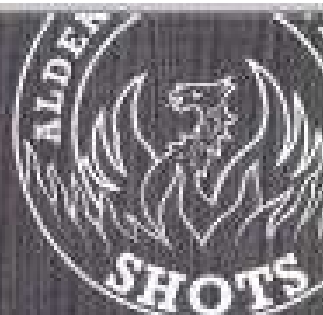

Exeter City aftermath

We entertain Dulwich Hamlet at the Rec this coming Saturday afternoon (December 11th) in a Ryman Premier Division match. Kick off is 3pm.

Farnborough Town

As you will be aware by now we will be entertaining our close neighbours Farnborough Town twice in 10 days over the Christmas period. On Tuesday 21st December we will stage the Ryman League Cup third round match (7.45pm) whilst on Monday 27th December we stage our first ever league match against Farnborough. Kick off is 3pm.

Neither match will be all ticket but we will be selling tickets in advance this coming Wednesday 10th December from 10am to 4.30pm onwards and before and after Saturday's match against Dulwich Hamlet.

For the Ryman League Cup tie season ticket holders will be able to reserve their seats by purchasing tickets in advance at the club offices. For the league match season ticket holders can gain access by using the relevant stub in their book.

For supporters purchasing seats in advance each ticket will have an individual seat number and supporters must sit in their allocated seat to avoid any problems. The ticket office will be open up until 4pm on Thursday 23rd December 1999.

There will be STRICT segregation and Farnborough Town supporters will be allocated the East Bank away section and also the McDonalds Family Stand. We apologise to our supporters who use the Family Stand – it is a disappointment that for every big match that is staged at the Rec the Family Stand is provided for visiting supporters and we will be addressing that issue and it may be that the Family Stand will be moved for next season.

We do advise supporters to purchase tickets in advance to ensure quicker access into the stadium on both matchdays.

Meet the Shots

GARY ABBOTT – Forward

Born Catford, 7th November 1964

Debut: 22nd August 1998 v Purfleet (A)

Appearances 75 – Goals 60

Signed from Slough Town in June 1998 and became a firm favourite with the Shots' supporters. Scored his first of four hat-tricks last season in the opening home match versus Hampton in August 1998. He also became the club's record goalscorer for a season netting 48 goals during the last campaign, including the winners in both the Ryman and Hampshire Senior Cup finals. Has also played for Barnet and Enfield and scored over 100 Conference goals for Welling United. Has represented England at amateur level. Scored two hat-tricks in a week in September.



OLLIE ADEBISI – Defence

Born Lewisham, 15th July 1970

Debut: 14th August 1999 v Hendon (A)

Appearances 21 – Goals 0

A close season acquisition from Bromley where he had played for the past six seasons. A reliable consistent centre half who impressed against the Shots on five occasions last season for the Kent side. Ollie progressed through the reserves initially before making the centre half position his own. A former Player of the Season at Bromley. Ollie has also played for Finchley and Boreham Wood.

NEIL BAKER – Defence

Born Addford (Middlesex), 4th September 1979

Debut: 7th September 1999 v Aylesbury United (A)

Appearances 6 – Goals 0

Arrived at the Recreation Ground in July from Farnborough Town. Neil served the Cherrywood Road club for three seasons and became renowned for producing a high level of consistency. A level headed player, Neil's father Keith is a former Assistant Manager at Aldershot Town who made 137 appearances for the club between 1992 and 1995.

SIMON BASSEY – Midfield

Born London, 5th February 1976

Debut: 6th December 1997 v Worthing (H)

Appearances 29 – Goals 1

A highly promising bustling midfield player who has bravely returned to full fitness with intense work after a poor challenge versus Gravesend & Northfleet ended his 1998/99 season in August. He received rapturous applause when he returned at Fisher Athletic in the F.A. Cup in early October. Originally signed for the club from Carshalton Athletic and started his career as an apprentice at Charlton Athletic.

NICKY BELL – Midfield

Born Reading, 18th December 1978

Appearances 5 – Goals 1

Local product who was an apprentice at Reading. Impressed in early season reserve team matches before joining the first team squad. Nicky's father, Terry, was a popular forward who spent five seasons at the Recreation Ground between 1973 and 1978.

MARK BENTLEY – Midfield

Born Hertford, 7th January 1978

Debut: 14th August 1999 v Hendon (A)

Appearances 19 – Goals 7

Signed during the close season after being a near ever-present for Enfield last season. Mark netted 11 Ryman League goals last season for the Middlesex club, for whom he had progressed through the ranks. Teamed up at Aldershot with former manager George Borg. Turned

down an offer to sign for Nationwide League Barnet last season. Mark scored the winning goal on his home debut against Gravesend & Northfleet in August.

GEORGE BORG – Manager

Born London, 11th May 1958

Has proved popular with the Aldershot faithful after leading the club to the Ryman Division One championship in his first season at the club and securing the first cup silverware in Aldershot's history last season. Renowned within non-League football George joined Aldershot with a fine pedigree after ensuring the most successful period in Enfield's history, leading the Middlesex club to the Premier Division championship and the third round of the F.A. Cup. Was also successful at Chesham United (a further championship trophy) and Harrow Borough (two cup final victories) and also against the odds progressed with Chelmsford City and Barking early in his management career, the latter when he was just 29 years of age.

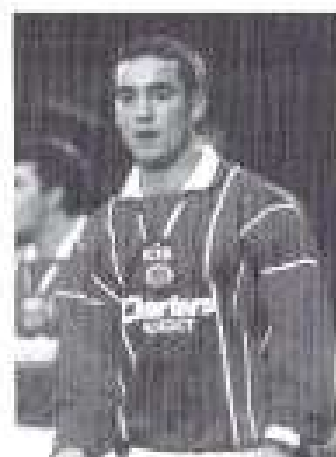
STUART CASH – Assistant Manager/Defence

Born Bolton, 5th September 1965

Debut: 24th September 1997 v Leyton Pennant (A)

Appearances 48 – Goals 2

Has proved a great influence in the dressing room under his Assistant Manager's role. First team opportunities were limited last season and injury halted Stuart's season early. A former professional with Chesterfield, Rotherham United and Brentford, Stuart actually featured in a league Cup match at Liverpool in 1992 when the lower division side were 2-0 in the lead and finally drew 4-4. A Wembley F.A. Trophy winner also with Wycombe Wanderers.



NEIL CHAMPION – Midfield

Born Farnborough,

5th November 1975

Debut: 16th August 1997

v Chertsey Town (H)

Appearances 102 – Goals 1

Missed only a handful of matches last season after forcing his way into the starting line-up in the First Division championship season. Neil was former manager Steve Wigley's first signing in the summer of 1997 after arriving from Farnham Town. Started his career as a youth player at AFC Bournemouth.

JASON CHEWINS – Defence

Born Portsmouth, 22nd October 1970

Debut: 13th August 1994 v Billerica Town (H)

Appearances 263 – Goals 6

Last season's Player of the Season. A left back who has proved popular with the supporters, and is now the longest serving player at the club. Is one of only three players to make 200 plus appearances for the club and now has Mark Butler's record of 303 matches in his sights. Previously served Basingstoke Town and Winklesboro.

SAM CORBETT – Midfield

Born Aldershot, 21st October 1980

Debut: 5th January 1999 v Berkhamstead Town (A)

Appearances 15 – Goals 0

A local product that forced his way into the first team last season and impressed the management to secure a two-year contract at the club. A former Mytchett Junior, Sam joined Aldershot Town at the age of 15 and was an influential part of the successful youth team last season.

Meet the Shots

OWEN COLL – Defence

Born Donegal, 9th April 1976

Debut: 24th November 1998 v Chertsey Town (A)

Appearances 56 – Goals 5

An ever-present towards the end of last season, Owen slotted into the centre back position with ease. Was also called to play at right back due to the injury situation at the club. A former Spurs apprentice, Owen made his Football League debut for AFC Bournemouth in Division Two at the age of 19 in March 1996, playing 34 times for them before joining the Shots via a brief spell at Stevenage Borough. Represented the Republic of Ireland at junior level.

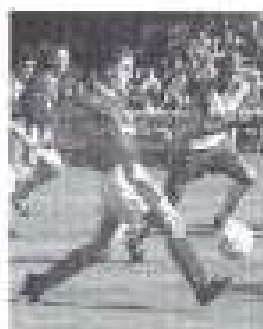
COLIN FIELDER – Player/Coach

Born Winchester, 5th January 1964

Debut: 23rd August 1997 v Purfleet (A)

Appearances 81 – Goals 7

The only player on the books who played for Aldershot in the Football League. Colin made 88 appearances as a professional before moving to neighbours Farnborough Town where he was a major part of their progress to the Conference in 1989 and 1991. An excellent career has also seen Colin win two F.A. Trophy medals with Woking, including scoring a last minute Wembley winner. Signed from Yeovil Town where, as Player/Coach, the Somerset club won promotion to the Conference in 1997. Appointed Player/Coach at Aldershot Town in the summer of 1999.



RICHARD GELL – Midfield

Born London, 8th December 1975

Debut: 14th August 1999 v Hendon (A)

Appearances 20 – Goals 0

Signed during the summer after a season at Chesham United. An attacking midfield player, Richard commenced his career on the books of Chelsea and Wycombe Wanderers. In 1995 he joined Yeading in the Premier Division of the Isthmian League and spent three seasons at the Middlesex club.

STUART HARTE – Defence

Born Basildon, 12th December 1977

Debut: 7th September 1999 v Aylesbury United (A)

Appearances 7 – Goals 0

Joined former Farnborough Town team-mate Darren Robson after arriving from Cherrywood Road during the summer. A former Bristol Rovers player, Stuart joined Farnborough Town during the 1997/98 season and produced a high level of consistency for the club in the right back position before joining the Shots.

IAN HATHAMWAY – Midfield

Born Wordsley, 22nd August 1968

Debut: 26th September 1998 v Billericay Town (A)

Appearances 71 – Goals 11

Had an excellent first season at the club, his first outside the professional game for 11 years. Was made captain as the team lifted the Hampshire Senior Cup in May. Commenced his playing career as an apprentice at W.B.A. before a spell in Midland non-League football ended when he joined Mansfield Town in 1989. In total he made 209 Football League appearances, scoring 17 goals and also featured for Rotherham United, Torquay United and Colchester United.

JOE HARTEY – Forward

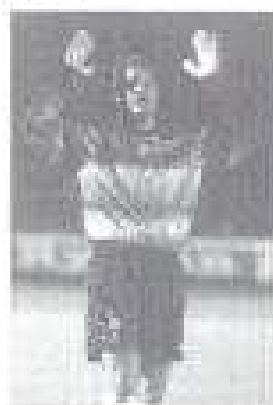
Born Ghana, 28th May 1976

Debut: 28th March 1998 v Billericay Town (H)

Appearances 73 – Goals 27

Recorded his best return of 29 goals last season, including four in a loan

spell at Billericay Town. Set a club record of scoring five goals in a match in the 8-0 win at Bishop's Cleeve in September 1998 and scored a further four goals against the Hertfordshire side in the 5-0 home victory. Completed 10 goals against Stortford by also netting against them in his loan spell. Arrived at the club from Chertsey Town in March 1998 and also had a successful spell at Hayes when the Middlesex club gained promotion to the Conference in 1996.



ANDY PAPE – Goalkeeper

Born Hammersmith, 22nd March 1962

Debut: 16th October 1999

v Lymington/New Milton (A)

Appearances 9 – Goals 0

Experienced goalkeeper who has Football League experience at Barnet and Queens Park Rangers. He had a highly successful period at Enfield, where he helped the Middlesex club to win the Football Conference title and F.A. Trophy. In total he spent over 10 seasons at Enfield in two spells. He also possesses 15 England semi-professional international caps.

GRANT PAYNE – Forward

Born Woking, 25th December 1973

Debut: 13th November 1999 v Enfield (A)

Appearances 2 – Goals 7

Signed from Nationwide Conference neighbours Woking, where he was extremely popular with the supporters. A former Wimbledon apprentice, Grant scored approaching 50 goals for Woking in a two-year spell. Made history on his Aldershot debut becoming the first player in 73 years of football in Aldershot to score four goals in his first match. Followed this up with a hat-trick in his next match, a Ryman League Cup tie at Abingdon Town.

ANDY PEARCE – Defence

Born Bradford upon Avon, 20th April 1966

Debut: 16th October 1999 v Lymington/New Milton (A)

Appearances 7 – Goals 0

Joined the Shots in October despite having the opportunity to remain in the professional game. Has made approaching 200 Premiership appearances, spanning spells at Coventry City, where he was signed by Bobby Gould, Sheffield Wednesday and Wimbledon. Adds height and experience to the team.

JIMMY SUGRUE – Midfield

Born Hammersmith, 1st January 1974

Debut: 18th March 1995 v Abingdon Town (A)

Appearances 181 – Goals 43

A firm favourite with the supporters who never gives less than 100%. Originally arrived at the club on loan from Kingsthorpe in March 1995 and instantly proved a hit. Is now in his second spell at the Recreation Ground and in between Jimmy was a part of Hayes' championship side of 1996 that won promotion to the Conference in 1996. Has previously won the Player of the Season Award. Another Shots' player who started his career in the professional ranks as an apprentice at Fulham.

SPONSORS OF THE RYMAN FOOTBALL LEAGUE

I remember my father telling me of the hoax which was played on the sporting public around the turn of the century, involving an entire race meeting card including horses, riders and a full s.p. – all of which was fictionall

Well, we must have come close to it a couple of weeks ago in the football world when it was reported in two national newspapers at least that Liverpool were interested in signing Didier Baptiste from Monaco – unfortunately the player was a character from the Sky soap, 'Dream Team'!

Monsieur Baptiste is portrayed by an actor who also plays Sunday League football and was chuffed when he heard Liverpool were prepared to bid £3.5 million for his services!

Naturally the rest of the national press, who had not been hoodwinked by this, did some investigating and alleged that the source of the story had been with a sports agency, who strangely enough were not available for comment. For Dream Team, read Nightmare.

Perhaps it was a quiet day on the football front, but whether the idea was a prank or just a genuine mistake, it falls short of the maxim that you should never believe anything you read until it's checked out.

But it gets worse – the programme's producer went on record by saying he had named the character, the aforesaid Didier Baptiste, after no less than two players. Firstly the Didier comes from Chelsea midfield player, French international Deschamps. Secondly the Baptiste was in memory of the "great international who played in the same French team as Michel Platini".

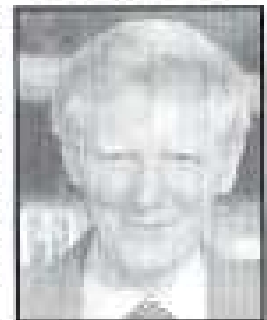
My memory being as suspect as anyone else's these days, I thought I had better check on the name myself as it did not register at all. Scanning through the Platini years I came across many with the letter 'b', notably Maxime Bossis,

Bruno Barönchelli, Dominique Bathenay, Marc Berdoll, Francois Bracci, Daniel Bravo and Bruno Bellone to name but a few. Then there was Patrick Battiston, but no Baptiste. More to the point, in the entire history of French international football there has never been a full international with that surname. It must have been Battiston.

So, Liverpool were not only on the point of signing a fictitious character, it was one who did not exist even in the figment of someone's imagination. Embarrassingly, Liverpool's Chief Executive Peter Robinson and Manager Gerard Houllier had to issue statements to the effect that they had never said they were interested in Baptiste.

One also suspects that the internet has something to answer for in this respect and it may not be the end of similar stories. Where will it end? Next thing the F.A. will allow a club already knocked out of the F.A. Cup to be reinstated – there's a joke.

But remember Darlington are not the first club to lose a match in the competition and appear in the next round. For a variety of reasons others have had defeat turned to victory. However, the quiz question of all time concerns Charlton, who reached the final in 1946 having lost one leg of a tie with Fulham, the season the tournament was based on home and away scores.

The Shots

LAST SEASON saw Aldershot Town perform in the Ryman Premier Division for the first time in the club's short seven-year existence. Indeed it was a bizarre season for the Hampshire club, who endured 65 matches in a marathon campaign.

In their league campaign the Shots finished in a creditable seventh position, losing only one of their last 10 matches. Goalscoring was also no problem and Gary Abbott netted 48 goals in his first season at the club and he was the top scorer in the whole of the Ryman League. At the Recreation Ground 89 goals were recorded in the 21 home league matches staged, the highest total in senior football within the United Kingdom.

It was in cup football that the club won silverware though – in a superb finale to the season the club won the Ryman League Cup and Hampshire Senior Cup within two days in the first week of May. In the Ryman League Cup Final Boreham Wood were beaten 2-1 with Gary Abbott netting an extra time winner to ensure that the Shots went one stage further than their 1995/96 final defeat versus Kingstonian. It was the Hampshire Senior Cup Final victory that sent the pukes racing though – playing with 10 players for over an hour of the match Aldershot clinched the County Cup for the first time in their history when Abbott netted an injury time winner to confirm a 1-0 victory against a Basingstoke Town side that had won their previous four matches against their local rivals. The match at Southampton F.C.'s The Dell was played in front of over 3,500 spectators, the vast majority travelling from Aldershot producing an electric atmosphere in what many supporters state was the best night they have experienced as an Aldershot supporter including the Football League era.

It has been a fairytale seven years for Aldershot Town. In March 1992 the town was without a football club after Aldershot F.C. became the first Football League team since Accrington Stanley in 1962 to fold during the season. An emotion-charged encounter at Cardiff City's Ninian Park on March 20th 1992 is now in history as the Shots' last competitive fixture and over 6,000 people were there to witness it.

There were, however, some excellent times in the Football League for the Hampshire club. As recently as 1987 Aldershot won promotion via the first ever Fourth Division Play-Off Final, beating Wolves 3-0 on aggregate – the second leg was played in front of 20,000 spectators at Molineux.

In the season before the closure of Aldershot F.C. the Shots held West Ham to a draw at Upton Park in an F.A. Cup third round replay. Also if the play-offs had been introduced earlier then Aldershot would have featured in them on five occasions in a 10-year spell prior to the introduction of them.

However it has been the re-emergence of football

in the town that has built an outstanding loyalty from the supporters who have been so influential in the club's progress. Starting in the Diadora Isthmian League in 1992 Aldershot Town were born. Despite the fact that the level was five divisions lower than the Football League the attendance for the first ever competitive fixture was higher than the last ever professional match played at the Rec. Ten successive victories were recorded and in front of an average attendance of over 2,000 Aldershot won the championship by 18 points.

A further promotion and an F.A. Vase quarter-final placing was achieved in the 1993/94 season and when manager Steve Wignall departed to take charge of Colchester United midway through the 1994/95 season he left the club content that he had built a firm foundation. Former Nottingham Forest winger Steve Wigley took over but was unfortunate that despite steering the club to six successive victories at the end of the season only goal difference prevented a third successive promotion.

After narrowly missing out during the next two seasons Wigley left to become Youth Development Officer at Nottingham Forest in July 1997 and after many hours of intense work Aldershot officials finally managed to secure the services of their number one choice to replace him.

George Borg arrived at the Recreation Ground in September 1997 with an excellent record. After ensuring he had the correct management team in Assistant Stuart Cash and Physiotherapist Phil Shedden, both arriving from his previous club Enfield, work was undertaken to secure the First Division championship by 11 points from Bilerjgay Town. Attendances continued to rise during this period and the final fixture at home to Berkhamsted Town attracted 4,289 people to the Rec.

Last season also saw the highest-ever attendance for an Aldershot Town fixture when 6,870 attended a rain-drenched Rec for the F.A. Cup fourth qualifying round visit of Woking. This surpassed the 5,951 that attended the 1993 Hampshire Senior Cup clash with local rivals Farnborough Town. The club were the best supported team outside the Nationwide Conference. It was also a prosperous time for the youth team last season – led by former player Andy Nunn and Dave Barnett, a runners-up spot in the Southern League was achieved together with another cup double – the Hampshire Floodlit Youth and Southern League Cup. Also for the 1999/2000 season the reserve team have been reformed and they compete in the Capital League. Club officials have worked hard to ensure that the progress of the club has continued and as we look forward to entering a new century supporters are optimistic that Aldershot Town F.C. is heading in the right direction.

GARETH HOWELLS – Goalkeeper

In his second season with the club after being signed from St Albans, where he made over 200 appearances in four seasons. A junior at Tottenham, where his brother David became a first team regular, he played a handful of youth games for Sutton in 1986 before making over 100 appearances for Torquay.

DANNY BROOKER – Defence

Attacking right back signed from Kingstonian in summer 1997, he missed only two games in his first two seasons with the club and his consistency won him the Player of the Year awards from both the Football Club and Supporters Club in 1997/98.

RICHARD SKELLY – Defence/Midfield

Left-sided player who has impressed in both defence and midfield after being signed from Basingstoke at the start of last season. He has Football League experience with Cambridge United and Northampton, and has also played for King's Lynn.

GWYNNE BERRY – Defence

Centre back in his third spell with the club and made his 300th appearance early this season. Spent a year and a half with Woking where he won an F.A. Trophy medal in 1994. Has represented the Ryman League and his outstanding form last season saw him voted the club Player of the Year.

ANDY RILEY – Defence

In his third spell with Sutton, Andy has also played for Carshalton (where he made over 400 appearances), Kingstonian, Crawley and Dulwich Hamlet. Originally signed in September 1996, he finished his first season at Sutton with the Player of the Year award. Captained the side to the Ryman Premier title last season and has represented the Ryman League.



PAUL HARFORD – Utility

Versatile player who was signed last October after a brief spell with Welling, although previously a regular in Farnborough Town's Conference line-up and won their Player of the Year award two seasons ago. Can play in defence, midfield or up front, although

most of his appearances have been in central midfield.

DAVID HARLOW – Midfield

Influential member of the squad after being signed early last season from Farnborough Town, with whom he represented England at semi-professional level. Began his career with Fulham before making over

300 appearances for Kingstonian. Represented the Ryman League last season.

PAUL SEARS – Midfield

Signed earlier this season from local Ryman rivals Carshalton. Previously with Crystal Palace.

SAMMY WINSTON – Striker

Signed during the summer from Chesham for a four-figure fee after an impressive loan spell at the end of last season. Previously played in the Conference for Yeovil after making 11 Football League appearances for Leyton Orient.

MARK WATSON – Striker

Originally signed from local football in 1993, making sufficient impact to earn a transfer to West Ham two years later. After loan spells at Shrewsbury and Leyton Orient, he spent a season with Boumemouth before joining Welling and then Sutton in March 1998. Finished last season as leading scorer with 32 goals despite missing two months through injury. Made his 100th appearance near the end of the season.



JIMMY DACK – Midfield

Began his third spell with the club when he rejoined from Aldershot Town last season. First signed as an 18-year-old in 1990, he made around 150 appearances in three years, including a number in the Conference, before spells with Crawley and Carshalton. Rejoined Sutton in 1995, making his 200th appearance and representing the Ryman League before joining Aldershot at the start of last season.

NKO EKOKU – Forward

Signed at the start of last season after three seasons with Harrow Borough. Previously with Hampton and Malden Vale, he is the brother of Nigerian international Efan Ekoku, who began his career with Sutton in 1989.

KEITH ROWLANDS – Striker

Signed in February from Farnborough Town, for whom he scored some important goals to preserve their Conference status two seasons ago. Previously with Hanwell Town.

JOE BAKER – Winger

Signed in early November after being released by Leyton Orient, for whom he made nearly 100 appearances. Previously with Charlton Athletic.

Welcome to the Rec



The U's

March 5th 1998 saw Sutton United celebrate its 100th birthday. With the amalgamation of Sutton Association and Sutton Guild Rovers, the club quickly established itself as the leading local outfit and in the years before the First World War the club played at a variety of local grounds, including one season at the Sutton Adult School Ground.

In 1910 the decision was made to seek senior status as members of the Southern Suburban League and after the war the club returned to the Adult School premises, whose name was changed to the Borough Sports Ground when ownership switched to the local council – that ground in Gander Green Lane has been home to the club ever since.

Sutton United was elected into the Athenian League in 1921 and captured its first Athenian League championship in 1928. During the thirties the club established itself as a rapidly developing force in the amateur game and enjoyed several good runs in the Amateur Cup. The semi-finals were reached in 1929 and 1937 but on the first occasion the club was expelled from the competition because two players were found 'guilty' of also playing Sunday football.

During World War Two United captured a young centre forward called Charlie Vaughan, whose prolific goalscoring helped the team to a succession of wartime honours. When the Athenian League re-commenced in the 1945/46 season, Vaughan's haul of 42 goals helped the side to another title success. The Surrey Senior Cup was also captured for the first time.

Vaughan soon turned professional with Charlton Athletic and although the 1950's brought few major playing honours, they were times of great change for Sutton, who were widely acknowledged as one of the most imaginative and forward-thinking clubs in the country. Assets were transferred to Sutton United Ltd in 1953, with current President Andrew Letts as Chairman of the club and the limited company, and a large new stand was constructed. Top young coaches were brought in to improve the side,

including Jimmy Hill and Malcolm Allison, but it was not until George Smith was appointed Manager that the groundwork began to bear fruit. The Athenian League title was won for a third time in 1958 and that year the London Senior Cup was captured for the first time.

George Smith left to take over at Crystal Palace and after Peter Milloy held the post for two seasons, United recruited Sid Cann from Wycombe to take charge of the team. His reign became known as the club's 'Golden Era', commencing with a visit to Wembley for the 1963 Amateur Cup Final, which Wimbledon won 4-2.

That summer the U's were elected into the Isthmian League and in 1967 they captured the title. Another trip to Wembley followed in 1969, ending in defeat again at the hands of North Shields, and in 1970 the club enjoyed nationwide fame with an FA Cup 4th Round clash at home to the mighty Leeds United, who won 6-0. Cann's charges finished as runners-up in the league twice and won the county cup three times.

In 1974 Cann was replaced by his former captain, England international Ted Powell, but United went through a series of managers in quick succession, including Dario Gradi, before Keith Brunt straddled the ship. His major achievement was to guide the team to win the Anglo-Italian Cup in 1979, before taking over at Maidon and being succeeded at The Lane by Barrie Williams.

The U's reached the FA Trophy Final in 1981, losing 1-0 to Bishop's Cleeve, and finished as league runners-up in 1982. In 1983 a treble of the Surrey Senior, London Senior and Hitachi Cups was completed, with two retained the following year, and in 1985 the Isthmian League title was captured again.

Because of problems connected with the ground lease, promotion to the Gola League was not sought, but the title was retained in 1986 and the U's joined the Vauxhall Conference. Five years in that competition were notable for FA Cup successes, including a draw with Middlesbrough and wins over Aldershot and Peterborough and, most famously of all, a 2-1 win against

Coventry City. The club captured the county cup a record six times in succession.

Despite winning the Bob Lord Trophy in 1991 and racking up a Conference record away win, 9-0 at Gateshead, the side was relegated at the end of the season. Hopes of a quick return to the top flight were not realised but Sutton could boast a growing list of players who were transferred into the Football League. That list was spearheaded by Efan Ekoku, but also included Paul Rogers, Andy Scott and Robert Scott, who all joined Sheffield United, Stuart Massey and Andy Barnes (both Crystal Palace), Ollie Morah (Cambridge United) and Mark Watson (West Ham United). A little earlier, record goalscorer Paul McKinnon had been sold to Blackburn Rovers.

More F.A. Cup glory was tasted in 1993 when both Colchester and Torquay were beaten on their own turf before a 3-2 defeat at Notts County in the third round. In 1996 a new managerial team took over, brother John and Tony Rains, second and third in the club's all time list of leading appearances.

They guided the team to third place in their first season and after leading the league table for many weeks, the U's just failed to celebrate their centenary by securing promotion into the Conference and eventually finished in third place behind Kingstorian – the league cup was won though, with centre forward Joff Vansittart scoring five times when Oxford City were beaten 6-1 in the final. He has since been sold to Dover Athletic and the goalscoring burden has fallen onto the skilful Frenchman, Nissim Akrou, Mark Watson (who re-joined the club towards the end of last season after a spell with Welling United) and summer signing Barry Blackman. Another to re-sign in the summer was Andy Riley, Player of the Year in 1997, and goalkeeper Gareth Howells was brought in from St Albans City.

The completion in 1997 of a new covered terrace behind the goal at the Gander Green Lane end has named the ground an 'A' grade and with the pitch benefiting from some intensive renovation last year, the old stadium now looks better than ever.

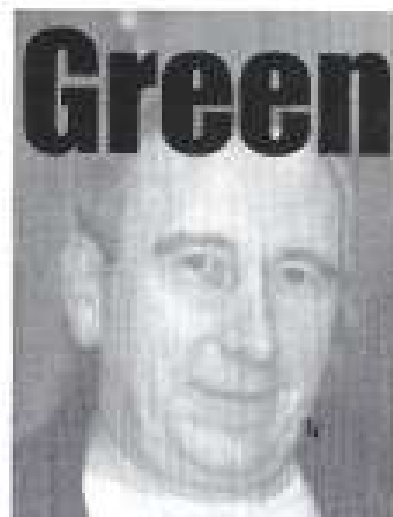

history of
Aldershot F.C.**

There is little doubt that the 1980/81 season was one of the craziest in which Aldershot were involved – we managed only 43 goals in 46 league games, failed to score at all in 21 of them, yet succeeded in finishing as high as sixth in the Fourth Division. Had the play-offs operated then, we would have made the same position we achieved before beating Wolves and Bolton at that stage six years later.

On 6th December our visitors were Halifax Town. Aldershot had been unable to find the back of the net – or anything approaching it over the goal line in the previous five league and cup matches. We had been knocked out of the F.A. Cup by the only goal of the game at Oxford United.

Mark Sanford was brought back into the first team for this one in the hope of injecting some finish into the front line and he took his place in the following team: Glen Johnson, Nigel Edwards, Alan Wooler, Les Briley, Tommy Youlden, Joe Jopling, Dave Tomlin, Mark Sanford, Colin Garwood, Malcolm Crosby, Stuart Robinson.

Many supporters felt at this time that Wooler was less effective at full back than he had been when first introduced as a sweeper after being signed from West Ham United in April 1976. Alas his arrival at that time was after the transfer deadline and he was unable to participate in any of the relegation battles which eventually led to Aldershot going down. With him playing we might have escaped the drop.

In 1976 we had a number of players whose surnames began with the letter 'w' – Richard Walden, Len Walker, Jim Wallace, Bob Wallace, Ronnie Walton and

Neil Warnock to be exact – so a Wooler seemed to be at home. Pity we could not use him.

Garwood had been our top scorer the previous 1979/80 season with 10 goals and had left Portsmouth where he had also been their leading marksman. As a result of adding these two sums together, he was awarded the Golden Boot in Division Four.

One less familiar name was Stuart Robinson – signed from Newcastle United he was to make 35 league and cup appearances, score six goals and then move on to play for Seaham Red Star in his native north-east. However, the Halifax game gave us two welcome points – the three points for a win did not come into the reckoning until the following season – and must have been as a consequence of looking at Aldershot's record which included 11 goalless draws . . .

In fact it was by courtesy of goals from Robinson and Sanford that enabled us to beat Halifax 2-1. Two weeks later in our next league game we crashed 4-1 at York, only to bounce back on Boxing Day with a 4-0 victory over Hereford United with Sanford grabbing all four goals. Alas in the next eight league games we were only able to score in two of them.

Four wins on the trot from mid-February helped to haul us back into a respectable position – but we even finished the season losing 1-0 at Halifax!

One only has to take a look at the current financial problems at Woking to see how important it is to generate additional forms of income so that, when the cup runs don't happen and the league gates drop, the club is still viable.

Whilst on the subject of fund-raising could I also remind everyone that many of our new and important players are still without kit sponsors. If you can't afford something individually why not consider perhaps getting together with others and 'all chipping in'. This is precisely what Jason Gibo and Kevin Selmes recently did in sponsoring Grant Payne's shirt. Many thanks guys and to all the other sponsors, your contribution is very much appreciated.

Finally, the Football Club Christmas Shop will be operating in the Wellington Centre again this year (on the ground floor) and opens this coming Saturday and will stay open until Christmas. Enjoy the game. *Mike Guess*
