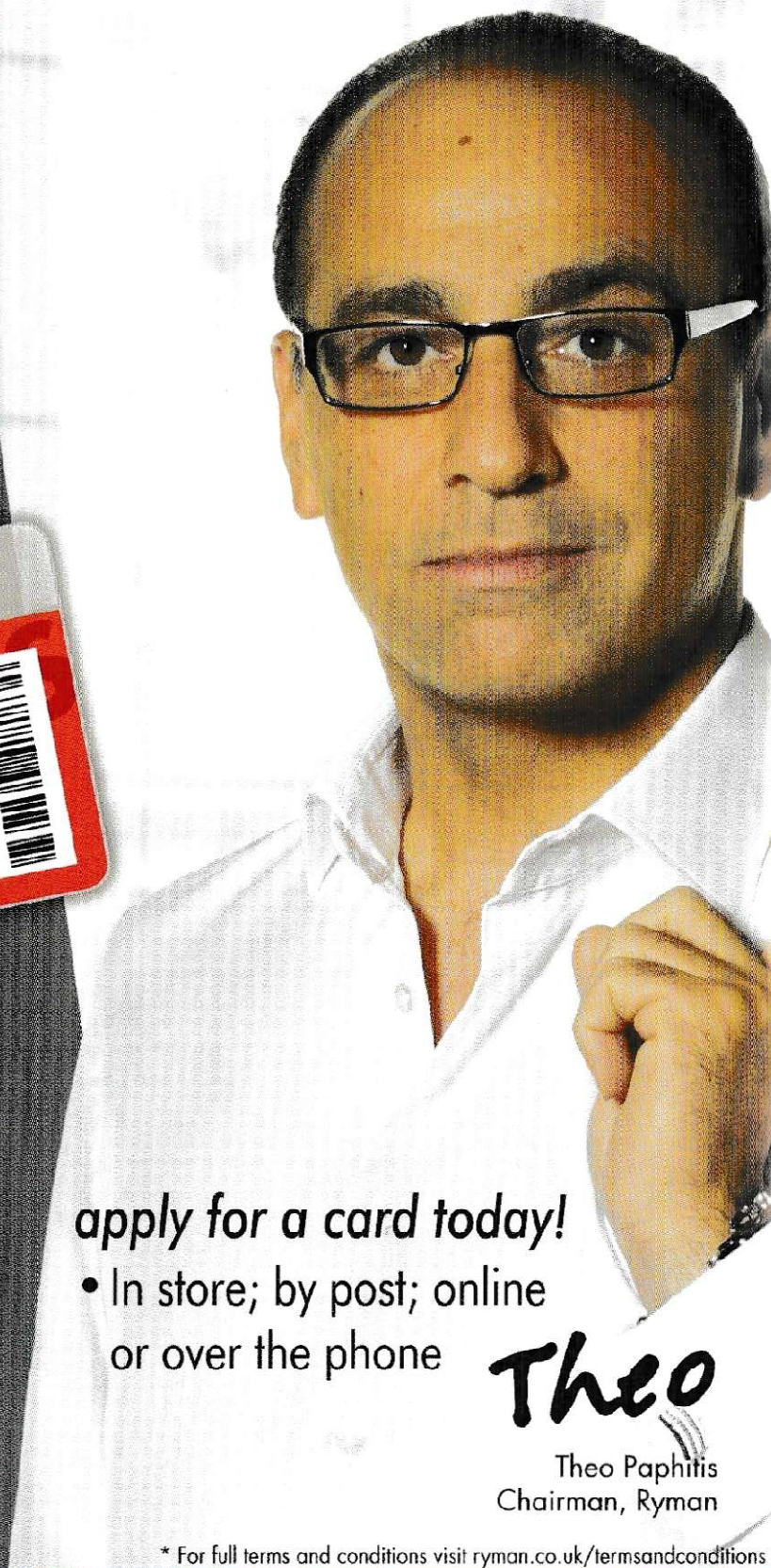

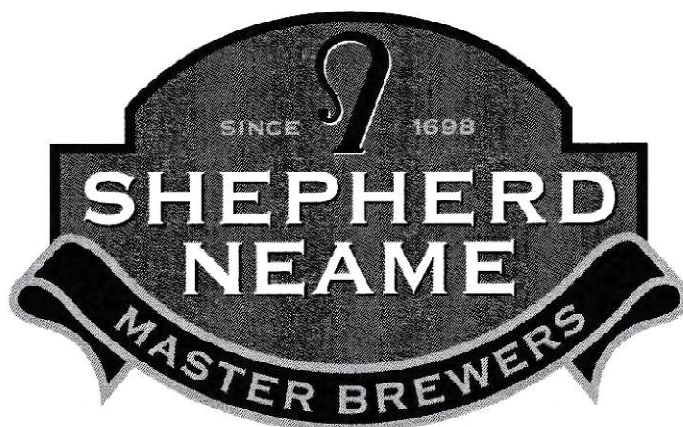
Thanks also to our advertisers who through their adverts have assisted with the printing of this programme so that all sales will be passed on to the British Heart Foundation.

# Editor's Notes

Hello everyone and welcome to Champion Hill for tonight's Isthmian Charity Shield match. Along with our opponents FAVERSHAM TOWN, we are delighted to have been chosen to participate in this annual fixture, which is a first for both clubs.

Most importantly, the BRITISH HEART FOUNDATION will benefit from the proceeds of tonight's match, but there is also the small matter of an impressive trophy at stake, so we look forward to ninety minutes of keenly-fought and entertaining football and may the best team win.

We extend our usual warm welcome to the Faversham officials, players and supporters and trust they will enjoy their short stay with us. The Lilywhites are currently ninth in the Ryman South table, with 13 points from eight games, and they had a good win at the weekend, defeating Cray Wanderers 3-0 away in the FA Cup on Sunday afternoon, thanks to goals from Luke Harvey, Dave Botterill and Darren Marsden.

We are also pleased to welcome officials from the Isthmian (Ryman) League this evening, along with tonight's four match officials. We trust they too will have a pleasant evening in our company.

Last Saturday, we won our FA Cup first qualifying round tie at home to SHOREHAM by six goals to nil. The Sussex County League side put up a gallant display, but it proved a very comfortable victory for our lads. Right from the start our fast-moving forwards posed problems for the Shoreham defence and Marcel Henry-Francis (twice) and Nyren Clunis went close with shots from around the edge of the penalty-area. It came as little surprise when we opened the scoring. In the 14<sup>th</sup> minute, Nyren Clunis cut inside from the left, evading several challenges along the way, before creating space and firing past 'keeper Josh Heyburn from 15 yards. Heyburn was certainly kept busy and minutes later he made fine saves from both Marcel Henry-Francis and Nyren Clunis. We also failed to convert an inviting Kevin James cross to the far post with the 'keeper beaten. However, we eventually went 2-0 ahead in the 23<sup>rd</sup> minute when, following a short corner on the left, Ellis Green squared the ball to Xavier Vidal who hit a screamer from 25 yards which flew past the unsighted Heyburn. We remained on top as the half progressed and two further goals arrived before the interval. In the 36<sup>th</sup> minute, Erhun Oztumer made it three from the penalty-spot, after Nyren Clunis had been tripped by defender Craig Stevens. Then, six minutes later, Erhun scored again, this time with a sublime free-kick into the top corner from fully 25 yards. Half-Time, 4-0.

We continued to dominate after the break. An inswinging corner from Kevin James was headed out from under his own crossbar by Shoreham defender Rob Allen, but it was a corner from the opposite flank, the right, which produced our fifth goal on 57 minutes when Erhun Oztumer's delivery to the near post was firmly headed home by Mathieu Boyer. Both sides made substitutions, but Heyburn remained the busiest man on the field, pulling off further fine saves from Xavier Vidal, Erhun Oztumer and Marcel Henry-Francis. It was one of our substitutes, Ian Daly, who rounded off the scoring in the 76<sup>th</sup> minute. Heyburn could only block a shot from Nyren Clunis, and Ian sidestepped the grounded 'keeper before slotting into an empty net. Three minutes later, Shoreham had a golden opportunity to snatch a consolation goal, but Elliot Quant headed over from point blank range when Phil Wilson was beaten by Josh Clack's cross to the far post. It was business as usual in the closing stages though, and Nassim Dukali should have scored when set up by Xavier Vidal.

The draw for the second qualifying round was made yesterday morning and we have been given a tough draw, away to MARGATE, currently one place above us in the Ryman Premier. That match will be played on Saturday week, 28<sup>th</sup> September, kick-off 3.00pm, which means our scheduled league visit to BURY TOWN will now have to be rearranged.

As mentioned in last Saturday's programme, our RESERVE TEAM fixture at Hayes & Yeading United, due to be played last night, was postponed and will be staged later in the season. The next match for our Capital League side is scheduled for Monday 30<sup>th</sup> September, at home to St. Albans City. Our Under 18 YOUTH TEAM were in action again on Sunday morning and made it two Kent Youth League wins out of two with a 3-2 victory away to Bromley. Kameiko Pope-Campbell scored two of our goals, the other was an own goal.

This coming Saturday, the First Team are back in league action with a home game against CANVEY ISLAND, kick-off 3.00pm. That is followed by another home league fixture next Tuesday, when MARGATE will be our visitors in a dress rehearsal for the FA Cup tie four days later!

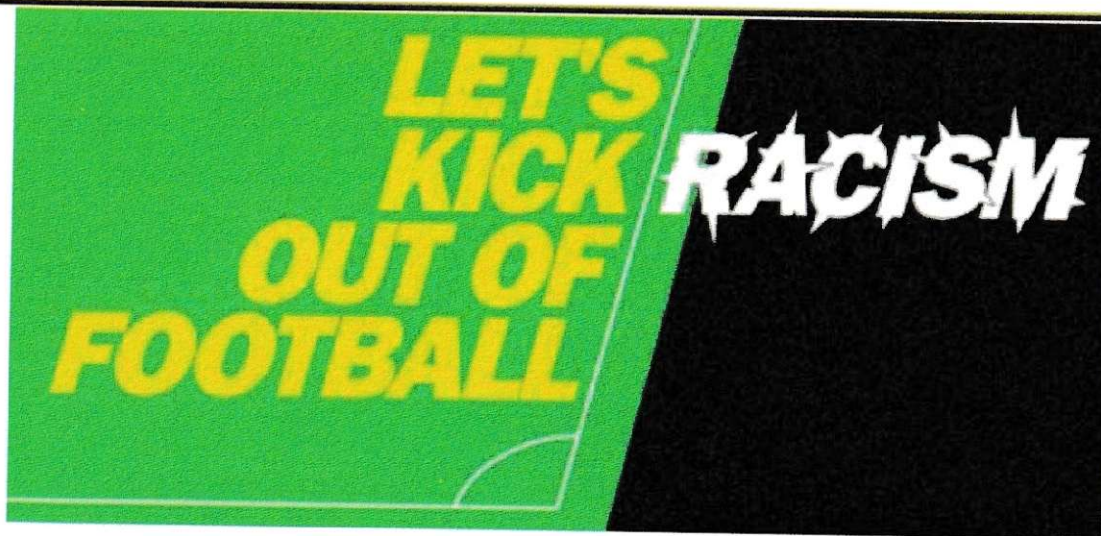

# Faversham Town F.C.

## A Brief History

The club's origins go back to 1884, but for many years the club name was not really consistent and they turned out as Faversham Town, Faversham Invicta, Faversham Services, Faversham Railway and Faversham Rangers along with others, before being disbanded before the Second World War.

Their first taste of competitive football came in 1894 when they became founder members of the Kent League, joining Division Two along with Cray Wanderers, Dover, Folkestone Harveians, Sevenoaks and Swanscombe, together with some reserve teams. In 1895/96 they were runners-up in Division Two to Sheppey United reserves.

Faversham Town reformed after World War Two and they re-joined the Kent League in 1947. They moved to their current home, Salters Lane, a year later. The club had a decent amateur side, but found the going tough against some of the professional Kent League clubs. Nevertheless, they won the Kent Amateur Cup in 1957 and 1959.

With the Kent League folding in 1959, the club had short spells in both the Aetolian and Greater London leagues. However, they returned to the Kent League when it reformed in 1968. Success soon followed. They were Kent League champions in 1969/70 and 1970/71 and in the second of those seasons also won the League Cup. The Kent Amateur Cup was then won three years in a row, 1972, 1973 and 1974.

After a brief flirtation with the Athenian League in the mid seventies, the club returned home to the Kent League, winning the Kent Senior Trophy in 1977, repeating this success the following season and being crowned Kent League champions for good measure to complete a notable 'double' in 1977/78.

The Kent League was won yet again in 1989/90 and the League Cup twelve months later. But league form dipped in season 1992/93 and was to stay that way for several seasons. The team did manage to reach the final of the League Cup in 2000, but things were in rapid decline. Matters reached crisis point in 2003, when the Kent County Football Association suspended the club for non-payment of fines, with the club's operators blaming just about everyone for the mess except themselves.

In the following months, the once proud Salters Lane was systematically wrecked by vandals. Meanwhile, the club trustees led by businessman Ray Leader, fought a desperate battle to heal a widening rift with the previous regime over the ownership of the club and ground.

In a separate development, the Faversham Town Independent Supporters' Club had been formed, and quickly gained a membership of over 300 paid up members in the town. This was despite the fact the club had no team, no manager, and whose ground had been totally wrecked by vandals and resembled a bomb site! Perhaps the real turning point came when trustees and independent Supporters committee members got together one evening and declared an alliance to get the club back on its feet. An interim club committee was formed, and the long road to recovery was started.

The revival was slow, but things began to happen. The ownership dispute was finally settled, and access to the ground was obtained. However, volunteer workers were confronted with completely smashed and vandalised buildings, and grass that reached shoulder height in places on what had been the pitch. A massive clear-up operation began, but it was back breaking work. Meanwhile, paper-work was put in order with a new club constitution written and agreed.

The KCFA allowed the club to retain their coveted senior status, subject to several conditions. Local authority grants were applied for and secured, sponsorship deals were obtained, and the club embarked on a range of fund-raising initiatives. Slowly but surely, Salters Lane emerged in its former glory, and then went even better with the erection of brand new floodlights. The revival of club and ground from the jaws of death was nothing short of a



miracle, with a story that would surely rival the efforts to revive both 'The Valley' at Charlton Athletic, and Accrington Stanley FC.

The first season back in 2005/06 was in the Kent County League, where the runners-up spot was achieved. Having passed various ground inspections, promotion to the Kent League was obtained, and Faversham Town had at last 'come home'. Season 2007/08 saw the arrival of Justin Luchford taking over the management with Jimmy Strouts with Town second bottom of the league. The pair then took Town to the bottom before gradually moving up to mid-table. Strouts soon left for personal reasons and Luchford, along with Clive Walker, took Town to the Kent Senior Trophy Final in season 2009/10, defeating Greenwich Borough 2-1 to lift the trophy. A week later, they were crowned Kent League Premier Division champions to gain promotion to the Ryman League.

Towards the end of the 2010/11 campaign, and with Town within touching distance of the Division One South play-offs, Luchford resigned. His place was taken by his assistant at the time, Ray Turner, who took charge for the last seven league games securing eighth spot and the position of the highest Kent team at this level.

Last season was the most successful in the Club's history with a third place finish in Ryman Division One South, before they lost to Maidstone United in the final of the play-offs. In addition, their Under 18s were runners-up in their division of the Ryman Youth League and achieved their best-ever run in the FA Youth Cup, reaching the second round proper.

This match attracted great interest at the time as the majority of the Nigerian team played in bare feet; indeed, only three of them wore football boots. The crowd, at our old Champion Hill ground, was an incredible 18,000.

**..... also on 17<sup>th</sup> September:-**

- 2001: After a six-day shutdown following the 11 September attacks, Wall Street trading resumed in New York.
- 1999: US president Bill Clinton lifted the trade, travel and banking restrictions that the USA had imposed on North Korea fifty years earlier.
- 1997: A hat-trick from Columbian striker Faustino Asprilla gave Newcastle United a memorable 3-2 win over Barcelona in a European Champions League tie at St. James Park.
- 1997: A treaty banning landmines was agreed by 90 countries, including Britain. The US, however, refused to sign.
- 1993: The right-wing British National Party won its first council seat in an east London by-election; the seat was lost one year later in a landslide victory for the Labour Party.
- 1987: A Russian hunter fired at a flying duck, but instead a fish fell out of the sky. The fish (a pike) apparently tried to catch the duck to eat, but as the terrified bird took off and gained height, the fish had to let go and was bagged by the hunter; an odd twist to the one that got away.
- 1986: Pat Phoenix, the English actress best known as Elsie Tanner in TV's *Coronation Street*, died of cancer.
- 1961: One of the biggest ever ban-the-bomb demonstrations took place in London. Among those arrested was the ecclesiastical chairman of CND, Canon Collins.
- 1944: World War Two – The British airborne invasion of Arnhem, Holland, known as 'Operation Market Garden', began. The objective was to secure a bridge over the Rhine to facilitate an Allied invasion of Germany, but after a battle which lasted ten days, the attempt failed.
- 1939: World War Two – The USSR invaded Poland.
- 1931: Long-playing records were demonstrated in New York by RCA-Victor, but the venture failed because of the high price of the players, and the first real microgroove records did not appear until 1948.
- 1929: Birth of Stirling Moss, the English motor racing driver who was the first non-Italian driver to win the Mille Miglia (in 1955). Despite winning many grand prix races, including the British and Monaco twice, he never won the world title.
- 1901: Birth of Sir Francis Chichester, the British yachtsman and aviation pioneer, who made a solo circumnavigation of the world in *Gypsy Moth IV* at the age of 65.
- 1871: The seven-mile Mont Cenis railway tunnel, linking France and Italy, was opened.
- 1862: At the American Civil War battle of Antietam, won by Union forces, over 23,000 men were killed, wounded or captured in a single day.

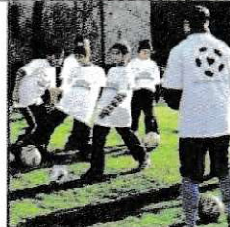

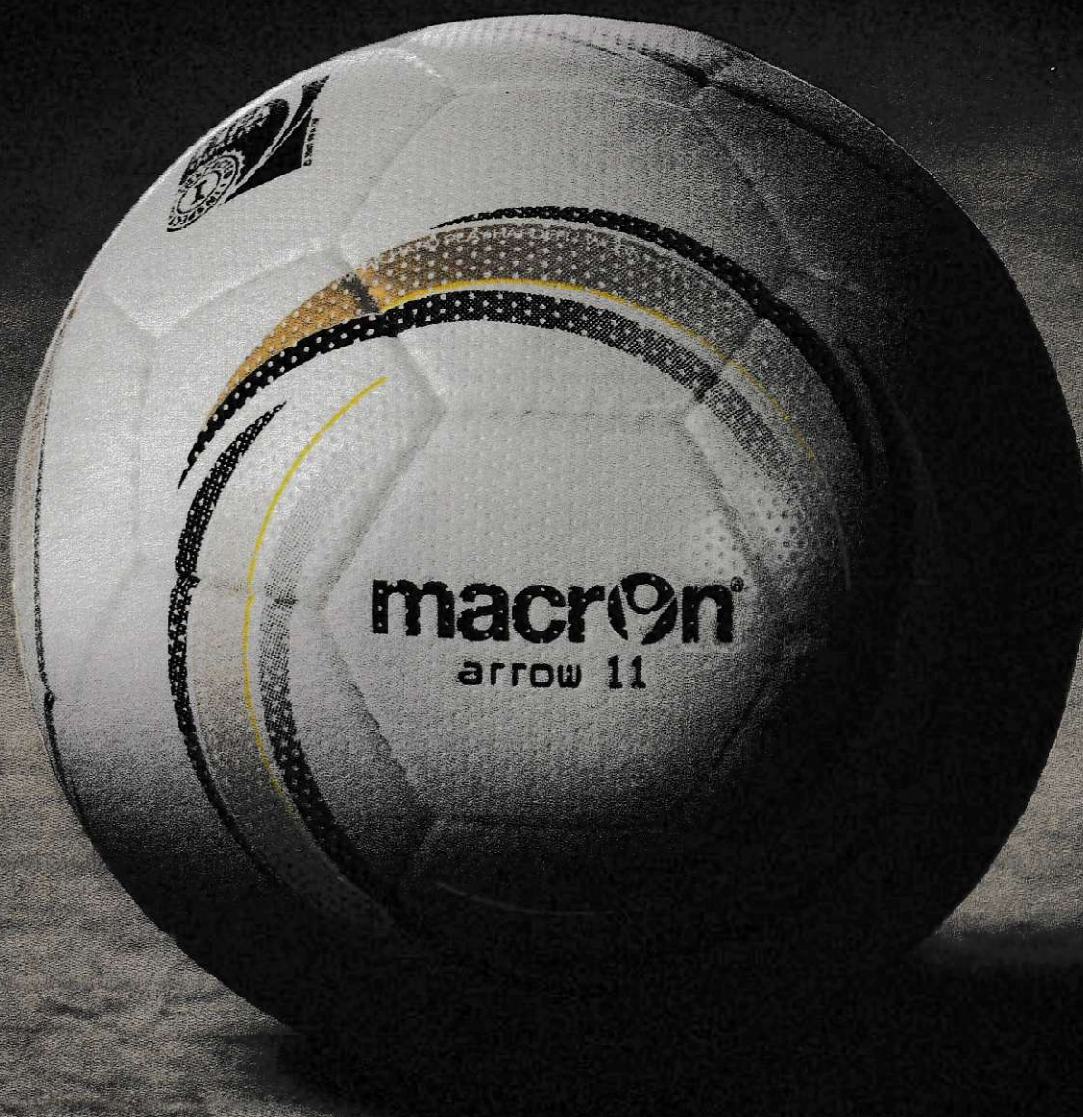

## Hamlet Pen Pics 2013/14

**GAVIN ROSE (Manager):** 36 year-old midfielder who is in his fifth season as Hamlet manager. Originally with the Club in season 2002/03, when he made 40 first team appearances whilst doubling up as youth team manager, he has also had spells with Wimbledon, Charlton Athletic, QPR, Southend United, Bromley, Gravesend & Northfleet and Walton & Hersham amongst others during his long career. In recent years he has been involved in running the Aspire Academy which specialises in coaching youngsters and he also had managerial experience with Beckenham Town whom he led to within a whisker of the Kent League championship. Under his guidance, Hamlet won the Ryman South title last season, after reaching the divisional play-off final in each of the previous two seasons; they have also reached two of the last three League Cup finals, and have won awards for their excellent disciplinary record. During the last two campaigns he has won a total of five Manager of the Month prizes and last term he became the first Hamlet boss to win a Manager of the Year award.

**JUNIOR KADI (Assistant Manager):** Influential midfielder and dead ball specialist who returned to Champion Hill in the summer of 2009 as Rose's assistant. Now aged 34, he began his career as a youngster at Coventry City and in 2000 was a member of Kingstonian's FA Trophy winning side. He had an earlier spell with the Hamlet in seasons 2001/02 and 2002/03, and his other former clubs include Woking, Slough Town, Lewes, Beckenham Town, Dartford and Carshalton Athletic where he was a key member of the squad that reached the Ryman Premier Division play-offs. He has now made over 180 appearances for Dulwich.

**KEVIN JAMES (Coach):** Experienced and skilful midfielder, aged 33, whose quality is highlighted at set pieces. He signed for Dulwich in February 2010, making his debut that month in a 2-0 win at Chatham Town, and last season passed a century of appearances for the Club. Earlier in his career he had spells with Charlton Athletic, Gillingham and Nottingham Forest, and he has also played in the Conference South for Chelmsford City.

**PETER ADENIYI:** Experienced midfield player, aged 33, who re-joined Dulwich during the summer of 2011 from Eastleigh and has now exceeded 150 appearances for the Club. Due to injuries, last season he featured mostly in the centre of defence where he played with great authority. He started his career with Erith Town and following an earlier spell with Dulwich in season 2002/03, he has also played for Lewes, Beckenham Town and Bromley. Team Captain.

**KARL BECKFORD:** Experienced midfielder, aged 28, who was a regular with Lewes last season. His other former clubs include AFC Wimbledon, Fisher Athletic, Carshalton Athletic, Kingstonian, Tooting & Mitcham United and Concord Rangers.

**MATHIEU BOYER:** French-born midfield player, aged 26, who joined Dulwich towards the end of last season and played in the last few fixtures. He was previously with the French club, Saint-Priest.

**NYREN CLUNIS:** 22 year-old winger with a fine turn of pace, he was the Club's top scorer in season 2010/11. A graduate of the Hamlet's successful youth side, he made his first team debut in November 2009 and his first senior goal secured a 1-0 win at Fleet Town. He has since been a regular in the squad and has now clocked up over 170 games.

**BILLY CROOK:** 23-year-old midfielder who joined during the summer, having been a regular for Metropolitan Police last season. He previously played for Tooting & Mitcham United and Carshalton Athletic.

**IAN DALY:** Recently-signed midfield player, aged 23, who had a spell at Bromley last season. Originally with Manchester City, he has played in Ireland for St. Patrick's and has also had spells in Spain and Greece.

**AHMED DEEN:** 28 year-old left-back who re-signed for the Club in March 2012, having previously played several games for the Hamlet at the end of the previous season. Born in Sierra Leone, he started his career with Peterborough United and has also had experience with Fisher Athletic, Aldershot Town, Hayes & Yeading United and Thurrock.



**LEWIS GONSALVES:** Reliable central defender, aged 31, who re-joined the Hamlet in October 2010 and marked his 100<sup>th</sup> appearance for the Club last season with a goal in the 3-3 draw at Burgess Hill Town. He rendered long and loyal service to Sutton United earlier in his career, making over 300 appearances for the Gander Green Lane outfit, and has also played for Carshalton Athletic in recent years. His first stint at Champion Hill was a short spell with Dulwich midway through season 2009/10.

**ELLIS GREEN:** A former Dulwich Hamlet youth, now aged 27, he returned to the Club in the summer of 2012 after two seasons with Maidstone United. A skilful wide midfielder player who delivers accurate crosses, he scored twice and was voted Man of the Match in the Hamlet's narrow defeat to Concord Rangers in last season's League Cup Final. His key contribution to the Club's Championship success also won him the Manager's Player of the Year award. He has also seen service with Eastleigh and Welling United.

**MARCEL HENRY-FRANCIS:** 19-year-old striker who joined the Hamlet earlier this month and scored twice on his full debut in the 3-1 win at Thamesmead. Previously with Birmingham City, he was on the bench for their FA Cup tie with Leeds United last season.

**PAUL IDEM:** 18 year-old reserve goalkeeper who has progressed from the Club's youth side. He achieved the rare feat of saving a penalty for each of the first team, reserves and youth team last September.

**RYAN JAMES:** Versatile 24 year-old who played at left-back for much of last season. He rejoined the Club last October, having made 17 appearances during his first spell at Champion Hill in season 2009/10. Since then he has had stints with Eastbourne Town, Metropolitan Police, Tooting & Mitcham United, Oxford United and Whitehawk.

**DEAN LODGE:** Exciting winger, aged 27, who signed from Kingstonian just before last season's transfer deadline. He came through the youth ranks at Queens Park Rangers, and has spent most of his senior career with K's, gaining a clean sweep of the end-of-season awards in 2007/08, whilst the following season he won an FA Cup Player of the Round award following a four-goal haul against Braintree Town. During short spells away from Kingsmeadow, he has played for Beckenham Town in the Kent League, Northwich Victoria in the Conference, and Carshalton Athletic.

**ERHUN OZTUMER:** Diminutive forward, aged 22, who is very skilful on the ball. He netted a match-saving penalty at Godalming on his Hamlet debut in September 2012 and finished last season as the team's leading scorer with 28 goals in 48 appearances, including a hat-trick in the 4-1 win at Worthing. **ETHAN PINNOCK:** 20 year-old midfielder who was a member of the Hamlet's successful youth team that reached the third round proper and a tie with Newcastle United in the FA Youth Cup three seasons ago. He made his senior debut in August 2010 and netted his first senior goal in the 2-0 win at Walton & Hersham that clinched that season's play-off spot. He returned to the squad over Easter after missing most of last season due to injury.

He first joined Dulwich in October 2009, re-signed in December 2011 and recently made his 100<sup>th</sup> appearance for the Club. He began his career with Oxford United and his other former clubs include Stevenage Borough, Maidenhead United, Sutton United and Carshalton Athletic.
