WE WILL NOT BE BEATEN ON PRICE ...

ISTHMIAN CHARITY SHIELD

THE Isthmian Charity Shield makes a welcome return after a six-year absence and, judging by past records, today's winners may well be going places!

The match was staged every year from 1978 to 2004 and, of the 27 previous winners, only two will be playing Ryman League football this season. It might have been just one: Sutton United, who won in 1984, and Kingstonian (1998) both qualified for the Premier Division play-offs at the end of last season but neither gained promotion.

You might not think of this competition as a stepping stone to the Football League. Well, think again. The Shield has been lifted 11 times by clubs who are now playing at that level.

Wycombe Wanderers landed the prize four times between 1981 and 1987 while Yeovil did so in 1986 and 1988. Aldershot Town captured the Shield in 1999 and 2003. In between those two triumphs, Dagenham & Redbridge won the 2000 competition and can also claim a share in successes by their predecessors Leytonstone-Ilford, who were victorious in 1982 and as Redbridge Forest in 1989, having changed their name that summer.

Dartford, of course, are the latest club to have moved onwards and upwards as our league champions and, as a new Conference South side, they will obviously take the field as favourites tonight, given the two-step gap between the teams. History, too, is on their side, with 17 of the previous winners having qualified for the Shield match as league champions.

The cup holders have been successful 11 times. Yes, that does make 28 rather than 27, and that's because three of the Shield winners (Enfield in 1980, Leytonstonellford in 1982 and Yeovil in 1988) had done the double in the previous season. You will no doubt now notice that 28-3=25. The other two successes were by clubs that had won neither the league nor cup. When Slough did the double in 1981 their opponents in the Charity Shield were Wycombe, who had finished third in the league but landed the trophy with a 4-1 away victory. Then, in 1986, double-winners Sutton came an even worse cropper, going down 5-1 at home to league runners-up Yeovil.

It has normally been the league runners-up who have taken part in the Charity Shield when the league and cup double has been achieved. Wycombe's appearance as the thirdplaced team in 1981 was presumably because runners-up Enfield had been promoted to the Alliance Premier League (now the Conference), although it's pleasing to note that all the other promoted teams, up to the suspension of the competition, bade farewell to the league by contesting the Charity Shield, a tradition which Dartford are reviving today.

You'd have thought perhaps that, if the league runners-up were unable or

unwilling to take part, the cup runners-up would have been next in line. But, for whatever reason, it was Wycombe rather than beaten cup finalists Walthamstow Avenue who contested that 1981 match. A year earlier, however, it was the cup runners-up, Sutton, who took on double-winning Enfield and not the league runners-up who were . . . Walthamstow Avenue!

Other past Charity Shield winners are scattered widely across the pyramid. The first three matches were won by Enfield, twice, and Barking, both of whom now ply their trade in the Step 5 Essex Senior League, the former as Enfield 1893.

Surprisingly, maybe, only three of the successful clubs now play in the Conference; Hayes, as Hayes & Yeading, in the Premier (Yeading themselves were beaten in the 2003 Shield), Woking and newly-promoted Farnborough in the southern section.

Three more previous winners, Chesham, Slough and Northwood, all find themselves in the Zamaretto League after the various boundary adjustments of recent years.

As well as the Essex Senior League pair, Aylesbury United and Chertsey Town have also dropped to Step 5 level. Chertsey's fading fortunes epitomise the uncertainty of football; their Shield victory in 1994 came with five unanswered goals at Stevenage Borough, the 2010 Football League debutants.

> Sutton have been the unluckiest Charity Shield team, having been beaten in seven of their eight appearances. They were on the receiving end of the record defeat, 6-1 at home to Kingstonian in 1998.

Goals should be on the menu today; only six previous Shield matches have produced fewer than three goals and the outcome has never had to be decided on penalties.

A dependable right back who has made the transition from the reserves to the first team squad this season.

Matt Francis

Left sided midfielder signed from Chertsey in September 2009. Matt loves to get forward and scored four goals against Whitstable in February 2010.

Rob Hill

Experienced left sided player signed from Merstham in



summer of 2009. Made his Leatherhead debut in November 2009.

Jack MacLeod

Very fast down the wing. Jack is a recent signing from Guildford City. Previous experience with Carshalton Athletic.

Luke Pigden

Signed in February 2010 from Godalming Town. A left sided midfielder who likes to go forward.

A commanding presence in midfield. Joined in summer of 2009 after three years at Merstham. His previous clubs include Croydon Athletic, Dulwich Hamlet, Corinthian-Casuals and Thamesmead Town.

Following an unsuccessful spell at the club he left and went on to play for a number of non-league teams including Canvey Island, Stevenage Borough and Woking. In May 2007 he left Woking for Maldon Town before joining his former club ChelmsfordCity from whom he joined the Darts.

Second season with the Darts, after joining from Braintree. Lee can play in a variety of positions and is a valuable addition to the Darts squad. Commenced his career with East Thurrock in the youth setup before moving up to the first team squad and then a move to Braintree where he stayed for two seasons.

Ryan joined the club towards the end of the 2004/5 season from Kent League side Slade Green and quickly established himself as a crowd favourite with his skilful wing play. .

There he won an FA Youth Cup winners medal as a sub in 2005. Ipswich released him in the summer of 2005. He was transferred to Charlton Athletic on a free transfer and then he went on trial at Crystal Palace, playing several games for their reserve side. He impressed, and was kept on for the pre-season scoring in a first-team pre-season friendly at Stevenage Borough. He also impressed against American champions, the Los Angeles Galaxy, which led to him being given a professional contract, on a

month-by-month contractual deal. He then impressed even further, and was given a full contract, lasting two years .as released at the end of the January 2008 transfer window without making a single first team appearance. He then signed for Bishops Stortford on 15 May 2009, from Welling United at the end of the 2008-9 season. Leading goal scorer for Welling in the 2008-09 season, scoring 26 goals in all competitions. Had a short loan at Histon until the end of the 2009-10 season, before signing for Dartford.

Carl Rook

Signed in January 2010 from Tonbridge Angels where he was leading scorer. Joined Tonbridge from Horsham in December 2007 following the appointment of former manager Tommy Warrilow as manager of Tonbridge. Previous clubs are Dover Athletic Hastings United, Whitstable, Sittingbourne and Folkestone Invicta
