NEWS FROM AROUND THE CLUBS

The "BERGER PAINTS ISTHMIAN YOUTH CUP" Kicked off three weeks ago with 27 Isthmian League Clubs taking their first steps on a rainbow coloured path leading to cash awards totalling £1,500. The new competition, conceived by the Isthmian League and backed by Berger Paints, is to be run on World Cup lines, with the 27 clubs formed into groups and playing on a league pattern in order to identify 8 finalists who will enter a knockout tournament.

Announcing the decision to sponsor the new competition, Berger Paints said the Company was very pleased to be able to sponsor a scheme designed to help with youth football and to encourage the ideals of sportsmanship, good behaviour and attacking football which were synonymous with the Isthmian League. Berger Paints would offer prizes of £100 to the losing ½ finalists; £200 to the losing semi-finalists; £300 to the losing finalists; and £400 to the Cup winners. But these **aw**ards would be subject to the team's good behaviour, since a disciplinary points scheme will apply and for each point awarded £10 will be deducted from a team's prize money. Points will be awarded as follows:-

Any player cautioned by the referee - 1 point Any player sent-off for persisting in misconduct after having been cautioned - 2 points Any player sent-off without having been cautioned (ie for violent conduct) - 4 points

Mr. Barry East, Chairman of the Isthmian League, said "We are delighted to have Berger Paints help in launching this new competition. It is a further step in developing the Isthmian League as an area in which the whole family unit can enjoy good football in comfortable, pleasant surroundings".

One of the aims of the Competition is to try to improve, through Isthmian League Clubs, the availability of training and coaching facilities for the host of good young players who have not been taken on by Football League clubs. The Isthmian League feel there is a wealth of talent in that age group, and much of it is lost to the game because young players are allowed to drift away. The Berger Paints Isthmian Youth Cup will help clubs to encourage more young players and to develop their own Youth polocies.

The Football Association have approved the Competition and its sponsorship by Berger Paints.

The clubs competing are divided into the following five groups:-

Group A - Hendon, Maidenhead United, St. Albans City, Slough Town, Southall, Wembley, Wokingham Town and Wycombe Wanderers. - Camberley, Hampton, Harrow Borough, Woking, Kingstonian Group B and Staines Town. Group C - Dagenham, Eastbourne United, Sutton United and Carshalton Athletic.

- Clapton, Ilford (who will play all their games away), Group D Leytonstone, Tilbury and Tring Town. Group E

- Aveley, Barking, Harlow Town and Hornchurch.

The top three clubs in Group A will go automatically into the quarter-finals with the remaining places being filled by the champions of the other four groups plus one other club.

Long-serving defender Peter Smith, released by Dulwich Hamlet recently, has joined CROYDON. Smith aged 29, spent eleven seasons and made over 400 first team appearances for the Champion Hill Club.

Charlton are expected to approach STAINES TOWN for their centre-half Peter Shaw. Andy Nelson is the latest manager to admire this defender's qualities and has been in touch with Staines about having Shaw on trial. The fee, however, of £10,000 has scared everyone else off, despite the success of ex-Hayes striker Cyrille Regis at West Bromwich Albion and winger Alan Devonshire who joined West Ham from Southall.

SUTTON UNITED have signed Joe Durrell, the former West Ham and Bristol City winger and Dave Smith, the current Army goalkeeper, while their former manager Alan Pentecost has been appointed youth team manager to Fourth Division Wimbledon.

LEYTONSTONE have placed their talented striker Steve King on the transfer list at a £7,000 fee, while winger Mike Mitchell has obtained his release from Tilbury and has joined WALTHAMSTOW AVENUE on a non contractual basis.

BISHOP'S STORTFORD have signed Enfield goalkeeper Willie Carrick on a month's loan, while another newcomer at Rhodes Avenue is former Dagenham, Enfield and Walthamstow Avenue defender Martin Smith who returns for his second spell at the Hertfordshire club. Stortford however, have released John Miller, John Oakley and Brian Swann.

Former Fulham defender Fred Callaghan who quit as Enfield's boss in January has taken over as manager at WOKING following the sacking of their former player. Pot Finn who only took over as manager at the Surrey club towards the end of last season.

MEET THIS SEASON'S NEWCOMERS - NO. 3 TERRY MOCRE

When the Enfield team was announced on September 3rd at Croydon it came as a complete surprise to the visiting supporters to hear "Number 1. T. Moore" given out over the loudspeaker system. Terry Moore's debut for Enfield, however, was a short-lived one for after taking a knock early in the first half and struggling for the remainder of the first forty-five minutes through this injury he failed to appear after the interval.

Seven days later at Hayes Terry was back in our line-up and since then has fortunately been free of any more injuries and been in commanding form of his 18-yard box. The reason why the majority of Enfield supporters were stified that Ted Hardy should sign another goalkeeper was that on the club's books we already had two of the best in the Isthmian League in Micky Lowe and Willie Carrick. However, Ted knew that he was doing and the signing of Moore, regarded by many experts as the best in the League between the posts, was just another step by our manager in making the Enfield team the best and hopefully most successful in the Isthmian ranks. Moore has already proved Hardy right in bringing him to the club and from his 15 first team appearances to date has kept a clean sheet in 10 of those matches.

Born in Hackney on the 15th May 1947, Terry has been at five previous clubs before moving to Southbury Road, His career started at Clapton and after spending five seasons with them moved to Hitchin Town where he stayed for two years. The next stop was Bishop's Stortford and after four years at Rhodes Avenue he joined Ilford and after one season with the Essex Club signed for Walthamstow Avenue spending just over one season with the Green Pond Road side.

Terry, who stands six feet one inch tall and weighs fourteen and a half stone, now resides in Harlow with his wife Christine and their two children Simon (age 4) and Emma (age 1¹/₂). Terry who works as a carpenter/joiner recalls his most memorable moment in football when he was a member of Bishop's Stortford F.A. Amateur Cup winning side in 1974, while his most disappointing moment was never winning an England Amateur International Cap.

In the music field Terry enjoys listening to The Beatles, Nat "King" Cole, Johnny Mathis and Frank Sinatra, while on T.V. his favourite programme is Out of Town. The former Stoke City and England goalkeeper Gordon Banks is Terry's favourite player, while his favourite Football League club is Orient. Terry's current ambition is to win the F.A. Trophy with Enfield this season.
