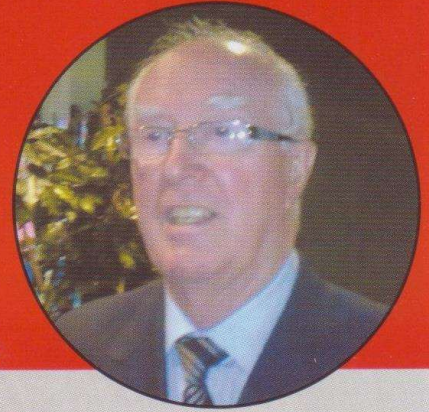



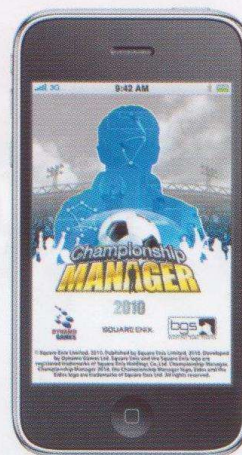

# ISTHMIAN CHARITY SHIELD

**THE Isthmian Charity Shield makes a welcome return after a six-year absence and, judging by past records, today's winners may well be going places!**

The match was staged every year from 1978 to 2004 and, of the 27 previous winners, only two will be playing Ryman League football this season. It might have been just one: Sutton United, who won in 1984, and Kingstonian (1998) both qualified for the Premier Division play-offs at the end of last season but neither gained promotion.

You might not think of this competition as a stepping stone to the Football League. Well, think again. The Shield has been lifted 11 times by clubs who are now playing at that level.

Wycombe Wanderers landed the prize four times between 1981 and 1987 while Yeovil did so in 1986 and 1988. Aldershot Town captured the Shield in 1999 and 2003. In between those two triumphs, Dagenham & Redbridge won the 2000 competition and can also claim a share in successes by their predecessors Leytonstone-Ilford, who were victorious in 1982 and as Redbridge Forest in 1989, having changed their name that summer.

Dartford, of course, are the latest club to have moved onwards and upwards as our league champions and, as a new Conference South side, they will obviously take the field as favourites tonight, given the two-step gap between the teams. History, too, is on their side, with 17 of the previous winners having qualified for the Shield match as league champions.

The cup holders have been successful 11 times. Yes, that does make 28 rather than 27, and that's because three of the Shield winners (Enfield in 1980, Leytonstone-Ilford in 1982 and Yeovil in 1988) had

done the double in the previous season. You will no doubt now notice that  $28-3=25$ . The other two successes were by clubs that had won neither the league nor cup. When Slough did the double in 1981 their opponents in the Charity Shield were Wycombe, who had finished third in the league but landed the trophy with a 4-1 away victory. Then, in 1986, double-winners Sutton came an even worse cropper, going down 5-1 at home to league runners-up Yeovil.

It has normally been the league runners-up who have taken part in the Charity Shield when the league and cup double has been achieved. Wycombe's appearance as the third-placed team in 1981 was presumably because runners-up Enfield had been promoted to the Alliance Premier League (now the Conference), although it's pleasing to note that all the other promoted teams, up to the suspension of the competition, bade farewell to the league by contesting the Charity Shield, a tradition which Dartford are reviving today.

You'd have thought perhaps that, if the league runners-up were unable or

unwilling to take part, the cup runners-up would have been next in line. But, for whatever reason, it was Wycombe rather than beaten cup finalists Walthamstow Avenue who contested that 1981 match. A year earlier, however, it was the cup runners-up, Sutton, who took on double-winning Enfield and not the league runners-up who were . . . Walthamstow Avenue!

Other past Charity Shield winners are scattered widely across the pyramid. The first three matches were won by Enfield, twice, and Barking, both of whom now ply their trade in the Step 5 Essex Senior League, the former as Enfield 1893.

Surprisingly, maybe, only three of the successful clubs now play in the Conference; Hayes, as Hayes & Yeading, in the Premier (Yeading themselves were beaten in the 2003 Shield), Woking and newly-promoted Farnborough in the southern section.

Three more previous winners, Chesham, Slough and Northwood, all find themselves in the Zambetta League after the various boundary adjustments of recent years.

As well as the Essex Senior League pair, Aylesbury United and Chertsey Town have also dropped to Step 5 level. Chertsey's fading fortunes epitomise the uncertainty of football; their Shield victory in 1994 came with five unanswered goals at Stevenage Borough, the 2010 Football League debutants.

Sutton have been the unluckiest Charity Shield team, having been beaten in seven of their eight appearances. They were on the receiving end of the record defeat, 6-1 at home to Kingstonian in 1998.

Goals should be on the menu today; only six previous Shield matches have produced fewer than three goals and the outcome has never had to be decided on penalties.

Experienced left sided player signed from Merstham in

Very fast down the wing. Jack is a recent signing from Guildford City. Previous experience with Carshalton Athletic.

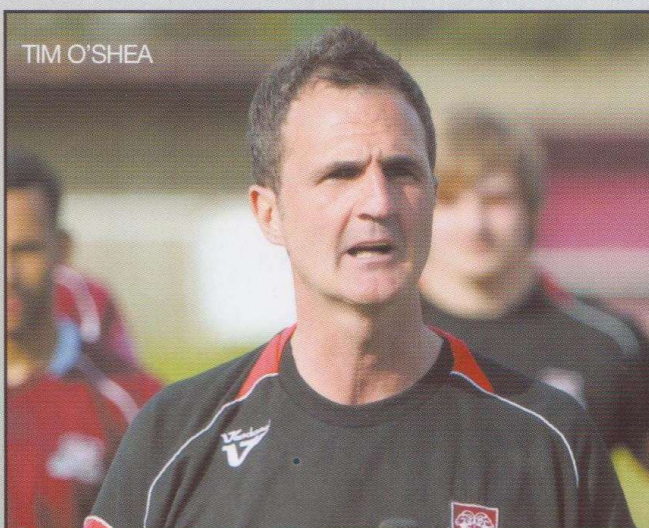

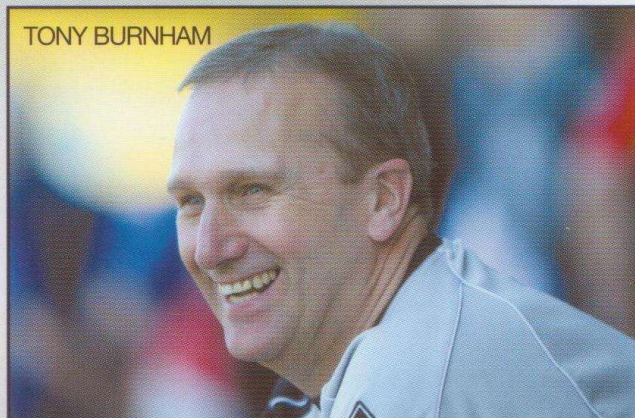

# DARTFORD FC

## GOALKEEPER

### Andrew Young

Third season with the Darts having joined in September 2008 following his release by Thurrock. Previously with Bishops Stortford who he joined in the summer of 2004 following impressive displays in pre-season. One of the stars of Bishops Stortford side of 2005 when they defeated Conference sides Dagenham, Gravesend & Northfleet and Canvey Island in their FA Trophy run. Previous clubs Hoddesdon Town and St Margaretsbury.

### Deren Ibrahim

Deren has progressed through from the Youth and Academy sides to be pressing for a first team spot this coming season. Had a year on loan to Ryman League Sittingbourne last season.

## DEFENDERS

### Billy Burgess

Started his career in the Welling United youth set up and later moved to Braintree for the past five seasons making over 130 appearances and was their captain in the 2008/9 season. Joined the Darts in the summer of 2009.

### Adam Gross

Now in his third season with the Darts. Adam started his career at Charlton Athletic before moving to Barnet where he made 47 League appearances. Transferred to Grays Athletic in May 2007 and had loan spells at Weymouth, Welling United and Dartford before a transfer to Dartford was made permanent. Has represented the Welsh Non-League under 23 team.

### Tom Champion

Signed in the summer of 2010 from Braintree where he had been since a move from Bishops Stortford in

January 2010. Former England under-18 midfielder commenced his career with the Watford Academy side who then signed for Barnet on a non-contract basis on the eve of the 2004/05 season to boost Barnet boss Paul Fairclough's first-team squad. Helped Barnet to win the Conference National before linking up with Bishops Stortford in July 2005.

### Paul Goodacre

Another new signing for this season, Paul joined the Darts from Braintree. Started his career at Burnham Ramblers and had trails with Southend United before joining Maldon Town before a move to Bishops Stortford in the summer of 2006. Appointed captain at Bishops Stortford in the summer of 2007 and was a pivotal part of the Stortford side that made the Blue Square play offs in 2007.

### Joseph Bruce

A third summer signing from Braintree. Joe started his career at Luton Town and following his release joined Molesey. Joined Hitchin in 2003 before a move to Grays Athletic in August 2003 where Joe stayed for three seasons before a move to Basingstoke in June 2006. Joe has also played, Bishop's Stortford, Welling and Cambridge City.

## MIDFIELD

### James White

James was a junior at Southend, Spurs and Arsenal before joining Great Wakering Rovers where he made his first team debut in January 2005 at the age of sixteen. An exiting prospect and good all round sportsman, James joined the Darts in the summer of 2008.

### Elliot Bradbrook

Elliot joined the Darts in the summer 2009 from Maidstone United. Rejoined the Stones in the summer of 2008 after a spell at University in the USA.

### Lee Noble

Lee commenced his career in the youth teams at Brentwood Town before joining the Darts in the summer of 2008. A talented midfielder and scorer of many vital goal

### Michael Shinn

Signed from Billericay Town shortly before deadline day in March 2010. Previously with Braintree.

### Ollie Berquez

Experience non-league midfielder who joined the Darts in the summer 2010 from Chelmsford City. Graduated through the youth academy at Ipswich Town but made no appearances for the first team and joined Chelmsford City in 1997 where he spent 4 years, winning promotion with them from the Southern League before joining Dagenham & Redbridge in 2001. Following an unsuccessful spell at the club he left and went on to play for a number of non-league teams including Canvey Island, Stevenage Borough and Woking. In May 2007 he left Woking for Maldon Town before joining his former club Chelmsford City from whom he joined the Darts.

## FORWARDS

### Lee Burns

Second season with the Darts, after joining from Braintree. Lee can play in a variety of positions and is a valuable addition to the Darts squad. Commenced his



career with East Thurrock in the youth setup before moving up to the first team squad and then a move to Braintree where he stayed for two seasons.

#### **Ryan Hayes**

Ryan joined the club towards the end of the 2004/5 season from Kent League side Slade Green and quickly established himself as a crowd favourite with his skilful wing play.

#### **Adam Burchell**

Young local lad who joined the Darts initially on work experience from Gillingham. Signed for the Darts in July 2009 following his release by Gillingham.

#### **Danny Harris**

Second season with the Darts having signed from Bishops Stortford where Danny had spent the previous two seasons. Danny is a fast and skilful forward. Previously with East Thurrock

#### **Charlie Sheringham**

New signing who joined the Darts in the summer 2010 from Bishops Stortford where he had been since joining from Welling United. Originally started out at Millwall as part of their academy set-up, before moving on to Tottenham Hotspur. After being released by Spurs, he was given a trial at Bournemouth and then another at Ipswich Town where he impressed and was given a one-year contract. There he won an FA Youth Cup winners medal as a sub in 2005. Ipswich released him in the summer of 2005. He was transferred to Charlton Athletic on a free transfer and then he went on trial at Crystal Palace, playing several games for their reserve side. He impressed, and was kept on for the pre-season scoring in a first-team pre-season friendly at Stevenage Borough. He also impressed against American champions, the Los Angeles Galaxy, which led to him being given a professional contract, on a

month-by-month contractual deal. He then impressed even further, and was given a full contract, lasting two years as released at the end of the January 2008 transfer window without making a single first team appearance. He then signed for Bishops Stortford on 15 May 2009, from Welling United at the end of the 2008-9 season. Leading goal scorer for Welling in the 2008-09 season, scoring 26 goals in all competitions. Had a short loan at Histon until the end of the 2009-10 season, before signing for Dartford.


#### **Carl Rook**

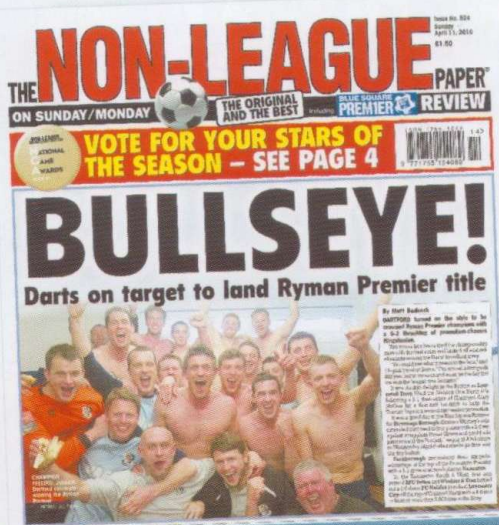
