Claremont Chatter

Good afternoon to you all and welcome to Claremont Road for today's Challenge match against the "Rest of the League".

This afternoon's game marks the official start to the 1973/74 season and the introduction of the new ROTHMANS ISTHMIAN LEAGUE. Further details of the sponsorship ideas etc. appear on page 13 of today's programme.

We at Hendon look forward to another successful season. Just to remind you all, we won the league title last season with the following record: Played 42, Won 34, Drew 6, Lost 2, For 88, Against 18, Points 74. This very fine effort included a run of 38 games unbeaten going from the start of the season, on August 12th at Clapton, to April 17 when we lost at home to Walton and Hersham. Without any doubt manager Jimmy Quail and his players have set a very high standard and one which they are determined to keep up.

THE ROTHMANS ISTHMIAN LEAGUE

The League was founded as the Isthmian League in 1905 and now enters its 69th season and without doubt takes on its biggest change ever as it enters the Sponsorship field and, as a result, changes its title to the Rothmans Isthmian League.

In addition to the first division there will also be a second division formed by 16 new clubs and as a result promotion and relegation will be introduced for the very first time. The 16 new clubs will be as follows: Aveley, Carshalton Athletic, Chesham United, Dagenham, Finchley, Hampton, Harlow, Harwich and Parkeston, Hertford Town, Horsham, Maidenhead, Slough, Southall, Staines, Tilbury, Wokingham.

Last season, also for the very first time in the League's history, there was a very fine trophy presented to the Champions, which we at Hendon are very proud to hold. In addition to this, through the efforts of the League's Chairman Mr. Barry East, there started a Champion of Champions Final which was staged here at Claremont Road and resulted in a two—nil victory for us over Northern League Champions, Blyth Spartans.

It was also recently decided that the League should become "open" as from this season and, if desired, clubs would be allowed to use two permit players in the competition.

Without any doubt the League is moving forward in a big way and will one day (not too far away) become the leading League outside the Football League.

AROUND THE CLUB

It is very pleasing to report that there is very little change on the playing strength of the first team squad and with that much-needed luck we can all look forward to another good season. Apart from the League we enter the F.A. Cup at the Fourth Qualifying Round stage; the Amateur Cup (in its last year) in the First Round Proper; and, of course, both the London and Middlesex Senior Cup Competitions.

Our reserve side, under assistant manager Bill Fisher, will again play in Middlesex Border League and enter both the London and Middlesex Intermediate Cups of which they are holders.

The basic points are as follows:

THE SPORTSMAN POOL

Clubs will lose four points if a player is sent off and one if he is cautioned. If a team loses eight or more points in a season it will not qualify them for a share of the large sportsmanship pool.

CHAMPIONS OF THE LEAGUE

Cash awards will be made to the clubs that finish in First, Second and Third places in both divisions of the League.

The scheme, which was instigated and approved by the League, was put together by Mr. Jimmy Hill and Mr. Doug Insole, both former players and members of the Sports Council.
