Good afternoon and welcome to Earlsmead for the first competitive game of the new season. Today we extend a warm welcome to the players, supporters and officials of Sutton United, also to the Isthmian League officials, representatives of Dylon International Limited, present today, the match officials and everyone else who has come to see what we hope will prove to be as good a match as it promises.

Today we make our first appearance in the Dylon Charity Shield although our visitors Sutton United are no strangers to the competition, having finished as runners up the past two seasons.

The games between Boro and Sutton have over the past few years produced some outstanding games. The results have gone Boro's way with six wins and a draw over the past seven meetings of the clubs. Despite some high scoring games probably the most outstanding game was the goaless draw here at Earlsmead last season. The game produced some fine football and two outstanding goalkeeping displays by Andy Pape and Sutton's Dave Collyer.

With the new season just a week away we all look forward to another exciting season with Boro on the championship pedestal ready to be knocked from all directions. Good news regarding cup competitions is that Boro are exempt until the First Round Proper of the F.A. Trophy and also exempt until the Fourth Qualifying Round of the F.A Cup. This gives a tremendous incentive to progress in these national competitions having tasted success in the past couple of seasons.

On Tuesday Boro entertain Queens Park Rangers in an attractive friendly fixture before we open the league season with a home fixture against last seasons Division One champions Windsor and Eton. A full seasons fixture list is now available.

Off the field an attractive event taking place at Boro is a Darts Exhibition by the world ranked number 2, 'Jacky Wilson', on Friday 14th September. Full details of this darts spectacular are available in the club foyer.

Sutton United

Sutton United began life in March 1898 with the merger of Sutton Association and Sutton Guild Rovers, their colours of amber and chocolate were inherited from Sutton Association. Beginning in the Herald League and Surrey Junior League, senior status was achieved in 1910 when Sutton joined the Sutton Suburban League, moving to their present ground in Gander Green Lane soon after the war. A 41 year membership of the Athenian League commenced in 1921 and Sutton achieved their first title in 1928, reaching the Amateur Cup Semi-Final the next season.

During the periods either side of the last war, Sutton were one of the strongest amateur sides with another appearance in the Amateur Cup Semi-Final in 1937 and a place in 1946 in the F.A. Cup First Round Proper. In these years several players won Amateur International honours and others later to make an impact on the professional ranks were Charlie Vaughan, Phil Woosnam and Terry Dyson. Famous names among the club's managers include Jimmy Hill and Malcolm Allison both of whom had brief spells in the 1950's and the Committee Minutes record one "R. Greenwood" as being interviewed.

Sutton 1957/58 brought the Athenian Championship back to Sutton along with the London Senior Cup for its one and only time. The sixties provided the golden era and in 1962 Sutton reached the Amateur Cup Final, losing out to Wimbledon. That year they were elected to the Isthmian League and the Championship followed in 1967 and they were runners up in 1968. In 1969 they reached Wembley again this time to fall to North Shields at the last hurdle. National acclaim came in 1970 when after a F.A. Cup run Leeds United were the visitors and victors at Sutton.

Going further afield Sutton had success in the Anglo-Italian competition which they won in 1979 as well as finishing runners up in 1980. Season 1980/81, of course, saw Sutton reach the pinnacle of success in semi professional football when they appeared in the F.A. Trophy Final. They were defeated by the only goal of the game by Bishop's Stortford in the dying minutes to provide one of the shocks of the season.

In the League Sutton are seemingly always amongst the front runners and last season was no exception. They were well positioned for a final challenge for the Championship finally finishing in fourth position. They did excell once again in cup competition, claiming the Hitachi League Cup and the Surrey Senior Cup. Sutton United since 1977 have been led by Manager Barrie Williams a former player with Dartford Casuals, coached Barking and Bexley United and managed Ilford for a short spell.
