VISITORS TO CHURCH ROAD: KINGSTONIAN F.C.

Dave ROOT (Goalkeeper).

Dave has been a virtual ever present with the K's since his arrival from Hendon at the start of the 1994/95 campaign. A stalwart with the Claremont Road outfit for several seasons, he has represented the Isthmian League on a number of occasions over the years.

Danny BROOKER (Midfielder).

Gifted player who formerly captained the youth team at Wimbledon. Joined the club in December 1994, and has since made in excess of 60 appearances. Aged 20.

Mark THOMAS (Defender).

Acquired by the Kingsmeadow outfit upon his return from coaching with Charlie Cooke in the U.S. He previously spent two years as a professional at Wimbledon.

Dave STEVENS (Defender).

A dependable player who came to the club at the beginning of the 1995/96 season from Carshalton Athletic. Dave has also seen service with Crystal Palace, and was formerly skipper of the England U/19 team. **Mark GARLAND** (Defender).

A steady defender who came to the K's at the beginning of this season, having previously been a youth team player with Crystal Palace.

Paul CLARK (Defender).

A combative centre half who has formerly seen service with Molesey, Carshalton Athletic and St.Albans City.

Andy FISHER (Midfielder).

Club Captain who was acquired at the start of last season from Carshalton Athletic. Has amassed vast experience in his career to date, including a spell as skipper of Dulwich Hamlet. Missed the second half of last season through injury.

Colin LUCKETT (Midfielder).

Talented youngster who has been converted to a midfield player over the last year or so. Now totals over 70 appearances for the K's.

Steve DARLINGTON (Forward).

A close season capture from Division One side Wokingham Town. Steve, who was top for his former club last term, has also played for Staines Town.

David JONES (Midfielder).

A stylish playmaker who is equally adept at battling in the middle of the park, Dave signed from Sutton United in October 1995. Gets forward at every opportunity, and has found the net with some important goals in his time at Kingsmeadow. Another to have represented the Isthmian League.

Eddie AKUAMOAH (Forward).

A further player to sign from Carshalton Athletic, on this occasion it was back in 1993. A fast and tricky striker, Eddie has played around 150 games for the club.

Jon WARDEN (Midfielder/Forward).

Very experienced player who spent most of last season in attack, finishing as top scorer with a total of 23 goals. Joined from Carshalton Athletic just prior to the start of the campaign, and was soon established as a crowd favourite with the K's followers. **Detzi KRUSZYNSKI** (Midfielder).

Creative Polish player who was a recent signing for the K's, having left Chertsey Town. His nomadic existence has seen him play professional football for Lech Gdansk, Saarbrucken, Hamburg, Coventry City, Wimbledon and Brentford. This has since been followed by stints in non league football with St.Albans City, Hayes and Crawley Town, arriving at Chertsey in the summer. **Matt ELVERSON** (Defender/Midfielder). Matt signed from Walton & Hersham last year, and gave a good account of himself when given an extended run after Christmas. Seen as a good prospect by the management at the club.

CONFERENCE REVIEW Saturday 19th October.

The eleven Conference games played Saturday produced 40 goals at an average of almost four a game. Aside from our fine 3-1 win over Altrincham, there were other results that carried an element of surprise. Pre-match leaders Kidderminster Harriers were held to a 1-1 draw at Northwich Victoria before a gate of 1,234. Vics went ahead through a Carwyn Humphreys penalty on 41 minutes, with Harriers levelling through Neil Doherty six minutes into the second period. This draw keeps the home side well placed in the top half. Macclesfield Town failed in their bid to close the gap at the top with a disappointing 1-1 stalemate at home to Welling United. Mike Rutherford actually put the Wings in front on 20 minutes, only for Tony Hemmings to equalise on the hour mark. The visitors drop to 16th despite this good result, in a game watched by 1,102 at Moss Lane. Making up the top three are Stevenage Borough, who stay third in spite of a second 1-3 away defeat in a Farnborough Town were the week. victors over Boro' at Cherrywood Road, being helped by the dismissal of Stuart Beevor for the away side. Phil Wingfield gave the hosts a 49th minute lead that was added to a minute later by Chris Boothe. Kenny Webster reduced the arrears on 52 with a penalty, but Steve Baker (77) sealed the victory. 1,148 were present for this one as the Hampshire club climb to 7th.

Slough Town swapped places with visiting **Telford United** after the Rebels 6-0 thumping of the team from Shropshire. Youth team graduate Lloyd Owusu scored four (20,39,51,61) on his home debut with the other goals from Gary Abbott (36) and Mark West (81). This puts Town fourth, and will have pleased the majority of the 1,002 in attendance. **Morecambe** also closed on the leaders after their 5-2 beating of **Kettering Town**. Craig Gaunt actually gave the Poppies a first minute lead, but strikes from Jackson (8) and a Norman own goal (14) put the Shrimps in front. Russell Stock brought Town level on 44 minutes, although a second from Jackson took the hosts 3-2 up at the break. The win was ensured with goals from McCluskie (76) and Burns (88). The crowd at Christie Park was 1,234 as Kettering remain 18th in the table. The other top half teams to win were Woking and Southport. The Cards were 4-0 winners at Halifax Town after the Shaymen had two players sent off in the first 51 minutes. Francis (42) and Paul Stoneman (51) were the men in guestion to receive their marching orders. Giuliano Grazioli, on loan from Peterborough United, scored a hat trick (62,76,85), with veteran Clive Walker (69) netting the other goal with a penalty. Town slide to 21st with their ninth reversal of the season in front of 807. Southport still hold the best defensive record after their 1-0 win at miserly Hednesford Town (att.1,149). Andy Whittaker scored the only goal on 51 minutes to move 'Port up to 11th.

At the bottom of the table, there were important wins for three clubs trying to move out of immediate danger. Gateshead went into 13th with a superb 4-0 win at a troubled Rushden & Diamonds. Paul Proudlock (19) and Tinkler (31) made it 2-0 at the break, Pearson (56) and Watson (86) completing the scoring. The Diamonds fall to 17th, but still attracted a gate of 2,214 to Nene Park. Bromsgrove Rovers went up to 15th with a 3-1 home win over Dover Athletic, themselves only perched one place higher. Rovers scored through Nick Dunphy (3,69) before Andy Theodosiou pulled one back on 71. Adie Mainwaring ensured the points on 79 in front of 803. Finally, Stalybridge Celtic moved off the bottom with a 2-0 win at Bath City (att.530). Ian Arnold (45) and Brendan Burke (85) gave Celtic their first away win as City drop to 22nd place after their eighth defeat.

FROM THE EDITOR...

Good evening everybody and welcome to Church Road for this Isthmian Charity Shield game between Hayes and Kingstonian. A warm welcome to the players, officials and supporters of the K's as they make the trip to play us tonight. We hope you enjoy the game and have a safe journey home afterwards.

I would like to join with League Chairman Alan Turvey in briefly welcoming the guests we have with us this evening. Top of the list is new F.A. Chairman Mr.Keith Wiseman, who recently took over the job from long serving Bert Millichip. Whilst none of can really imagine the work involved in this role, I am sure Keith is enjoying every minute of it. Also present tonight will be representatives from ICIS and Guardian Insurance, both leading sponsors in the Isthmian League. We hope that they will continue their backing of non league football as the revenue generated is much needed by the clubs. To you, and all of the other various guests here tonight, we hope you enjoy the game, and the hospitality provided by our friendly club.

Last Saturday's game here at Church Road witnessed a promising **3-1** win over an **Altrincham** side who began the day in the top half of the table. Our side saw three changes from the one that had been so unlucky to lose by a single goal at Welling the previous Tuesday. Russell Meara replaced Kunle Odetoyinbo in goal, Jason Goodliffe came in for James Wise at left back, while Freddie Hyatt took the place of Kieren Adams. Joining the latter on the bench were Martin Randall and Jason Roberts.

The key to most of our Conference games this season has been our consistent inability, espcially at home, to score an early goal that brings the away side out of their defensive shell. In this game we managed to score twice in the opening eleven minutes. The first goal came via a long ball from Andy Cox that was spilled by the keeper (who was under pressure from **Gary Williams**). The big striker collected the loose ball and lobbed it over the retreating keeper and into the unguarded net. The same player then added a second just ninety seconds later. Junior Haynes burst down the left hand side and whipped in a near post cross. **Williams** turned his man and shot left footed into the far corner. Altrincham made every effort to get back into the game by forcing a series of corners, but we continued to hold the upper hand and could have turned round with a couple more goals to our credit. Goodliffe fired a shot into the side netting from 15 yards, whilst Haynes glanced a Brady free kick onto the bar as Dickins hesitated.

Just two minutes into the second period, **Haynes** did make it 3-0 as he scored his sixth of the season in impressive fashion. Williams supplied the pass to Junior as he outstripped the covering defender, rounded the outcoming keeper, and drove the ball home from the narrowest of angles. This spurred Alty into action, and they pulled one back on 57 minutes with a Stuart Terry shot. After a spell of pressure from the visitors, we finished the stronger and could eventually count ourselves unlucky not to have won by a bigger margin. The three points, which lift us two places into 19th, are the vital factor as we accrue only our second league win of the season.

This Saturday sees the F.A. Cup Fourth Qualifying Round tie with Slough Town here at Church Road. Make sure you arrive in plenty of time as a big crowd is expected. Following this we have trips to Farnborough Town in the Spalding Challenge Cup (Tuesday 29th), and Conference games at Northwich Victoria (Saturday 2nd November), and Kidderminster Harriers (Monday 4th). The next home league game is Saturday 9th November when we face Stalybridge Celtic.

If the scores are level at 90 minutes, thirty minutes extra time will be played. If there is still no decisive result, penalties will decide the outcome.

HAYES vs K's MEMORIES-PART ONE.

This article looks at the eight matches between the two clubs in 1990/91 - 1992/93. During this period there were three Hayes wins, two draws, and two triumphs for Kingstonian.

1990/91.

The first meeting of this season came on Saturday 27th October as we entertained the K's in the F.A. Cup Fourth Qualifying Round. The visitors, who contained future Hayes players Andy Dear, Roddy Brathwaite, David Pearce and Robin Lewis in their squad, began as favourites in this tie as they were near the top of the league at the time. Hayes, by contrast, sat in mid table, but we raised our game before a gate of 759 at Church Road. Colin Day put us ahead with a right foot shot on 17 minutes, a lead we held fairly comfortably until the break. The K's poured on the pressure after the interval as they laid siege to our goal for long periods. We survived this onslaught though, and sealed the win with a goal on the break from Chris Walton two minutes from time. This gave us a tie with Cardiff City in Round One. Saturday 1st December saw our second clash at Church Road, this time in the Third Qualifying Round of the F.A. Trophy, with a crowd of 501. Reg Leather gave us the ideal start by heading home in the first minute, a lead doubled by Day with another headed effort on 15 minutes. Pearce pulled one back for the away side on 26 minutes to give the Surrey side hope, and they duly levelled matters ten minutes from time. After sustained pressure, it was substitute Geoff Thompson who scored an 80th minute goal that looked like forcing a replay. However, Paul Clarke saw us through with a winning goal with two minutes to go, as he flicked his header past Adrian Blake to secure our passage.

Three weeks later, we met again here at Church Road in the-then Vauxhall League. A hard fought 0-0 draw, before 411, ensued in a game short on goalmouth action. The return fixture was contested at Kingsmeadow on Easter Saturday (30th March) in front of a gate of 827. The K's, who were unbeaten at home in the league at the time, led the table. We included Warren Kelly and debutant Neal Stevens in our ranks as we tried to pull off a shock win. Following an exciting opening 45 minutes, we snatched a famous victory with the only goal of the contest after 54 minutes. Leather nodded down a corner for Chris Dixon to flick home past Blake. We defended well as the game progressed, and were well worth the three points.

1991/92.

Our two League meetings of this season were somewhat less memorable. A dour 0-0 draw was the order of the day in the home game (delayed until Tuesday 10th March due to postponements) that drew a crowd of just 241 to Church Road. The away match (played on Saturday 4th April) witnessed Francis Cassidy fire home a 2nd minute free kick to put us ahead, but Pearce level on 14 minutes. A good Hayes showing was ruined late on as Richard Cherry headed home to hand the K's a 2-1 victory.

1992/93.

The match at Kingsmeadow (Tuesday 13th October) saw Francis Vines open the scoring from close range after 6 minutes, John Stephen earning us a point with a 45th minute equaliser after a goalmouth scramble. The eventful home game produced a 3-2 win for the K's. David Harlow gave the away side the lead on 14 minutes, and this was added to by Pearce (who had only just left us) on the stroke of half time. Jason Court gave us hope with a 63rd minute strike, and Phil Wingfield looked to have secured apoint with a goal a minute from the end. Pearce had the last word though, as he struck in stoppage time to earn the victory.

HAYES vs K's MEMORIES -PART TWO.

This article looks at the six matches between the two clubs in 1993/94 - 1995/96. During this period there were three Hayes wins, one draw, and two wins for Kingstonian.

1993/94.

It was a Hayes side low on confidence that made the trip to Surrey on Tuesday 26th October as just two league wins had been achieved up to that point. Our side contained three players still with the club - Warren Kelly, Jason Goodliffe and Neal Stevens, while current K's John Finch and Eddie Akuamoah played for the home side. They were never in any danger as a 4-1 K's victory was recorded. A goalless first half counted for nothing as David Harlow (53) and Roddy Brathwaite (59) made it 2-0. Jamie Ndah added a third on 81 minutes, before Ron Riley got one back within a minute. The rout was completed in injury time when Harlow added the fourth to delight the majority of the 539 crowd. The second meeting of the campaign came on Saturday 2nd April when we ran out 2-1 winners. Terry Brown had taken over the reins, and included one more current squad member, Steve Baker, in the squad. Jimmy Sugrue was on the bench for the K's, entering the fray in the second half. Lance Pedlar volleyed us in front on 19 minutes, and David Ross made it 2-0 eight minutes later. The consolation goal for the K's arrived a minute from the end as Mark Underdown pulled one back. The attendance for this match was 320.

1994/95.

We trekked to Surrey in only our third league game, having won the first two matches (against Purfleet and Harrow Borough respectively). Our line-up saw Goodliffe, Kelly, Baker and Stevens, as well as the fit-again Andy Cox. The first half sending off of Kelly (Warren, not Tony) marred what turned out to be a very good game that was played in front of a crowd of 531. We took a 65th minute lead with a David Pearce goal against the run of play, Jamie Ndah drawing the hosts level three minutes later. Both sides could have nicked it at the death, but a draw was probably the right result. The return game, played here on Saturday 28th January was a desperately tight game as we held top spot, and Kingston were in the lower reaches. Lee Flynn and Jon Brady were additions to the squad as we managed to steal a 1-0 victory through a 79th minute header from Andy Cox, who had remained on the field despite a head wound. 620 saw this hard fought clash.

1995/96.

The away match last season took place on Tuesday 31st October before a crowd of 432. We were unbeaten in the league to this point, but could not maintain this record as a single Colin Luckett goal, glanced home on 35 minutes, was enough to give the home side all three points. The game here took place on Saturday 2nd March, and provided us with our seventh league win on the trot. The K's contained very well in the first half, and, for a while, it looked as if we would never score. Eventually, two goals in four second half minutes did the damage. Andy Cox headed home from a corner on 77 minutes, before Pearce followed up a half-saved Martin Randall shot on 81. Jon Warden pulled a goal back for the visitors on in the final minute, but it was not enough to make any real difference. The crowd at Church Road for this encounter was 431.

The complete record since 1990/91 is six Hayes wins, four draws, and four Kingstonian wins. We have managed 17 goals, the K's totalling just one fewer, with 16.

Dutch striker Joff Vansittart did all the damage, as he scored twice (24,32) in the first period to seal the points. Enfield also recorded a win as they stayed in the hunt at the top. Purfleet were defeated 1-3 on their own ground as the E's made it four away wins from six attempts. Lee Marshall opened the scoring on 15 minutes, Paul Underwood adding the second six minutes prior to the break. Paul Cavell pulled one back a minute after the break, but Underwood clinched the E's win with his second goal on 55 minutes. Oxford City continue to reside in the top half after their eye-catching 4-2 triumph at Chertsey Town. An own goal by Jamie Beer put City ahead on 19 minutes, but Rob Peters levelled for the Curfews nine minutes later. Terry Morrisey (31) and Andy Smith (55) made it 3-1 to the visiting side, before Rob McKane reduced the arrears on 61 minutes. The away victory was ensured with an 86th minute strike from Steve Fontaine as City scored their 28th league goal in only their twelfth fixture. There were two matches that finished 0-0 on Saturday, Boreham Wood drawing with Kingstonian at Meadow Park, and Carshalton Athletic being frustrated at home by battling Dagenham & Redbridge. The day's other game witnessed Harrow Borough slump to a 0-2 loss against fellow strugglers Staines Town. Williams (37) and Braithwaite (47) found the net for the Swans as they enjoyed their first league success in nine outings.

Eight Premier Division clubs took part in the First Qualifying Round of the F.A. Trophy last weekend, six teams making it through at the first time of asking. **Bishop's Stortford** enjoyed the biggest winning margin, with a 3-0 beating of Croydon at Rhodes Avenue. There were also good performance from **Aylesbury United** (2-0 at Tonbridge Angels), **Heybridge Swifts** (1-0 at Canvey Island), and **Yeading** (1-0 at Whyteleafe). Home victories were recorded by **Bromley** (1-0 vs Uxbridge) and **Grays Athletic** (2-1 vs Bashley), whilst **Hendon** drew 1-1 at home to Thame United. The only side to go out were **Hitchin Town**, as they went down 1-4 at Ashford Town.

F.A. CUP PREVIEW: Fourth Qualifying Round.

This Saturday sees one of the biggest weekends in non league football as 56 clubs do battle for a coveted place in the First Round Proper. This article examines the main games, and where the potential for upsets could be.

Apart from our own eye-catching tie with local rivals Slough Town, there is only one other meeting of Conference clubs as Hednesford Town take on neighbouring Telford United at Keys Park. Both sides presently reside in the top half of the table, but the home side will probably start as slight favourites to progress. Having said that, United do have a formidable pedigree in the Cup, and may settle for going through after as replay. There are only two more Northern-based Conference sides at home on Saturday as a further five must travel. Gateshead entertain Consett, a club based locally in Durham. It would be a surprise if the visitors, who compete in the Northern League, were able to force a draw at The International Stadium despite the indifferent form of their more illustrious opponents. Stalybridge Celtic also play at home, the opposition at Bower Fold being provided by Leek Town. This is a very tricky match for Celtic as Leek are well clear at the top of the Unibond Premier, and will fancy their chances of going through. However, new manager Brian Kettle has instilled relative stability at the club, and his side are certainly capable of winning at home.

Current leaders **Kidderminster Harriers** are away at Unibond Premier side **Witton Albion** in a tricky tie at Wincham Park. The Harriers are on a great run at the moment, and it would be foolish to back against them making their way through. **Altrincham** face a sterner test, being drawn at **Barrow**, another Unibond Premier side. Alty will not fancy going to Holker Street in what will definitely be a traditional 'blood and thunder' cup tie. John King is an experienced manager though, and will have done his homework on their Cumbrian opponents. Southport also have a trip north, as they visit Spennymoor United in another potential shock. 'Port will feel that they have the know-how and experience to squeeze through, even if, as in the last round, it takes two games to do so. There is yet another local derby at Lancaster City, where the locals play in-form Morecambe. The indifferent form of City so far this term will count for little on Saturday as their players raise their game in the Cup. The other Conference side in this regionalised zone are Bromsgrove Rovers. They are away to Shepshed Dynamo, and will expect to progress to the First Round with few alarms. Only two of the Southern-based clubs involved are at home this weekend, the other three being forced to journey away. Rushden & Diamonds should have little difficulty in beating Bognor Regis Town at Nene Park, the Sussex side occupying a bottom half spot in ICIS Division One. Bath City's home tie with Cheltenham Town is not so straightforward as the Dr.Martens Premier side are always capable of earning a good result against supposedly superior opposition. In this case, Town have a reasonable chance of sneaking through, maybe after a second game. The sides with away trips all look well capable of winning their ties with plenty to spare. Welling United are at Staines Town in a game that the Wings will be confident of achieving a positive result, especially as the Swans only recently ended a six game losing run in the ICIS Premier. Stevenage Borough will start as firm favourites at Gravesend & Northfleet, who are in the lower reaches of the Dr.Martens Premier, while Farnborough Town should have enough to win at Cinderford Town. They will have to make an improvement from the last round though, after a narrow 3-2 win over Bracknell Town.

The pick of the other ties see **Bromley** pitted with **Sutton United** and **Hastings Town** at home to **Hendon**.
