Boreham Wood Football Club, as it is now known, was formed in 1948, following the amalgamation of Boreham Rovers and Royal Retournez.

The Club progressed through the Mid-Herts. League and into the Parthenon League, where it finished Runners-up on three occasions, and Champions once.

The next step was to join the Spartan League, where the Club finished Runners-up in 1963/64 and 1965/66, before moving on to the Athenian League. Boreham Wood F.C. made rapid

progress in this League and won the Premier Division Championship, by nine points in 1973/74.

An application was made to join the Isthmian Football League in 1974/75 and two years later the Club won the Division Two Championship, by sixteen points. After five seasons in the Premier Division, Boreham Wood were relegated for the first and only time in their history, at the end of the 1981/82 season. During the following two seasons the Club finished sixth and fifth, and on each occasion missed promotion by just five points.

1994/95 was one of the most successful season's in the Club's history. The
Division One Championship was won by an amazing twenty-two points, and
promotion back to the Premier Division was achieved. The Club also reached
the Finals of the Herts. Charity Cup and the Carlsberg Cup, as well as the
Semi-Final of The London Challenge Cup.

Boreham Wood have reached the First Round Proper of the FA Challenge Cup twice, only to lose at Southend United in 1973/4 and 2-0 at Swindon Town in a replay in 1977/78, having drawn 0-0 at Meadow Park. The Club's best performances in the FA Challenge Trophy have been in the last and this current seasons, in both cases they have reached the Third Round.

In domestic football in Hertfordshire they have won many honours in the Senior
Challenge Cup, the Charity Shield, the Junior Cup, the Intermediate Cup and
the Charity Cup.

The Club's Reserve Team and Youth Team have both been successful in recent seasons, and several players have progressed through them and into the First Team squad.

Having regained Premier Division status the Club have been trying very hard
this season, not just to consolidate its position but to challenge for a place in the
Vauxhall Conference. As these notes were penned early last week, the Club
would have had to win its final game against relegated Worthing 4-0 or more
and both Enfield and Hayes would have needed to have lost their Saturday
matches for Boreham Wood to be ICIS League Champions.

Martin Taylor (Goalkeeper) A very experienced and highly rated 'keeper, now in his fourth season at Boreham Wood. Since joining from Bishop's Stortford he has made over 150 appearances. He has also played for Jyderup (Denmark), Hendon and Woodford Town.

Barry Fox (Defender) An experienced
player who has made almost 100 first team
appearances since joining from Grays
Athletic, where he spent many years.

Started his career at Millwall.

Tony Joyce (Defender) 24 year old who joined from Stevenage Borough early in 1994. His career started at Queens Park Rangers, but he has also played for Aldershot and Woking. A regular member of Stevenage's Isthmian League Premier
Division Championship winning side in 1993/94
Dave Hatchett (Utility player) The clubs longest serving member, he is now in his eleventh season with the Club he joined from Enfield. At the start of the current season, he had made 497 appearances and

had scored 80 times. "Player of the Year on

no less than six occasions. Dave had a well
 deserved Testimonial in 1994/95.

Garry Nisbet (Central Defender) 32 year
old who is a tall and commanding central
defender who joined the club from Collier
Row in the summer of 1994. Was Player of
the Year last season and has also played for
Eton Manor, Barkingside and Walthamstow
Pennant - his ambition in football is "to win
every game".

Billy Harrigan (Central Defender) Was appointed Boreham Wood's Club Captain on his arrival from Bishop's Stortford in the summer of 1994. The captain of the . "Bishop's" side that won Division One in 1993/94, Bill repeated the achievement with "Wood" in 1994/95. He has also played for Walthamstow Avenue, Chesham United and Middlesex Wanderers and was a member of the Leytonstone Ilford Championship side in 1988/9 under Ted Hardy. . Steve Heffer (Midfield) 22 year old who . joined from Hendon during the summer of 1994. His previous clubs are West Ham

United, Southend United, Swindon Town

and Grays Athletic. Missed much of the 1994/95 through injury, from which he is happily recovered.

Jason Shaw (Midfield) 24 year old attacking creative midfield player who joined Boreham Wood from Harrow Borough during the summer of 1994. Jason began his career with West Ham United and also played for Redbridge Forest and Dartford.

Anthony Samuels (Forward) Junior as he is popularly known is an experienced player, now aged 28 and with the speed and ability to turn defences inside out - he is also a proven goalscorer. Joined "Wood" from Leyton in October 1994 and previously played for Leytonstone Ilford, Bromley and Collier Row. A Stoke City trialist, he was the leading scorer for Boreham Wood in 1994/95 with 23 goals. Andy Prutton (Midfield) 26 year old who joined from Harrow Borough in the summer of 1995 where he had spent the previous three seasons. His career started at Wormley Rovers before progressing to Cheshunt and Dartford. His goalscoring abilities have greatly assisted this season. Marc Liburd (Wing Forward) 21 year old who joined Boreham Wood in 1992/93 having started his career at Watford as a Youth Trainee. He has also had spells with Millwall and Peterborough United. A lively forward who is noted for his crosses, which are still attracting the attention of Professional Club scouts.

Brian Stein (Forward) Joined Wood last summer after a distinguished career in Professional football. Started out at Edgware FC but quickly moved on to Luton where he scored 130 times in just over 400 games for the club. He has also played for Cannes, Barnet, Stevenage Borough, St. Albans City and Enfield. Gained International honours at Under 21 and Full level for England, and is the brother of Edwin and Mark Stein

**Damon Miles** (Forward) Signed earlier this • season from ICIS Division Two side Ware. • Was the leading scorer for Ware last • season. •

Sutton United came into being in 1898 when two local clubs, Sutton Association and Sutton Guild Rovers merged. They moved to the Gander Green Lane enclosure in 1913 and some fifteen years later won their first major honour - the Athenian League.

After a depressing time in the early 30's . they later become one of the top amateur • sides in the country and the return to • peace in 1946 saw the club bring off • their second Athenian championship. Another dozen or so years were to pass • before more success in the form of a •

third championship was to come Sutton's way.

In 1963 under Sid Cann, the club reached Wembley for the Amateur Cup Final and although they lost to Wimbledon, some success came in the form of an invitation to join the Isthmian League. Only four years were to elapse before Sutton won the title, and two years later they were back at Wembley, again for a . fruitless visit for the Amateur Cup Final of 1969. In 1970 they achieved national • fame by playing Don Revie's Leeds United at Gander Green Lane in the FA Cup. After the break up of that side and several years in the doldrums, Keith Blunt became manager and immediately matters improved. U's became the only side to win the Anglo-Italian semi-professional tournament and they returned to . Wembley for a third time (alas unluckily again) in the 1981 FA Trophy Final. By • . this time Barrie Williams was the manager and after winning the Isthmian League • title in 1985 and 1986, Sutton accepted the offer to move up to the Conference - finishing in the top three in three out of the first four seasons. Aldershot and Peterborough became victims of the U's in the FA Cup, but the magic memory is the defeat of Coventry City 2-1 at Gander Green Lane. Sutton lost their Conference spot in 1991 despite winning the Bob Lord Trophy . (league cup). They have, since their time back in the Isthmian League continued • their FA Cup giant-killing tradition with wins at Colchester United and Torquay

United. They have also registered wins in the Surrey Senior Cup Final in 1993 and 1995.

The U's have a tradition of inspiring long service, former goalkeeper Ralph Carr
joined from Hayes in the 1930's and won an England Amateur Cap before
serving as Club Secretary. He is still a director. Joint Managers Larry Pritchard
and Ted Shepherd are two more who have found it difficult to stay away from the
Lane. The club was rocked in January this year by the death of popular Chairman
Dave Hermitage, himself a former player in the 1960's after a short illness.

Gary McCann (Goalkeeper) After several Ewell years at the club as a youth team player, during which time he had trials for several London pro clubs, Gary broke into the first team and made over 50 appearances before moving on to several clubs including Walton & Hersham and Chesham. Recently made his 100th. appearance. Chris Roberts (Goalkeeper) Signed earlier this season after being released by Cambridge United, previously with Crystal . Palace. Paul Gates (Defender) Consistent player who is at home in any defensive position and can also play in midfield. Signed from Chipstead in 1989, he has now made over 350 appearances and was voted Player of the Year in 1992/93. He has also represented Middlesex Wanderers. Giles Marchant (Defender) Right Full . Back signed in March 1994 from Walton & Hersham, with whom he gained league . representative honours. Previously with a Wimbledon. Nigel Golley (Defender) Signed from Whyteleafe in 1982, he has now made over 650 appearances and scored more than 80 goals for the club and was rewarded with a testimonial against Crystal Palace last season. He has won the ø Football Club and Supporters' Club Player æ of the Year awards, including both in the same year year in 1992. Mark Costello (Defender) A graduate of Sutton's Youth Team who won a record number of Surrey youth caps and made his . senior debut in November 1990, since . he has made around 300 when . appearances. Scored only his second goal for the club in the semi-final replay win at Carshalton Athletic. . Chris Green (Defender) Signed from Dulwich midway through last season and is quickly establishing himself as а dominating centre-half. His father, Mike, was at one time player-manager of Torquay United. . Steve Watson (Midfield) Powerfully built . midfielder signed from Croydon in . October '95, he has quickly adapted to the . higher level. Jimmy Dack (Midfield) On Brentford's books as a youngster, he first joined Sutton in August 1990 from Epsom &

Ewell and made around 50 senior appearances over the next three years. After spells with Crawley and Carshalton, he returned to the club during last summer and celebrated his 100th. appearance for the club with both goals in the 2-1 win at Carshalton on Easter Monday.

**David Shepherd** (Midfield) Graduated through the youth team to make a dozen first team appearances at Vauxhall Conference level in the late 1980's, and returned to the club towards the end of last season. His other clubs include Whyteleafe and Crawley.

**Steve Payne** (Midfield) Winger signed in the close season from Crawley Town. Previously with Ringmer, he opened his account with two goals in the win at Hendon and has scored nine times in his 50 appearances.

Martin Lempriere (Midfield) Right sided player signed from Kingstonian in March 1995. Previously with Crawley Town and on the books of Crystal Palace as a youngster. Dominic Feltham (Forward) Signed in November 1991 after five years in America where he played for Baltimore Blast after earning a marketing degree. Has averaged better than a goal every other game after more than 200 appearances. The leading scorer last season, he was also voted Football Club Player of the Year. Amongst the leading ICIS League scorers again this season with 26 league and cup goals after 27th. April.

. Mark Hynes (Forward) Signed at the start of . the season from Whyteleafe, with whom he enjoyed three good years after joining from . Fisher Athletic. He finished as top goalscorer 0 in Division One in 1993 and was voted Whyteleafe's Player of the Year. He has also played for Croydon, Merstham and Croydon Athletic. Scored twice in the semi-final replay win at Carshalton.Voted Supporters Player . of the Year for 1995/96 after scoring 21 . times in 47 appearances.

Joff Vansittart (Forward) A former Brighton junior. Joff broke into the Crawley side as a teenager and left the Sussex club for Sutton in the summer. Scored on his U's debut at Bishop's Stortford on the opening day of the season and reached double figures in the league by the end of September. Recently returned to the First Team after injury.
