half allowing Maidstone to have more of the game and although they reduced the arrears through a headed goal from their centre-forward there was never any danger of our losing the game.

RESERVES 4; WEALDSTONE RES. 1

This was the reserves best performance of the season and doubly welcome against their close rivals Wealdstone. Man of the match was Roy Drake, who was making a come back after his rib injury against Bromley on September 11th. Playing in the centre-forward spot Roy set a fine example to his young colleagues scoring two excellent goals and bringing his colleagues into the game to good purpose. Another player to shine was young Barry Mitchell in goal who impressed the committee men with his anticipation and safe handling of the ball. He was only beaten from the penalty spot two minutes from time and should be an able deputy for John Swannell or Ray Whittaker should the occasion arise. Bobby Wills and Peter Dean completed the scoring.
