The Editor's Notes

Good evening and welcome to all the players, officials and supporters of Wingate & Finchley for tonight's Isthmian Charity Shield match and a special warm welcome to all our guests from the Ryman League.

My lasting memory of the Isthmian Charity Shield, a match traditionally played between the League's Champions and League Cup Winners, is the tremendous pride I felt for Leatherhead FC when the team beat Dartford at Princes Park in July last year. They say that pride often



comes before a fall, but the win at Dartford was a springboard for what turned into a tremendous season for Leatherhead, culminating in the 4-3 play-off final win against Dulwich Hamlet in May.

I know very little about our visitors from North London, but the clubs do have a couple of things in common. Both clubs won their respective Division One play-off finals last season, and both had prestigious victories against Dulwich Hamlet along the way, with the Blues sweeping Hamlet aside 2-0 in the League Cup Final, played at Imber Court and to complete a remarkable treble, Wingate & Finchley also won the London Senior Cup last season, beating Hendon 3-1 in the Final.

Tonight's match is the first of five first team games for Leatherhead over the next fortnight at Fetcham Grove. On Saturday we welcome Lewes for our first Saturday match at the Grove since September. That's followed by matches against Concord Rangers, AFC Hornchurch and Margate. I know Richard Brady is keen to make home advantage count in the run up to Christmas, in the hope that the team gets a winning run together and can pull clear from the foot of the table.

At the time of writing these notes, we still don't have a date for our Surrey Senior Cup tie against Dorking. Nor do we know the draw for the last sixteen of the Alan Boon Cup. One match that *has* been rearranged is our League fixture against tonight's opponents. Leatherhead will now play Wingate & Finchley here at Fetcham Grove on Tuesday 13th December.

Enjoy tonight's match.

Welcome to Fetcham Grove

We extend a very warm welcome the players, officials and supporters of Wingate and Finchley to Fetcham Grove this evening for this prestigious match in which we compete for the Isthmian Charity Shield. Wingate and Finchley were also promoted to the Premier Division of the league last season via the play-offs and are lying in 10th place at present.

Their progress to date has no doubt been assisted by 11 league goals from Leon Smith who is the highest scorer in the Premier Division this season. Another contributory factor could be that the club made few changes to the squad that gained them promotion from Ryman North thereby ensuring that a good level of continuity was maintained and this had also been the pattern of the previous two seasons.

Due to the importance of this match we are delighted to welcome this evening the leading figures in the Ryman League – Alan Turvey, the President and Chairman, Nick Robinson, Company Secretary and Kellie Discipline, the League Secretary. While mentioning Nick Robinson I saw a report that he attended an FA Trophy game last month between Faversham and Walton Casuals at which one of the Assistant Referees was injured. The report went on to say that Nick Robinson took over from the unfortunate official for the remainder of the game. No doubt we can find some suitable foot ware for him should a similar event occur tonight!

We remember that the Football Association introduced the 'Respect' campaign in season 2008-09. On September 11th this year 'The Non-League Paper' took the matter further and launched its own Fair Play League in support of the FA's 'Respect' campaign but to cover Steps 1 to 4. Since then 'The Non League Paper' has published an abbreviated 'Fair Play League' table showing the top ten and the bottom ten clubs on a Saints and Sinners basis. The whole table is published on the newspaper's website. The latest table on Sunday showed the following clubs, who are well known to us, listed as 'Saints' – Burgess Hill Town, Harrow Borough, Dulwich Hamlet and Sutton United. In the 'Sinners' list I was surprised to see the name of Corinthian-Casuals given their perceived historic pedigree for sporting behaviour.

I was minded to write about this important subject having seen two pages in Carshalton Athletic's match day programme devoted to giving updates on the 'Respect' campaign when we were there supporting The Tanners on Saturday. It was heartening to see in that programme that the figures for this season to the end of October show that the three Ryman League Divisions have improved very significantly when compared with the same stage last year (and Ryman South had a very poor record last season). In other words there has been a significant downward trend in the number of offences that are the main cause for concern and figures show that the 'Respect' campaign has led to a decline in the number of the most serious offences.

The 'Fair Play League' is particularly concerned about highlighting and reducing those offences that can easily be avoided. These include dissent, abusive language and violent conduct and bad behaviour from the dug-out. Dissent is utterly pointless as referees do not change their minds and cards lead to unnecessary suspensions that are easily avoided if self control is exercised. I make no apology for highlighting this matter because in Carshalton's programme they have the table showing how well clubs in the Ryman League adhere to the 'Respect' programme and it is of concern to see that of the 66 Ryman league clubs we are down in 57th position with only Aveley and Cray Wanderers from the Premier League having a poorer disciplinary record than Leatherhead.

The good news is that our performance in this area has improved since the new management team arrived and long may it continue. (*Editor's Note - The table is reprinted on page 19 of tonight's programme*).

Let's get behind our team tonight and help them to be the winners of this Shield for the second time in succession. Enjoy the match.

Leatherhead advanced to the 4th Round of the League Cup with a less than convincing win against Bognor. Goals from Jack Macleod and Elliott Thompson either side of half time were enough to extinguish the visitors' hopes of reaching the last sixteen.

With Chico Ramos unavailable, Leatherhead manager Richard Brady gave a first team debut to Audie Matheson-Light in goal and rested Tom Hutchings and Mark Simmons, with Liam Pestle taking the captain's armband.

Matheson-Light faced his first serious test after 15 minutes, when a Steve Harper shot was deflected onto a post and behind for a corner. Harper had another attempt on target ten minutes later, but this time the keeper did well to hold on to the ball. Matheson-Light appeared tentative in the first half, relying on his defence to get him out of trouble instead of stamping his own authority in the penalty area.

Bognor had more of the telling possession in the opening half but without their enigmatic striker, Jason Prior, they were unable to create a decisive break. Better finishing would certainly have embarrassed Leatherhead in the opening half, as their defence were exposed time and again. Matheson-Light led a charmed life in the opening 45 minutes, with another shot hitting a post and rebounding back into his arms.

Tanners rode their luck and took a fortunate lead just before the interval, when a slip from Bognor captain Dan Beck allowed Macleod to burst through the Rocks defence to shoot from the edge of the box. Macleod showed no hesitation in firing past goalkeeper Craig Stoner to nab his first goal of the season for Leatherhead.

The second half had hardly started before Tanners doubled their lead. Thompson, so often the provider this season, was on the receiving end this time to finish with ease. Macleod broke clear down the right and found Thompson in the box to fire home from close range, producing a similar finish to when he scored against Sutton United in the FA Cup.

Rocks vainly attempted to get back into the match, but they faced a more confident Matheson-Light in the second half. Another stinging shot from Harper was well saved after 55 minutes, before a Stuart Axten header came back off the post and into the arms of the fortunate keeper. Thereafter Leatherhead took firm control as Bognor quickly ran out of ideas.

Thompson set up Macleod in a good shooting position on the hour mark, but he got his foot under the ball and skied his effort high over.

Stoner made a fine save from Terry before the Tanners striker was replaced by 18 year old Ryan Thomas, a recent signing from Whyteleafe. Thomas made an instant impression on the match, latching onto a through ball and forcing another good stop from Stoner.

Beck was booked for an untidy challenge on Leatherhead's Colin Richmond after 78 minutes ; but without a dead ball specialist in their ranks, it was left to Liam Pestle to have a pop at goal from 25 yards. Pestle's well struck effort cleared the wall but went a yard or so over the bar. There were few complaints, as Leatherhead saw out the final ten minutes to ease their way through to the next round.

Leatherhead picked up another point on their travels with a solid performance against Carshalton on Saturday. Tom Hutchings gave Tanners an early lead from the penalty spot before Dean Lodge hit back with an equaliser after 37 minutes.

Leatherhead started the match well, with a Jack Macleod shot and a Colin Richmond header testing Robins' keeper Nick Hamann. The match sparked into life after 17 minutes when Tanners were awarded a penalty after Richmond was felled by Justyn Roberts on the edge of the box.

The referee sought guidance from the touchline, with his assistant having a much clearer view of the incident, before awarding a penalty. None of the Carshalton players questioned the decision, although from a distance it looked as though Richmond was a yard or so outside the box when the contact was made. Hutchings firmly struck the spot kick low to the keeper's left to put the visitors ahead.

Leatherhead continued to press forward, keeping their hosts pegged back inside their own half for long periods in the first half. Just when it looked as though Tanners were taking control of the match, Carshalton hit back with an equaliser. Tom Davis broke clear of his marker in the centre circle and played the ball forward into the path of Lodge. Tanners' keeper, Chico Ramos, was in two minds on whether to come out of his area, to get to the ball before Lodge, or to hold his ground. A moment's hesitation saw him opt for the latter, although he may have regretted his decision seconds later as Lodge latched on to the ball and fired home from the edge of the box.

Ramos showed tremendous bravery early in the second half, coming off his line to make a save at the feet of Paul Vines. The Carshalton forward made a heavy contact with the Leatherhead keeper and play was held up for a couple of minutes while Ramos received treatment for a head injury before being able to continue.

The Leatherhead keeper had to be alert after 74 minutes, when Vines hit a speculative cross into the box from the right touch line. The ball curled over everyone's heads in the box before Ramos tipped it behind for a corner.

Leatherhead created a number of winning chances in the closing stages. Hutchings beat Hamaan with a shot from a tight angle, but the ball ran wide of goal, staying in play. Kev Terry reached it first and played it back into the path of Greg Andrews. But instead of taking his time to place the shot, Andrews blasted the ball high and wide of the goal.

Hutchings had another fine effort on target after 81 minutes, but this time Hamann produced a good save low to his left. Terry had a chance from a wide angle four minutes later, but placed his shot into the side netting.

Following the Ramos head injury, the referee added five minutes of stoppage time. During the first of these added minutes Leatherhead had their best chance to win the match. With Carshalton's defence spread out all over the box Terry won the ball on the edge of the area, with sufficient time to look up and think about where to place his shot. Terry hit the ball firmly towards the centre of the goal, but found Carshalton's Michael Kamara standing in his way to clear the ball off the line with a powerful header.

The point may have disappointed Tanners supporters but it was enough to lift Leatherhead off the foot of the table, as both Horsham and East Thurrock lost on their travels today.

Ryman Premier Weekend Round Up: 19th November 2011

11

THERE was little change at the top of the Ryman Premier on Saturday, with all the top four winning. **Lowestoft** thus stayed a point clear after their narrow 2-1 home victory against a **Cray** side who conceded two penalties and finished with nine men. Dale Cockrill put the Trawlerboys ahead from the spot in the 25th minute but Tommy Whitnell equalised shortly after half-time. That was followed by a flare-up which led to the dismissal of Allan McLeod. Another penalty in the 71st minute was again converted by Cockrill and any hopes Cray had of rescuing a point were dashed when another disagreement brought a red card for Sam Long.

Hot on Lowestoft's heels are Hornchurch and Billericay, who are now level on points and with identical goal records, though the Blues have a game in hand. Urchins take over second spot in the printed table thanks to their 'AFC' prefix, and thanks to a goal in the fourth minute of added time by **Hendon**'s Isaiah Rankin which restricted **Billericay** to a 2-1 margin. They struck early, with an 11th-minute Richard Halle penalty quickly followed by a goal for Emeka Onwubiko.

Hornchurch, meanwhile, beat **Hastings** 3-1 to chalk up their eighth away win in the league. The game turned their way in a minute midway through the first half, when Martin Tuohy scored and then crossed for Lewis Smith to head home. It was Tuohy's 11th league goal and made him the division's joint-top scorer. Jonathan Hunt, who recently celebrated his 40th birthday, chipped the third in the 71st minute and Zac Attwood fired in a free kick for a late consolation.

Met Police, easily the most successful so far of the four promoted clubs, stayed three points further back by strolling to a 3-0 home win over **Tooting**. They scored two quick goals at virtually the same time as Hornchurch, Duran Reynolds and Ty Smith the marksmen, and Chris Bourne wrapped it up with a solo effort 11 minutes after the break. The division's other 11-goal man, **Wingate**'s Leon Smith, failed to add to his total, and no-one else found the target either as they drew 0-0 at **Lewes**. The Sussex club will be disappointed with the outcome, though the point lifted them two places to fifth.

At the other end of the table, two Essex clubs won at home for the first time this season. Ray Freeman headed **Horsham** in front after 27 minutes at **Aveley**, playing their first league game under new boss Lee Hodges. His day improved considerably when Danny Francis equalised in the 72nd minute and Cedric Ngakam headed the winner two minutes later against a Horsham side now down to ten men after Nicky Humphrey's dismissal. **Concord** left it late to break their home duck. Tony Stokes headed the only goal of their game against **Harrow** with just a minute of normal time to go.

Another Essex club, **East Thu**rrock, are now at the foot of the table. A week after their rather unlucky 3-0 FA Cup defeat by League Two Macclesfield, they crashed 5-2 at **Bur**y. A remarkable first half produced all seven goals, making the rest of the afternoon something of an anti-climax. Lee Read and John Sands put Bury 2-0 up by the 12th minute and Sam Higgins replied two minutes later. There was a brief lull before Sam Nunn nodded Bury's third on 25 minutes and the rest of the goals followed at regular intervals before half-time. Kye Ruel headed the visitors' second, only for Billy Clark and Sands to put the points beyond their reach. Rocks hit the bottom because previous table-proppers **Leatherhead** took a point from a 1-1 draw at **Carshalton**, also overtaking Horsham as they moved up to 20th place. Tommy Hutchings put Tanners ahead with a 16th-minute penalty which was, surprisingly, his first league goal of the season. The same was true of Dean Lodge, who replied eight minutes before half-time. A goalline clearance denied Kev Terry a late Tanners winner.

Kwesi Appiah took his league tally into double figures and his overall total to 22 with a dramatic winner for **Margate** in added time. **Kingstonian** went down 2-1 despite scoring both the previous goals. Gary MacDonald found his own net from a corner to give Margate an early lead and Bobby Traynor levelled matters with a penalty right on half-time.

Wes Parker's 18th-minute header gave **Wealdstone** the lead at home to **Canvey** but they had Peter Dean sent off before the interval and the islanders hit back to win 2-1. Jay Curran equalised on 57 minutes and penalty ace Rob King finished the job with 15 minutes to go.

Wingate & Finchley Football Club History

Wingate and Finchley Football club can trace its roots back to the formation of Finchley Football Club in 1874 making it one of the oldest clubs in the country. Founded by Pa Jackson, who also was instrumental in the creation of the Corinthians, The London Football Association as well as later serving as secretary of the FA, Finchley became founder members of the Athenian League in 1912 after spells in the London League and North London League. They finished fourth in the maiden season, higher than such luminaries as Grays Athletic, Chelmsford City and Enfield.

However their stay was cut short due to the onset of World War One and they would only return for a lone season in 1929 before returning to the London League and forging success. The club's first piece of silverware was won during the 1934-1935 season when the League Cup was captured, with the taste of achievement forming Finchley went on to win the London League in 1936-1937 before World War Two scuppered their winning streak.

It was immediately after the conflict that saw Major Harry Sadow, Frank Davis, George Hyams and Asher Rebak form a Jewish Football Club believing the field of play was a ground of battling the ignorance of anti-Semitism. So in 1946 Wingate Football Club began life in the Middlesex Senior League. The club was named after General Orde C. Wingate who despite not being Jewish himself oversaw the creation of the Israeli Army during the Second World War. The club enjoyed early success and by 1952 they were promoted to the London League.

Meanwhile Finchley, back in the Athenian League, were in the middle of their glory years with the 1952-1953 season proving to be the pinnacle. That year saw their progression to the Third Round Proper of the FA Cup. Defeated along the way were Chelmsford City, Kidderminster Harriers (1-0 at Aggborough) and Crystal Palace (3-1 at Summers Lane) before the Finches were finally beaten 2-0 at Gay Meadow against Shrewsbury Town.

Despite an Amateur Cup semi-final appearance, losing to bitter local rivals Hendon at Highbury in 1965, a sense of decline was starting to emerge. A switch to the Isthmian Premier League failed to stop the halt, and in 1980-81 Finchley were relegated to the second division.

Wingate by now had become a senior club and were competing in the Athenian League. Many players had become members of the Middlesex FA representative side and also partook on behalf of Great Britain in the Maccabiah Games. Disaster struck though in 1972 when their Hall Lane ground in Hendon was lost to the M1 extension and despite a short ground share with Finchley FC the club reverted to junior football.

Wingate finally returned to the senior game with a brief merger with Leyton FC. This partnership proved to be unsuccessful and despite a 1984-1985 League Cup victory, ironically defeating Finchley in the final, both clubs went their separate ways. In 1991 with Finchley struggling in the Isthmian League Second Division and with mounting debts it was announced that a merger with Wingate would take place in the summer. After extensive refurbishment and a name change of the Summers Lane ground in honour of long time Wingate supporter Harry Abrahams, Wingate and Finchley took to the field for the start of the 1991-1992 season.

Wingate & Finchley Football Club History

Success was immediate and despite starting life in the South Midlands League the club were quickly competing in the Isthmian League and by season 2003-2004 were members of the newly formed Division One North.

In recent seasons the club has continued its growth. A brief flirtation with the Southern League was shortly followed by the arrivals of Manager Michael Stone and Chairman Aron Sharpe. Now back in the Isthmian League a youthful squad achieved seventh position in the First Division North in the 2008-2009.

Stone sadly left the club in 2009 after being offered the post of Assistant Manager at Conference giants Rushden and Diamonds. The club's first team manager in time for the start of the 2009/10 season was former Oswestry Town manager and Total Network Solutions Llansantffraid midfielder David Norman. At the end this season the Club finished in a record high position of 3rd in the Ryman Division One North, mainly thanks to a record run of 17 matches without defeat from the turn of the year, a run which included 13 wins. The Club reached the playoffs but lost out to Enfield Town in the semi-final 3-2 in an incredible match. This paved the way for what was to be a monumental and unforgettable 2010/11 season.

The Club was quickly becoming the most progressive non-league club in the area, thanks to Sharpe's focus on youth development. Bobby Aisien and Medi Alabimba had progressed from Hadley Wood & Wingate to earn professional contracts, and in 2011 over 20 of the U16-18 age group represented their County. Six boys at U16's were given scholarships with pro sides and the club developed into a community club with a Mencap disability initiative, work with schools, and it entered its fourth year of the Flex educational scheme.

A consistent league season for the First Team saw the side match their previous 3rd place league finish and earn a second crack at the playoffs. In the semi-final Harlow Town were beaten 4-2 after extra time, and promotion to the Ryman premier Division was won with a 118th minute winner over Brentwood Town in extra time of the final - The Blues winning 3-2 on their home turf.

This victory was the middle leg of a remarkable and unique Treble. Earlier that season the club had lifted the Ryman League Cup having beaten Dulwich Hamlet 2-0 at Imber Court, and London Senior Cup success was to follow shortly afterwards when Hendon were convincingly beaten 3-1 in the final.

Success flowed throughout the Club this year, with the youth teams also building on their previous season's work as they progressed superbly. The U18's won the Middlesex County Cup, and at U15 level the League Title and three Cup trophies followed (two County cups and the League cup). Even the Under 10's were getting in on the action as they lifted the Spring Cup!

The Club have staved off much interest from elsewhere and kept the entirety of their playing staff as the Ryman Premier Division beckons.

A much changed line-up took time to settle into a 4-2-3-1 formation that confused Epsom Eagles as well as some Leatherhead players. Leatherhead were on the front foot from the very start, forcing a series of well taken corners by Steve Fitzgerald who was involved in most of the sides attacks. Clive McFarlane headed just wide from a corner, before opening the scoring on 12 minutes from another corner, finishing well at the back post. A free kick was well saved from Man of the Match Fitzgerald before Eagles drew level, against the run of play on 26 minutes, when Leatherhead needlessly gave away a free kick that should have been saved, but Leyland was partially distracted by the sun. McFarlane hit the post from a well worked move, and Buchannon should have restored Leatherhead's lead just before half time, unmarked six yards out, and heading wide.

The home side reverted to 4-4-2 at half time and, as expected, their superior fitness stretched Eagles. On 50 minutes a scrambled defence was unable to avoid deflecting a Buchannon cross into their own goal, and five minutes later a fine through ball found Fitzgerald one on one with the keeper only to be bundled to the ground by a defender. Bennett scored from the penalty to make it 3-1. Strangely the referee chose not to dismiss the last defender, who was guilty of conceding the penalty. Matt Ellams made it 4-1 from another set up chance by Fitzgerald on 65 minutes, and ten minutes later it was 5-1 courtesy of a great run and cross from the touchline by McFarlane with Bennett on hand to finish coolly at the back post. Leif Borqusk made it 6-1 on 83 minutes finishing a move orchestrated by Bennett, and on the stroke of full time, a soft goal was conceded from a speculative cross by the visitors.
